# Mark 1

## **Mark 1:1**

#### ULT

<sup>1</sup> The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

#### **UST**

<sup>1</sup> This is the beginning of the good news about Jesus the Messiah, who is the Son of God.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## **Mark 1:2**

## **ULT**

<sup>2</sup> Just as it is written in Isaiah the prophet, "Behold, I am sending my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way;

## **UST**

<sup>2</sup> This good news began just as the prophet Isaiah said that it would when he wrote long ago, "Look, I am sending my messenger ahead of you. He will make people ready for when you come.

# What did the prophet Isaiah predict would happen before the Lord came? (vv2-3)

Isaiah predicted that God would send a messenger, a voice of someone calling out in the wilderness, to prepare the way of the Lord.

#### **Mark 1:3**

## **ULT**

<sup>3</sup> a voice crying out in the wilderness, 'Make ready the way of the Lord; make his paths straight.'"

## **UST**

<sup>3</sup> He will be a voice calling out in the desolate place to anyone who hears him, saying 'Make yourselves ready to welcome the Lord. Get everything organized for his coming.'"

## **Mark 1:4**

## **ULT**

<sup>4</sup> John came, the one baptizing in the wilderness and preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins.

## **UST**

<sup>4</sup> The messenger that Isaiah wrote about was John. People called him "The Baptizer." John was in a desolate area near the Jordan River. He was baptizing people and telling them, "If you want God to forgive your sins, you must reject wrong ways of living. Then I will baptize you!"

## What did John come preaching?

John came preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins.

# **Mark 1:5**

# **ULT**

<sup>5</sup> And the whole region of Judea and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River, confessing their sins.

## **UST**

<sup>5</sup> A great number of people from the district of Judea and the city of Jerusalem went out to the wilderness to hear John speak. Many of those who heard him agreed that they had sinned. Then John baptized them in the Jordan River.

## What did the people do as they were baptized by John?

The people confessed their sins as they were baptized by John.

## **Mark 1:6**

#### **ULT**

<sup>6</sup> And John was clothed with camel hair and a leather belt around his waist, and eating locusts and wild honey.

# **UST**

<sup>6</sup> John wore clothes made of camel's hair and a leather belt around his waist. He ate grasshoppers and honey that he found in that desolate area.

## What did John eat?

John ate locusts and wild honey.

## **Mark 1:7**

## **ULT**

<sup>7</sup> And he was proclaiming, saying, "One mightier than I is coming after me, of whom the strap of his sandals I am not worthy to stoop down to untie.

## **UST**

<sup>7</sup> He was preaching, "Very shortly one will come who is very great. I am nothing compared to him. I am not even worthy to stoop down and untie his sandals.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## **Mark 1:8**

## **ULT**

<sup>8</sup> I baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

## **UST**

<sup>8</sup> I baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

# With what did John say the one coming after him would baptize?

John said the one coming after him would baptize with the Holy Spirit.

## **Mark 1:9**

## **ULT**

<sup>9</sup> And it happened that in those days Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee, and he was baptized by John in the Jordan.

## **UST**

<sup>9</sup> During the time when John was preaching, Jesus came from Nazareth, a town in the Galilee region. He went to where John was preaching, and John baptized him in the Jordan River.

#### Mark 1:10

## **ULT**

<sup>10</sup> And immediately, coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens being split open and the Spirit coming down on him like a dove.

## **UST**

<sup>10</sup> As Jesus was coming up out of the water, he saw heaven open up and the Spirit of God descending on himself. The Spirit of God came down from heaven like a dove.

## What did Jesus see as he came up out of the water after being baptized by John?

After being baptized, Jesus saw the heavens split open and the Spirit descend on him as a dove.

# Mark 1:11

# **ULT**

<sup>11</sup> And a voice came out of the heavens, "You are my beloved Son. I am well-pleased with you."

#### **UST**

<sup>11</sup> Then, God spoke from heaven and said, "You are my Son, the one whom I love dearly. I am very pleased with you."

## What did the voice from heaven say after Jesus was baptized?

The voice from heaven said, "You are my beloved Son; I am very pleased with you".

#### Mark 1:12

# **ULT**

<sup>12</sup> And immediately, the Spirit compelled him to go out into the wilderness.

## **UST**

<sup>12</sup> Then the Spirit of God sent Jesus out into the desolate area.

# Who drove Jesus out into the wilderness?

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the wilderness.

## Mark 1:13

## **ULT**

<sup>13</sup> And he was in the wilderness 40 days, being tempted by Satan. And he was with the wild animals, and the angels were serving him.

## **UST**

<sup>13</sup> Jesus was in the wilderness for 40 days. During that time, Satan was tempting him. There were wild animals in that place, and angels were taking care of him.

# How long was Jesus in the wilderness, and what happened to him there?

Jesus was in the wilderness forty days, and he was tempted by Satan there.

# Mark 1:14

## **ULT**

<sup>14</sup> But after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God

#### **UST**

<sup>14</sup> Later, after the governor Herod Antipas put John the Baptizer in prison, Jesus went to the Galilee region. In Galilee, he was preaching God's good news.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 1:15

#### **ULT**

<sup>15</sup> and saying, "The time has been fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near. Repent and believe in the gospel.

# **UST**

<sup>15</sup> He was saying, "The time has come at last. God will soon show that he is king. Be sorry that you have sinned, and decide to stop it, so that God may forgive you. Believe the good news."

# What message did Jesus preach?

Jesus preached that the kingdom of God was near, and that people must repent and believe in the gospel.

## Mark 1:16

## **ULT**

<sup>16</sup> And walking beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and Andrew, the brother of Simon, casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen.

## **UST**

<sup>16</sup> One day, while Jesus was walking along the coast of the sea of Galilee, he saw two men, Simon and Simon's brother, Andrew. They were casting their fishing net into the sea. They earned money by catching and selling fish.

# What was the occupation of Simon and Andrew?

Simon and Andrew were fishermen.

## Mark 1:17

#### **ULT**

<sup>17</sup> and Jesus said to them, "Come after me, and I will make you to become fishers of men."

## **UST**

<sup>17</sup> Then Jesus said to them, "Just like you have been gathering fish, come with me and I will teach you how to gather people to be my disciples."

# What did Jesus say he would make Simon and Andrew?

lesus said he would make Simon and Andrew fishers of men.

# Mark 1:18

## **ULT**

<sup>18</sup> And immediately, having left the nets, they followed him.

## **UST**

<sup>18</sup> Immediately after Jesus said this, they stopped working, and they went with him.

## Mark 1:19

## **ULT**

<sup>19</sup> And having gone on a little farther, he saw James, the {son} of Zebedee, and John, his brother, and they are mending the nets in the boat.

## **UST**

<sup>19</sup> After they had gone on a little further, Jesus saw two other men, James and James' brother, John. They were the sons of a man named Zebedee. They were all in a boat fixing their fishing nets.

## What was the occupation of James and John?

James and John were fishermen.

# Mark 1:20

## **ULT**

<sup>20</sup> And immediately, having called them and they having left their father, Zebedee, in the boat with the hired servants, they went away after him.

## **UST**

<sup>20</sup> As soon as Jesus saw them, he told them to come with him. So they left their father Zebedee in the boat with his servants, and they went away with Jesus.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 1:21

# **ULT**

<sup>21</sup> And he enters into Capernaum, and immediately on the Sabbaths, having entered into the synagogue, he began to teach.

#### **UST**

<sup>21</sup> Jesus, along with Peter, Andrew, James and John went into a nearby town called Capernaum. There, Jesus began teaching in the Jewish meeting place on the Sabbath.

#### Mark 1:22

## **ULT**

<sup>22</sup> And they were astonished at his teaching, for he was teaching them as having authority and not as the scribes.

## **UST**

<sup>22</sup> They were amazed at the way he taught. He taught like a teacher who relies on what he himself knows. He did not teach like those who taught the Jewish laws, who repeated the different things that other men had taught.

# Why did Jesus' teaching astonish the people in the synagogue?

Jesus' teaching astonished the people because Jesus taught as one with authority.

## Mark 1:23

# **ULT**

<sup>23</sup> And immediately there was a man in their synagogue with an unclean spirit, and he cried out,

# **UST**

<sup>23</sup> In the Jewish preaching place where Jesus taught, there was a man that an evil spirit controlled. The man with the evil spirit began shouting,

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 1:24

#### **ULT**

<sup>24</sup> saying, "What to us and to you, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God!"

#### **UST**

<sup>24</sup> "Hey! Jesus, from Nazareth! We evil spirits have nothing to do with you! Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are. You are the Holy One from God!"

# What title did the unclean spirit in the synagogue give Jesus?

The unclean spirit in the synagogue gave Jesus the title of the Holy One of God.

#### Mark 1:25

### **ULT**

<sup>25</sup> And Jesus rebuked it, saying, "Be silenced and come out from him!"

# **UST**

<sup>25</sup> Jesus rebuked the evil spirit, saying, "Be quiet and come out of that man!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 1:26

## **ULT**

<sup>26</sup> And having thrown him down and having cried out with a loud voice, the unclean spirit went out from him.

#### **UST**

<sup>26</sup> The evil spirit shook the man violently. It screamed loudly, and then he came out of the man and left.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 1:27

## **ULT**

<sup>27</sup> And they all were amazed, so they discussed among themselves, saying, "What is this? A new teaching according to authority! He even commands the unclean spirits and they obey him!"

# **UST**

<sup>27</sup> All the people who were in the synagogue were amazed. As a result, they discussed this among themselves, saying, "This is something we have never seen before! Not only does he teach in a new and authoritative way, but he also commands the evil spirits and they obey him!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 1:28

#### **ULT**

<sup>28</sup> And the news of him immediately went out everywhere into the whole surrounding region of Galilee.

# **UST**

<sup>28</sup> The people very soon told many others throughout the entire Galilee region what Jesus had done.

# What happened with the news about Jesus?

The news about Jesus went out everywhere.

## Mark 1:29

## **ULT**

<sup>29</sup> And immedately, having come out from the synagogue, they came into the house of Simon and Andrew, along with James and John.

## **UST**

<sup>29</sup> After they left the Jewish preaching place, Jesus, Simon and Andrew, along with James and John, went directly to the house of Simon and Andrew.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 1:30

## **ULT**

<sup>30</sup> Now the mother-in-law of Simon was lying down, being sick with a fever, and immediately they speak to him concerning her.

# **UST**

<sup>30</sup> Simon's mother-in-law was lying in bed because she was feeling sick due to having a fever. Right away someone told Jesus about her being sick.

# When they went into Simon's house, who did Jesus heal?

When they went into Simon's house, Jesus healed Simon's mother-in-law.

## Mark 1:31

#### **ULT**

<sup>31</sup> And having come near, he raised her up, having taken hold of {her} hand, and the fever left her, and she began to serve them.

# **UST**

<sup>31</sup> Jesus went to her, took her by the hand, and helped her up. She immediately recovered from the fever and began serving them.

## Mark 1:32

## **ULT**

<sup>32</sup> Now when it became evening, after the sun had set, they were bringing to him all those having sickness and those possessed by demons.

## **UST**

<sup>32</sup> That evening, after the sun had gone down, people from the surrounding area brought to Jesus many others who were sick and those that evil spirits controlled.

## What happened when it was evening? (vv32-34)

When it was evening, the people brought all who were sick or possessed by demons, and Jesus healed them.

# Mark 1:33

# **ULT**

<sup>33</sup> And the whole city was gathered together at the door.

## **UST**

<sup>33</sup> It seemed as though everyone who lived in the town had gathered at the doorway of Simon's house.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 1:34

## **ULT**

<sup>34</sup> And he healed many having sickness with various diseases, and cast out many demons, but he was not permitting the demons to speak because they knew him.

## **UST**

<sup>34</sup> Jesus healed many people who were sick with various diseases. He also forced many evil spirits to come out from people. He did not allow the evil spirits to tell people about him, because they knew that he was the Holy One from God.

## Mark 1:35

## **ULT**

<sup>35</sup> And very early in the night, having gotten up, he left and went away to a solitary place, and there he began to pray.

## **UST**

<sup>35</sup> Jesus got up very early the next morning while it was still dark. He left the house and went away from the town to a place where there were no people. Then he prayed.

# What did Jesus do before the sun rose?

Before the sun rose, Jesus went out to a solitary place and prayed there.

# Mark 1:36

# **ULT**

<sup>36</sup> And Simon and those who {were} with him searched for him,

## **UST**

<sup>36</sup> Simon and his companions searched for him.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 1:37

## **ULT**

<sup>37</sup> and found him, and say to him, "Everyone is seeking you."

# **UST**

<sup>37</sup> When they found him they said, "Everyone in town is looking for you."

## Mark 1:38

## **ULT**

<sup>38</sup> And he says to them, "Let us go elsewhere, into the surrounding towns, so that I may preach there also, because I came for this."

## **UST**

<sup>38</sup> Jesus said to them, "We need to go to the other towns in this region so that I can preach there as well. This is the reason I came here."

# What did Jesus tell Simon he had come to do? (vv38-39)

Jesus said that he had come to preach in the surrounding towns.

# Mark 1:39

## ULT

<sup>39</sup> And he went in all Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and casting out the demons.

#### **UST**

<sup>39</sup> So they went throughout Galilee region. As they went, Jesus would preach in the Jewish preaching places and forced evil spirits to come out from people.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 1:40

#### **ULT**

<sup>40</sup> And a leper comes to him, begging him and kneeling down, saying to him, "If you would be willing, you are able to make me clean."

#### **UST**

<sup>40</sup> One day a man who had a bad skin disease called leprosy came to Jesus. He knelt down in front of Jesus and pleaded with him, saying, "Please make me clean, because you are able to make me clean if it is your will!"

What attitude did Jesus have toward the leper who begged Jesus to be healed? (vv40-42) Jesus had pity on the leper and healed him.

## **Mark 1:41**

# **ULT**

<sup>41</sup> And having been moved with compassion, having reached out his hand, he touched him, and says to him, "I am willing. Be cleansed."

# **UST**

<sup>41</sup> Jesus felt compassion for him. He reached out his hand and touched the man. Then he said to him, "It is my will to heal you, so be healed!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 1:42

# **ULT**

<sup>42</sup> And immediately the leprosy departed from him, and he was made clean.

# **UST**

<sup>42</sup> Immediately the man was healed! He was no longer a leper!

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 1:43

# **ULT**

<sup>43</sup> But having strictly warned him, he immediately sent him away.

# **UST**

<sup>43</sup> Jesus gave the man a warning as he was sending him away.

## Mark 1:44

## **ULT**

<sup>44</sup> And he says to him, "See that you may say nothing to anyone, but go, show yourself to the priest, and offer for your cleansing what Moses commanded, for a testimony to them."

## **UST**

<sup>44</sup> He said, "Do not tell anyone what just happened. Instead, go to a priest and show yourself to him in order that he may examine you and see that you no longer have leprosy. Then make the offering that Moses commanded for people whom God has healed from leprosy. This will be the testimony to the community that you no longer have leprosy."

## What did Jesus tell the leper to do, and why?

Jesus told the leper to go offer the sacrifices according to what Moses commanded as a testimony.

## Mark 1:45

## **ULT**

<sup>45</sup> But he, having gone out, began to proclaim often and to spread the word widely, so that he was able no longer to enter into a town openly, but he was out in desolate places, and they were coming to him from all sides.

# **UST**

<sup>45</sup> The man did not follow Jesus' instruction. He began telling many people about how Jesus had healed him. As a result, Jesus was no longer able to enter towns publicly because the crowds of people would surround him. Instead, he remained outside the towns in places where no one lived. But people kept coming to him from all over that region.

# Mark 2

## **Mark 2:1**

# **ULT**

<sup>1</sup> And having entered again into Capernaum after {some} days, it was heard that he is at home.

#### **UST**

<sup>1</sup> After some days had passed, Jesus returned to the town called Capernaum. People spread the news quickly to others that Jesus had returned and was in a certain house.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# **Mark 2:2**

#### ULT

<sup>2</sup> And many gathered so that there {was} no more space, not even at the door, and he began to speak the word to them.

# **UST**

<sup>2</sup> Soon a great number of people gathered where Jesus was staying. The number was so great that the house was full. There was no longer space to stand, not even around the doorway. Jesus spoke God's message to them.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## **Mark 2:3**

#### ULT

<sup>3</sup> And they come bringing to him a paralytic, being carried by four men.

# **UST**

<sup>3</sup> Some people came to the house, who were bringing to Jesus a man who was paralyzed. Four men carried him on a sleeping pad.

#### Mark 2:4

## **ULT**

<sup>4</sup> And not being able to approach him because of the crowd, they removed the roof where he was, and having dug an opening, they lower the mat where the paralytic was lying.

## **UST**

<sup>4</sup> They were not able to bring the man close to Jesus because of the crowd that had gathered. So, they went up on the roof of the house and made a big hole in the roof above Jesus. They lowered the paralyzed man on his sleeping pad through the hole in front of Jesus.

# What did the four men do who were carrying the paralyzed man?

The men removed the roof of the house and lowered the paralyzed man to Jesus.

# **Mark 2:5**

# **ULT**

<sup>5</sup> And Jesus, having seen their faith, says to the paralytic, "Child, your sins are forgiven."

# **UST**

<sup>5</sup> After Jesus perceived that the men believed that he could heal this man, he said to the paralyzed man, "My child, I have forgiven your sins!"

# What did Jesus say to the paralyzed man?

Jesus said, "Child, your sins are forgiven".

## Mark 2:6

## **ULT**

<sup>6</sup> But some of the scribes were sitting there, and reasoning in their hearts,

## **UST**

<sup>6</sup> Some men who taught the lewish laws were sitting there. They started thinking to themselves,

# Why did some of the scribes object to what Jesus had said? (vv6-7)

Some of the scribes reasoned that Jesus had blasphemed because only God can forgive sins.

## **Mark 2:7**

## **ULT**

<sup>7</sup> "Why does this man speak this way? He is blaspheming! Who is able to forgive sins except God alone?"

# **UST**

<sup>7</sup> "Who does this man think he is talking like that? He insults God by saying that! No person can forgive sins—only God can!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 2:8

# **ULT**

<sup>8</sup> And immediately Jesus, having perceived in his spirit that they are thinking in this manner within themselves, says to them, "Why are you thinking these things in your hearts?

## **UST**

<sup>8</sup> Jesus knew right away within himself what they were thinking. He said to them, "Why are you thinking that I don't have the right to forgive sins?

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# **Mark 2:9**

## ULT

<sup>9</sup> Which is easier to say to the paralytic, 'Your sins are forgiven' or to say 'Get up and take up your mat, and walk'?

## **UST**

<sup>9</sup> Which would be easier for me to say to the paralyzed man, 'I have forgiven your sins' or to say, 'Stand up! Take your sleeping pad and walk'?

## Mark 2:10

## **ULT**

<sup>10</sup> But in order that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on the earth to forgive sins," he says to the paralytic,

## **UST**

<sup>10</sup> I will demonstrate to you that God has given the Son of Man authority on earth to forgive sins." Then he said to the paralyzed man,

How did Jesus demonstrate that he had authority on earth to forgive sins? (vv10-12) Jesus told the paralyzed man to take up his bed and go to his house, and the man did.

# Mark 2:11

## ULT

<sup>11</sup> "I say to you, get up, take up your mat, and go away to your house."

## **UST**

11 "Stand up! Pick up your sleeping pad and go home!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 2:12

## **ULT**

<sup>12</sup> And having gotten up and immediately having taken up the mat, he went out in front of everyone, so that they are all amazed and glorify God, saying, "We never saw thus."

# **UST**

<sup>12</sup> The man stood up immediately. He picked up the sleeping pad, and he walked out of the house while all the people there were watching. They were all amazed, and they praised God and said, "We have never before seen anything like what happened just now!"

#### Mark 2:13

## **ULT**

<sup>13</sup> And he went out again beside the sea, and all the crowd was coming to him, and he was teaching them.

# **UST**

<sup>13</sup> Jesus left the town of Capernaum and walked again along the shore of the Sea of Galilee. A large crowd came to him and he taught them.

# What was Levi doing when Jesus told Levi to follow him? (vv13-14)

Levi was sitting at the tax-collecting place when Jesus called him.

#### Mark 2:14

# **ULT**

<sup>14</sup> And passing by, he saw Levi the {son} of Alphaeus sitting at the tax collector's tent, and he says to him, "Follow me." And having gotten up, he followed him.

#### **UST**

<sup>14</sup> As he was walking, he saw a man named Levi whose father's name was Alpheus. He was sitting in his office where he collected taxes. Jesus said to him, "Come with me and be my disciple." He got up and went with Jesus.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 2:15

#### **ULT**

<sup>15</sup> And he happened to recline to eat in his house, and many tax collectors and sinners were dining with Jesus and his disciples, for many also were following him.

# **UST**

<sup>15</sup> Later, Jesus was eating a meal in Levi's house. Many men who collected taxes and others who the religious leaders considered to be sinners were eating with Jesus and his disciples. There were many people like this who were going everywhere with Jesus.

# At Levi's house, what was Jesus doing that offended the Pharisees? (vv15-16)

Jesus was dining with the sinful people and tax collectors.

#### Mark 2:16

## **ULT**

<sup>16</sup> And the scribes of the Pharisees, having seen that he was eating with the sinners and tax collectors, began to say to his disciples, "Why is he eating with the tax collectors and sinners?"

## **UST**

<sup>16</sup> Men who taught the Jewish laws and who were members of the Pharisee sect saw that Jesus was eating with sinners and men who collected taxes. They asked Jesus' disciples, "Why does he eat and drink with sinners and men who collect taxes?"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 2:17

#### ULT

<sup>17</sup> And having heard this, Jesus says to them, "The ones being healthy do not have need of a physician, but the ones having sickness. I came not to call the righteous, but sinners."

## **UST**

<sup>17</sup> After Jesus heard what they were asking, he said to the men who taught the Jewish laws, "Healthy people do not need a doctor. On the contrary, it is those who are sick who need a doctor. I did not come to invite those who think they are righteous to come to me, but those who know that they have sinned."

# Who did Jesus say he had come to call?

Jesus said he had come to call sinful people.

#### Mark 2:18

## **ULT**

<sup>18</sup> And the disciples of John and the Pharisees were fasting, and they come and say to him, "Because of what are the disciples of John and the disciples of the Pharisees fasting, but your disciples are not fasting?"

#### **UST**

<sup>18</sup> Now at this time, the students of John the Baptizer and some men who belonged to the Pharisee sect were abstaining from food, as they often did. Some men came to Jesus and asked him, "The disciples of John and of the Pharisees often abstain from food. Why do your students not abstain from food?"

#### What question did some people ask Jesus about fasting?

They asked Jesus why his disciples did not fast when John's disciples and the Pharisees' disciples did fast.

#### Mark 2:19

## **ULT**

<sup>19</sup> And Jesus said to them, "The sons of the wedding chamber are not able to fast while the bridegroom is still with them, are they? As much time as they have the bridegroom with them, they are not able to fast.

## **UST**

<sup>19</sup> Jesus said to them, "When a man is marrying a woman, his friends will certainly not abstain from food while he is still with them. The wedding is a time of feasting and celebrating with the groom. It is not a time for abstaining from food, especially while the groom is with them.

# How did Jesus explain why his disciples were not fasting?

Jesus said that while the bridegroom is still with the wedding attendants they cannot fast.

# Mark 2:20

# **ULT**

<sup>20</sup> But days will come when the bridegroom may be taken away from them, and in those days, then they will fast.

#### **UST**

<sup>20</sup> But some day, the groom will be taken away from his friends. Then in those days, they will abstain from food."

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 2:21

#### ULT

<sup>21</sup> No one sews a patch of unshrunk cloth on an old garment, but if not, the filler pulls away from it, the new from the old, and there is a worse tear.

# **UST**

<sup>21</sup> Jesus went on to say to them, "People do not sew a patch of unshrunken cloth on an old garment in order to mend a hole. If they did, when they washed the garment, the patch would shrink and the new piece of cloth would tear off more of the old cloth. As a result, the hole would become even bigger!

#### Mark 2:22

## **ULT**

<sup>22</sup> And no one puts new wine into old wineskins, but if not, the wine will burst the wineskins and the wine and the wineskins will be destroyed, but new wine into fresh wineskins."

## **UST**

<sup>22</sup> Similarly, people do not put new wine into old animal skin bags to store it. If they did, the new wine will burst the skin bags because they would not stretch when the wine ferments and expands. As a result both the wine and the skin bags would be ruined! On the contrary, people must put new wine into new skin bags!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 2:23

#### ULT

<sup>23</sup> And he happened on the Sabbaths to pass through the grainfields, and his disciples began to make {their} way, picking the heads of grain.

# **UST**

<sup>23</sup> On one Jewish day of rest, Jesus was walking through some grain fields with his students. As they were walking along through the grain fields, Jesus' disciples were plucking some of the heads of grain.

# What did Jesus' disciples do in some fields on the Sabbath which offended the Pharisees? (vv23-24)

Jesus' disciples picked heads of grain and ate them on the Sabbath.

#### Mark 2:24

#### **ULT**

<sup>24</sup> And the Pharisees were saying to him, "Look, why are they doing what is not lawful on the Sabbaths?"

#### **UST**

<sup>24</sup> Some of the Pharisees saw what they were doing and said to Jesus, "Look at this! They are breaking the Jewish law concerning the day of rest. Why are they doing that?"

## Mark 2:25

## **ULT**

<sup>25</sup> And he says to them, "Have you never read what David did when he had need and was hungry—he and the ones with him—

## **UST**

<sup>25</sup> Jesus said to them, "Have you never read the scriptures concerning King David and the men who were with him when they were hungry?

# What example did Jesus give of someone who needed and ate bread normally forbidden for them? (vv25-26)

Jesus gave the example of David who out of need ate the bread of the presence normally reserved for the priests.

## Mark 2:26

#### **ULT**

<sup>26</sup> how he went into the house of God during Abiathar the high priest, and ate the bread of the presence, which is not lawful to eat, except for the priests, and he also gave to those being with him?"

# **UST**

<sup>26</sup> During the time Abiathar was high priest, King David entered the house of God and asked for some bread. The high priest gave him some of the bread that had been on display before God. According to our laws, only the priests could eat that bread! But David ate some of it. Then he also gave some of it to the men who were with him."

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 2:27

#### **ULT**

<sup>27</sup> And he said to them, "The Sabbath was made for man, and not man for the Sabbath.

## **UST**

<sup>27</sup> Jesus said to them further, "God made the day of rest for the sake of mankind. He did not make the day of rest to be a burden on mankind.

## For whom did Jesus say the Sabbath was made?

Jesus said the Sabbath was made for people.

# Mark 2:28

# **ULT**

 $^{\mathbf{28}}$  Therefore, the Son of Man is Lord, even of the Sabbath."

# **UST**

<sup>28</sup> So, to be clear, the Son of Man is Lord, even of the day of rest!"

# What authority did Jesus claim for himself?

Jesus said that he was Lord also of the Sabbath.

# Mark 3

## **Mark 3:1**

# **ULT**

<sup>1</sup> And he entered into the synagogue again, and there was a man having a withered hand.

#### **UST**

<sup>1</sup> On another Jewish day of rest, Jesus again went into a Jewish meeting place. There was a man there whose hand was shriveled.

# Why were they watching Jesus on the Sabbath in the synagogue? (vv1-2)

They were watching Jesus to see if he would heal on the Sabbath, so they could accuse him.

#### **Mark 3:2**

# **ULT**

<sup>2</sup> And they were watching him closely, if he will heal him on the Sabbaths, so that they might accuse him.

## **UST**

<sup>2</sup> Some men of the Pharisee sect watched him carefully to see whether he would heal the man on the day of rest. For they wanted to be able to accuse him of doing something wrong.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## **Mark 3:3**

## **ULT**

<sup>3</sup> And he says to the man having the withered hand, "Stand up in the midst."

## **UST**

<sup>3</sup> Jesus said to the man whose hand was shriveled, "Stand up here in front of everyone!" {So the man stood up.}

#### **Mark 3:4**

## **ULT**

<sup>4</sup> And he says to them, "Is it lawful on the Sabbaths to do good, or to do harm; to save a life, or to kill?" But they were keeping silent.

## **UST**

<sup>4</sup> Then Jesus said to the people, "Do the laws that God gave Moses permit people to do good on the day of rest, or to do evil? Do the laws permit us to save a person's life on the day of rest, or permit us to refuse to help a person and let them die?" But they did not reply.

## What question did Jesus ask the people about the Sabbath?

Jesus asked the people if it was lawful to do good or to do harm on the Sabbath.

# How did the people respond to Jesus' question?

The people were silent.

#### **Mark 3:5**

## **ULT**

<sup>5</sup> And having looked around at them with anger, being grieved by the hardness of their heart, he says to the man, "Stretch out your hand." And he stretched it out, and his hand was restored.

## **UST**

<sup>5</sup> He looked around at them angrily. He was very disappointed that they were stubborn {and not willing to help the man}. So he said to the man, "Extend your hand!" When the man extended his shriveled hand, it became healthy again!

## What then was Jesus' attitude toward them?

Jesus became angry with them.

## **Mark 3:6**

#### **ULT**

<sup>6</sup> And the Pharisees, having gone out, immediately were making counsel with the Herodians against him, as to how they might kill him.

## **UST**

<sup>6</sup> The Pharisees left the meeting place. They immediately met with some of the Jews who supported Herod Antipas, who ruled the district of Galilee. Together they planned how they could kill Jesus.

# What did the Pharisees do when Jesus healed the man?

The Pharisees went out and plotted to put Jesus to death.

## **Mark 3:7**

## **ULT**

<sup>7</sup> And Jesus, with his disciples, withdrew to the sea, and a great crowd followed from Galilee, and from Judea,

## **UST**

<sup>7</sup> Jesus and his disciples left that town and went to an area further along the sea of Galilee. A great crowd of people followed him. The people that followed him came from the districts of Galilee and Judea,

# How many people followed Jesus as he went to the sea? (vv7-8)

A great crowd followed Jesus.

## **Mark 3:8**

# **ULT**

<sup>8</sup> and from Jerusalem, and from Idumea and beyond the Jordan and around Tyre and Sidon. A great crowd, hearing how much he was doing, came to him.

#### **UST**

<sup>8</sup> from the city of Jerusalem, from the district of Idumea, from the region on the east side of the Jordan River, and from the region around the cities of Tyre and Sidon. They all came to Jesus because they had heard about what he was doing.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## **Mark 3:9**

#### ULT

<sup>9</sup> And he spoke to his disciples so that a small boat might be waiting for him because of the crowd, so that they might not press against him.

#### **UST**

<sup>9-10</sup> Because he had healed many people, many other people who had various illnesses pushed forward in order to touch him. They believed that if only they touched him, it would make them well. So he told his disciples that they should get a small boat ready for him in order that the crowd would not crush him when they pushed forward to touch him.

## Mark 3:10

## **ULT**

<sup>10</sup> For he healed many, so then as many as had diseases pressed against him so that they might touch him.

# **UST**

<sup>10</sup> Because Jesus healed many people before, others who were sick drew near to him, in order that they might touch him and be healed.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 3:11

## **ULT**

<sup>11</sup> And whenever the unclean spirits saw him, they were falling down before him and crying out, saying, "You are the Son of God."

# **UST**

<sup>11</sup> Whenever the evil spirits saw Jesus, they caused the people whom they controlled to fall down in front of Jesus and call out to him, "You are the Son of God!"

# What did the demons cry out when they saw Jesus?

The demons cried out that Jesus was the Son of God.

#### Mark 3:12

#### **ULT**

<sup>12</sup> And he was often rebuking them so that they might not make him known.

#### **UST**

<sup>12</sup> Jesus commanded the evil spirits strongly that they must not tell anyone who he was.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 3:13

#### ULT

<sup>13</sup> And he goes up on the mountain and summons those whom he himself wanted, and they went to him.

#### UST

<sup>13</sup> Jesus went up into the hills. There, he summoned those that he wanted to go with him and they followed him.

## Mark 3:14

## **ULT**

<sup>14</sup> And he appointed 12 (whom he also named apostles) so that they might be with him and so that he might send them to preach,

## **UST**

<sup>14</sup> He appointed twelve men to travel with him, whom also he would send out to preach. He called them his representatives.

How many men did Jesus appoint as apostles, and what were they to do? (vv14-15) lesus appointed twelve apostles who were to be with him, preach, and have authority to cast out demons.

## Mark 3:15

## ULT

<sup>15</sup> and to have authority to cast out the demons.

#### **UST**

<sup>15</sup> He also gave them power to be able to force evil spirits to come out from people.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 3:16

#### ULT

 $^{16}$  And he appointed the Twelve  $^{[1]}$ , and he added to Simon the name Peter;

# **UST**

<sup>16</sup> These were the twelve men he appointed: Simon (and Jesus gave him the new name Peter).

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 3:17

#### **ULT**

<sup>17</sup> and James the {son} of Zebedee, and John the brother of James, to whom he also added the name Boanerges, that is, sons of thunder;

#### **UST**

<sup>17</sup> And along with Peter, Jesus also appointed James the son of Zebedee, and John the brother of James. He gave both of them the new name, 'Men who are like Thunder' because of their fiery zeal;

## Mark 3:18

## **ULT**

<sup>18</sup> and Andrew, and Philip, and Bartholomew, and Matthew, and Thomas, and James the {son} of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus, and Simon the Zealot,

## **UST**

<sup>18</sup> and he appointed Andrew, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Thomas, and James who was the son of Alphaeus; and he appointed Thaddaeus, Simon the Zealot,

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 3:19

# **ULT**

<sup>19</sup> and Judas Iscariot, who also betrayed him.

#### **UST**

<sup>19</sup> and Judas Iscariot (who later caused him to get arrested).

# Who was the apostle that would betray Jesus?

The apostle that would betray Jesus was Judas Iscariot.

## Mark 3:20

## **ULT**

<sup>20</sup> And he comes into a house, and the crowd gathers together again, so that they are not able even to eat bread.

## **UST**

<sup>20</sup> Jesus and his disciples went to a house. Again a crowd gathered where he was staying. Many people crowded around him. He and his apprentices did not even have time to eat.

## Mark 3:21

## **ULT**

<sup>21</sup> And those beside him, having heard about it, went out to seize him, for they were saying, "He is out of his mind."

## **UST**

<sup>21</sup> When his relatives heard about this, they went to take him home with them because some people were saying that he was insane.

What did Jesus' family think about the crowds and the events surrounding Jesus? Jesus' family thought that he was out of his mind.

## Mark 3:22

#### **ULT**

<sup>22</sup> And the scribes who had come down from Jerusalem were saying, "He has Beelzebul" and "By the ruler of the demons he casts out the demons."

# **UST**

<sup>22</sup> Some men who taught the Jewish laws came downhill from the city of Jerusalem. They heard that Jesus was forcing evil spirits to come out of people. So they were telling people, "Beelzebul, who rules the evil spirits, controls Jesus. He is the one who gives Jesus the power to force evil spirits out from people!"

## What accusation did the scribes make against Jesus?

The scribes accused lesus of driving out demons by the ruler of demons.

## Mark 3:23

## **ULT**

<sup>23</sup> But having called them to himself, in parables he was saying to them, "How is Satan able to cast out Satan?

# **UST**

<sup>23</sup> So Jesus summoned those men over to himself. Jesus spoke to them in parables and said, "How can Satan expel Satan?

## What was lesus' response to the scribes' accusation? (vv23-25)

Jesus responded that no kingdom divided against itself can stand.

## Mark 3:24

## **ULT**

<sup>24</sup> And if a kingdom might have been divided against itself, that kingdom is not able to stand.

# **UST**

<sup>24</sup> If people who live in the same country are fighting against one another, their country will cease to be a united country.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 3:25

## **ULT**

<sup>25</sup> And if a house might have been divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand.

## **UST**

<sup>25</sup> And if people who live in the same house fight each other, they will certainly not remain united as one family.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 3:26

#### ULT

<sup>26</sup> And if Satan rose up against himself and was divided, he is not able to stand, but he has an end.

#### **UST**

<sup>26</sup> Similarly, if Satan and his evil spirits were fighting one another, instead of remaining strong, he would become powerless.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 3:27

# **ULT**

<sup>27</sup> But no one is able, having entered into the house of the strong man, to steal his possessions unless he would tie up the strong man first, and then he will plunder his house.

# **UST**

<sup>27</sup> No one can go into the house of a strong man and take his possessions away from him unless he first ties up the strong man. Only then will he be able to steal the things in that man's house."

#### Mark 3:28

#### **ULT**

<sup>28</sup> Truly I say to you that all the sins of the sons of men will be forgiven, even whatever blasphemies they may blaspheme,

## **UST**

<sup>28</sup> Jesus also said, "Consider this carefully! People may sin in many ways and they may speak evil about God. Yet God can still forgive them,

# What sin did Jesus say cannot be forgiven? (vv28-30)

Jesus said that blasphemy against the Holy Spirit cannot be forgiven.

# Mark 3:29

#### **ULT**

<sup>29</sup> but whoever might have blasphemed against the Holy Spirit does not have forgiveness to eternity, but is guilty of an everlasting sin"—

# **UST**

<sup>29</sup> but if anyone speaks evil words about the Holy Spirit, God will never forgive them. That person is eternally quilty of sin."

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 3:30

#### **ULT**

<sup>30</sup> because they were saying, "He has an unclean spirit."

#### **UST**

 $^{30}$  Jesus told them this because they were saying, "An evil spirit is controlling him!"

#### Mark 3:31

#### **ULT**

<sup>31</sup> And his mother and his brothers come, and standing outside, they sent to him, summoning him.

# **UST**

<sup>31</sup> Jesus' mother and younger siblings came to where Jesus was teaching. While they stood outside, they sent someone inside to tell Jesus to come to them.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 3:32

#### **ULT**

<sup>32</sup> And a crowd was sitting around him and they say to him, "Behold, your mother and your brothers seek you outside."

# **UST**

<sup>32</sup> A crowd was sitting around Jesus. Some of them said to him, "Listen! Your mother and younger siblings are outside. They want to see you."

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 3:33

#### **ULT**

<sup>33</sup> And answering them, he says, "Who are my mother and my brothers?"

#### **UST**

33 Jesus asked them, "Who is my mother? Who are my siblings?"

# Who did Jesus say were his mother and brothers? (vv33-35)

Jesus said that his mother and brothers were those who do the will of God.

# Mark 3:34

# **ULT**

<sup>34</sup> And having looked around at those sitting in a circle around him, he says, "Behold, my mother and my brothers!

# **UST**

<sup>34</sup> After he looked around at those who sat with him, he said, "Look here! You are my mother and my siblings.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 3:35

# **ULT**

<sup>35</sup> For whoever may do the will of God, this is my brother, and sister, and mother."  $3:16^{[1]}$ 

# **UST**

<sup>35</sup> For those who do what God wants are my brother, my sister, or my mother!"

# Mark 4

#### **Mark 4:1**

# **ULT**

<sup>1</sup> And again, he began to teach beside the sea, and a large crowd is gathered around him. Therefore he had stepped into a boat on the sea to sit in it, and the whole crowd was on the shore beside the sea.

# **UST**

<sup>1</sup> Another time Jesus began to teach people alongside the sea of Galilee. As he was teaching, a very large crowd gathered around him. Because of this, he got into a boat and pushed out onto the water [so he could teach them all better]. The crowd listened to his teaching from the shore of the sea.

# Why did Jesus get into a boat to teach?

Jesus got into a boat to teach because a very large crowd had gathered around him.

#### **Mark 4:2**

## **ULT**

<sup>2</sup> And he was teaching them many things in parables, and was saying to them in his teaching,

#### **UST**

<sup>2</sup> Then he taught them many parables. While he was teaching them, he told them this:

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### **Mark 4:3**

#### ULT

<sup>3</sup> "Listen! Behold, the sower went out to sow.

# **UST**

<sup>3</sup> "Listen to this: A man went out to his field to plant some seeds.

#### **Mark 4:4**

#### **ULT**

<sup>4</sup> And it happened that as he sowed, some fell beside the road, and the birds came and devoured it.

# **UST**

<sup>4</sup> As he was scattering them over the soil, some of the seeds fell on the path. Then some birds came and ate those seeds.

# What happened to the seeds sown on the road?

The birds came and devoured them.

#### **Mark 4:5**

# **ULT**

<sup>5</sup> And other fell on the rocky ground, where it did not have much soil, and immediately it sprang up, because it did not have deep soil.

# **UST**

<sup>5</sup> Other seeds fell on ground where there was little soil, and it was filled with rocks. Very soon the seeds appeared through the soil because the soil was not very deep.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### **Mark 4:6**

#### ULT

<sup>6</sup> And when the sun rose, it was scorched, and because it had no root, it was dried up.

# **UST**

<sup>6</sup> But after the sun shone on those young plants, they became scorched. Then they withered because their roots were not deep enough in the ground.

# What happened to the seeds sown on the rocky ground when the sun rose?

They withered away because they had no root.

#### **Mark 4:7**

#### **ULT**

<sup>7</sup> And other fell into the thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked it, and it did not produce fruit.

# **UST**

<sup>7</sup> As he sowed, other seeds fell on ground that contained roots of thorny plants. The seeds grew, but the thorny plants also grew up and crowded out the good plants. So the plants produced no grain.

# What happened to the seeds sown among thorn plants?

The thorn plants choked them.

#### **Mark 4:8**

#### **ULT**

<sup>8</sup> And other fell into the good soil, and it was giving fruit, growing up and being increased and yielding one, 30, and one, 60, and one, 100."

#### **UST**

<sup>8</sup> But as he sowed, other seeds fell on good soil. As a result, they sprouted, they grew well, and then they produced plenty of grain. Some plants bore thirty times as much as the seed that the man had planted. Some bore sixty times as much. Some bore one hundred times as much."

# What happened to the seeds sown in the good soil?

The seeds produced grain, yielding thirty, sixty, and some a hundred times what was planted.

#### **Mark 4:9**

## **ULT**

<sup>9</sup> And he said, "Whoever has ears to hear, let him hear!"

# **UST**

<sup>9</sup> Then Jesus said, "Whoever is willing to listen, listen to what I say."

#### Mark 4:10

#### **ULT**

<sup>10</sup> And when he was alone, those around him with the Twelve were asking him about the parables.

# **UST**

<sup>10</sup> Later, when only the twelve disciples and other close followers were with him, they asked him about the parables.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 4:11

### **ULT**

<sup>11</sup> And he began to say to them, "To you has been given the mystery of the kingdom of God, but to those who {are} outside, everything is in parables,

# **UST**

<sup>11</sup> He said to them, "To you I have explained the message about how God reveals himself as king, but to the others I have spoken in parables.

# What did Jesus say was given to the Twelve, but not to those outside?

lesus said the mystery of the kingdom of God was given to the Twelve, but not to those outside.

#### Mark 4:12

#### **ULT**

<sup>12</sup> so that looking, they may look but may not see, and hearing, they may hear but may not understand, so that they might not turn and it might be forgiven to them."

#### **UST**

<sup>12</sup> When they see what I am doing, they will not learn. When they hear what I say, they will not understand. If they learned or understood, they would be sorry that they had sinned and decide to stop sinning, and God would forgive them."

#### Mark 4:13

#### **ULT**

<sup>13</sup> And he says to them, "Do you not understand this parable? And how will you understand all the parables?

# **UST**

<sup>13</sup> He also said to them, "Do you not understand this parable? How then will you understand when I teach you other parables?

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 4:14

### **ULT**

<sup>14</sup> The sower sows the word.

#### **UST**

<sup>14</sup> In the parable that I told you, the man who sows seeds represents someone who teaches God's message to others.

# In Jesus' parable, what is the seed?

The seed is the word of God.

#### Mark 4:15

#### **ULT**

<sup>15</sup> Now these are the ones beside the road, where the word is being sown, but whenever they might have heard it, Satan immediately comes and takes away the word that was sown in them.

#### **UST**

<sup>15</sup> Some people are like the path where some of the seeds fell. When they hear God's message, Satan comes at once and causes them to forget what they have heard.

## What does the seed sown on the road represent?

It represents those who hear the word, but immediately Satan takes it away.

#### Mark 4:16

#### **ULT**

<sup>16</sup> And in the same manner, these are the ones being sown on the rocky ground, who, whenever they might have heard the word, immediately receive it with joy,

#### **UST**

<sup>16</sup> Some people are like the ground where the soil was not very deep over the rock. When they hear God's message, they immediately accept it with joy.

# What does the seed sown on the rocky ground represent? (vv16-17)

It represents those who hear the word with joy, but when persecution comes they stumble.

# Mark 4:17

# **ULT**

<sup>17</sup> and they have no root in themselves, but are temporary. Then, tribulation or persecution having come because of the word, immediately they are caused to stumble.

# **UST**

<sup>17</sup> But, because the message does not grow deep, they believe it for only a short time. They are like the plants that did not have deep roots. When others treat them badly or cause them to suffer because they believed God's message, those people who are suffering soon stop believing God's message.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 4:18

#### ULT

<sup>18</sup> And others are the ones being sown into the thorns. These are the ones who have heard the word,

# **UST**

<sup>18</sup> Some people are like the soil that has thorny weeds in it. Those people hear God's message,

#### What does the seed sown among thorn plants represent? (vv18-19)

It represents those who hear the word, but the cares of the world choke the word.

#### Mark 4:19

#### **ULT**

<sup>19</sup> but the cares of the age, and the deceitfulness of riches, and the desires concerning other things, entering in, choke the word, and it becomes unfruitful.

## **UST**

<sup>19</sup> but they desire to be rich and they want to own many other things. So they only worry about what they have and they forget God's message and they do not do the things that God wants them to do.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

### Mark 4:20

# **ULT**

<sup>20</sup> And those are the ones sown in the good soil, who hear the word and receive it, and produce fruit—one, 30, and one, 60, and one, 100."

# **UST**

<sup>20</sup> But some people are like the good soil. They hear God's message and they accept it and they believe it, and they do the things that God wants them to do. They are like the good plants that produced thirty, sixty, or one hundred grains."

# What does the seed sown in the good soil represent?

It represents those who hear the word, receive it, and produce fruit.

#### Mark 4:21

#### ULT

<sup>21</sup> And he was saying to them, "The lamp does not come so that it might be put under a basket or under the bed, does it? Is it not so that it might be put on the lampstand?

#### **UST**

<sup>21</sup> He told them another parable: "People certainly do not light an oil lamp and then bring it in the house in order to put something over it to cover its light. Instead, they put it on a lampstand so that the light will shine.

#### Mark 4:22

#### **ULT**

<sup>22</sup> For nothing is hidden except so that it might be revealed, and nothing secret has happened except so that it might come to exposure.

#### **UST**

<sup>22</sup> Similarly, things that were hidden—one day everyone will know them, and the things that have happened in secret—one day everyone will see them in full light.

# What did Jesus say would happen to the hidden and secret things?

# **ULT**

<sup>23</sup> If anyone has ears to hear, let him hear!"

# **UST**

<sup>23</sup> If you want to understand this, you should consider carefully what you have just heard."

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 4:24

#### **ULT**

<sup>24</sup> And he was saying to them, "Pay attention to what you hear. In that measure you use it will be measured to you, and it will be added to you.

#### **UST**

<sup>24</sup> "Consider carefully what you hear me say to you, for God will let you understand to the same degree that you consider what I say. He will let you understand even more than that.

#### Mark 4:25

#### **ULT**

<sup>25</sup> For he who has, it will be given to him, and he who does not have, even what he has will be taken away from him"

#### **UST**

<sup>25</sup> For if person has some understanding, he will receive even more. But if a person does not have understanding, even what little he has, he will lose."

(There are no questions for this verse.)

### Mark 4:26

# **ULT**

<sup>26</sup> And he was saying, "Thus is the kingdom of God: As a man may throw the seed on the ground,

#### **UST**

<sup>26</sup> Jesus also said, "When God begins to show himself as king, it is like a man who has scattered seed on the ground.

# In what way is the kingdom of God like a man who casts his seed upon the ground? (vv26-29)

The man casts the seed, and it grows, but he does not know how, then when the harvest is ripe he gathers it.

#### Mark 4:27

# **ULT**

<sup>27</sup> and he may sleep and may get up, night and day, and the seed may sprout and may grow—how, he himself does not know.

#### **UST**

<sup>27</sup> Afterwards he slept each night and rose up each day without worrying about the seeds. During that time the seeds sprouted and grew in a way that he did not understand.

#### Mark 4:28

#### **ULT**

<sup>28</sup> The soil produces fruit of its own accord: First the blade, then the head, then the mature grain in the head.

# **UST**

<sup>28</sup> The ground produced the crop on its own. First the stalks appeared. Then the heads appeared. Then the full kernels in the heads appeared.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 4:29

### **ULT**

<sup>29</sup> And whenever it may have delivered the fruit, he immediately sends forth the sickle because the harvest has come."

## **UST**

<sup>29</sup> As soon as the grain was ripe he sent people to harvest it because it was time to harvest the grain."

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 4:30

#### ULT

<sup>30</sup> And he was saying, "How might we compare the kingdom of God, or in what parable might we present it?

#### **UST**

<sup>30</sup> Jesus told them another parable. He said, "When God begins to show himself as king, what is it like? What parable can I use to describe it?

#### In what way is the kingdom of God like a mustard seed? (vv30-32)

The mustard seed begins as the smallest of seeds, yet grows into a great plant where many can make their nests.

#### Mark 4:31

#### **ULT**

<sup>31</sup> {It is} like a mustard seed, which, when it may have been sown in the soil, being the smallest of all the seeds that {are} on the earth,

#### **UST**

<sup>31</sup> It is like mustard seeds. You know what happens to mustard seeds when we plant them. Though mustard seeds are among the smallest of seeds, they become large plants.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

### Mark 4:32

# **ULT**

<sup>32</sup> and when it may have been sown, it grows and becomes greater than all the garden plants, and it makes large branches, so that the birds of the sky are able to make their nests in its shade."

# **UST**

<sup>32</sup> After they are planted, they grow up and become larger than the other garden plants. They put out big branches so that birds are able to make nests in their shade."

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 4:33

#### ULT

<sup>33</sup> And with many such parables he was speaking the word to them, just as they were able to hear;

#### **UST**

<sup>33</sup> Jesus used many parables when he talked to the people about God's message. If they were able to understand some, he kept telling them more.

#### Mark 4:34

#### **ULT**

<sup>34</sup> but he was not speaking to them without a parable, but by himself, he was explaining everything to his own disciples.

#### **UST**

<sup>34</sup> He always used parables when he spoke to them. But he explained all the parables to his own apprentices when he was alone with them.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 4:35

# **ULT**

<sup>35</sup> And he says to them on that day, evening having come, "Let us cross over to the other side."

#### UST

<sup>35</sup> On that same day, when the sun was setting, Jesus said to his apprentices, "Let us cross over to the other side of the lake."

# What happened as the disciples and Jesus crossed the lake? (vv35-37)

A great storm began, threatening to fill the boat with water.

#### Mark 4:36

#### **ULT**

<sup>36</sup> And having left the crowd, they take him with them, as he was, in the boat, and other boats were with him.

#### **UST**

<sup>36</sup> Jesus was already in the boat, so they left the crowd of people and sailed away. Other people also went along with them in their boats.

#### Mark 4:37

#### **ULT**

<sup>37</sup> And a great storm of wind happens and the waves were breaking into the boat so as to already be filling the boat.

#### **UST**

<sup>37</sup> A strong wind came up and the waves started coming into the boat! The boat was soon nearly full of water!

(There are no questions for this verse.)

### Mark 4:38

#### **ULT**

<sup>38</sup> And he himself was in the stern, sleeping on the cushion. And they wake him up and say to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?"

# **UST**

<sup>38</sup> Jesus was in the back part of the boat. He was sleeping with his head on a cushion. So they woke him up and said to him, "Teacher! Are you not concerned that we are about to die?"

# What was Jesus doing at this time in the boat?

Jesus was sleeping.

#### What question did the disciples ask Jesus?

The disciples asked Jesus if he cared that they were about to die.

# Mark 4:39

#### **ULT**

<sup>39</sup> And having been awakened, he rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Be silent! Be still!" And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm.

#### **UST**

<sup>39</sup> So Jesus got up and rebuked the wind and he spoke to the lake, "Be quiet! Be still!" The wind stopped blowing and then the lake became very calm.

#### What did Jesus then do?

lesus rebuked the wind and calmed the sea.

# Mark 4:40

#### **ULT**

<sup>40</sup> And he said to them, "Why are you afraid? Do you not yet have faith?"

# **UST**

<sup>40</sup> He said to the apprentices, "Why are you afraid? Do you not yet believe that I can protect you?"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 4:41

#### **ULT**

<sup>41</sup> And they were filled with great fear and were saying to one another, "Who then is this, for even the wind and the sea obey him?"

# **UST**

<sup>41</sup> They were terrified. They said to one another, "Who is this man? Even the wind and the waves obey him!"

# After Jesus did this, what was the response of the disciples?

The disciples were filled with great fear and wondered who Jesus was that the wind and sea obeyed him.

# Mark 5

#### **Mark 5:1**

# **ULT**

<sup>1</sup> And they came to the other side of the sea, to the region of the Gerasenes.

#### **UST**

<sup>1</sup> Jesus and his apprentices arrived on the other side of the Galilee lake. People called the Gerasenes lived near the place where they landed.

# Who met Jesus when they came to the region of the Gerasenes? (vv1-2)

A man with an unclean spirit met Jesus.

#### **Mark 5:2**

# **ULT**

<sup>2</sup> And when he had gotten out from the boat, immediately a man with an unclean spirit came from the tombs to meet him,

# **UST**

<sup>2</sup> When Jesus stepped out of the boat, a man came out from the tombs in a cemetery. Evil spirits controlled the man

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# **Mark 5:3**

#### ULT

<sup>3</sup> who had {his} dwelling in the tombs, and no one was able to bind him anymore, not even with a chain,

# **UST**

<sup>3</sup> The man was coming out of the cemetery because he lived in tombs. The people knew him and at times they tried to restrain him. They could not restrain him, not even with chains.

#### **Mark 5:4**

#### **ULT**

<sup>4</sup> because he had often been bound with shackles and chains, but the chains had been torn apart by him and the shackles had been shattered, and no one was strong enough to subdue him.

# **UST**

<sup>4</sup> Whenever they used chains and shackles, the man would break them apart. He was so strong that no one was able to subdue him.

# What had happened when people tried to restrain this man with chains?

When people tried to restrain this man with chains, he tore the chains apart.

# **Mark 5:5**

#### **ULT**

<sup>5</sup> And throughout every night and day in the tombs and in the mountains, he was crying out and cutting himself with stones.

#### **UST**

<sup>5</sup> Day and night the man would spend his time in the caves in the cemetery and in the hills. He would scream out loud and cut himself with sharp stones.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### **Mark 5:6**

#### **ULT**

<sup>6</sup> And having seen Jesus from a distance, he ran to him and bowed down to him.

#### **UST**

<sup>6</sup> When he saw Jesus in the distance getting out of the boat, he ran over to him and knelt before him.

#### **Mark 5:7**

#### **ULT**

<sup>7</sup> And crying out in a loud voice, he says, "What to me and to you, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you by God, may you not torment me."

# **UST**

<sup>7-8</sup> Jesus had been saying to the evil spirit, "You evil spirit, come out of this man!" But the demon did not leave quickly. It shouted very loudly, "Jesus, I know that you are the Son of God, so we have nothing in common. Leave me alone! In God's name, I beg you. Do not torture me!"

# What title did the unclean spirit give Jesus?

The unclean spirit called Jesus the Son of the Most High God.

## **Mark 5:8**

# **ULT**

<sup>8</sup> For he was saying to him, "Come out from the man, unclean spirit."

#### **UST**

<sup>7-8</sup> Jesus had been saying to the evil spirit, "You evil spirit, come out of this man!" But the demon did not leave quickly. It shouted very loudly, "Jesus, I know that you are the Son of God, so we have nothing in common. Leave me alone! In God's name, I beg you. Do not torture me!"

#### What did lesus say to the man?

Jesus said to the man, "Come out of the man, you unclean spirit".

## **Mark 5:9**

#### ULT

<sup>9</sup> And he was asking him, "What {is} your name?" And he says to him, "My name {is} Legion, for we are many."

#### **UST**

<sup>9</sup> Jesus asked him, "What is your name?" He replied, "My name is Mob because there are many of us evil spirits in this man."

#### What was the name of the unclean spirit?

The unclean spirit's name was Army, because there were many.

#### Mark 5:10

#### **ULT**

<sup>10</sup> And he was begging him repeatedly that he would not send them out of the region.

# **UST**

<sup>10</sup> Then the evil spirits kept asking Jesus fervently that he not send them out of the region.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 5:11

#### ULT

<sup>11</sup> But there was a great herd of pigs being fed on the hill,

#### **UST**

<sup>11</sup> At the same time, a large herd of pigs was grazing nearby on the hillside.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 5:12

#### ULT

<sup>12</sup> and they begged him, saying, "Send us into the pigs, so that we might enter into them."

#### **UST**

<sup>12</sup> So the evil spirits pleaded with Jesus, "Allow us to go to the pigs in order that we might enter them!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 5:13

#### ULT

<sup>13</sup> And he permitted them, and having come out, the unclean spirits entered into the pigs, and the herd—about 2,000—rushed down the steep slope into the sea, and drowned in the sea.

#### **UST**

<sup>13</sup> Jesus permitted them to do that. So the evil spirits left the man and entered the pigs. The herd, which numbered about two thousand, rushed down the steep hill into the lake, where they drowned.

# What happened when Jesus cast out the unclean spirit from the man?

The spirits came out and entered a herd of pigs, who ran down a steep hill and drowned in the lake.

#### Mark 5:14

#### **ULT**

<sup>14</sup> And those feeding them ran away and reported this in the city and in the countryside, and they went out to see what it was that had happened.

## **UST**

<sup>14</sup> The men who were tending the pigs ran and reported in the town and the countryside what had happened. Many people went to see for themselves what had happened.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

### Mark 5:15

#### **ULT**

<sup>15</sup> And they come to Jesus and see the one being demon-possessed, sitting, clothed and being in his right mind—the one who had had the Legion—and they became afraid.

# **UST**

<sup>15</sup> They came to the place where Jesus was. Then they saw the man whom evil spirits had previously controlled. He was sitting there with clothes on and mentally sound. They were afraid when they saw all this.

# After the unclean spirit was cast out, what was the condition of the man?

The man was sitting with Jesus, clothed and in his right mind.

#### Mark 5:16

# **ULT**

<sup>16</sup> And those who had seen how it happened to the one who was demon-possessed related it to them, and about the pigs.

# **UST**

<sup>16</sup> The people who had seen the events told those who had come from the town and from the countryside about what had happened to the man whom the evil spirits previously controlled. They also described what had happened to the pigs.

#### Mark 5:17

#### **ULT**

<sup>17</sup> And they began to beg him to depart from their region.

# **UST**

<sup>17</sup> Then the people pleaded with Jesus to leave their region.

# What did the people of the region ask Jesus to do?

The people asked Jesus to leave their region.

#### Mark 5:18

## **ULT**

<sup>18</sup> And when he is getting into the boat, the one who had been demon-possessed was begging him so that he might be with him.

# **UST**

<sup>18</sup> As Jesus got in the boat to leave, the man whom the evil spirits previously controlled begged Jesus, "Please let me go with you!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 5:19

#### **ULT**

<sup>19</sup> But he did not permit him, but says to him, "Go to your house, to your {people}, and report to them how much the Lord has done for you and had mercy on you."

#### **UST**

<sup>19</sup> But Jesus did not let him go with him. Instead, he said to him, "Go home to your family and tell them how much the Lord has done for you, and tell them how he has been so kind to you."

# What did Jesus tell the man who had lived in the tombs to now do?

Jesus told the man to tell his people what the Lord had done for him.

#### Mark 5:20

#### **ULT**

<sup>20</sup> And he went away and began to proclaim in the Decapolis how much Jesus did for him, and everyone was marvelling.

#### **UST**

<sup>20</sup> So the man went and traveled around the Ten Towns in that district. He told people how much Jesus had done for him. All the people who heard what the man said were amazed.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

### Mark 5:21

#### **ULT**

<sup>21</sup> And when Jesus had crossed over again to the other side in the boat, a great crowd was gathered around him, and he was beside the sea.

# **UST**

<sup>21</sup> Once more Jesus crossed over to the other side of the Galilee lake in a boat. When he arrived, a large crowd gathered around Jesus while he was standing on the shore.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 5:22

#### ULT

<sup>22</sup> And behold, one of the leaders of the synagogue, named Jairus, comes, and having seen him, he falls at his feet.

#### **UST**

<sup>22</sup> One of the men who presided over a Jewish preaching place, whose name was Jairus, came there. When he saw Jesus, he knelt at his feet.

# What request did Jairus, the synagogue leader, make of Jesus? (vv22-23)

Jairus asked Jesus to come with him to lay hands on his daughter who was near death.

#### Mark 5:23

#### **ULT**

<sup>23</sup> And he begs him repeatedly, saying, "My little daughter is near the end; come, so that you might lay {your} hands on her in order that she might be healed and she might live."

#### **UST**

<sup>23</sup> Then he pleaded with Jesus earnestly, "My daughter is sick and nearly dead! Please come to my house and place your hands on her. Heal her and make her live!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 5:24

# **ULT**

<sup>24</sup> And went with him, and a great crowd was following him and was pressing around him.

#### **UST**

<sup>24</sup> So Jesus and his apprentices went with him. A large crowd followed and many pushed in close to Jesus.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 5:25

#### ULT

<sup>25</sup> And a woman, being with a flow of blood for 12 years,

#### **UST**

<sup>25</sup> There was a woman in the crowd who had a bleeding disorder. She had been bleeding every day for twelve years.

# What was the problem with the woman who touched Jesus' cloak?

The woman had suffered with a discharge of blood for twelve years.

#### Mark 5:26

#### **ULT**

<sup>26</sup> and having suffered much from many doctors, and having spent everything that she had, and not having been helped, but instead having become worse,

#### **UST**

<sup>26</sup> She had suffered much over the years while doctors treated her. She had spent all her money to pay the doctors and after all they did to her, she got worse instead of better.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

### Mark 5:27

# **ULT**

<sup>27</sup> having heard the things about Jesus, having come up behind him in the crowd, she touched his cloak.

#### UST

<sup>27</sup> When she heard that Jesus healed people, she came to where he was and pushed in the crowd close behind Jesus.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 5:28

#### ULT

<sup>28</sup> For she was saying, "If I might touch just his clothes, I will be saved."

#### **UST**

<sup>28</sup> She was thinking, "If I touch him or even if I touch his clothes, it will heal me." So she touched Jesus' clothes.

# Why did the woman touch Jesus' cloak?

The woman thought that if she just touched Jesus' clothes, she would be healed.

#### Mark 5:29

#### **ULT**

<sup>29</sup> And immediately the flow of her blood was dried up, and she knew in {her} body that she had been healed from the disease.

#### **UST**

<sup>29</sup> At once her bleeding stopped. At the same time, she sensed within herself that she had been cured of her illness

(There are no questions for this verse.)

### Mark 5:30

#### **ULT**

<sup>30</sup> And immediately Jesus, having realized in himself that {his} power had gone out from him, having turned around in the crowd, was saying, "Who touched my clothes?"

# **UST**

<sup>30</sup> Jesus also immediately sensed within himself that his power had healed someone. So he turned around in the crowd and then he asked, "Who touched my clothes?"

# What did Jesus do when the woman touched his cloak?

Jesus knew that power had gone out from him and looked around to see who had touched him.

#### Mark 5:31

# **ULT**

<sup>31</sup> And his disciples were saying to him, "You see this crowd pressing in on you, and you say, 'Who touched me?'"

#### **UST**

<sup>31</sup> His apprentices replied, "You can see that many people are crowding close to you! Probably many people touched you! So why do you ask, 'Who touched me?'"

#### Mark 5:32

#### **ULT**

<sup>32</sup> But he was looking around to see the one having done this.

# **UST**

32 But Jesus kept looking around in order to see the one who had done it.

# What did Jesus do when the woman touched his cloak?

Jesus knew that power had gone out from him and looked around to see who had touched him.

#### Mark 5:33

# **ULT**

<sup>33</sup> But the woman, having become afraid and trembling, having known what had happened to her, came and fell down before him and told him the whole truth.

# **UST**

<sup>33</sup> The woman was very afraid and trembling. She knelt before him and told him what she had done.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 5:34

# **ULT**

<sup>34</sup> But he said to her, "Daughter, your faith has healed you. Go in peace and be healed from your disease."

# **UST**

<sup>34</sup> He said to her, "Daughter, because you have believed that I could heal you, I have now healed you. You may go home with peace in your heart, because I promise that you will not be sick with this disease anymore."

# When the woman told Jesus all the truth, what did Jesus say to her?

Jesus told her that her faith had made her well, and to go in peace.

#### Mark 5:35

#### **ULT**

<sup>35</sup> While he is still speaking, they come from the synagogue leader's {house}, saying, "Your daughter died. Why trouble the teacher any longer?"

#### **UST**

<sup>35</sup> While Jesus was still speaking to that woman, some people arrived who had come from Jairus' house. They said to Jairus, "Your daughter has now died. So there is no need to bother the teacher any longer, to bring him to your house!"

What was the condition of Jairus' daughter when Jesus arrived at the house? Jairus' daughter was dead.

#### Mark 5:36

#### **ULT**

<sup>36</sup> But Jesus, having heard the word being spoken, says to the leader of the synagogue, "Do not fear. Only believe."

# **UST**

<sup>36</sup> But when Jesus heard what these men said, he said to Jairus, "Do not think that the situation is hopeless! Just keep believing that she will live!"

#### What did Jesus tell Jairus at this time?

Jesus told Jairus to not be afraid, but to just believe.

# Mark 5:37

#### **ULT**

<sup>37</sup> And he did not permit anyone to accompany him, except Peter, and James, and John the brother of James.

# **UST**

<sup>37</sup> Then he allowed only his three closest apprentices, Peter, James, and John, to go with him to the house. He did not allow any other people to go with him.

#### Which disciples went with Jesus into the room where the child was?

Peter, James, and John went with Jesus into the room.

#### Mark 5:38

#### **ULT**

<sup>38</sup> And he comes to the house of the leader of the synagogue and sees a commotion, and weeping and much wailing.

#### **UST**

<sup>38</sup> After they arrived near Jairus' house, Jesus saw that the people there were in turmoil. They were weeping and wailing loudly.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

### Mark 5:39

#### **ULT**

<sup>39</sup> And entering, he says to them, "Why are you upset and weeping? The child has not died, but is sleeping."

#### **UST**

<sup>39</sup> He entered the house and then he said to them, "Why are you so upset and crying? The child is not dead, but only sleeping."

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 5:40

#### ULT

<sup>40</sup> And they were laughing at him. But he, having put them all outside, takes along the father of the child, and the mother, and those with him, and he enters where the child was.

#### **UST**

<sup>40</sup> The people laughed at him, because they knew that she was dead. He sent all the other people outside the house. Then he took the child's father and mother and the three apprentices who were with him. He went into the room where the child was lying.

What did the people in the house do when Jesus said Jairus' daughter was only sleeping? The people laughed at Jesus when he said that Jairus' daughter was only sleeping.

#### Mark 5:41

#### **ULT**

<sup>41</sup> And having taken the hand of the child, he says to her, "Talitha, koum!" which is translated: "Little girl, I say to you, rise up."

#### **UST**

<sup>41</sup> He took hold of the child's hand and said to her in her own language, "Talitha koum!" That means, "Little girl, get up!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

### Mark 5:42

# **ULT**

<sup>42</sup> And immediately the little girl rose up and was walking (for she was 12 years {of age}), and they were immediately astonished with great amazement.

# **UST**

<sup>42</sup> At once the girl got up and walked around. (It was not surprising that she could walk, because she was twelve years old.) When this happened, all who were present were greatly amazed.

# When the child got up and walked, how did the people react?

The people were greatly overcome and astonished.

#### Mark 5:43

# **ULT**

<sup>43</sup> And he strictly ordered them that no one should know about this, and he told them to give her something to eat.

#### **UST**

 $^{43}$  Jesus ordered them strictly, "Do not tell anyone about what I have done!" Then he told them to give the girl something to eat.

#### Mark 6

## Mark 6:1

# **ULT**

<sup>1</sup> And he went out from there and comes to his hometown, and his disciples are following him.

#### **UST**

<sup>1</sup> Jesus left Capernaum city and went to his hometown, Nazareth. His apprentices went with him.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 6:2

#### ULT

<sup>2</sup> And the Sabbath having come, he began to teach in the synagogue. And many of those who were hearing him were amazed, saying, "From where are these things, and what {is} this wisdom that has been given to him, and these miracles happening by his hands?"

#### UST

<sup>2</sup> On the Jewish day of rest, he entered the Jewish preaching place and taught the people. Many who were listening to him were amazed. They wondered where he gained all his wisdom and the power to perform miracles.

# Why were the people of Jesus' home town shocked about him?

The people did not know from where he got his teachings, his wisdom, and his miracles.

#### Mark 6:3

#### ULT

<sup>3</sup> "Is this not the carpenter, the son of Mary and the brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon? And are his sisters not here with us?" And they were offended by him.

#### **UST**

<sup>3</sup> They said, "He is just an ordinary carpenter! We know him and his family! We know Mary his mother! We know his younger brothers James, Joses, Judas and Simon! And his younger sisters also live here with us!" So they resented him.

#### Mark 6:4

#### **ULT**

<sup>4</sup> And Jesus was saying to them, "A prophet is not without honor, except in his hometown and among his relatives and in his own house."

#### **UST**

<sup>4</sup> Jesus said to them, "It is certainly true that people honor me and other prophets in other places, but not in our hometowns! Even our relatives and the people who live in our own houses do not honor us!"

# Where did Jesus say a prophet is without honor?

Jesus said a prophet is without honor in his home town, among his relatives, and in his own household.

# Mark 6:5

# **ULT**

<sup>5</sup> And he was not able to do any mighty work there, except, having laid {his} hands on a few sick people, he healed them.

#### **UST**

<sup>5</sup> So, although he healed a few sick people there, he was not able to perform any other miracle.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### **Mark 6:6**

#### ULT

<sup>6</sup> And he was amazed because of their unbelief, and he was going around the villages teaching.

#### **UST**

<sup>6</sup> He was amazed by their unbelief, but he went through their villages and taught them.

# What amazed Jesus about the people in his home town?

Jesus was amazed by the unbelief of the people in his home town.

#### Mark 6:7

#### **ULT**

<sup>7</sup> And he calls the Twelve and began to send them out two by two, and he was giving them authority over the unclean spirits,

#### **UST**

<sup>7</sup> One day he called the twelve apprentices together, and then he told them that he was going to send them out two by two to teach people in various towns. He gave them power to force evil spirits out from people.

# What authority did Jesus give the Twelve as he sent them out?

Jesus gave the Twelve authority over unclean spirits.

# Mark 6:8

#### **ULT**

<sup>8</sup> and commanded them that they should take nothing for the journey, except only a staff—no bread, no bag, no money in {their} belts—

#### **UST**

<sup>8-9</sup> He also instructed them to wear sandals and to take along a walking stick when they were traveling. He told them not to take food, nor a bag in which to put supplies, nor any money for their journey. He also did not allow them to take an extra tunic.

# What did the Twelve take with them on their journey? (vv8-9)

The Twelve took a staff, sandals, and one tunic.

# Mark 6:9

#### ULT

<sup>9</sup> but having put on sandals, and, "You may not wear two tunics."

# **UST**

<sup>8-9</sup> He also instructed them to wear sandals and to take along a walking stick when they were traveling. He told them not to take food, nor a bag in which to put supplies, nor any money for their journey. He also did not allow them to take an extra tunic.

#### Mark 6:10

#### **ULT**

<sup>10</sup> And he was saying to them, "Whenever you might enter into a house, remain there until you may go out from there.

#### **UST**

<sup>10</sup> He also instructed them, "After you enter a town, if someone invites you to stay in his house, go into his house. Eat and sleep in that same home until you leave that town.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

### Mark 6:11

#### **ULT**

<sup>11</sup> And whatever place might not receive you nor listen to you, going out from there, shake off the dust that {is} under your feet for a testimony against them."

# **UST**

<sup>11</sup> Wherever the people do not welcome you and wherever the people do not listen to you, shake off the dust from your feet as you leave that place. By doing that, you will be testifying that they did not welcome you."

# What did Jesus tell the Twelve to do if a place did not receive them?

Jesus told the Twelve to shake off the dust under their feet as a testimony against them.

#### Mark 6:12

# **ULT**

<sup>12</sup> And having gone out, they proclaimed that people should repent.

# **UST**

<sup>12</sup> So after the disciples went out to various towns, they were preaching that people should be sorry that they have sinned, and decide to stop it, so that God may forgive them.

#### Mark 6:13

#### **ULT**

<sup>13</sup> And they were casting out many demons, and anointing many sick people with oil and healing them.

# **UST**

<sup>13</sup> They were also forcing many evil spirits out from people, and they were anointing many sick people with olive oil and healing them.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 6:14

#### **ULT**

<sup>14</sup> And King Herod heard this, for his name became well known, and some were saying, "John the Baptist has been raised from the dead, and because of this, miraculous powers are working in him."

## **UST**

<sup>14</sup> Now King Herod Antipas heard about what Jesus was doing, because many people were talking about it. Some people were saying about Jesus, "He must be John the Baptizer! He has risen from the dead! That is why he has God's power to perform these miracles!"

# Who did the people suppose Jesus was? (vv14-15)

The people supposed that Jesus was John the Baptizer, or Elijah, or a prophet.

#### Mark 6:15

#### **ULT**

<sup>15</sup> But others were saying, "He is Elijah." But others were saying, "A prophet, like one of the prophets."

# **UST**

<sup>15</sup> Others were saying about Jesus, "He is the ancient prophet Elijah, whom God promised to send back again." Others were saying about Jesus, "No, he is a different prophet, like one of the other prophets who lived long ago."

# Mark 6:16

# **ULT**

<sup>16</sup> But Herod, having heard this, was saying, "John, whom I beheaded—he has been raised."

# **UST**

<sup>16</sup> Having heard what the people were saying, King Herod Antipas himself said, "The man performing those miracles must be John! I commanded my soldiers to cut off his head, but he has become alive again!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 6:17

# **ULT**

<sup>17</sup> For Herod himself, having sent, seized John and he bound him in prison on account of Herodias (the wife of his brother Philip), because he married her.

# **UST**

<sup>17</sup> What happened was this—some time before, Herod had taken and married Herodias, although she was the wife of his brother, Philip.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 6:18

#### **ULT**

<sup>18</sup> For John was saying to Herod, "It is not lawful for you to have the wife of your brother."

#### **UST**

<sup>18</sup> After that, John kept telling Herod, "God's law does not permit you to marry the wife of your brother while he is still alive." Then, because Herodias urged him to put John in prison, Herod himself sent soldiers to John. They arrested John and put him in prison.

# What had John the Baptizer told Herod he was doing unlawfully?

John had told Herod it was unlawful for Herod to marry his brother's wife.

# Mark 6:19

# **ULT**

<sup>19</sup> But Herodias was angry with him and was wanting to kill him, but she was not able,

# **UST**

<sup>19</sup> But because Herodias wanted to get further revenge on John, she wanted someone to execute him. But she could not do that because while John was in prison, Herod kept John safe from her.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 6:20

# **ULT**

<sup>20</sup> for Herod was fearing John, knowing him to be a righteous and holy man, and he was keeping him safe, and having heard him, he was greatly perplexed, yet he was listening to him gladly.

# **UST**

<sup>20</sup> Herod did this because he respected John, because he knew that he was a righteous man who devoted himself to God. Whenever Herod listened to him, he became very disturbed and did not know what he should do with him, but he liked to listen to him.

# How did Herod react when he heard John preach?

Herod became upset when he heard John preach, but he was still glad to hear him.

# Mark 6:21

# **ULT**

<sup>21</sup> And the opportune day having come when Herod made his birthday dinner for his officials, and for the commanders, and for the leaders of Galilee,

#### **UST**

<sup>21</sup> But Herodias was able to eventually have someone execute John. One day when they honored Herod on his birthday, he invited the most important government officials, the most important army leaders, and the most important men in the district of Galilee to eat and celebrate with him.

# Mark 6:22

# **ULT**

<sup>22</sup> and the daughter of Herodias herself having entered and having danced and having pleased Herod and those reclining to eat with him, the king said to the girl, "Ask me whatever you might desire and I will give it to you."

# **UST**

<sup>22</sup> While they were eating, Herodias' daughter came into the room and danced for the king and his guests. She pleased King Herod and his guests so much that he said to her, "Ask me for whatever you wish and I will give it to you!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 6:23

#### **ULT**

<sup>23</sup> And he swore to her, "Whatever you might ask of me, I will give it to you, up to half of my kingdom."

# **UST**

<sup>23</sup> He also promised to her, "Whatever you ask, I will give it to you! I will give you up to half of what I own and rule, if you ask for it."

#### What oath did Herod swear to Herodias?

Herod swore that she could have whatever she asked of him, up to half of his kingdom.

# Mark 6:24

#### ULT

<sup>24</sup> And having gone out, she said to her mother, "What should I ask?" And she said, "The head of John the Baptist."

# **UST**

<sup>24</sup> The girl left the room and went to her mother. She told her what the king had said, and asked her, "What should I ask for?" Her mother replied, "Ask the king to give you the head of John the Baptizer!"

# Mark 6:25

# **ULT**

<sup>25</sup> And immediately, having entered in with haste to the king, she requested, saying, "I desire that you would give me at once the head of John the Baptist on a platter."

# **UST**

<sup>25</sup> The girl quickly entered the room again. She went to the king and she said, "I want you to command someone to cut off the head of John the Baptizer and bring it to me at once on a platter!"

#### For what did Herodias ask?

Herodias asked for the head of John the Baptizer on a platter.

# Mark 6:26

# **ULT**

<sup>26</sup> And the king, having become deeply grieved, he did not want to refuse her because of {his} oaths and those reclining to eat with him,

# **UST**

<sup>26</sup> The king became very distressed when he heard what she asked for because he knew John was a very righteous man. But he could not refuse what she requested because he had promised that he would give her anything she asked for, and his guests had heard him promise.

# How did Herod react to Herodias' request?

Herod became very sorry, but did not refuse her request because of the oaths he had made in front of his quests.

# Mark 6:27

# **ULT**

<sup>27</sup> and the king, immediately having sent an executioner, commanded him to bring his head, and so having departed, he beheaded him in the prison.

# **UST**

<sup>27</sup> So the king at once ordered someone to go and cut off John's head and bring it to the girl. That man went to the prison and cut off John's head.

#### Mark 6:28

# **ULT**

<sup>28</sup> And he brought his head on a platter and gave it to the girl, and the girl gave it to her mother.

# **UST**

<sup>28</sup> He put it on a platter, brought it back, and gave it to the girl. The girl took it to her mother.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 6:29

#### ULT

<sup>29</sup> And his disciples, having heard of this, came and took his body and placed it in a tomb.

# **UST**

<sup>29</sup> After John's apprentices heard what happened, they went to the prison and took John's body; then they buried it.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 6:30

#### ULT

<sup>30</sup> And the apostles are gathered together with Jesus and reported to him all that they did and what they taught.

#### **UST**

<sup>30</sup> The twelve sent ones returned to Jesus from the places to which they had gone. They reported to him what they had done and what they had taught to people.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

### Mark 6:31

# **ULT**

<sup>31</sup> And he says to them, "You yourselves, come away by yourself to a desolate place and rest a little while." For those coming and those going were many, and they were not even having opportunity to eat.

# **UST**

<sup>31</sup> He said to them, "Come with me to a place where no people are living, in order that we can be alone and rest a little while!" He said this because many people were continually coming to them and going away again, with the result that Jesus and his apprentices did not have time to eat or do anything else.

# Mark 6:32

# **ULT**

<sup>32</sup> And they went away in the boat to a desolate place by themselves.

# **UST**

<sup>32</sup> So they went away by themselves in a boat to a place where no people were living.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 6:33

# **ULT**

<sup>33</sup> But many saw them leaving and recognized them, and they ran there together on foot from all the towns, and they arrived before them.

# **UST**

<sup>33</sup> But many people saw them leaving. They also recognized that they were Jesus and the apprentices, and they saw where they were going. So they ran ahead on land from all the nearby towns to the place where Jesus and his apprentices were going. They actually arrived there before Jesus and the apprentices.

What happened when Jesus and the apostles tried to go away by themselves to rest? Many people recognized them and ran to arrive there before Jesus and the apostles.

#### Mark 6:34

#### **ULT**

<sup>34</sup> And having gotten out, he saw a great crowd and had compassion on them because they were like sheep not having a shepherd, and he began to teach them many things.

#### **UST**

<sup>34</sup> As Jesus and his apprentices got out of the boat, Jesus saw this great crowd. He felt compassion for them because they were confused, like sheep that do not have a shepherd. So he taught them many things.

# What was Jesus' attitude toward the crowd that was waiting for them?

Jesus had compassion on them because they were like sheep without a shepherd.

# Mark 6:35

# **ULT**

<sup>35</sup> And the hour already having become late, his disciples, having come to him, were saying, "This place is desolate, and the hour {is} already late.

# **UST**

<sup>35</sup> Late in the afternoon the apprentices came to him and said, "This is a place where no one lives, and it is very late.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 6:36

# **ULT**

<sup>36</sup> Send them away so that, having gone away into the surrounding countryside and villages, they might buy something for themselves to eat."

# **UST**

<sup>36</sup> So send the people away in order that they may go to the surrounding places where people live and to villages in order that they can buy for themselves something to eat!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 6:37

#### **ULT**

<sup>37</sup> But he, answering, said to them, "You give them to eat." And they say to him, "Having gone away, might we buy 200 denarii of bread and give it to them to eat?"

# **UST**

<sup>37</sup> But he replied to them, "No, you yourselves give them something to eat!" They replied to him, "We could not buy enough bread to feed this crowd, even if we had as much money as a man earns by working 200 days!

# When asked by Jesus, what did the disciples think they would have to do to feed the people?

The disciples thought they would have to go and buy two hundred denarii worth of bread.

# Mark 6:38

# **ULT**

<sup>38</sup> But he says to them, "How many loaves do you have? Go. See." And having found out, they say, "Five, and two fish."

# **UST**

<sup>38</sup> But he replied to them, "How many loaves of bread do you have? Go and find out!" They went and found out and then they told him, "We have only five flat loaves and two cooked fish!"

# What food did the disciples already have with them?

The disciples already had five loaves and two fish with them.

# Mark 6:39

# **ULT**

<sup>39</sup> And he commanded them all to recline group by group on the green grass.

# **UST**

<sup>39</sup> He instructed the apprentices to tell all the people to sit down on the green grass.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 6:40

# **ULT**

<sup>40</sup> And they reclined group by group according to hundreds and according to fifties.

# **UST**

 $^{40}$  So the people sat in groups. There were fifty people in some groups and one hundred people in other groups.

# Mark 6:41

# **ULT**

<sup>41</sup> And having taken the five loaves and the two fish, having looked up to heaven, he blessed and broke the loaves and was giving them to his disciples so that they might set them before them, and he divided the two fish among them all.

#### **UST**

<sup>41</sup> Jesus took the five flat loaves and the two fish. He looked up toward heaven and thanked God for them. Then he broke the loaves and fish into pieces and kept giving them to the apprentices in order that they would distribute them to the people.

# What did Jesus do as he took the loaves and fish?

As he took the loaves and fish, Jesus looked up to heaven, blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to his disciples.

# Mark 6:42

# **ULT**

<sup>42</sup> And they all ate and were satisfied.

# **UST**

<sup>42</sup> Everyone ate this food until they all had enough to eat!

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 6:43

#### ULT

<sup>43</sup> And they took up 12 full baskets of broken pieces, and from the fish.

#### **UST**

<sup>43</sup> The apprentices then collected twelve baskets full of pieces of bread and of the fish that were left over.

# How much food was left after everyone ate?

There were twelve baskets of bread, and pieces of fish left after everyone ate.

# Mark 6:44

# **ULT**

44 And those who ate the loaves were 5,000 men.

# **UST**

<sup>44</sup> There were about five thousand men who ate the bread and fish. They did not even count the women and children.

# How many men had been fed?

There were five thousand men that had been fed.

#### Mark 6:45

# **ULT**

<sup>45</sup> And immediately he compelled his disciples to get into the boat and to go ahead to the other side, to Bethsaida, while he sends the crowd away.

#### **UST**

<sup>45</sup> Right away Jesus told his apprentices to get into the boat and then go ahead of him to Bethsaida town, which was further around the Galilee lake. He stayed and dismissed the many people who were there.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 6:46

#### ULT

<sup>46</sup> And having sent them away, he went to the mountain to pray.

#### **UST**

<sup>46</sup> After he said goodbye to the people, he went up into the hills in order to pray.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 6:47

#### ULT

<sup>47</sup> And having become evening, the boat was in the middle of the sea, and he {was} alone on the land.

#### UST

<sup>47</sup> When it was evening, the apprentices' boat was in the middle of the lake, and Jesus was by himself on the land.

# Mark 6:48

# **ULT**

<sup>48</sup> And having seen them being tormented as they rowed, for the wind was against them, and about the fourth watch of the night he comes to them, walking on the sea, and he intended to pass by them.

# **UST**

<sup>48</sup> He saw that the wind was blowing against them as they rowed. As a result, they were having great difficulty. He approached them early in the morning, when it was still dark, by walking on the water. He intended to walk by them.

# How did Jesus come to the disciples on the lake?

Jesus came to the disciples walking on the lake.

# Mark 6:49

# **ULT**

<sup>49</sup> But they, having seen him walking on the sea, thought that he is a ghost and they cried out,

# **UST**

<sup>49</sup> They saw him walking on the water, but they thought that he was a ghost. They screamed

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 6:50

#### **ULT**

<sup>50</sup> for they all saw him and were troubled. But immediately he spoke with them and says to them, "Take courage! It is I! Do not be afraid!"

#### **UST**

<sup>50</sup> because they all were terrified when they saw him. But he spoke to them. He said to them, "Be calm! Do not be afraid, because it is I!"

# What did Jesus tell the disciples when they saw him?

Jesus told the disciples to be brave and to not be afraid.

# Mark 6:51

# **ULT**

<sup>51</sup> And he went up into the boat with them, and the wind stilled, and they were very much amazed among themselves.

# **UST**

<sup>51</sup> He got into the boat and sat down with them and the wind stopped blowing. They were completely amazed about what he had done.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 6:52

# **ULT**

<sup>52</sup> For they did not understand about the loaves, but their heart had been hardened.

### **UST**

<sup>52</sup> Although they had seen Jesus multiply the bread and the fish, they did not understand how powerful he was, as they should have.

# Why did the disciples not understand about the miracle of the loaves?

The disciples did not understand about the miracle of the loaves because their minds were slow to understand.

#### Mark 6:53

#### ULT

<sup>53</sup> And having crossed over to the land, they came to Gennesaret and anchored there.

#### **UST**

<sup>53</sup> After they went further around the Galilee lake in a boat, they came to shore at Gennesaret town. Then they fastened the boat there.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 6:54

# **ULT**

<sup>54</sup> And when they had come out from the boat, immediately having recognized him,

# **UST**

<sup>54</sup> As soon as they got out of the boat, the people there recognized Jesus.

# Mark 6:55

# **ULT**

<sup>55</sup> they ran throughout that whole region and began to carry on {their} mats those having sickness where they were hearing that he is.

# **UST**

<sup>55</sup> So they ran throughout the whole district in order to tell others that Jesus was there. Then the people placed those who were sick on stretchers and carried them to any place where they heard people say that Jesus was.

# What did the people of the region do when they recognized Jesus?

The people brought the sick on stretchers to Jesus wherever they heard he was coming.

# Mark 6:56

# **ULT**

<sup>56</sup> And wherever he was entering into villages, or into cities, or into the countryside, they were placing the sick in the marketplaces and were begging him so that at least they might touch the edge of his garment, and as many as touched him were being healed.

# **UST**

<sup>56</sup> In whatever village, town or place in the countryside where he went, they would bring to the marketplaces those who were sick. Then the sick people would beg Jesus to let them touch him or even the edge of his clothes in order that Jesus might heal them. All those who touched him or his robe were healed.

# What happened to those who just touched the fringe of Jesus' garment?

Those who just touched the fringe of Jesus' garment were healed.

# Mark 7

# **Mark 7:1**

# **ULT**

<sup>1</sup> And the Pharisees and some of the scribes, having come from Jerusalem, are being gathered around him.

#### **UST**

<sup>1</sup> One day some Pharisees and some men who teach the Jewish laws who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# **Mark 7:2**

#### **ULT**

<sup>2</sup> And they had seen some of his disciples that eat bread with defiled hands, that is, unwashed.

# **UST**

<sup>2</sup> The Pharisees saw that his apprentices often ate without washing their hands first.

What were some of Jesus' disciples doing that offended the Pharisees and scribes? Some of the disciples were eating with unwashed hands.

#### **Mark 7:3**

#### **ULT**

<sup>3</sup> (For the Pharisees and all the Jews do not eat unless they would wash {their} hands with a fist, holding to the tradition of the elders;

#### **UST**

<sup>3</sup> The Pharisees and all of the other Jews strictly observe their traditions that their ancestors taught. For example, they refuse to eat until they first wash their hands with a special ritual,

# Whose tradition was it that hands, cups, pots, copper vessels, and dining couches be washed before eating? (vv3-4)

It was the tradition of the elders that hands, cups, pots, copper vessels, and dining couches be washed before eating.

# **Mark 7:4**

# **ULT**

<sup>4</sup> and from the marketplace, they do not eat unless they would wash, and there are many other things which they received to observe: the washing of cups, and pots, and copper vessels.)

# **UST**

<sup>4</sup> especially after they return from buying things in the marketplace. They think that God will be angry with them if they do not do that, because some person or thing unacceptable to God might have touched them or the things they bought.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# **Mark 7:5**

#### ULT

<sup>5</sup> And the Pharisees and the scribes ask him, "Why do your disciples not walk according to the tradition of the elders, but they eat {their} bread with unwashed hands?"

# **UST**

<sup>5</sup> That day, those Pharisees and men who taught the Jewish laws saw that some of his apprentices were eating food with hands that they had not washed using the special ritual. So they questioned Jesus and said, "Your apprentices disobey the traditions of our elders! Why do they eat food if they have not washed their hands using our ritual!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### **Mark 7:6**

# **ULT**

<sup>6</sup> But he, answering, said to them, "Isaiah prophesied well about you hypocrites. As it is written, 'This people honors me with {their} lips, but their heart is far from me.

#### **UST**

<sup>6</sup> Jesus said to them, "Isaiah rebuked your ancestors, and his words describe very well you people who only pretend to be good! He wrote these words that God said: 'These people speak as if they honor me, but they really do not think about honoring me at all.

# **Mark 7:7**

# **ULT**

<sup>7</sup> But they worship me in vain, teaching commandments of men as doctrines.'

# **UST**

<sup>7</sup> It is useless for them to worship me, because they teach only what people say as if I myself had commanded them.'

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# **Mark 7:8**

# **ULT**

<sup>8</sup> Having abandoned the commandment of God, you hold fast to the tradition of men."

# **UST**

<sup>8</sup> You, like your ancestors, refuse to do what God has commanded. Instead, you follow only the traditions that others have taught."

# What did Jesus say to the Pharisees and scribes about their teaching on the issue of washing? (vv8-9)

Jesus said that the Pharisees and scribes taught the rules of men while abandoning the commandment of God.

# **Mark 7:9**

#### ULT

<sup>9</sup> And he was saying to them, "How well you reject the commandment of God so that you may keep your tradition!

# **UST**

<sup>9</sup> Jesus also said to them, "You think that you are clever in refusing to do what God commanded just so that you can obey your own traditions!

# Mark 7:10

# **ULT**

10 For Moses said, 'Honor your father and your mother,' and, 'The one speaking evil of {his} father or mother —let him end in death.'

# **UST**

<sup>10</sup> For example, our ancestor Moses wrote God's command, 'Honor your fathers and your mothers'. He also wrote, 'The authorities must execute a person who speaks evil about his father or mother.'

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 7:11

# **ULT**

<sup>11</sup> But you say, 'If a man may say to {his} father or his mother, "Whatever you would have profited from me {is} Corban"' (that is, a gift),

# **UST**

<sup>11</sup> But you teach people that it is all right if people give their things to God instead of giving them to their parents. You allow them to say to their parents, 'What I was going to give to you to provide for you, I have now promised to give to God. So I cannot any longer help you!'

# How did the Pharisees and scribes void the commandment of God which says to honor your father and mother? (vv11-13)

They voided God's commandment by telling people to give to them as Corban the money that would have helped their father and mother.

# Mark 7:12

#### **ULT**

<sup>12</sup> you no longer permit him to do anything for {his} father or {his} mother,

# **UST**

<sup>12</sup> As a result, you are actually telling people that they no longer have to help their parents!

# Mark 7:13

# **ULT**

 $^{13}$  nullifying the word of God by your tradition which you handed down, and you do many such similar things."

# **UST**

<sup>13</sup> In this way you disregard what God commanded! You teach your own things to others and tell them that they should obey them! And you do many other things like that."

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 7:14

# **ULT**

<sup>14</sup> And having summoned the crowd again, he was saying to them, "Listen to me, all of you, and understand:

### **UST**

<sup>14</sup> Then Jesus again summoned the crowd to come closer. Then he said to them, "All of you people listen to me! Try to understand what I am about to tell you.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 7:15

#### **ULT**

<sup>15</sup> there is nothing from outside the man, entering into him, that is able to defile him; but the things that come out from the man are the things defiling the man."

# **UST**

<sup>15</sup> Nothing that people eat causes God to consider them to be defiled. On the contrary, it is that which comes from people's inner beings that causes God to consider them to be defiled."

# What did Jesus say does not defile a person?

Jesus said that nothing from outside of a person can defile him when it enters into him.

# What did Jesus say defiles a person?

Jesus said that what comes out of a person defiles him.

# Mark 7:16

# **ULT**

16[1] [If anyone has ears to hear, let him hear.]

# **UST**

16[1] [Every one of you should think carefully about what you heard me say.]

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 7:17

# ULT

<sup>17</sup> And when he entered into the house from the crowd, his disciples were asking him about the parable.

# **UST**

<sup>17</sup> After Jesus had left the crowd, he entered a house with his apprentices. They questioned him about the parable that he had just spoken.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 7:18

# **ULT**

<sup>18</sup> And he says to them, "Are you also thus without understanding? Do you not understand that everything that is entering into the man from outside is not able to defile him,

# **UST**

<sup>18</sup> He replied to them, "Did you not understand what it means? You ought to understand that nothing that enters us from outside can cause God to consider us unacceptable to him.

# What did Jesus say does not defile a person? (vv18-19)

Jesus said that nothing from outside of a person can defile him when it enters into him.

#### Mark 7:19

# **ULT**

<sup>19</sup> because it does not go into his heart, but into the stomach, and passes out into the latrine?" (making all foods clean.)

# **UST**

<sup>19</sup> Instead of entering and ruining our minds, it goes into our stomachs, and afterwards the refuse passes out of our bodies." By saying this, Jesus was declaring that people can eat any food without causing God to consider them unacceptable to him.

# What kinds of foods did Jesus declare to be clean?

lesus declared all foods to be clean.

# Mark 7:20

# **ULT**

<sup>20</sup> But he was saying, "What is coming out from the man, that defiles the man.

# **UST**

<sup>20</sup> He also said, "It is the thoughts and actions that come from within people that cause God to consider them unacceptable to him.

# What did Jesus say defiles a person? (vv20-23)

Jesus said that what comes out of a person defiles him.

# Mark 7:21

# **ULT**

<sup>21</sup> For from within, from the heart of men, proceed evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder,

# **UST**

<sup>21</sup> Specifically, it is people's innermost being that causes them to think things that are evil; they act immorally, they steal things, they commit murder.

# What are three things that Jesus said can come out of a person to defile him? (vv21-22)

Jesus said that evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, coveting, wickedness, deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, pride, and folly can come out of a person to defile him.

# Mark 7:22

# **ULT**

<sup>22</sup> adultery, coveting, wickedness, deceit, sensuality, an evil eye, slander, pride, {and} folly.

# **UST**

<sup>22</sup> They commit adultery, they are greedy, they act maliciously, they deceive people. They act indecently, they envy people, they speak evil about others, they are proud, and they act foolishly.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 7:23

# **ULT**

<sup>23</sup> All these evils come out from within, and they defile the man."

# **UST**

<sup>23</sup> People think these thoughts and then they do these evil actions, and that is what causes God to consider them unacceptable to him."

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 7:24

#### **ULT**

<sup>24</sup> Now having gotten up from there, he went away to the region of Tyre and Sidon, and having entered into a house, he was wanting no one to know it, but he was not able to hide.

# **UST**

<sup>24</sup> After Jesus and his apprentices left Galilee, they went to the region around the cities of Tyre and Sidon. While he stayed at a certain house, he did not want anyone to know it, but people soon found out that he was there.

# Mark 7:25

# **ULT**

<sup>25</sup> But immediately, having heard about him, a woman, of whom her little daughter had an unclean spirit, having come, fell down at his feet.

# **UST**

<sup>25</sup> A certain woman, whose daughter had an evil spirit within her, heard about Jesus. At once she came to him and knelt at his feet.

# Was the woman whose daughter had an unclean spirit a Jew or a Greek? (vv25-26)

The woman whose daughter had an unclean spirit was a Greek.

# Mark 7:26

# **ULT**

<sup>26</sup> Now the woman was a Greek, a Syrophoenician by descent, and she was asking him that he would cast out the demon from her daughter.

# **UST**

<sup>26</sup> Now this woman was not a Jew. Her ancestors were not Jews. She herself had been born in the area around the region of Phoenicia, in the district of Syria. She pled with Jesus that he force the evil spirit out from her daughter.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 7:27

#### ULT

<sup>27</sup> And he was saying to her, "Permit the children first to be fed, for it is not good to take the bread of the children and to throw it to the dogs."

# **UST**

<sup>27</sup> He said to the woman, "First let the children eat all they want, because it is not good for someone to take the food the mother has prepared for the children and then throw it to the little dogs."

# Mark 7:28

# **ULT**

<sup>28</sup> But she answered and says to him, "Yes, Lord, and the little dogs under the table eat from the crumbs of the children."

# **UST**

<sup>28</sup> She replied to him, "Sir, what you say is correct, but even the house dogs, who lie under the table, eat the crumbs that the children drop."

# How did the woman respond when Jesus told her that it was not right to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs?

The woman said that even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs.

#### Mark 7:29

### **ULT**

<sup>29</sup> And he was saying to her, "Because of this word, go! The demon has gone out from your daughter."

#### **UST**

<sup>29</sup> Jesus said to her, "Because of what you have said, go home. I have caused the evil spirit to leave your daughter."

# What did Jesus do for the woman? (vv29-30)

Jesus cast the demon out of the woman's daughter.

# Mark 7:30

# **ULT**

<sup>30</sup> And having gone away to her house, she found the child had been laid on the bed, and the demon had gone out.

# **UST**

<sup>30</sup> The woman returned to her house and saw that her child was lying quietly on the bed and that the evil spirit had left.

# Mark 7:31

# **ULT**

<sup>31</sup> And again having gone out from the region of Tyre, he went through Sidon to the Sea of Galilee, up to a part of the region of the Decapolis.

# **UST**

<sup>31</sup> Jesus and his apprentices left the region around Tyre and went north through Sidon, then toward the east through the area of the Ten Towns, and then south to the towns near the Sea of Galilee.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 7:32

# **ULT**

<sup>32</sup> And they bring to him a deaf man and one having difficulty speaking, and they beg him that he would lay {his} hand on him.

# **UST**

<sup>32</sup> There, people brought to him a man who was deaf and could not talk. They begged Jesus to lay his hands on him in order to heal him.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 7:33

#### **ULT**

<sup>33</sup> And having taking him aside from the crowd by himself, he put his fingers into his ears, and having spit, he touched his tongue.

# **UST**

<sup>33</sup> So Jesus took him away from the crowd in order that the two of them could be alone. Then he put one of his fingers into each of the man's ears. After he spat on his fingers, he touched the man's tongue with his fingers.

# When the man who was deaf and had a speech impediment was brought to Jesus, what did he do to heal him? (vv33-34)

Jesus put his fingers in the man's ears, spit and touched his tongue, then looked to heaven and said, "Open!"

# Mark 7:34

# **ULT**

<sup>34</sup> And having looked up to heaven, he sighed and says to him, "Ephphatha!" (that is, "Be opened!").

# **UST**

<sup>34</sup> Then he looked up toward heaven, he sighed and then in his own language he said to the man's ears, "Ephphatha," which means, "Be opened!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 7:35

# **ULT**

<sup>35</sup> And his ears were opened, and the band of his tongue was released, and he began speaking plainly.

# **UST**

<sup>35</sup> At once the man could hear plainly. He also began to speak clearly because what was causing him to be unable to speak was healed.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 7:36

#### **ULT**

<sup>36</sup> And he ordered them so that they would tell it to no one. But as much as he ordered them, the more abundantly they were proclaiming it.

# **UST**

<sup>36</sup> Jesus told the people not to tell anyone what he had done. But, although he ordered them and others repeatedly not to tell anyone about it, they kept talking about it all the more.

# What did the people do when Jesus told them to tell no one about his healings?

The more Jesus commanded them to be quiet, the more they talked about it.

# Mark 7:37

# **ULT**

 $^{37}$  And they were extremely astonished, saying, "He has done all things well. He even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak."

7:16 <sup>[1]</sup>

# **UST**

<sup>37</sup> People who heard about it were utterly amazed and were saying, "Everything he has done is wonderful! Besides doing other amazing things, he enables deaf people to hear! And he enables those who cannot speak to speak!"

7:16 <sup>[1]</sup>

# Mark 8

# **Mark 8:1**

# **ULT**

<sup>1</sup> In those days, there again being a great crowd, and not having anything to eat, having summoned his disciples, he says to them,

# **UST**

<sup>1</sup> During those days, a large crowd of people gathered again. After they had been there for two days, they had no food to eat. So Jesus called his apprentices to come close to him, and then he said to them,

What concern did Jesus state about the great crowd that had been following him? (vv1-2) Jesus stated that he was concerned the great crowd had nothing to eat.

# **Mark 8:2**

### **ULT**

<sup>2</sup> "I have compassion on the crowd, because they are remaining with me already for three days and do not have anything to eat.

# **UST**

<sup>2</sup> "This is the third day that these people have been with me, and they have nothing left to eat, so now I am very concerned for them.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### **Mark 8:3**

#### **ULT**

<sup>3</sup> And if I would send them away to their home fasting, they will faint on the way, and some of them have come from far way."

#### **UST**

<sup>3</sup> If I send them home while they are still hungry, some of them will faint on the way home. Some of them have come from far away."

# **Mark 8:4**

# **ULT**

<sup>4</sup> And his disciples answered him, "From where will anyone be able to feed these people with bread here in this desolate place?"

# **UST**

<sup>4</sup> His apprentices knew that he was suggesting that they give the people something to eat, so one of them replied, "We cannot possibly find food to satisfy this crowd. No one lives in this place!

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# **Mark 8:5**

#### ULT

<sup>5</sup> And he asked them, "How many loaves do you have?" And they said, "Seven."

### **UST**

<sup>5</sup> Jesus asked them, "How many loaves of bread do you have?" They replied, "We have seven flat loaves."

# How many loaves did the disciples have with them?

The disciples had seven loaves with them.

# **Mark 8:6**

# **ULT**

<sup>6</sup> And he commands the crowd to recline on the ground, and having taken the seven loaves, having given thanks, he broke them and was giving them to his disciples so that they might serve them, and they served the crowd.

#### **UST**

<sup>6</sup> Jesus commanded the crowd, "Sit down on the ground!" After they sat down, he took the seven loaves, thanked God for them, broke them into pieces, and gave them to his apprentices to distribute to the people.

# What did Jesus do with the disciples' loaves?

Jesus gave thanks, broke the loaves, and gave them to his disciples to serve.

# **Mark 8:7**

# **ULT**

<sup>7</sup> And they had a few small fish, and having blessed them, he told them to serve these also.

# **UST**

<sup>7</sup> They had also found that they had a few small fish. So after he thanked God for these, he told his apprentices, "Distribute these also." After they distributed the fish to the crowd,

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# **Mark 8:8**

# **ULT**

<sup>8</sup> And they ate and were satisfied, and they picked up an abundance of broken pieces—seven baskets.

# **UST**

<sup>8</sup> the people ate this food, and they had plenty to satisfy themselves. His apprentices collected the pieces of food that were left over and filled seven large baskets.

# How much food remained after everyone had eaten?

There were seven baskets of food remaining after everyone had eaten.

# **Mark 8:9**

# **ULT**

<sup>9</sup> Now there were about 4,000, and he sent them away.

# **UST**

<sup>9</sup> His apprentices estimated that there were about four thousand people who ate on that day. Then Jesus dismissed the crowd.

# How many people ate and were satisfied?

There were about four thousand men who ate and were satisfied.

# Mark 8:10

# **ULT**

<sup>10</sup> And immediately, having gotten into the boat with his disciples, he went into the region of Dalmanutha.

# **UST**

<sup>10</sup> Immediately after that, he got into the boat along with his apprentices, and they went around the Galilee lake to the district of Dalmanutha.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 8:11

# **ULT**

<sup>11</sup> And the Pharisees came out and began to argue with him, seeking from him a sign from heaven, testing him.

# **UST**

<sup>11</sup> Then some Pharisees came to Jesus. They began arguing with him and insisting that he perform a miracle to show that God had sent him.

# To test him, what did the Pharisees want Jesus to do?

The Pharisees wanted Jesus to give them a sign from heaven.

#### Mark 8:12

#### **ULT**

<sup>12</sup> And having sighed deeply in his spirit, he says, "Why does this generation seek for a sign? Truly I say to you, if a sign will be given to this generation…"

#### **UST**

<sup>12</sup> Jesus sighed deeply within himself, and then he said, "Why are you asking me to perform a miracle? I will not do a miracle for you!"

# Mark 8:13

# **ULT**

<sup>13</sup> And having left them, having boarded a boat again, he went away to the other side.

# **UST**

<sup>13</sup> Then he left them. He got into the boat again, along with his apprentices, and they went further around the Galilee lake.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 8:14

# **ULT**

<sup>14</sup> And they forgot to bring bread, and except for one loaf, they did not have any with them in the boat.

# **UST**

<sup>14</sup> His apprentices had forgotten to bring along enough food. Specifically, they had only one flat loaf of bread with them in the boat.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 8:15

#### ULT

<sup>15</sup> And he was warning them, saying, "Keep watch! Be on guard against the yeast of the Pharisees and the yeast of Herod."

#### **UST**

<sup>15</sup> As they were going, Jesus warned them and said, "Be careful! Beware of the yeast of the Pharisees and of Herod!"

# About what did Jesus warn his disciples concerning the Pharisees?

Jesus warned his disciples to be on guard of the yeast of the Pharisees.

# Mark 8:16

# **ULT**

<sup>16</sup> And they were reasoning with each other that they have no bread."

# **UST**

<sup>16</sup> The apprentices misunderstood him. So they said to one another, "He must have said that because we have no bread."

# About what did the disciples think Jesus was talking?

The disciples thought Jesus was talking about the fact that they had forgotten to bring bread.

# Mark 8:17

# **ULT**

<sup>17</sup> And having known this, Jesus says to them, "Why are you reasoning that you do not have bread? Do you not yet perceive, nor understand? Have your hearts become hardened?

#### **UST**

<sup>17</sup> Jesus knew what they were discussing among themselves. So he said to them, "Why are you talking about not having enough bread? You should understand what I have said by now! You are not thinking!

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 8:18

#### **ULT**

<sup>18</sup> Having eyes, do you not see? And having ears, do you not hear? And do you not remember?

#### **UST**

<sup>18</sup> You have eyes, but you do not understand what you see! You have ears, but you do not understand what I say!" Then he asked, "Do you not remember what happened

# Mark 8:19

# **ULT**

<sup>19</sup> When I broke the five loaves among the 5,000, how many baskets full of broken pieces did you take up?" They say to him, "12."

# **UST**

<sup>19</sup> when I broke only five loaves and fed the five thousand people? Not only was everyone satisfied, but there was food left over! How many baskets of pieces of bread that were left over did you collect?" They replied, "We collected twelve baskets full."

Jesus reminded his disciples that what had happened when Jesus had broken five loaves? Jesus reminded them that when he had broken five loaves, five thousand people had been fed and twelves baskets full of broken pieces had been taken up.

#### Mark 8:20

# **ULT**

<sup>20</sup> "And when the seven among the 4,000, how many baskets full of broken pieces did you take up?" And they say to him, "Seven."

# **UST**

<sup>20</sup> Then he asked, "When I broke the seven loaves in order to feed the four thousand people, again when everyone had plenty to eat, how many large baskets of pieces of bread that were left over did you collect?" They replied, "We collected seven large baskets full."

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 8:21

#### **ULT**

<sup>21</sup> And he said to them, "How do you not yet understand?"

#### **UST**

<sup>21</sup> Then he said to them, "I am disappointed that you do not understand yet that you should never worry that you do not have enough food!"

# Mark 8:22

# **ULT**

<sup>22</sup> And they come to Bethsaida, and they bring to him a blind man and beg him that he would touch him.

# **UST**

<sup>22</sup> They arrived in the boat at Bethsaida town. People brought a blind man to Jesus and begged him touch the man in order to heal him.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 8:23

# **ULT**

<sup>23</sup> And having taken hold of the hand of the blind man, he led him out from the village. And having spit into his eyes, having laid {his} hands on him, he was asking him, "Do you see anything?"

# **UST**

<sup>23</sup> Jesus took the hand of the blind man and led him outside the town. Then he spat into the man's eyes, he put his hands on the man and then asked him, "Do you see anything?"

What two things did Jesus first do to the blind man in order to restore his sight? Jesus first spat on his eyes and laid his hands upon him.

### Mark 8:24

# **ULT**

<sup>24</sup> And having looked up, he was saying, "I see men who look like walking trees."

#### **UST**

<sup>24</sup> The man looked up and then he said, "Yes, I see people! They are walking around, but I cannot see them clearly. They look like trees!"

# Mark 8:25

# **ULT**

<sup>25</sup> Then he again laid {his} hands upon his eyes, and he looked intently and was restored, and he was seeing everything clearly.

# **UST**

<sup>25</sup> Then Jesus again touched the eyes of the blind man. The man looked intently, and at that moment he was completely healed! He could see everything clearly.

What third thing did Jesus do to the blind man in order to completely restore his sight? Jesus laid his hands upon his eyes.

# Mark 8:26

# **ULT**

<sup>26</sup> And he sent him away to his home, saying, "You may not even enter into the town."

### **UST**

<sup>26</sup> Jesus said to him, "Do not go into the town!" Then he sent the man to his home.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 8:27

# **ULT**

<sup>27</sup> And Jesus and his disciples went out into the villages of Caesarea Philippi, and on the way he was questioning his disciples, saying to them, "Who do men say that I am?"

# **UST**

<sup>27</sup> Jesus and his apprentices left Bethsaida town and went to the villages near Caesarea Philippi town. On the way he questioned them, "Who do people say that I am?"

# Mark 8:28

# **ULT**

<sup>28</sup> But they spoke to him, saying, "John the Baptist, and others, 'Elijah,' but others, 'One of the prophets.'"

# **UST**

<sup>28</sup> They replied, "Some people say that you are John the Baptizer. Others say that you are the prophet Elijah. And others say that you are one of the other former prophets."

# Who were the people saying that Jesus was?

The people were saying that Jesus was John the Baptizer, Elijah, or one of the prophets.

#### Mark 8:29

# **ULT**

<sup>29</sup> And he was questioning them, "But who do you say that I am?" And answering, Peter says to him, "You are the Christ."

#### **UST**

<sup>29</sup> He asked them, "What about you? Who do you say that I am?" Peter replied to him, "We believe that you are the Messiah!"

# Who did Peter say that Jesus was?

Peter said that Jesus was the Christ.

### Mark 8:30

# **ULT**

<sup>30</sup> And he warned them that they might tell no one about him.

# **UST**

<sup>30</sup> Then Jesus warned them strongly that they should not tell anyone yet that he was the Messiah.

## Mark 8:31

## **ULT**

<sup>31</sup> And he began to teach them that it is necessary for the Son of Man to suffer many things and to be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes, and to be killed, and to rise up after three days.

## **UST**

<sup>31</sup> Then Jesus began to teach them that he, the Son of Man, would certainly suffer very much. He would be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the men who teach the Jewish laws. He would even be killed. But on the third day after he died, he would become alive again.

## About what future events did Jesus begin to teach his disciples clearly?

Jesus taught his disciples that the Son of Man must suffer, be rejected, be killed, and be raised after three days.

## Mark 8:32

# **ULT**

<sup>32</sup> And he was speaking this word openly. And Peter, having taken him aside, began to rebuke him.

## **UST**

<sup>32</sup> He said this to them clearly. But Peter took Jesus aside and started to scold him for talking this way.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 8:33

#### **ULT**

<sup>33</sup> But Jesus, having turned and having looked at his disciples, rebuked Peter and says, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are not setting your mind on the things of God, but on the things of men."

#### **UST**

<sup>33</sup> Jesus turned around and looked at his apprentices. Then he rebuked Peter, saying, "Stop thinking like that! Satan is causing you to talk like that! Instead of wanting what God wants me to do, you are wanting me to do only what people would want me to do."

## What did Jesus say when Peter began to rebuke him?

Jesus said to Peter, "Get behind me Satan! You do not care for the things of God, but for the things of people".

#### Mark 8:34

## **ULT**

<sup>34</sup> And having summoned the crowd along with his disciples, he said to them, "If anyone wants to follow after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me.

## **UST**

<sup>34</sup> Then he called the crowd together along with his apprentices so that they might listen to him. He told them, "If any one of you wants to be my apprentice, you must not do only what makes you live easily. You must be willing to suffer pain like criminals who are forced to carry crosses to the places where they will be crucified. That is what anyone who wants to be my apprentice must do.

## What did Jesus say anyone who wants to follow him must do?

Jesus said that anyone who wants to follow him must deny himself and take up his cross.

## Mark 8:35

## **ULT**

<sup>35</sup> For whoever wants to save his soul will lose it, but whoever loses his soul for the sake of me and of the gospel will save it.

## **UST**

<sup>35</sup> You must do that, because those who try to save their lives by denying that they belong to me will lose their lives. Those who are killed because they are my apprentices and because they tell others the good news will live forever with me.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 8:36

#### **ULT**

<sup>36</sup> For what does it profit a man to gain the whole world and to forfeit his soul?

#### **UST**

<sup>36</sup> People might get everything they want in this world, but they are really gaining nothing if they do not gain eternal life!

# What did Jesus say about a person's desire to gain the things of the world?

Jesus said, "What does it profit a person to gain the whole world, and then forfeit his life?"

## Mark 8:37

## **ULT**

<sup>37</sup> For what might a man give as an exchange for his soul?

## **UST**

<sup>37</sup> Think carefully about the fact that there is absolutely nothing that people can give to God that would enable them to gain eternal life!

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 8:38

## **ULT**

<sup>38</sup> For if anyone may be ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, the Son of Man will also be ashamed of him when he would come in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."

## **UST**

<sup>38</sup> And think about this: Those who refuse to say that they belong to me, and who reject what I say in these days when many people have turned away from God and are very sinful, I, the Son of Man, will also refuse to say that they belong to me when I come back with the holy angels and have the glory that my Father has!"

What did Jesus say he would do concerning those who are ashamed of him and his words? Jesus said that at his coming he would be ashamed of those who were ashamed of him and his words.

## Mark 9

## **Mark 9:1**

## **ULT**

<sup>1</sup> And he was saying to them, "Truly I say to you, there are some of those standing here who may certainly not taste death before they would see the kingdom of God come with power."

## **UST**

<sup>1</sup> Jesus also said to the crowds and his disciples, "Listen carefully! Some of you who are here now will not die before you see God ruling powerfully!"

# Who did Jesus say would see the kingdom of God coming with power?

Jesus said that some standing there with him would not die before they saw the kingdom of God coming with power.

### **Mark 9:2**

## **ULT**

<sup>2</sup> And after six days, Jesus takes Peter and James and John and leads them up on a high mountain by themselves, alone, and he was transfigured before them.

## **UST**

<sup>2</sup> Six days later Jesus took Peter, James, and James' brother John and led them up a high mountain. While they were alone up there, he appeared very different to them.

# What happened to Jesus when Peter, James, and John went up a high mountain with him? (vv2-3)

Jesus was transfigured and his garments became radiantly brilliant.

#### **Mark 9:3**

#### **ULT**

<sup>3</sup> And his garments became radiantly, extremely white, such as no launderer on the earth is able thus to make them white.

## **UST**

<sup>3</sup> His clothes became dazzling white. They were whiter than anyone on earth could make them by bleaching them.

<sup>4</sup> And Elijah with Moses were seen by them, and they were talking with Jesus.

## **UST**

<sup>4</sup> Two prophets, who had lived long ago, Moses and Elijah, appeared to them. Then the two of them began talking with Jesus.

# Who was talking with Jesus on the mountain?

Elijah and Moses were talking with Jesus.

## **Mark 9:5**

# **ULT**

<sup>5</sup> And answering, Peter says to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here, and let us make three shelters, one for you, and one for Moses, and one for Elijah."

## **UST**

<sup>5</sup> After a short time, Peter said, "Teacher, it is wonderful to be here! So allow us to make three shelters. One will be for you, one will be for Moses, and one will be for Elijah!"

#### **Mark 9:6**

#### **ULT**

<sup>6</sup> (For he did not know what he might answer, for they were terrified.)

## **UST**

<sup>6</sup> He said this because he wanted to say something, but he did not know what to say because he and the other two disciples were terrified.

## **Mark 9:7**

## **ULT**

<sup>7</sup> And a cloud came, overshadowing them, and a voice came from the cloud, "This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him."

## **UST**

<sup>7</sup> Then a shining cloud appeared that covered them. God spoke to them from the cloud saying, "This is my Son. He is the one whom I love. Therefore, listen to him!"

## On the mountain, what did the voice from the cloud say?

The voice said, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him".

# **Mark 9:8**

#### ULT

<sup>8</sup> And suddenly, having looked around, they no longer saw anyone with them, but only Jesus.

### **UST**

<sup>8</sup> When the three disciples looked around, they suddenly saw that only Jesus was with them, and that Elijah and Moses were no longer there.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## **Mark 9:9**

#### **ULT**

<sup>9</sup> And as they were coming down from the mountain, he ordered them that they would relate to no one what they had seen, until the Son of Man would rise from the dead.

#### **UST**

<sup>9</sup> While they were coming down the mountain, Jesus told them that they should not tell anyone yet what had just happened to him. He said, "You may tell them after I, the Son of Man, become alive again after I die."

What did Jesus command the disciples about what they had seen on the mountain? Jesus commanded them to tell no one what they had seen, until the Son of Man had risen from the dead.

<sup>10</sup> And they kept the word to themselves, discussing together what it is "to rise from the dead."

# **UST**

<sup>10</sup> So they did not tell others about it for a long time. But they discussed among themselves what it meant when he said that he would rise from the dead.

## **ULT**

<sup>11</sup> And they were questioning him, saying, "Why do the scribes say that it is necessary for Elijah to come first?"

## **UST**

<sup>11</sup> The three disciples asked Jesus, "The men who teach the Jewish laws say that Elijah must come back to the earth before the Messiah comes to earth, {but we have just seen Elijah,} so is what they are teaching wrong?"

# What did Jesus say about Elijah's coming? (vv11-13)

lesus said that Elijah does come first to restore all things, and that Elijah had already come.

#### Mark 9:12

#### **ULT**

<sup>12</sup> But he was saying to them, "Elijah has come first to restore all things. And how has it been written about the Son of Man that he would suffer many things and would be despised?

#### **UST**

12-13 Jesus answered them, "It is true that God promised to send Elijah to come first to put everything as it should be. But Elijah has already come, and our leaders treated him very badly, just like they wanted to do, as prophets long ago had said they would. But there is much written in the scriptures about me, the Son of Man. The scriptures say that I will suffer much and that people will reject me."

#### Mark 9:13

## **ULT**

<sup>13</sup> But I say to you that Elijah has indeed come, and they did whatever they wanted to him, just as it is written about him."

## **UST**

<sup>12-13</sup> Jesus answered them, "It is true that God promised to send Elijah to come first to put everything as it should be. But Elijah has already come, and our leaders treated him very badly, just like they wanted to do, as prophets long ago had said they would. But there is much written in the scriptures about me, the Son of Man. The scriptures say that I will suffer much and that people will reject me."

<sup>16</sup> Jesus asked them, "What are you arguing about?"

## Mark 9:17

<sup>17</sup> And one from the crowd answered him, "Teacher, I brought my son to you, having a mute spirit.

## **UST**

<sup>17</sup> A man in the crowd answered him, "Teacher, I brought my son here to you {in order that you would heal him}. There is an evil spirit in him that makes him unable to talk.

# What were the disciples unable to do for the father and his son? (vv17-18)

The disciples were unable to drive out the evil spirit from the father's son.

## Mark 9:18

# **ULT**

<sup>18</sup> And wherever it might seize him, it throws him down, and he foams at the mouth and grinds {his} teeth, and he becomes rigid, and I asked your disciples that they might cast it out, but they were not strong enough."

# **UST**

<sup>18</sup> Whenever the spirit begins to control him, it throws him down. He foams at the mouth, he grinds his teeth together, and he becomes stiff. I asked your disciples to expel the spirit, but they were not able to do it."

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 9:19

# **ULT**

<sup>19</sup> But answering them, he says, "You unbelieving generation, until when will I be with you? Until when will I bear with you? Bring him to me."

## **UST**

<sup>19</sup> Jesus replied to them by saying, "You faithless people! I have been with you a long time, and you still cannot do what I do! You test my patience! Bring the boy to me."

## Mark 9:20

## **ULT**

<sup>20</sup> And they brought him to him, and having seen him, the spirit immediately threw him into a convulsion, and having fallen on the ground, he was rolling around, foaming at the mouth.

## **UST**

<sup>20</sup> So they brought the boy to Jesus. As soon as the evil spirit saw Jesus, it shook the boy severely, and the boy fell on the ground. He rolled around and foamed at the mouth.

## Mark 9:21

## **ULT**

<sup>21</sup> And he asked his father, "How much time is it when this has been happening to him?" And he said, "From childhood.

# **UST**

<sup>21</sup> Jesus asked the boy's father, "How long has he been like this?" He replied, "This started to happen when he was a child.

#### Mark 9:22

#### **ULT**

<sup>22</sup> And it has often thrown him both into the fire and into the waters in order that it might destroy him, but if you are able to do anything, help us, having had compassion on us."

## **UST**

<sup>22</sup> The spirit does not only do this, but he also often throws him into the fire or into the water in order to kill him. Pity us and help us, if you can!"

# Into what did the evil spirit throw the boy to try to destroy him?

The evil spirit threw the boy into the fire or into the waters to try to destroy him.

## Mark 9:23

## **ULT**

<sup>23</sup> But Jesus said to him, "'If you are able'? All things are possible for the one believing."

## **UST**

<sup>23</sup> Jesus exclaimed to him, "Of course I can! God can do anything for people who believe in him!"

# How did the father respond when Jesus said all things are possible for the one who believes? (vv23-24)

The father responded, "I believe! Help my unbelief!"

#### Mark 9:24

## **ULT**

<sup>24</sup> And immediately the father of the child, having cried out, was saying, "I believe! Help me in {my} unbelief!"

## **UST**

<sup>24</sup> Immediately the child's father shouted, "I believe that you can help me, but I do not believe strongly. Help me to believe more strongly!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 9:25

## **ULT**

<sup>25</sup> And Jesus, having seen that the crowd is running to them, rebuked the unclean spirit, saying to it, "You mute and deaf spirit, I command you, come out from him, and you may never enter into him again."

#### **UST**

<sup>25</sup> Jesus saw that the crowd was growing. He rebuked the evil spirit: "You evil spirit, you who are causing this boy to be deaf and unable to talk! I command you to come out of him and never enter him again!"

#### Mark 9:26

## **ULT**

<sup>26</sup> And having cried out and convulsed him greatly, it came out, and he became like a dead person, so that many said, "He has died."

## **UST**

<sup>26</sup> The evil spirit shouted and shook the boy violently; then it left the boy. The boy did not move. He seemed like a dead body. So most of the people there said, "He is dead!"

Why were the disciples unable to cast out the mute and deaf spirit in the boy? (vv28-29)

The disciples were unable to cast out the spirit because it could not be cast out except by prayer.

#### Mark 9:29

#### ULT

<sup>29</sup> And he said to them, "This kind is able to come out by nothing except by prayer and fasting." <sup>[1]</sup>

#### **UST**

<sup>29</sup> He said to them, "You can force this kind of evil spirit out only by abstaining from food and praying that God will give you the power to do it. There is no other way that you can expel them."

## Mark 9:30

## **ULT**

<sup>30</sup> And having gone out from there, they were passing through Galilee, but he was not wanting that anyone would know it,

## **UST**

<sup>30</sup> After Jesus and his apprentices left that region, they traveled through Galilee district. Jesus did not want anyone else to know where he was.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 9:31

## **ULT**

<sup>31</sup> for he was teaching his disciples and saying to them, "The Son of Man is being delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him. And having been killed, he will rise again after three days."

# **UST**

<sup>31</sup> He wanted to have time to teach his apprentices. He was telling them, "Some day my enemies will arrest me, the Son of Man, and I will be put into the hands of other men. Those men will kill me. But on the third day after I die, I will become alive again!"

# What did Jesus tell his disciples would happen to him?

Jesus told them he would be put to death, then after three days he would rise again.

## Mark 9:32

#### ULT

 $^{32}$  But they were not understanding this statement, and they were afraid to ask him.

#### **UST**

<sup>32</sup> They did not understand what he was telling them, and they were afraid to ask him what he meant.

#### Mark 9:33

## **ULT**

<sup>33</sup> And they came to Capernaum, and having come into the house, he was asking them, "What were you discussing on the way?"

## **UST**

<sup>33</sup> Then Jesus and his apprentices returned to Capernaum town. When they were in the house, he asked them, "What were you talking about while we were traveling on the road?"

# What were the disciples arguing about along the way? (vv33-34)

The disciples were arguing about who among them was the greatest.

# Mark 9:34

# **ULT**

<sup>34</sup> But they were silent, for they had been arguing with one another on the way about who {was} greatest.

#### **UST**

<sup>34</sup> But they did not reply. They were ashamed to reply because, while they were traveling, they had been arguing with each other about which one of them was the most important.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 9:35

#### **ULT**

<sup>35</sup> And having sat down, he called the Twelve together and says to them, "If anyone wants to be first, he will be last of all and a servant of all."

## **UST**

<sup>35</sup> He sat down, he called the twelve apprentices to come close to him and then said to them, "If anyone wants God to consider him to be the most important person of all, he must consider himself to be the least important person of all, and he must serve everyone else."

# Who did Jesus say is first?

Jesus said that he is first who is servant of all.

## Mark 9:36

## **ULT**

<sup>36</sup> And having taken a little child, he placed him in their midst, and having taken him in his arms, he said to them,

## **UST**

<sup>36</sup> Then he took a child and placed him among them. He took the child in his arms and then he said to them,

# When someone receives a little child in Jesus' name, who are they also receiving? (vv36-37)

When someone receives a little child in Jesus' name, they are also receiving Jesus and the one who sent Jesus.

#### Mark 9:37

## **ULT**

<sup>37</sup> "Whoever may receive one of these little children in my name receives me; and whoever may receive me, does not receive me but the one who sent me."

## **UST**

<sup>37</sup> "Those who welcome a child like this one because they love me, God considers that they are welcoming me. It is also true that they are also welcoming God, who sent me."

#### Mark 9:38

## **ULT**

<sup>38</sup> John was saying to him, "Teacher, we saw someone casting out demons in your name and we were preventing him, because he was not following us."

#### **UST**

<sup>38</sup> John said to Jesus, "Teacher, we saw someone who was forcing evil spirits out of people. He claimed that he had authority from you to do that. So we told him to stop doing it because he was not one of the apprentices."

## Mark 9:39

## **ULT**

<sup>39</sup> But Jesus said, "Do not prevent him, for there is no one who will do a mighty work in my name and will be able soon afterwards to speak evil about me.

## **UST**

<sup>39</sup> Jesus said, "Do not tell him to stop doing that. For no one will say bad things about me soon after performing a mighty deed with my authority.

## Mark 9:40

## **ULT**

<sup>40</sup> For he who is not against us is for us.

### **UST**

<sup>40</sup> Those who are not opposing us are trying to achieve the same goals that we are.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 9:41

#### ULT

<sup>41</sup> For whoever may give you a cup of water in the name because you are Christ's, truly I say to you that he may certainly not lose his reward.

## **UST**

<sup>41</sup> God will certainly reward those who help you in any way, even if they simply give you a cup of water to drink because you follow me, the Messiah!"

#### Mark 9:42

## **ULT**

<sup>42</sup> And whoever may cause one of these little ones who believe in me to stumble, it is better for him instead if a large millstone is put around his neck and he is thrown into the sea.

## **UST**

<sup>42</sup> Jesus also said, "But if you cause someone who believes in me to sin, God will severely punish you, even if that person is socially unimportant like this little child. If someone tied a heavy stone around your neck and threw you into the sea, it would be better for you than if God punished you for causing a person who believes in me to sin.

# What would be better for someone who causes a little one who believes in Jesus to stumble?

It would be better for that one if a millstone were tied around his neck and he was thrown into the sea.

## Mark 9:43

#### ULT

<sup>43</sup> And if your hand may cause you to stumble, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life maimed than, having two hands, to go away into Gehenna, into the unquenchable fire.

## **UST**

<sup>43</sup> So if you are wanting to use one of your hands to sin, do not use it! Even if you have to cut your hand off and throw it away to avoid sinning, do it! It is good that you live eternally, even though you lack one of your hands while you are here on earth. But it is not good that you sin and as a result God throws your whole body into hell. There the fires never go out!

#### **ULT**

44[2] [where their worm does not end, and the fire is not quenched.]

#### **UST**

44[1] [where worms never stop feeding on them, and the fire that burns them never goes out.]

<sup>45</sup> And if your foot may cause you to stumble, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life lame than, having two feet, to be thrown into Gehenna.

## **UST**

<sup>45</sup> If you are wanting to use one of your feet to sin, do not use it! Even if you have to cut off your foot to avoid sinning, do it! It is good that you live eternally, even though you lack one of your feet while you are here on earth. But it is not good that you sin and as a result for God to throw your whole body into hell.

#### **ULT**

**46**[3] [where their worm does not end, and the fire is not quenched.]

# **UST**

46[2] [where their worm does not die, and the fire is not put out.]

<sup>47</sup> And if your eye may cause you to stumble, throw it out. It is better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye than, having two eyes, to be thrown into Gehenna,

## **UST**

<sup>47</sup> If because of what you see you are tempted to sin, stop looking at those things! Even if you have to gouge out your eye and throw it away to avoid sinning, do it! It is better to have only one eye and for God to agree to rule over you, than him to throw you with two eyes into hell.

## What did Jesus say to do with your eye if it causes you to stumble?

Jesus said to tear out your eye if it causes you to stumble.

## Mark 9:48

## **ULT**

<sup>48</sup> where their worm does not end, and the fire is not quenched.

## **UST**

<sup>48</sup> In that place worms feed on the people there forever and the fires are never put out."

# What did Jesus say happens in hell?

Jesus said that in hell the worm does not die, and the fire is not put out.

## Mark 9:49

## **ULT**

<sup>49</sup> For everyone will be salted with fire.

## **UST**

<sup>49</sup> "For God will put fire on everyone, just like people put salt on their food.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 9:50

## **ULT**

 $^{50}$  Salt is good, but if the salt might become unsalty, with what will you season it? Have salt in yourselves, and be at peace with one another."

## What question did the Pharisees ask Jesus in order to test him?

The Pharisees asked Jesus if it was lawful for a husband to divorce his wife.

#### **ULT**

<sup>3</sup> But he, answering, said to them, "What did Moses command you?"

#### UST

<sup>3</sup> He answered them, "What did Moses command your ancestors about this?"

## Mark 10:4

## **ULT**

<sup>4</sup> And they said, "Moses permitted him to write a certificate of divorce and to send her away."

## **UST**

<sup>4</sup> One of them replied, "Moses permitted that a man may write out divorce papers so that he may send her away."

# What commandment had Moses given the Jews concerning divorce?

Moses had allowed a man to write a certificate of divorce and then send his wife away.

#### Mark 10:5

# **ULT**

<sup>5</sup> But Jesus said to them, "Because of your hardness of heart, he wrote this commandment to you.

## **UST**

<sup>5</sup> Jesus said to them, "Your ancestors stubbornly wanted to be able to send their wives away. That is why Moses wrote that law.

# Why had Moses given the Jews this commandment concerning divorce?

Moses had given this commandment to the Jews because of their hard hearts.

## Mark 10:6

### ULT

<sup>6</sup> But from the beginning of creation, 'He made them male and female.'

#### **UST**

<sup>6</sup> But when God first created people, it says, 'God made them male and female.'

# To what event in history did Jesus refer when telling the Pharisees about God's original design for marriage?

Jesus referred to the creation of male and female at the beginning when telling about God's original design for marriage.

## Mark 10:7

## **ULT**

<sup>7</sup> 'On account of this a man will leave his father and mother, <sup>[1]</sup>

## **UST**

<sup>7</sup> That explains why God said, 'When a man marries, he must leave his parents and join with his wife.

# What did Jesus say the two people, the man and his wife, become when they are married? (vv7-8)

Jesus said that the two become one flesh.

#### Mark 10:8

## **ULT**

<sup>8</sup> and the two will be one flesh.' So they are no longer two, but one flesh.

## **UST**

<sup>8</sup> They will become like one person. They will no longer be like two people, but like one.'

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 10:9

## **ULT**

<sup>9</sup> Therefore what God joined together, let man not separate."

## **UST**

<sup>9</sup> Because that is true, a man must not separate from his wife. God has joined them together and he wishes them to stay together!"

# What did Jesus say about what God joins together in marriage?

Jesus said that what God joins together, let no man tear apart.

## Mark 10:10

## **ULT**

<sup>10</sup> And in the house again, the disciples asked him about this.

## **UST**

<sup>10</sup> When Jesus and his apprentices were alone in a house, they asked him again about this.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 10:11

## **ULT**

<sup>11</sup> And he says to them, "Whoever might divorce his wife and might marry another commits adultery against her.

## **UST**

<sup>11</sup> He said to them, "God considers that any man who divorces his wife and marries another woman is committing adultery.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 10:12

## **ULT**

<sup>12</sup> And if she, having divorced her husband, might marry another, she commits adultery."

## **UST**

 $^{12}$  God also considers a woman who divorces her husband and marries another man to be committing adultery."

## Mark 10:13

## **ULT**

<sup>13</sup> And they were bringing little children to him so that he might touch them, but the disciples rebuked them.

## **UST**

<sup>13</sup> Now people were bringing children to Jesus so that he would touch and bless them. But his apprentices scolded those people.

# What was Jesus' reaction when the disciples rebuked those bringing little children to him? (vv13-14)

Jesus was angry with the disciples and told them to permit the little children to come to him.

#### Mark 10:14

## **ULT**

<sup>14</sup> But having seen this, Jesus was indignant and said to them, "Permit the little children to come to me, and do not prevent them, for of those such as these is the kingdom of God.

## **UST**

<sup>14</sup> When Jesus saw that, he became angry. He said to his apprentices, "Allow the children to come to me! Do not forbid them! It is people who have qualities like children over whom God will agree to rule.

#### Mark 10:15

## **ULT**

<sup>15</sup> Truly I say to you, whoever might not receive the kingdom of God as a little child may certainly not enter into it."

# **UST**

<sup>15</sup> Note this: Those who do not welcome God as their king in the same manner as children would, God will certainly not agree to rule over them."

# How did Jesus say the kingdom of God must be received in order to enter it?

Jesus said the kingdom of God must be received as a little child in order to enter it.

## Mark 10:16

## **ULT**

<sup>16</sup> And having taken them into his arms, he blessed them, placing {his} hands on them.

# **UST**

<sup>16</sup> Then he embraced the children. He also put his hands on them and called on God to do good to them.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 10:17

#### ULT

<sup>17</sup> And as he is proceeding on the journey, someone ran up to him and having knelt before him, was asking him, "Good Teacher, what might I do in order that I might inherit everlasting life?"

## **UST**

<sup>17</sup> As Jesus was starting to travel again with his apprentices, a man ran up to him. He knelt before Jesus and asked him, "Good teacher, what must I do to have eternal life?"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 10:18

#### ULT

<sup>18</sup> But Jesus said to him, "Why are you calling me good? No one {is} good except God alone.

## **UST**

<sup>18</sup> Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? Only God is good!

#### Mark 10:19

## **ULT**

<sup>19</sup> You have known the commandments: 'Do not kill, do not commit adultery, do not steal, do not testify falsely, do not defraud, honor your father and mother.'"

## **UST**

<sup>19</sup> But to answer your question, you know the commandments of Moses: 'Do not murder anyone, do not commit adultery, do not steal, do not lie about others, do not cheat anyone, and honor your father and mother'."

## What did Jesus first tell the man he must do to inherit eternal life?

Jesus told the man he must not kill, not commit adultery, not steal, not testify falsely, not defraud, and must honor his father and mother.

#### Mark 10:20

## **ULT**

<sup>20</sup> But he was saying to him, "Teacher, all these things I have obeyed from my youth."

## **UST**

<sup>38</sup> But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup which I drink or to be baptized with the baptism with which I am being baptized?"

# What did Jesus send two of his disciples to do in the village opposite them?

Some people asked the disciples what they were doing, so they spoke to the people as Jesus told them, and the people let them go their way.

<sup>6</sup> They told them what Jesus had said. So the people permitted them to take the donkey.

The people were shouting that the kingdom of their father David was coming.

## **UST**

<sup>17</sup> Then as he taught those people, he said to them, "It is written in the scriptures that God said, 'I want my house to be a house where people from all nations can pray,' but you bandits have made it like a cave where robbers hide."

# What did Jesus say the temple was supposed to be, according to Scripture?

Jesus said that the temple was supposed to be a house of prayer for all the nations.

# What did Jesus say the chief priests and scribes had made the temple?

Jesus said they had made the temple a den of robbers.

## Mark 11:18

## **ULT**

<sup>18</sup> And the chief priests and the scribes heard this, and they were seeking a way they might kill him, for they feared him because the entire crowd was amazed at his teaching.

## **UST**

<sup>18</sup> The chief priests and the men who taught the Jewish laws later heard about what he had done. They were planning how they might kill him, but they feared him because they realized that the crowd was amazed at what he was teaching.

## What were the chief priests and scribes trying to do to Jesus?

The chief priests and scribes were trying to kill Jesus.

## Mark 11:19

#### **ULT**

<sup>19</sup> And when evening came, they were departing from the city.

#### UST

<sup>19</sup> Every evening Jesus and his apprentices would leave the city.

## Mark 11:20

## **ULT**

<sup>20</sup> And passing by in the morning, they saw the fig tree had been withered from the roots.

## **UST**

<sup>20</sup> The next morning while they were going along the road toward Jerusalem, they saw that the fig tree that Jesus had cursed had withered completely.

# What happened to the fig tree to which Jesus had spoken?

The fig tree to which Jesus had spoken withered away to its roots.

## Mark 11:21

# **ULT**

<sup>21</sup> And having been reminded, Peter says to him, "Rabbi, behold! The fig tree that you cursed has been withered away."

#### **UST**

<sup>21</sup> Peter remembered what Jesus had said to the fig tree and he said to Jesus, "Teacher, look! The fig tree that you cursed has withered!"

<sup>27</sup> Jesus and his apprentices arrived in the temple courtyard in Jerusalem again. While Jesus was walking there, a group consisting of chief priests, some men who taught the Jewish laws, and elders came to him.

# In the temple, what did the chief priests, scribes, and elders want to know from Jesus? (vv27-28)

They wanted to know by what authority he did the things he was doing.

## **ULT**

<sup>32</sup> But we might say, 'From men,'..." (They were afraid of the crowd, for they all held that John really was a prophet.)

## **UST**

<sup>32</sup> On the other hand, if we say that it was people who authorized John, then what will happen to us?" They were afraid to say that about John, because they knew that the people would be very angry with them. They knew that all the people truly believed that John was a prophet whom God had sent.

# Why did the chief priests, scribes, and elders not want to answer that John's baptism was from men?

They did not want to give this answer because they feared the people, who all believed that John was a prophet.

## Mark 11:33

## **ULT**

 $^{33}$  And answering Jesus, they say, "We do not know." And Jesus says to them, "Neither do I say to you by what authority I do these things."

11:26 <sup>[1]</sup>

11:31 [2], but the best manuscripts include it.

## **UST**

<sup>33</sup> So they answered Jesus, "We do not know from whom John received his authority." Then Jesus said to them, "Because you did not answer my question, I will not tell you who authorized me to do those things here yesterday."

## Mark 12

#### Mark 12:1

## **ULT**

<sup>1</sup> And he began to speak to them in parables: "A man planted a vineyard, and put a hedge around it, and dug a pit for a winepress, and built a watchtower, and leased it to vine growers, and went away on a journey.

## **UST**

<sup>1</sup> Then Jesus began to tell the Jewish leaders a parable. He said, "A certain man planted a vineyard. He built a fence around it. He made a stone tank to collect the grape juice. He also built a tower for someone to sit in to guard his vineyard. He leased the vineyard to some farmers to cultivate it, and then he went away to another country.

# After building and leasing the vineyard, what did the owner do?

After building and leasing the vineyard, the owner went away on a journey.

## Mark 12:2

## **ULT**

<sup>2</sup> And at the season, he sent a slave to the vine growers so that he might receive from the vine growers from the fruit of the vineyard.

## **UST**

<sup>2</sup> When the time came to harvest the grapes, the owner of the vineyard sent a servant to the men who had taken a lease on his vineyard because he wanted to receive from them his share of the grapes that the vineyard had produced.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 12:3

## **ULT**

<sup>3</sup> But having seized him, they beat him, and sent him away with nothing.

## **UST**

<sup>3</sup> But when the servant arrived, they grabbed him and beat the servant, and they did not give him any fruit. Then they sent him away.

## Mark 12:4

## **ULT**

<sup>4</sup> And again he sent to them another slave, and that one, they wounded in the head and treated shamefully.

## **UST**

<sup>4</sup> Later the owner sent another servant to them. But they beat that one on the head and they hurt him terribly, for which they should be ashamed.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 12:5

## **ULT**

<sup>5</sup> And he sent another, and that one they killed, and many others—beating these, but killing those.

## **UST**

<sup>5</sup> Later the owner sent still another servant. That man the farmers killed. They also mistreated many other servants whom he sent. Some they beat and some they killed.

# What did the vine dressers do to the many servants that the owner sent to receive the fruit of the vineyard?

The vine dressers beat some and killed some of the many servants.

## Mark 12:6

#### ULT

<sup>6</sup> Having one more, a beloved son, he sent him to them last of all, saying, 'They will respect my son.'

#### **UST**

<sup>6</sup> The owner still had one other person with him, his son, whom he loved very much. So he sent his son to them because he thought that they would respect him.

## Who did the owner send last to the vine dressers?

The owner sent his beloved son last.

## Mark 12:7

## **ULT**

<sup>7</sup> But those vine growers said to each other, 'This is the heir. Come, let us kill him, and the inheritance will be ours.'

## **UST**

<sup>7</sup> But when the farmers saw his son coming, they said to each other, 'Look! Here comes the owner's son, who will some day inherit the vineyard! So let us kill him in order that this vineyard will be ours!'

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 12:8

#### ULT

<sup>8</sup> And having seized him, they killed him, and threw him outside of the vineyard.

#### **UST**

<sup>8</sup> They seized the owner's son and killed him. Then they threw his body outside the vineyard.

# What did the vine dressers do with the one sent last by the owner?

The vine dressers seized him, killed him, and threw him out of the vineyard.

#### Mark 12:9

## **ULT**

<sup>9</sup> Therefore, what will the lord of the vineyard do? He will come and destroy the vine growers and will give the vineyard to others.

# **UST**

<sup>9</sup> So do you know what the owner of the vineyard will do? He will come and kill those evil men who had taken a lease on his vineyard. Then he will arrange for other people to take care of it.

## What will the owner of the vineyard do to the vine dressers?

The owner of the vineyard will come and destroy the vine dressers and give the vineyard to others.

## Mark 12:10

## **ULT**

<sup>10</sup> And have you not read this scripture? 'The stone which the builders rejected, this has become the head of the corner.

## **UST**

<sup>10</sup> Now think carefully about these words, which you have read in the scriptures: "The men who were building the building refused to use a certain stone. But the Lord has put that same stone in its proper place, and it has become the most important stone in the building!

# In the scripture, what happens to the stone which the builders rejected?

The stone which the builders rejected has been made the cornerstone.

## Mark 12:11

# **ULT**

11 This came about from the Lord, and it is marvelous in our eyes."

# **UST**

<sup>11</sup> The Lord has done this, and we marvel as we look at it."

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 12:12

#### **ULT**

<sup>12</sup> And they were seeking to seize him, but they feared the crowd, for they knew that he spoke this parable against them. And having left him, they went away.

#### **UST**

<sup>12</sup> Then the Jewish leaders realized that Jesus was accusing them when he told this story about what those wicked people did. So they wanted to arrest him. But they were afraid of what the crowds of people would do if they did that. So they left him and went away.

## Mark 12:13

## **ULT**

<sup>13</sup> And they send some of the Pharisees and the Herodians to him in order to trap him with a word.

## **UST**

<sup>13</sup> The Jewish leaders sent to Jesus some Pharisees and some members of the party that supported Herod Antipas. They wanted to trick Jesus; they wanted to make him say something wrong so they could show people that he taught wrong things so they could bring charges against him.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 12:14

#### **ULT**

<sup>14</sup> And having come, they say to him, "Teacher, we know that you are truthful, and it is not a concern to you about anyone, for you do not look at the face of men, but, you teach the way of God according to truth. Is it lawful to give taxes to Caesar or not? Should we give, or should we not give?"

## **UST**

<sup>14</sup> After they arrived, they said to him, "Teacher, we know that you teach the truth. We also know that you are not concerned about what people say about you, even if an important person does not like what you say. Instead, you teach truthfully what God wants us to do. So tell us what you think about this matter: Is it right that we pay taxes to the Roman government, or not? Should we pay the taxes, or should we not pay them?"

## What question did the Pharisees and some of the Herodians ask Jesus?

They asked him if it was lawful to pay taxes to Caesar or not.

## Mark 12:15

#### ULT

<sup>15</sup> But he, knowing their hypocrisy, said to them, "Why do you test me? Bring to me a denarius so that I might look at it."

#### **UST**

<sup>15</sup> Jesus knew that they did not really want to know what God wanted them to do. So he said to them, "I know that you are just trying to make me say something wrong for which you can accuse me. But I will answer your question anyway. Bring me a coin so that I might look at it."

## Mark 12:16

## **ULT**

<sup>16</sup> And they brought one, and he says to them, "Whose {is} this image and inscription?" And they said to him, "Caesar's."

## **UST**

<sup>16</sup> After they had brought him a coin, he asked them, "Whose picture is on this coin? And whose name is on it?" They replied, "It is a picture and the name of Caesar."

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 12:17

## **ULT**

<sup>17</sup> And Jesus said to them, "The things of Caesar, give back to Caesar, and the things of God, to God." And they were marveling at him.

## **UST**

<sup>17</sup> Jesus said to them, "That is correct, so give to Caesar what belongs to him, and give to God what belongs to him." They were completely amazed by what he said.

# How did Jesus answer their question?

Jesus said they should give to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God, the things that are God's.

## Mark 12:18

# **ULT**

<sup>18</sup> And Sadducees, who say there is no resurrection, come to him and are questioning him, saying,

# **UST**

<sup>18</sup> Men who belong to the group of Sadducees deny what other Jews believe, that people become alive again after they die. Some Sadducees came to Jesus and asked him,

#### In what did the Sadducees not believe?

The Sadducees did not believe in the resurrection.

## Mark 12:19

## **ULT**

<sup>19</sup> "Teacher, Moses wrote to us, 'If someone's brother might die and might leave behind a wife, but might not leave a child, that his brother should take the wife and should raise up offspring to his brother.'

## **UST**

<sup>19</sup> "Teacher, Moses wrote for us Jews that if a man's brother dies and leaves a wife but no children, his brother should marry the widow and raise up a descendant for his brother.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 12:20

## **ULT**

<sup>20</sup> There were seven brothers, and the first took a wife and dying, did not leave offspring,

#### **UST**

<sup>20</sup> So here is an example. There were seven brothers in one family. The oldest one married a woman, but he and his wife did not bear any children. Then he later died.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 12:21

## **ULT**

<sup>21</sup> and the second took her and died, not having left offspring, and the third likewise.

#### **UST**

<sup>21</sup> The second brother also married that woman, but he, too, did not bear any children. Then he later died. The third brother did like his other brothers did. But he also did not bear any children, and later died.

## Mark 12:22

## **ULT**

<sup>22</sup> And the seven did not leave offspring. Last of all, the woman also died.

## **UST**

<sup>22</sup> Eventually all seven brothers married that woman one by one, but no one had any children, and one by one they died. Afterwards the woman died, too.

# In the story told by the Sadducees, how many husbands did the woman have?

The woman had seven husbands.

#### Mark 12:23

## **ULT**

<sup>23</sup> In the resurrection, when they may rise again, of which of them will she be a wife? For the seven had her as wife."

#### **UST**

<sup>23</sup> Now on the day when people will become alive again after they die, whose wife will that woman be? Keep in mind that she had been married to all seven brothers!"

#### What guestion did the Sadducees ask Jesus about the woman?

They asked which of the men would be the woman's husband in the resurrection.

#### Mark 12:24

## **ULT**

<sup>24</sup> Jesus said to them, "Are you not being led astray because of this, not knowing the Scriptures nor the power of God?

# **UST**

<sup>24</sup> Jesus replied to them, "You are certainly wrong. You do not know what the scriptures teach about this. You also do not understand God's power to make people alive again.

## What reason did Jesus give the Sadducees for their error?

Jesus said that the Sadducees did not know the scriptures nor the power of God.

## Mark 12:25

## **ULT**

<sup>25</sup> For when they may rise from the dead, they neither marry nor are given in marriage, but they are like angels in the heavens.

## **UST**

<sup>25</sup> That woman will not be the wife of any of those brothers, because when people become alive again, instead of men having wives and women having husbands, they will be like the angels in heaven. Angels do not marry.

# What was Jesus' answer to the Sadducees' question about the woman?

Jesus said that in the resurrection, men and women will not marry, but will be like angels.

#### Mark 12:26

# **ULT**

<sup>26</sup> But concerning the dead that are raised, did you not read in the book of Moses, at the bush, how God spoke to him, saying, 'I am the God of Abraham and the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob'?

## **UST**

<sup>26</sup> But let me talk about people becoming alive again after they die. In the book that Moses wrote, he wrote about people who have died; I am sure that you have read it. When Moses was looking at the bush that was burning, God said to him, 'I am the God whom Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob worship.'

## How did Jesus show from the scriptures that there is a resurrection? (vv26-27)

Jesus quoted from the book of Moses, where God says that he is the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob - all who must then be still alive.

## Mark 12:27

## **ULT**

<sup>27</sup> He is not the God of the dead, but of the living. You are being quite deceived."

# **UST**

<sup>27</sup> Now it is not dead people who worship God. It is living people who worship him. So when you say that dead people do not become alive again, you are very wrong."

## Mark 12:28

## **ULT**

<sup>28</sup> And one of the scribes, having come up, having heard them discussing this together, having seen that he answered them well, he asked him, "Which is the first commandment of all?"

## **UST**

<sup>28</sup> A man who taught the Jewish laws heard their discussion. He knew that Jesus had answered the Sadducees' question very well. So he stepped forward and asked Jesus, "Which commandment is the most important?"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 12:29

## ULT

<sup>29</sup> Jesus answered, "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is one.

## **UST**

<sup>29</sup> Jesus answered, "The most important commandment is this: 'Listen, O Israel! The Lord our God is one Lord.

# What commandment did Jesus say is most important? (vv29-30)

Jesus said that to love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength is the most important commandment.

## Mark 12:30

#### ULT

<sup>30</sup> And you will love the Lord your God from your whole heart, and from your whole soul, and from your whole mind, and from your whole strength.'

# **UST**

<sup>30</sup> You must love the Lord your God in all that you want and feel, in all that you think, and in all that you do!'

## Mark 12:31

## **ULT**

 $^{31}$  The second  $\{is\}$  this, 'You will love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other greater commandment than these."

## **UST**

<sup>31</sup> The next most important commandment is: 'You must love the people around you as much as you love yourself.' No other commandment is more important than these two!"

## What commandment did Jesus say is second?

Jesus said that to love your neighbor as yourself is the second commandment.

# Mark 12:32

## **ULT**

<sup>32</sup> And the scribe said to him, "Good, Teacher! According to truth you have said that he is one, and there is no other besides him.

## **UST**

<sup>32</sup> The man said to Jesus, "Teacher, you have answered well. You correctly said that God is the only God and that there is no other God.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 12:33

# **ULT**

<sup>33</sup> And to love him from the whole heart and from the whole understanding and from the whole strength, and to love the neighbor as oneself, is even more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices."

#### **UST**

<sup>33</sup> You have also said correctly that we should love God in all that we want and feel, in all that we think, and in all that we do. And you have said correctly that we must love people with whom we come in contact as much as we love ourselves. And you have also correctly said that doing these things pleases God more than burning food or animals as an offering or giving other sacrifices."

## Mark 12:34

## **ULT**

<sup>34</sup> And Jesus, having seen him, that he had answered wisely, said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." And no one any longer was daring to question him.

## **UST**

<sup>34</sup> Jesus realized that this man had answered wisely. So he said to him, "You are close to the point where God will agree to rule over you." After that, the Jewish leaders were afraid to ask him any more questions like that to try to trick him.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 12:35

#### ULT

<sup>35</sup> And answering, Jesus, teaching in the temple, said, "How do the scribes say that the Christ is the son of David?

#### **UST**

<sup>35</sup> Later, while Jesus was teaching in the temple area, he said to the people, "How is it that those who teach the law say—and they are correct in saying—that the Messiah is a descendant of King David?

# What question did Jesus ask the scribes about David? (vv35-37)

Jesus asked how David could call the Christ Lord when the Christ is the son of David.

#### Mark 12:36

#### ULT

<sup>36</sup> David himself, in the Holy Spirit, said, 'The Lord said to my Lord, "Sit at my right hand, until I may place your enemies under your feet."'

# **UST**

<sup>36</sup> The Holy Spirit caused David to say about the Messiah, 'God said to my Lord, "Sit here beside me at my right hand, in the place where I will highly honor you above everyone else! Sit here while I completely defeat your enemies!"'

## Mark 12:37

## **ULT**

<sup>37</sup> David himself calls him 'Lord,' and how is he his son?" And a large crowd was listening to him gladly.

## **UST**

<sup>37</sup> In this Psalm of David he refers to the Messiah as 'Lord.' But how—as the teachers of the law correctly say —can the Messiah also be a descendant of David?" Many people listened to him gladly as he taught these things.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 12:38

## **ULT**

<sup>38</sup> And in his teaching, he was saying, "Watch out for the scribes, who are desiring to walk in long robes, and greetings in the marketplaces,

## **UST**

<sup>38</sup> While Jesus was teaching the people, he said to them, "Beware that you do not act like the men who teach our laws. They like people to honor them, so they put on long robes and walk around in order to show people how important they are. They also like people to greet them respectfully in the marketplaces.

# What did Jesus tell the people to beware of concerning the scribes? (vv38-40)

Jesus said that the scribes desire to be honored by men, but they devour widows' houses, and make long prayers for people to see.

#### Mark 12:39

## **ULT**

<sup>39</sup> and the chief seats in the synagogues, and chief places at the banquets.

## **UST**

<sup>39</sup> They like to sit in the most important seats in the synagogues. At festivals, they like to sit in the seats where the most honored people sit.

## Mark 12:40

## **ULT**

 $^{40}$  They are devouring the houses of the widows, and as a pretext offer long prayers. These will receive greater condemnation."

## **UST**

<sup>40</sup> They swindle the houses and property of widows by cheating them. Then they pretend that they are good by praying long prayers in public. God will certainly punish them severely!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 12:41

## **ULT**

<sup>41</sup> And having sat down across from the temple offering box, he was watching how the crowd puts money into the offering box. And many rich people were putting in much.

## **UST**

<sup>41</sup> Later, Jesus sat down in the temple area opposite the boxes in which people put offerings. As he was sitting there, he watched as they put money in one of the boxes. Many rich people put in large amounts of money.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 12:42

## **ULT**

<sup>42</sup> And having come, one poor widow put in two mites, which are a quadrans.

#### **UST**

<sup>42</sup> Then a poor widow came along and dropped in two small copper coins, which had a very small value.

## Mark 12:43

## **ULT**

<sup>43</sup> And having called his disciples, he said to them, "Truly I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all of those putting into the offering box.

## **UST**

<sup>43-44</sup> Jesus gathered his disciples around him and said to them, "The truth is that those other people have a lot of money, but they gave only a small part of it. But this woman, who is very poor, has put in all the money that she had to pay for the things she needed for today. So this poor widow has put more money into the box than all the others!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 12:44

#### **ULT**

<sup>44</sup> For all of them gave from their abundance, but she, from her poverty, put in everything, as much as she had, all of her livelihood."

## **UST**

<sup>43-44</sup> Jesus gathered his disciples around him and said to them, "The truth is that those other people have a lot of money, but they gave only a small part of it. But this woman, who is very poor, has put in all the money that she had to pay for the things she needed for today. So this poor widow has put more money into the box than all the others!"

# Why did Jesus say that the poor widow had put in more than all who contributed to the offering box?

Jesus said she had contributed more because she gave out of her poverty while the others gave out of their abundance.

## Mark 13

#### Mark 13:1

## **ULT**

<sup>1</sup> And as he is walking away from the temple, one of his disciples says to him, "Teacher, look! What manner of stones and what manner of buildings!"

## **UST**

<sup>1</sup> While Jesus was leaving the temple area, one of his apprentices said to him, "Teacher, look at how marvelous these huge cut blocks of stone in the walls are and how wonderful these buildings are!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 13:2

#### ULT

<sup>2</sup> And Jesus said to him, "Do you see these great buildings? Stone upon stone may certainly not be left here, which may certainly not be torn down."

## **UST**

<sup>2</sup> Jesus said to him, "Yes, these buildings that you are looking at are wonderful, but I want to tell you something about them. They will be destroyed completely. No block of stone here in this temple area will remain on top of another block."

What did Jesus say would happen to the wonderful stones and buildings of the temple? Jesus said that not one stone would be left on another which would not be torn down.

## Mark 13:3

#### **ULT**

<sup>3</sup> And as he is sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, and James, and John, and Andrew were asking him by himself,

#### **UST**

<sup>3</sup> After they arrived at the Mount of Olives across the valley from the temple, Jesus sat down. When Peter, James, John, and Andrew were alone with him, they asked him,

## Mark 13:4

## **ULT**

<sup>4</sup> "Tell us, when will these things be? And what {is} the sign when all these things are about to be fulfilled?"

## **UST**

<sup>4</sup> "Tell us, when will these things that God has planned happen? What will happen to show us these things are about to take place?"

# What question did the disciples then ask Jesus?

The disciples asked Jesus when these things would happen and what would be the sign.

## Mark 13:5

# **ULT**

<sup>5</sup> Now Jesus began to say to them, "Be careful that no one might deceive you.

## **UST**

<sup>5</sup> Jesus replied to them, "Beware that no one deceive you concerning what will happen!

# About what did Jesus say the disciples must be careful? (vv5-6)

Jesus said the disciples must be careful that no one lead them astray.

## Mark 13:6

## **ULT**

<sup>6</sup> Many will come in my name, saying, 'I am!' and they will deceive many.

# **UST**

<sup>6</sup> Many people will come and say that I sent them. They will say, 'I am the Messiah!' They will deceive many people.

#### Mark 13:7

## **ULT**

<sup>7</sup> But when you might hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not worry; it is necessary for it to happen, but {it is} not yet the end.

## **UST**

<sup>7</sup> When you hear the sound of soldiers fighting battles, or when you hear news about wars that are far away, do not be troubled. These things will definitely happen. But when they do happen, do not think that God will finish all that he has planned at that time!

# What did Jesus say would be the beginnings of birth pains? (vv7-8)

Jesus said the beginning of birth pains would be wars, rumors of wars, earthquakes, and famines.

#### Mark 13:8

# **ULT**

<sup>8</sup> For nation will rise against nation and kingdom against kingdom. There will be earthquakes in various place; there will be famines. These are the beginning of birth pains.

#### **UST**

<sup>8</sup> Groups who live in various countries will fight each other, and various kings and leaders will fight each other. There will also be earthquakes in various places, and there will be famines. Yet, when these things happen, people will have only just begun to suffer. These first things that they suffer will be like the first pains a woman suffers who is about to bear a child. They will suffer much more after that.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 13:9

#### ULT

<sup>9</sup> But you, watch yourselves! They will deliver you to councils and to synagogues; you will be beaten and you will be made to stand before governors and kings because of me, for a testimony to them.

#### **UST**

<sup>9</sup> Be ready for what people will do to you at that time. They will arrest you and put you on trial before groups of leaders. People will beat you in various synagogues. They will put you on trial in the presence of high government authorities. As a result, you will be able to tell them about me.

# What did Jesus say would happen to the disciples?

Jesus said that the disciples would be delivered to councils, beaten in synagogues, and would stand before governors and kings as a testimony.

#### Mark 13:10

## **ULT**

<sup>10</sup> And first, it is necessary for the gospel to be proclaimed to all the nations.

## **UST**

<sup>10</sup> My followers must proclaim the good news to people in all nations before God finishes everything that he has planned.

# What did Jesus say must happen first?

Jesus said the gospel must be preached to all the nations first.

## Mark 13:11

# **ULT**

<sup>11</sup> And when they might lead you away, handing you over, do not worry about what you should say. But whatever might be given to you in that hour, speak that; for you will not be the ones speaking, but the Holy Spirit.

## **UST**

<sup>11</sup> When people arrest you, do not worry about what you will say. Instead, say what God puts into your mind at that time. Then it will not be just you who will be speaking. It will be the Holy Spirit who will be speaking through you.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 13:12

#### ULT

<sup>12</sup> And brother will deliver brother to death, and a father, {his} child. And children will rise up against parents and put them to death.

# **UST**

<sup>12</sup> Some brothers and sisters will betray other brothers and sisters. Some fathers will betray their children. Some children will betray their parents so that government officials will kill their parents.

# What did Jesus say would happen between family members?

Jesus said that one family member would deliver up another family member to death.

## Mark 13:13

## **ULT**

<sup>13</sup> And you will be hated by everyone because of my name. But the one who endured to the end, that one will be saved.

## **UST**

<sup>13</sup> Most people will hate you because you believe in me. But all you who continue to trust in me until your life is finished will be saved.

## Who did Jesus say would be saved?

Jesus said that whoever endures to the end would be saved.

## Mark 13:14

## **ULT**

<sup>14</sup> But when you might see the abomination of desolation standing where it should not be (let the reader understand), then let those {who are} in Judea flee to the mountains,

## **UST**

<sup>14</sup> During that time the detestable thing will enter the temple. It will defile the temple and cause people to abandon it. When you see it where it should not be, you should run away quickly! (May everyone who is reading this pay attention to this warning!) At that time those people who are in the district of Judea should flee to higher hills.

# What did Jesus say those in Judea should do when they see the abomination of desolation?

Jesus said that those in Judea should flee to the mountains when they see the abomination of desolation.

#### Mark 13:15

#### **ULT**

<sup>15</sup> but let the one on the housetop not go down nor go in to take anything from his house,

## **UST**

<sup>15</sup> Those people who are outside their houses should not enter their houses in order to get anything.

## Mark 13:16

## **ULT**

<sup>16</sup> and let the one in the field not turn back to the things behind to get his cloak.

## **UST**

<sup>16</sup> Those who are working in a field should not return to their houses in order to get additional clothes.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 13:17

#### ULT

<sup>17</sup> But woe to those having in the womb, and to those nursing in those days!

#### **UST**

<sup>17</sup> I feel very sorry for women who will be pregnant and women who will be nursing their babies in those days, because it will be very difficult for them to run away!

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 13:18

#### ULT

<sup>18</sup> But pray that it might not happen in winter.

## **UST**

<sup>18-19</sup> In those days people will suffer very severely. People have never suffered like that since the time when God first created the world until now; and people will not suffer that way again. So pray that this painful time will not happen in winter, when it will be hard to travel.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 13:19

## **ULT**

<sup>19</sup> For there will be in those days tribulation—such as this kind has not happened from the beginning of creation which God created until now, and may certainly not happen.

# **UST**

<sup>18-19</sup> In those days people will suffer very severely. People have never suffered like that since the time when God first created the world until now; and people will not suffer that way again. So pray that this painful time will not happen in winter, when it will be hard to travel.

#### Mark 13:20

## **ULT**

<sup>20</sup> And if the Lord did not cut short the days, no flesh would be saved. But for the sake of the elect whom he chose, he cut short the days.

# **UST**

<sup>20</sup> If the Lord God had not decided that he would shorten that time when people suffer so much, everyone would die. But he has decided to shorten that time because he is concerned about the people whom he has chosen.

# What did Jesus say the Lord would do for the sake of the elect, so that they would be saved?

Jesus said the Lord would shorten the days of tribulation for the sake of the elect.

#### Mark 13:21

## **ULT**

<sup>21</sup> And then if anyone says to you, 'Look, here {is} the Christ! Look, there!' do not believe it.

#### **UST**

<sup>21-22</sup> At that time people will falsely say that they are the Messiah. And some will appear claiming to be prophets from God. Then they will perform many kinds of miracles. They will even try to deceive the people whom God has chosen. So at that time if someone says to you, 'Look, here is the Messiah!', or if someone says, 'Look, there he is!', do not believe it!

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 13:22

#### ULT

<sup>22</sup> For false Christs and false prophets will be raised up and will give signs and wonders, to deceive, if possible, the elect.

## **UST**

<sup>21-22</sup> At that time people will falsely say that they are the Messiah. And some will appear claiming to be prophets from God. Then they will perform many kinds of miracles. They will even try to deceive the people whom God has chosen. So at that time if someone says to you, 'Look, here is the Messiah!', or if someone says, 'Look, there he is!', do not believe it!

## Who did Jesus say would arise to deceive people?

Jesus said that false Christs and false prophets would arise to deceive people.

## Mark 13:23

## **ULT**

<sup>23</sup> But you, watch out! Behold, I have told you everything beforehand.

## **UST**

<sup>23</sup> Be alert! Remember that I have warned you about all this before it happens!

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 13:24

## ULT

<sup>24</sup> But in those days, after that tribulation, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light;

## **UST**

<sup>24</sup> After the time when people suffer like that, God will cause the sun to become dark, and the moon will not shine;

# What will happen to the powers in the heavens after the tribulation of those days? (vv24-25)

The sun and moon will be darkened, the stars will fall from the sky, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken.

# Mark 13:25

## **ULT**

<sup>25</sup> and the stars will be falling from the sky, and the powers that are in the heavens will be shaken.

## **UST**

<sup>25</sup> God will cause the stars to fall from the sky, and all the things in the sky to shake out of their place.

## Mark 13:26

## **ULT**

<sup>26</sup> And then they will see the Son of Man coming in clouds with great power and glory.

## **UST**

<sup>26</sup> Then people will see me, the Son of Man, coming through the clouds powerfully and gloriously.

# What will the people see in the clouds?

They will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory.

#### Mark 13:27

## **ULT**

<sup>27</sup> And then he will send the angels and he will gather together his elect from the four winds, from the end of the earth to the end of the sky.

## **UST**

<sup>27</sup> Then I will send out my angels so they can gather together the people whom God has chosen from everywhere, from the most remote places on earth.

# What will the Son of Man do when he comes?

The Son of Man will gather his elect from the ends of the earth and the sky.

## Mark 13:28

## **ULT**

<sup>28</sup> Now learn the parable from the fig tree. When already its branch might become tender and might put out {its} leaves, you know that summer is near.

## **UST**

<sup>28</sup> Now I want you to learn something from how fig trees grow. When their branches become tender and their leaves begin to sprout, you know that summer is near for us.

## Mark 13:29

## **ULT**

<sup>29</sup> So also, when you see these things happening, know that he is near, at the doors.

## **UST**

<sup>29</sup> Similarly, when you see what I have just described happening, you yourselves will know that it is very near the time for me to return. It will be as though I am already at the door.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 13:30

## **ULT**

<sup>30</sup> Truly I say to you, this generation will certainly not pass away until all these things occur.

## **UST**

<sup>30</sup> Keep this in mind: this generation will not die until these things take place.

# What did Jesus say would not pass away until all of these things occurred?

Jesus said that this generation would not pass away until all of these things occurred.

# Mark 13:31

# **ULT**

<sup>31</sup> The heaven and the earth will pass away, but my words will certainly not pass away.

## **UST**

<sup>31</sup> You can be certain that these things that I have prophesied will happen. The earth and what is in the sky will one day be destroyed, but these things that I have told you will certainly happen.

## What did Jesus say would never pass away?

Jesus said that his words would never pass away.

## Mark 13:32

## **ULT**

<sup>32</sup> But concerning that day or the hour, no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, except the Father.

# **UST**

<sup>32</sup> But no one knows the exact time when I will return. The angels in heaven also do not know. Even I, God's Son, do not know. Only my Father knows.

# When did Jesus say all these things would happen?

Jesus said that no one knows the day or hour, except the Father.

# Mark 13:33

## **ULT**

<sup>33</sup> Be alert! Watch and pray, because you do not know when the time is.

#### **UST**

<sup>33</sup> So be ready! Always be alert, because you do not know when that time will come when God will cause all these events to happen!

# What command did Jesus give his disciples regarding his coming?

Jesus told his disciples to be alert and watch.

## Mark 13:34

# **ULT**

<sup>34</sup> As a man on a journey, having left his house, and having given to each of his servants authority over his work, and he commanded the door-keeper that he would stay alert;

# **UST**

<sup>34</sup> When a man who wants to travel to a distant place is about to leave his house, he tells his servants that they should manage the house. He tells each one what he should do. Then he tells the doorkeeper to be ready for his return.

## Mark 13:35

## **ULT**

<sup>35</sup> therefore, stay alert, because you do not know when the lord of the house is coming—whether evening, or midnight, or at rooster crowing, or at dawn—

# **UST**

<sup>35</sup> That man must always be ready, because he does not know whether his master will return in the evening, at midnight, when the rooster crows, or at dawn. Similarly, you also must always be ready, because you do not know when I will return.

# What command did Jesus give his disciples regarding his coming?

Jesus told his disciples to be alert and watch.

# Mark 13:36

# **ULT**

<sup>36</sup> lest, having come suddenly, he might find you sleeping.

# **UST**

<sup>36</sup> May it not happen that when I come suddenly, I will find that you are not ready!

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 13:37

#### **ULT**

<sup>37</sup> But what I say to you I say to everyone: Stay alert!"

# **UST**

<sup>37</sup> These words that I am saying to you apprentices I am saying to everyone: Always be ready!"

# What command did Jesus give his disciples regarding his coming?

Jesus told his disciples to be alert and watch.

## Mark 14

# Mark 14:1

# **ULT**

<sup>1</sup> Now the Passover and the Festival of Unleavened Bread was in two days, and the chief priests and the scribes were seeking how, having seized him by stealth, they might kill him.

# **UST**

<sup>1</sup> It was only two days before the people would begin to celebrate the week-long festival that they called the Passover. During those days they also celebrated the festival which they called Unleavened Bread. The chief priests and the men who taught the Jewish laws were planning how they could arrest Jesus secretly and put him to death.

# What were the chief priests and scribes considering how to do?

They were considering how to stealthily arrest Jesus and then kill him.

# Mark 14:2

# **ULT**

<sup>2</sup> For they were saying, "Not during the festival, so that there will not be a riot of the people."

# **UST**

<sup>2</sup> But they were saying to one another, "We must not do it during the festival because if we do it then, the people will be very angry with us and riot!"

# Why did the chief priests and scribes not want to act during the Feast of Unleavened Bread?

They were worried that a riot would arise among the people.

#### Mark 14:3

## **ULT**

<sup>3</sup> And while he is in Bethany in the house of Simon the leper, while he is reclining to eat, a woman came, having an alabaster jar of very costly annointing-oil of pure nard. Having broken the jar, she poured it on his head.

## **UST**

<sup>3</sup> Jesus was at Bethany town in the house of Simon, whom Jesus had healed from leprosy. While they were eating, a woman came to him. She was carrying a stone jar that contained expensive, fragrant perfume called nard. She opened the jar and then poured all the perfume on Jesus' head.

# What did a woman do to Jesus at the house of Simon the leper?

A woman broke a vial of costly liquid and poured it on Jesus' head.

# Mark 14:4

## **ULT**

<sup>4</sup> But there were some who are angry within themselves, "For what has this waste of the anointing oil happened?

# **UST**

<sup>4</sup> Some of the people who were present became angry and said to themselves, "It is terrible that she wasted that perfume!

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 14:5

## **ULT**

<sup>5</sup> For this perfume was able to be sold for more than 300 denarii, and given to the poor." And they were scolding her.

#### **UST**

<sup>5</sup> It could have been sold for almost a year's wages and then the money could have been given to poor people!" So they scolded her.

# For what were some rebuking the woman?

Some were rebuking the woman for not selling the perfume and giving the money to the poor.

## Mark 14:6

## **ULT**

<sup>6</sup> But Jesus said, "Leave her alone. Why are you causing trouble for her? She did a good work for me.

# **UST**

<sup>6</sup> But Jesus said, "Stop scolding her! She has done to me what I consider to be very appropriate. So you should not bother her!

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 14:7

## **ULT**

<sup>7</sup> For you always have the poor with yourselves, and whenever you might desire you are able to do good to them, but you do not always have me.

# **UST**

<sup>7</sup> You will always have poor people among you. So you can help them whenever you want to. But I will not be here with you much longer.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 14:8

## ULT

<sup>8</sup> What she could, she did. She anticipated to anoint my body for burial.

## **UST**

<sup>8</sup> It is appropriate that she has done what she could do. It is as if she had known that I was going to die soon, because she has anointed my body ahead of time so that it is ready for burial.

# What did Jesus say the woman had done for him?

Jesus said the woman had anointed his body for burial.

## Mark 14:9

## **ULT**

<sup>9</sup> But truly I say to you, wherever the gospel might be preached in the whole world, what she has done will also be spoken of, in remembrance of her."

# **UST**

<sup>9</sup> I will tell you this: Wherever my followers preach the good news throughout the world, they will also tell what she has done, and people will remember her."

# What promise did Jesus make about what the woman had done?

Jesus promised that wherever the gospel was preached in the whole world, what the woman had done would be spoken of in memory of her.

# Mark 14:10

# **ULT**

<sup>10</sup> And Judas Iscariot, who {was} one of the Twelve, went away to the chief priests so that he might betray him to them.

#### **UST**

<sup>10</sup> Then Judas Iscariot went to the chief priests to talk about helping them to capture Jesus. He did that even though he was one of the twelve apprentices.

# Why did Judas Iscariot go away to the chief priests?

Judas Iscariot went away to the chief priests so that he might deliver Jesus to them.

# Mark 14:11

# **ULT**

<sup>11</sup> But they, having heard it, were glad and promised to give him silver. And he was seeking how to conveniently betray him.

# **UST**

<sup>11</sup> When the chief priests heard what he was willing to do for them, they were very happy. They promised that they would give him a large amount of money in return. Judas agreed and began watching for an opportunity to hand Jesus over to them.

#### Mark 14:12

## **ULT**

<sup>12</sup> And on the first day of unleavened bread, when they were sacrificing the Passover lamb, his disciples say to him, "Where do you want us to go away to prepare, so that you might eat the Passover?"

# **UST**

<sup>12</sup> On the first day of the festival that they call Unleavened Bread, when they kill the lambs for the Passover, Jesus' apprentices said to him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare the meal for the Passover Celebration so that we can eat it?"

# How did the disciples find the place where they would all eat the Passover? (vv12-14)

Jesus told them to go into the city and follow a man carrying a pitcher of water, and then ask him where the guest room was that they would use to eat the Passover.

#### Mark 14:13

## **ULT**

<sup>13</sup> And he sends two of his disciples and says to them, "Go into the city, and a man bearing a pitcher of water will meet you. Follow him.

# **UST**

<sup>13</sup> So Jesus chose two of his apprentices to prepare everything. He said to them, "Go into Jerusalem city. A man will meet you, who will be carrying a large jar full of water. Follow him.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 14:14

## **ULT**

<sup>14</sup> And wherever he may enter, say to the owner of that house, 'The Teacher says, "Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?"'

#### **UST**

<sup>14</sup> When he enters a house, say to the man who owns the house, 'Our teacher wants us to prepare the meal of the Passover Celebration so that he can eat it with us his disciples. Please show us the room.'

## Mark 14:15

## **ULT**

<sup>15</sup> And he will show you a large upper room, furnished {and} ready, and make the preparations for us there."

# **UST**

<sup>15</sup> He will show you a large room that is on the upper floor of the house. It will be furnished and ready for us to eat a meal in it. Then prepare the meal there for us."

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 14:16

## **ULT**

<sup>16</sup> And the disciples left and went to the city, and they found it just as he said to them, and they prepared the Passover.

# **UST**

<sup>16</sup> So the two apprentices left. They went into the city and found everything to be just like he had told them. They prepared the meal for the Passover Celebration there.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 14:17

## ULT

<sup>17</sup> And, evening having arrived, he came with the Twelve.

#### **UST**

<sup>17</sup> When it was evening, Jesus arrived at that house with the twelve apprentices.

## Mark 14:18

## **ULT**

<sup>18</sup> And as they were reclining to eat and eating, Jesus said, "Truly I say to you, one from among you who is eating with me will betray me."

# **UST**

<sup>18</sup> As they were all sitting there and eating, Jesus said, "Listen carefully to this: One of you will make it possible for my enemies to arrest me. It is one of you who is eating with me right now!"

# What did Jesus say as they were reclining at the table and eating?

Jesus said that one of the disciples eating with him would betray him.

# Mark 14:19

## **ULT**

<sup>19</sup> They began to be grieved, and to say to him one by one, "Surely not I?"

# **UST**

<sup>19</sup> The apprentices became very sad and they said to him one by one, "Surely it is not I?"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 14:20

## **ULT**

<sup>20</sup> But he said to them, "{It is} one of the Twelve, the one dipping with me into the bowl.

# **UST**

<sup>20</sup> Then he said to them, "It is one of you twelve apprentices, the one who is dipping bread into the sauce in the dish along with me.

# Which disciple did Jesus say would betray him?

Jesus said that the disciple dipping bread with him in the bowl would betray him.

## Mark 14:21

## **ULT**

<sup>21</sup> For the Son of Man is going away just as it is written about him, but woe to that man through whom the Son of Man is being betrayed! It would have been good for him if that man had not been born."

# **UST**

<sup>21</sup> It is certain that I, the Son of Man, will die, because that is what has been written about me. But there will be terrible punishment for the man who betrays me! In fact, he would have been better off if he had never been born!"

# What did Jesus say about the destiny of the disciple who betrayed him?

Jesus said that it would have been better for him if he had not been born.

#### Mark 14:22

# **ULT**

<sup>22</sup> And as they were eating, having taken bread, having blessed it, he broke it, and gave it to them and said, "Take it. This is my body."

#### **UST**

<sup>22</sup> While they were eating, he took a flat loaf of bread and thanked God for it. Then he broke it into pieces and gave it to them and said to them, "This bread is my body. Take it and eat it."

# What did Jesus say as he gave the disciples the broken bread?

Jesus said, "Take this. This is my body".

# Mark 14:23

# **ULT**

<sup>23</sup> And having taken a cup, having given thanks, he gave it to them, and they all drank from it.

# **UST**

<sup>23</sup> Afterwards, he took a cup that contained wine and thanked God for it. Then he gave it to them and they all drank.

#### Mark 14:24

## **ULT**

<sup>24</sup> And he said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, that is being poured out for many.

# **UST**

<sup>24</sup> He said to them, "This wine is my blood, which is about to be shed when my enemies kill me. With this blood I will confirm the covenant that God has made to forgive the sins of many people.

# What did Jesus say as he gave the disciples the cup?

Jesus said, "This is my blood of the covenant, the blood that is poured out for many".

## Mark 14:25

# **ULT**

<sup>25</sup> Truly I say to you that I may certainly not any longer drink from the fruit of the vine until that day when I may drink it new in the kingdom of God."

#### **UST**

<sup>25</sup> I want you to know this: I will not drink any more wine until the time when I drink it again when God shows himself as king."

## When did Jesus say he would again drink of this fruit of the vine?

Jesus said he would again drink of this fruit of the vine on the day when he drank it anew in the kingdom of God.

## Mark 14:26

# **ULT**

<sup>26</sup> And having sung a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.

## **UST**

<sup>26</sup> After they sang a hymn, they went out toward the Mount of Olives.

## Mark 14:27

## **ULT**

<sup>27</sup> And Jesus says to them, "You all will fall away, for it is written, 'I will strike the shepherd and the sheep will be scattered.'

# **UST**

<sup>27</sup> While they were on their way, Jesus said to them, "They wrote in the scriptures that God said about me, 'I will kill the shepherd and scatter his sheep.' Those words will come true. You will leave me and run away.

# At the Mount of Olives, what did Jesus predict about his disciples?

Jesus predicted that his disciples would all fall away because of him.

# Mark 14:28

## **ULT**

<sup>28</sup> But after I have been raised up, I will go before you into Galilee."

## **UST**

<sup>28</sup> But after God makes me alive again, I will go ahead of you to the district of Galilee and meet you there."

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 14:29

## **ULT**

<sup>29</sup> But Peter was saying to him, "Even if all will be caused to stumble, yet not I."

# **UST**

<sup>29</sup> Then Peter said to him, "Perhaps all the other disciples will leave you, but I will not! I will not leave you!"

## Mark 14:30

## **ULT**

<sup>30</sup> And Jesus says to him, "Truly I say to you, that today—this very night—before the rooster crows twice, you will deny me three times."

# **UST**

<sup>30</sup> Then Jesus said to him, "The truth is that this very night, before the rooster crows two times, you will say about me three times, that you do not know me.

# What did Jesus tell Peter after Peter said he would never fall away?

Jesus told Peter that before the rooster crowed twice, Peter would deny Jesus three times.

# Mark 14:31

## **ULT**

<sup>31</sup> But he said emphatically, "Even if it is necessary for me to die with you, I will certainly not deny you." And they all also were speaking in the same manner.

## **UST**

<sup>31</sup> But Peter replied strongly, "Even if they kill me, I will not say that I do not know you." And all the other apprentices said the same thing.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 14:32

#### **ULT**

<sup>32</sup> And they come to a place, the name of which {is} Gethsemane, and he says to his disciples, "Sit here while I may pray."

# **UST**

<sup>32</sup> On the way, Jesus and his apprentices came to the place that people call Gethsemane. Then he said to some of his disciples, "Stay here while I pray!"

# What did Jesus tell his three disciples to do while he prayed? (vv32-34)

Jesus told them to remain there and watch.

## Mark 14:33

## **ULT**

<sup>33</sup> And he takes along Peter, and James, and John with him and began to be distressed and deeply troubled.

# **UST**

<sup>33</sup> Then he took Peter, James, and John with him. He became extremely upset.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 14:34

## **ULT**

<sup>34</sup> And he says to them, "My soul is deeply grieved, even to death. Remain here and stay alert."

## **UST**

<sup>34</sup> He said to them, "I am very sorrowful. It is as if I were about to die. You men stay here and keep watch!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 14:35

# **ULT**

<sup>35</sup> And having gone a little farther, he fell to the ground and was praying that, if it is possible, the hour might pass from him.

# **UST**

<sup>35</sup> He went a bit farther and threw himself on the ground. Then he prayed that if it were possible, he would not have to suffer.

# For what did Jesus pray?

Jesus prayed that this hour might pass from him.

#### Mark 14:36

## **ULT**

<sup>36</sup> And he was saying, "Abba, Father, all things {are} possible with you. Remove this cup from me. But not what I will, but what you will."

# **UST**

<sup>36</sup> He said, "O my Father, because you are able to do everything, rescue me so that I do not have to suffer now! But do not do what I want. Instead, do what you want!"

# What was Jesus willing to accept as an answer to his prayer to the Father?

Jesus was willing to accept whatever the Father's will was for him.

# Mark 14:37

# **ULT**

<sup>37</sup> And he comes and finds them sleeping, and he says to Peter, "Simon, are you sleeping? Were you not able to stay alert for one hour?

## **UST**

<sup>37</sup> Then he returned and found his apprentices sleeping. He woke them up and said, "Simon Peter! Are you sleeping? Were you not able to stay awake for just a short time?"

# What did Jesus find when he returned to the three disciples?

Jesus found the three disciples sleeping.

# Mark 14:38

# **ULT**

<sup>38</sup> Stay alert and pray, so that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit indeed {is} willing, but the flesh {is} weak."

# **UST**

<sup>38</sup> And he said to them, "You want to do what I say, but you are weak. So keep awake and pray so that you can resist when you are tempted!"

## Mark 14:39

## **ULT**

<sup>39</sup> And again, having gone away, he prayed, having said the same thing.

## **UST**

<sup>39</sup> Then he went away again and prayed again what he prayed before.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 14:40

#### **ULT**

<sup>40</sup> And again, having come, he found them sleeping, for their eyes were weighed down, and they did not know what to answer to him.

# **UST**

<sup>40</sup> When he returned, he found that they were sleeping again; they were so sleepy that they could not keep their eyes open. Because they were ashamed, they did not know what to say to him when he awakened them.

# What did Jesus find the second time he returned from praying?

Jesus found the three disciples sleeping.

# Mark 14:41

## **ULT**

<sup>41</sup> And he comes the third time and says to them, "Are you still sleeping and resting? It is enough! The hour has come. Behold, the Son of Man is being betrayed into the hands of sinners.

## **UST**

<sup>41</sup> Then he went and prayed again. He returned a third time and found them sleeping again. He said to them, "You are still asleep? No more of this! The time for me to suffer is about to begin. Look! Someone is about to enable sinful men to capture me, the Son of Man.

# What did Jesus find the third time he returned from praying?

Jesus found the three disciples sleeping.

## Mark 14:42

# **ULT**

<sup>42</sup> Get up, let us go. Behold, the one betraying me is near."

# **UST**

## **ULT**

<sup>43</sup> And immediately, while he is still speaking, Judas, one of the Twelve, arrives, and a crowd with him with swords and clubs, from the chief priests, and the scribes, and the elders.

# **UST**

<sup>43</sup> While he was still speaking, Judas arrived. Even though he was one of Jesus' twelve disciples, he came to enable Jesus' enemies to capture him. A crowd who carried swords and clubs was with him. The leaders of the Jewish council had sent them.

# Mark 14:44

## **ULT**

<sup>44</sup> Now his betrayer had given them a sign, saying, "Whomever I may kiss, he it is. Seize him and lead him away securely."

## **UST**

<sup>44</sup> Judas, who was betraying Jesus, had previously told this crowd, "The man whom I kiss is the one whom you want. When I kiss him, seize him and lead him away."

What sign did Judas give to show the guards which person was Jesus? (vv44-45) Judas kissed Jesus to show which person was Jesus.

## Mark 14:45

## **ULT**

<sup>45</sup> And having arrived, immediately having come up to him, he says, "Rabbi," and he kissed him.

## **UST**

<sup>45</sup> So, when Judas arrived, he immediately went to Jesus and said, "My teacher!" Then he kissed Jesus.

## ULT

<sup>46</sup> And they laid hands on him and seized him.

#### UST

<sup>46</sup> Then the crowd grabbed Jesus.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 14:47

## ULT

<sup>47</sup> But a certain one of those standing by, having drawn {his} sword, struck the servant of the high priest and cut off his ear.

## **UST**

<sup>47</sup> But one of his apprentices who was standing nearby drew his sword. He struck the servant of the high priest with it, but he only cut off his ear.

# **ULT**

<sup>48</sup> And answering, Jesus said to them, "Did you come out, as against a robber, with swords and clubs to seize me?

# **UST**

<sup>48</sup> Jesus said to them, "Have you come here to seize me with swords and clubs, as if I were a bandit?

# What did Jesus say was being done in his arrest to fulfill scripture? (vv48-49)

Jesus said that scripture was being fulfilled because they came to arrest him like a robber, with swords and clubs.

## **ULT**

<sup>49</sup> Every day I was with you teaching in the temple, and you did not seize me. But so that the Scriptures might be fulfilled..."

# **UST**

<sup>49</sup> Day after day I was with you in the temple courtyard teaching the people Why did you not seize me then? But this is happening in order that what the prophets have written in the Scriptures about me may happen."

<sup>50</sup> And having left him, they all ran away.

## **UST**

<sup>50</sup> All his apprentices at once left him and ran away.

# What did those with Jesus do when Jesus was arrested?

Those with Jesus left him and fled.

## **ULT**

<sup>51</sup> And a certain young man was following him, wearing a linen garment over {his} naked body. And they seize him,

## **UST**

<sup>51</sup> At that time, a young man was following Jesus. He was wearing only a linen cloth around his body. The crowd grabbed him,

# What did a young man who was following Jesus do when Jesus was arrested? (vv51-52)

The young man left his linen garment there and ran away naked.

## Mark 14:52

## **ULT**

<sup>52</sup> but he, having left behind the linen garment, ran away naked.

# **UST**

<sup>52</sup> but, as he pulled away from them, he left behind the linen cloth in their hands, and then he ran away naked.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 14:53

## **ULT**

<sup>53</sup> And they led Jesus away to the high priest, and all the chief priests, and the elders, and the scribes gather together.

# **UST**

<sup>53</sup> The men who had seized Jesus led him away to the high priest's house. All of the Jewish council were gathering there.

# Where was Peter as Jesus was taken to the high priest? (vv53-54)

Peter sat among the guards, near a fire to keep warm.

#### Mark 14:54

#### **ULT**

<sup>54</sup> Now Peter followed him from a distance, as far as into the courtyard of the high priest, and he was sitting with the guards and warming himself at the fire.

# **UST**

<sup>54</sup> Peter followed Jesus at a distance. He went into the courtyard of the house where the high priest lived, and he sat there with the men who guarded the house of the high priest. He was warming himself beside a fire.

## Mark 14:55

## **ULT**

<sup>55</sup> Now the chief priests and the entire Sanhedrin were seeking testimony against Jesus to put him to death, and they were not finding any.

# **UST**

<sup>55</sup> The chief priests and all the rest of the Jewish council were looking for evidence against Jesus that would be strong enough to put him to death. But they did not find any evidence that would require the officials to put him to death.

# What was wrong with the testimony against Jesus given to the Council? (vv55-56)

The testimony against Jesus was false and did not agree.

# **ULT**

<sup>56</sup> For many were testifying falsely against him, but {their} testimony was not the same.

# **UST**

<sup>56</sup> Many other people told lies about Jesus, but the statements they made did not agree with each other. And so, their statements were not strong enough to make a charge against Jesus.

# **ULT**

<sup>57</sup> And certain ones, having stood up, were testifying falsely against him, saying,

#### **UST**

<sup>57</sup> Finally, some stood up and accused him falsely by saying,

## Mark 14:58

## **ULT**

 $^{58}$  "We heard him saying, 'I will destroy this temple made with hands, and in three days I will build another made without hands.'"

# **UST**

<sup>58</sup> "We heard him when he said, 'I will destroy this temple that was built by men, and then within three days I will build another temple without help from anyone else.'"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 14:59

# **ULT**

<sup>59</sup> And not even in this manner was their testimony the same.

# **UST**

<sup>59</sup> But what some of these men said also did not agree with what others of them said.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 14:60

## ULT

 $^{60}$  And having stood up in the midst, the high priest questioned Jesus, saying, "Do you not answer at all? What {are} these testifying against you?"

## **UST**

<sup>60</sup> Then the high priest himself stood up in front of them and said to Jesus, "Are you not going to reply? What do you say about all the things that they are saying in order to accuse you?"

## Mark 14:61

## **ULT**

<sup>61</sup> But he was silent and did not answer at all. Again the high priest was questioning him and saying to him, "Are you the Christ, the Son of the Blessed One?"

# **UST**

<sup>61</sup> But Jesus was silent and did not reply. Then the high priest tried again. He asked him, "Are you the Messiah? Do you say that you are the Son of God?"

# What question did the high priest ask Jesus about who Jesus was?

The high priest asked Jesus if he was the Christ, the son of the Blessed.

# Mark 14:62

# **ULT**

<sup>62</sup> But Jesus said, "I am; and you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of power and coming with the clouds of heaven."

## **UST**

<sup>62</sup> Jesus said, "I am. Furthermore, you will see me, the Son of Man, ruling beside God, who is completely powerful. You will also see me coming down through the clouds in the sky!"

# What was Jesus' answer to the high priest's question?

lesus answered that he was the Christ, the son of the Blessed.

# Mark 14:63

# **ULT**

63 But the high priest, having torn his garments, says, "What need do we still have of witnesses?

# **UST**

<sup>63</sup> When Jesus said this, the high priest tore his own outer garment in protest, and the high priest said, "Do we need more witnesses to testify against this man?

#### Mark 14:64

## **ULT**

<sup>64</sup> You heard the blasphemy. What is evident to you?" And they all condemned him to be deserving of death.

# **UST**

<sup>64</sup> You have heard his blasphemous claim to be God!" They all agreed that Jesus was guilty and that he deserved to be put to death.

# Hearing Jesus' answer, of what did the high priest say Jesus was guilty?

The high priest said that Jesus was guilty of blasphemy.

# Mark 14:65

# **ULT**

<sup>65</sup> And certain ones began to spit on him, and to cover his face, and to strike him, and to say to him, "Prophesy!" And the officers received him with slaps.

#### **UST**

<sup>65</sup> Then some of them began spitting on Jesus. They put a blindfold on him, and then they began striking him and saying to him, "If you are a prophet, tell us who hit you!" And those who were guarding Jesus struck him with their hands.

# What did they do to Jesus after condemning him as one who deserved death?

They spit on him, struck him, and beat him.

# **ULT**

<sup>66</sup> And while Peter was below in the courtyard, one of the servant girls of the high priest comes to him.

# **UST**

<sup>66</sup> While Peter was outside in the courtyard of the high priest's house, one of the girls who worked for the high priest came near him.

What was Peter's answer to the servant girl who said that Peter was with Jesus? (vv66-68)

Peter answered that he did not know or understand about what the girl was talking.

## Mark 14:67

## **ULT**

<sup>67</sup> And having seen Peter warming himself, having looked closely at him, she says, "You were also with the Nazarene, Jesus."

# **UST**

<sup>67</sup> When she saw Peter warming himself beside the fire, she looked at him closely. Then she said, "You also were with Jesus, that man from Nazareth!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 14:68

# **ULT**

<sup>68</sup> But he denied it, saying, "Neither have I known nor do I understand what you are saying." And he went out, outside into the courtyard. <sup>[1]</sup>

# **UST**

<sup>68</sup> But he denied it by saying, "I do not know what you are talking about! I understand nothing of it!" Then he went away from there to the gate of the courtyard.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 14:69

#### **ULT**

 $^{69}$  But the servant girl, having seen him {there}, began to say again to those standing around, "This one is from among them!"

## **UST**

<sup>69</sup> The servant girl saw him there and said again to the people who were standing nearby, "This man is one of those who have been with that man they arrested."

#### Mark 14:70

## **ULT**

<sup>70</sup> But he was denying it again. And after a little while those standing around again were saying to Peter, "Truly you are from among them, for you also are a Galilean."

# **UST**

<sup>70</sup> But he denied it again. After a little while, those who were standing there said to Peter again, "We can tell that you also are from Galilee district. So it is certain that you are one of those who accompanied Jesus!"

# Mark 14:71

#### **ULT**

<sup>71</sup> But he began to curse and to swear, "I do not know this man whom you are talking about."

## **UST**

<sup>71</sup> But he began to say that God could punish him if he were not telling the truth; he said, "I do not know the man that you are talking about!"

# What was Peter's response when he was asked a third time if he was one of Jesus' disciples?

Peter swore and put himself under curses that he did not know Jesus.

#### Mark 14:72

## **ULT**

<sup>72</sup> And immediately a rooster crowed a second time, and Peter remembered the word that Jesus said to him: "Before a rooster crows twice, you will deny me three times," and having broken down, he was weeping. 14:68 <sup>[1]</sup>

# **UST**

<sup>72</sup> Immediately the rooster crowed a second time. Then Peter remembered what Jesus had said to him earlier: "Before the rooster crows a second time, you will deny three times that you know me." When he realized that he had denied him three times, he started crying.

# What happened after Peter answered the third time?

After Peter answered the third time, the rooster crowed a second time.

#### What did Peter do after he heard the rooster?

After he heard the rooster, Peter broke down and wept.

## Mark 15:1

# **ULT**

<sup>1</sup> And immediately at dawn, having held a consultation, the chief priests with the elders and scribes and the entire Sanhedrin, having bound Jesus, led him away and handed him over to Pilate.

# **UST**

<sup>1</sup> Very early in the morning the chief priests met together with the rest of the Jewish council in order to decide how to accuse Jesus before the Roman governor. Their guards tied Jesus' hands again. They took him to the residence of Pilate, the governor.

# Early in the morning, what did the chief priests do with Jesus?

Early in the morning, they bound Jesus and handed him over to Pilate.

#### Mark 15:2

# **ULT**

<sup>2</sup> And Pilate questioned him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" But he, answering him, says, "You say so."

## **UST**

<sup>2</sup> Pilate asked Jesus, "Do you say that you are the king of the Jews?" Jesus answered him, "You yourself have said so."

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 15:3

#### **ULT**

<sup>3</sup> And the chief priests were accusing him of many things.

## **UST**

<sup>3</sup> Then the chief priests claimed that Jesus had done many bad things.

## Mark 15:4

## **ULT**

<sup>4</sup> Now Pilate again was questioning him, saying, "Do you not answer at all? See how many things they are accusing you!"

# **UST**

<sup>4</sup> So Pilate asked him again, "Do you have nothing to reply? Listen to how many bad things they are saying that you have done!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 15:5

# **ULT**

<sup>5</sup> But Jesus no longer answered anything, so that Pilate was amazed.

#### UST

<sup>5</sup> But even though Jesus was not guilty, he did not say anything more. The result was that Pilate was very much surprised.

# While the chief priests were presenting many charges against Jesus, what amazed Pilate about Jesus?

Pilate was amazed that Jesus no longer answered him.

#### Mark 15:6

## **ULT**

<sup>6</sup> Now during the festival, he usually released to them one prisoner, whom they were requesting.

## **UST**

<sup>6</sup> Now it was the governor's custom each year during the Passover Celebration to release one person who was in prison. He usually released any prisoner the people requested.

# What did Pilate usually do for the crowd at the time of the feast?

Pilate usually released to the crowd one prisoner they requested at the time of the feast.

#### Mark 15:7

## **ULT**

<sup>7</sup> Now there was one who was called Barabbas, bound with the rebels, who had committed murder in the insurrection.

# **UST**

<sup>7</sup> At that time there was a man called Barabbas who was in prison with some other men. They had committed murder when they rebelled against the Roman government.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 15:8

# **ULT**

<sup>8</sup> And having come up, the crowd began to request of him just as he usually did for them.

# **UST**

<sup>8</sup> A crowd approached Pilate and asked him to release someone, just as in the past.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 15:9

## ULT

<sup>9</sup> But Pilate answered them, saying, "Do you desire that I would release to you the King of the Jews?"

#### **UST**

<sup>9</sup> Pilate answered them, "Would you like me to release for you the man whom you people say is your king?"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 15:10

# **ULT**

<sup>10</sup> For he knew that the chief priests had handed him over because of envy.

# **UST**

<sup>10</sup> He asked this because he realized what the chief priests were wanting to do. They were accusing Jesus because they were jealous of him because many people were becoming his disciples.

# Why did Pilate want to release Jesus to the crowd?

Pilate knew that it was because of envy that the chief priests had handed Jesus over to him.

## Mark 15:11

## **ULT**

<sup>11</sup> But the chief priests stirred up the crowd so that he would release Barabbas to them instead.

# **UST**

<sup>11</sup> But the chief priests urged the crowd to request that Pilate release Barabbas for them instead of Jesus.

# Who did the crowd cry out to be released?

The crowd cried out for Barabbas to be released.

# Mark 15:12

# **ULT**

<sup>12</sup> But answering again, Pilate, said to them, "What therefore should I do to the one you call the King of the Jews?"

# **UST**

<sup>12</sup> Pilate said to them again, "If I release Barabbas, what do you want me to do with your king?"

# What did the crowd say should be done with the King of the Jews? (vv12-13)

The crowd said that the King of the Jews should be crucified.

# Mark 15:13

# **ULT**

<sup>13</sup> But they cried out again, "Crucify him!"

# **UST**

<sup>13</sup> Then they shouted back, "Command your soldiers to crucify him!"

## Mark 15:14

## **ULT**

<sup>14</sup> But Pilate was saying to them, "What wrong has he done?" But they cried out even more, "Crucify him."

# **UST**

<sup>14</sup> Then Pilate said to them, "Why? What crime has he committed?" But they shouted even louder, "Crucify him!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 15:15

## **ULT**

<sup>15</sup> Now Pilate, wanting to do what was pleasing to the crowd, released Barabbas to them and handed over Jesus, having flogged him, so that he might be crucified.

# **UST**

<sup>15</sup> So because Pilate wanted to please the crowd, he released Barabbas to them. Then his soldiers flogged Jesus; after that, Pilate told them to take him away and crucify him.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 15:16

## ULT

<sup>16</sup> Now the soldiers led him inside the palace (that is, the Praetorium), and call together the whole cohort,

#### **UST**

<sup>16</sup> The soldiers took Jesus into the courtyard of the barracks. Then they summoned the whole cohort who were on duty there.

## Mark 15:17

## **ULT**

<sup>17</sup> and put on him a purple robe, and place on him a crown of thorns they had twisted together,

# **UST**

<sup>17</sup> After the soldiers gathered together, they put a purple robe on Jesus. Then they placed on his head a crown that they had woven from thornbush branches. They did those things in order to ridicule him by pretending that he was a king.

# How did the cohort of soldiers dress Jesus?

The soldiers put a purple robe on Jesus and put on him a twisted crown of thorns.

# Mark 15:18

## **ULT**

<sup>18</sup> and they began to salute him: "Hail, King of the Jews!"

## **UST**

<sup>18</sup> Then they greeted him like they would greet a king, in order to ridicule him; they said, "Greetings, King of the Jews!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 15:19

#### **ULT**

<sup>19</sup> And they were striking his head with a staff and spitting on him, and bending the knee, they were bowing down to him.

#### **UST**

<sup>19</sup> They repeatedly struck his head with a reed and spat on him. They knelt down in front of him to pretend to honor him.

## Mark 15:20

## **ULT**

<sup>20</sup> And when they had mocked him, they took off from him the purple robe and put his own garments on him, and lead him out so that they might crucify him.

# **UST**

<sup>20</sup> When they had finished mocking him, they pulled off the purple robe. They put his own clothes on him, and then they led him outside of the city in order to nail him to a cross.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 15:21

# **ULT**

<sup>21</sup> And they pressed into service a certain passerby, Simon of Cyrene (the father of Alexander and Rufus), coming from the country, so that he might carry his cross.

# **UST**

<sup>21</sup> Now a man named Simon from Cyrene came along. He was the father of Alexander and Rufus, and he was passing by Jesus on his way to the city from somewhere else. The soldiers compelled Simon to carry the cross for Jesus.

# Who carried Jesus' cross?

A passerby, Simon of Cyrene, was forced to carry Jesus' cross.

## Mark 15:22

#### ULT

<sup>22</sup> And they bring him to Golgotha (a place which is translated, "Place of a Skull").

#### **UST**

<sup>22</sup> The soldiers brought them both to a place that they call Golgotha. That name means, "A place like a skull."

# What was the name of the place where the soldiers brought Jesus to crucify him?

The name of the place was Golgotha, which means Place of a Skull.

## Mark 15:23

# **ULT**

<sup>23</sup> And they were offering him wine having been mixed with myrrh, but he did not drink it.

# **UST**

<sup>23</sup> Then they tried to give Jesus wine that was mixed with myrrh. They wanted him to drink it so that he would not feel so much pain when they crucified him. But he refused to drink it.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 15:24

# **ULT**

<sup>24</sup> And they crucified him and divide his garments, casting lots for them, who would take what.

# **UST**

<sup>24</sup> Some of the soldiers took his clothes. Then they nailed him to a cross. Afterwards, they divided his clothes among themselves by gambling for them.

# What did the soldiers do with Jesus' garments?

The soldiers cast lots for Jesus' garments.

# Mark 15:25

## **ULT**

<sup>25</sup> Now it was the third hour, and they crucified him.

# **UST**

<sup>25</sup> It was nine o'clock in the morning when they crucified him.

## Mark 15:26

## **ULT**

<sup>26</sup> And this was the inscription of the charge against him having been written: "The King of the Jews."

# **UST**

<sup>26</sup> They attached to the cross above Jesus' head a sign on which it had been written the reason why they were nailing him to the cross. It said, "The King of the Jews."

# What charge against Jesus did the soldiers write on the sign?

The soldiers wrote "The King of the Jews" on the sign.

# Mark 15:27

# **ULT**

<sup>27</sup> And they crucify two robbers with him, one on {his} right, and one on his left.

# **UST**

<sup>27</sup> At the same time, they also nailed to crosses two men who were robbers. They nailed one to a cross at the right side of Jesus and one to a cross at his left side.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 15:28

## **ULT**

<sup>28[1]</sup> [And the scripture was fulfilled that says, 'And he was counted with the lawless ones.']

# **UST**

<sup>28[1]</sup> [The scripture was fulfilled that says, 'He was counted with the lawless ones.']

## Mark 15:29

## **ULT**

<sup>29</sup> And those passing by were blaspheming him, shaking their heads, and saying, "Aha! The one destroying the temple and rebuilding it in three days,

# **UST**

<sup>29</sup> The people who were passing by insulted him by shaking their heads at him. They said, "Aha! You said that you would destroy the temple and then you would build it again within three days.

# What did those who passed by challenge Jesus to do? (vv29-30)

Those who passed by challenged Jesus to save himself and get down from the cross.

# Mark 15:30

# ULT

<sup>30</sup> save yourself, having come down from the cross!"

## **UST**

<sup>30</sup> If you could do that, then rescue yourself by coming down from the cross!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 15:31

## **ULT**

<sup>31</sup> In the same way also, the chief priests, mocking him to each other, along with the scribes, were saying, "He saved others; he is not able to save himself.

# **UST**

<sup>31</sup> The chief priests, along with the men who taught the Jewish laws, also wanted to make fun of Jesus. So they said to each other, "He has saved others from trouble, but he cannot save himself!

# What did the chief priests say Jesus should do so they would believe? (vv31-32)

The chief priests said that Jesus should come down from the cross so they would believe.

#### Mark 15:32

#### **ULT**

<sup>32</sup> Let the Christ, the King of Israel, come down now from the cross, so that we might see and might believe," and those who had been crucified with him were taunting him.

#### **UST**

<sup>32</sup> He said, 'I am the Messiah. I am the King who rules the people of Israel.' If his words are true, he should come down now from the cross! Then we will believe him!" The two men who were nailed onto crosses beside him also insulted him.

# What titles did the chief priests use for Jesus as they mocked him?

The chief priests called Jesus the Christ and the King of Israel.

#### Mark 15:33

# **ULT**

<sup>33</sup> And the sixth hour having arrived, darkness came over the whole land until the ninth hour.

# **UST**

<sup>33</sup> At noon the whole land became dark, and it stayed dark until three o'clock in the afternoon.

#### What happened at the sixth hour?

At the sixth hour, darkness came over the whole land.

#### Mark 15:34

# **ULT**

<sup>34</sup> And at the ninth hour, Jesus cried out with a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani?" which is translated, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

## **UST**

<sup>34</sup> At three o'clock Jesus shouted loudly, "Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani?" That means, "My God, my God, why have you deserted me?"

#### What did Jesus cry out at the ninth hour?

Jesus cried out, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

#### Mark 15:35

#### **ULT**

<sup>35</sup> And some of those who had been standing by, having heard him, were saying, "Look, he is calling for Elijah."

#### **UST**

<sup>35</sup> When some of the people who were standing there heard the word 'Eloi', they misunderstood it and said, "Listen! He is calling for the prophet Elijah!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

## Mark 15:36

## **ULT**

<sup>36</sup> But someone, having run and having filled a sponge with sour wine, having put it on a reed, was giving it to him to drink, saying, "Let him alone! Let us see if Elijah comes to take him down!"

# **UST**

<sup>36</sup> One of them ran and filled a sponge with sour wine. He placed it on the tip of a reed, and then held it up to try to get Jesus to suck on it. He said, "Wait! Let us see whether Elijah will come to take him down from the cross!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

#### Mark 15:37

#### **ULT**

<sup>37</sup> But Jesus, having cried out with a loud voice, breathed his last.

#### **UST**

<sup>37</sup> And then Jesus shouted loudly, stopped breathing, and died.

# What did Jesus do before he died?

Jesus cried out with a loud voice before he died.

#### Mark 15:38

#### **ULT**

<sup>38</sup> And the curtain of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom.

#### **UST**

<sup>38</sup> At that moment the curtain in the temple sanctuary split into two pieces from top to bottom. That showed that ordinary people could now go into the presence of God.

## What happened in the temple when Jesus died?

The curtain of the temple was split in two from top to bottom when Jesus died.

## What did the centurion testify when he saw how Jesus died?

The centurion testified that truly this man was the Son of God.

<sup>40</sup> Now there were also women looking on from a distance. Among them were Mary Magdalene, and Mary (the mother of James the younger and of Joses), and Salome,

## **UST**

**40-41** There were also some women there; they were watching these events from a distance. They had accompanied Jesus when he was in Galilee, and they had provided what he needed. They had come with him to Jerusalem. Among those women was Mary from Magdala. There was another Mary, who was the mother of the younger James and of Joses. There was also Salome.

#### Mark 15:41

#### **ULT**

<sup>41</sup> who, when he was in Galilee, were following him and serving him, and many other women who had come up with him to Jerusalem.

#### **UST**

**40-41** There were also some women there; they were watching these events from a distance. They had accompanied Jesus when he was in Galilee, and they had provided what he needed. They had come with him to Jerusalem. Among those women was Mary from Magdala. There was another Mary, who was the mother of the younger James and of Joses. There was also Salome.

He was also one of those who had been waiting expectantly for when God would show himself as king. Evening was now approaching. It was the day before the Sabbath, a day the Jews called the day of preparation. So he went with courage to Pilate and asked him to permit him to take the body of Jesus down from the cross and bury it immediately.

# On what day did Jesus die?

Jesus died on the day before the Sabbath.

#### Mark 15:43

#### **ULT**

<sup>43</sup> Joseph who {was} from Arimathea, a respected member of the council who also was himself waiting for the kingdom of God, having come, he boldly went in to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus.

#### UST

**42-43** When evening was near, a man named Joseph from Arimathea came there. He was a member of the Jewish council, one whom everyone respected. He was also one of those who had been waiting expectantly for when God would show himself as king. Evening was now approaching. It was the day before the Sabbath, a day the Jews called the day of preparation. So he went with courage to Pilate and asked him to permit him to take the body of Jesus down from the cross and bury it immediately.

#### Mark 15:46

#### ULT

<sup>46</sup> And having bought a linen cloth, having taken him down, he wrapped him in the linen cloth, and laid him in a tomb that was cut from a rock. And he rolled a stone against the entrance of the tomb.

#### **UST**

<sup>46</sup> After Joseph had bought a linen cloth, he and others took Jesus' body down from the cross. They wrapped it in the linen cloth and laid it in a tomb that previously had been dug out of the rock cliff. Then they rolled a huge flat stone in front of the entrance to the tomb.

#### What did Joseph of Arimathea do after Jesus died?

Joseph of Arimathea took Jesus down from the cross, wrapped him in linen cloth, and laid him in a tomb, rolling a stone against the entrance of the tomb.

# **ULT**

 $^{47}$  Now Mary Magdalene and Mary the {mother} of Joses were watching where he was laid. 15:28  $^{[1]}$ 

# **UST**

 $^{47}$  Mary from Magdala and Mary the mother of Joses were watching where they placed Jesus' body. 15:28  $^{[1]}$

#### Mark 16:1

# **ULT**

<sup>1</sup> And the Sabbath having passed, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the {mother} of James, and Salome bought spices, so that having come, they might anoint him.

# **UST**

<sup>1</sup> On Saturday evening when the Jewish day of rest had ended, Mary from Magdala, Mary the mother of the younger James, and Salome bought fragrant ointments to follow the Jewish custom and anoint Jesus' body for burial.

#### Mark 16:2

#### **ULT**

<sup>2</sup> And very early on the first of the week, they arrive at the tomb, the sun having come up.

#### **UST**

<sup>2</sup> Very early on Sunday, the first day of the Jewish week, just after the sun rose, they took the fragrant ointment and started going toward the tomb.

# When did the women go to Jesus' tomb to anoint his body?

The women went to the tomb on the first day of the week when the sun came up.

#### Mark 16:3

#### **ULT**

<sup>3</sup> And they were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance of the tomb?"

#### **UST**

<sup>3</sup> While they were going there, they were asking each other, "Who will roll away for us the stone that blocks the entrance of the tomb?"

#### Mark 16:4

#### **ULT**

<sup>4</sup> And having looked up, they see that the stone has been rolled away, for it was extremely large.

#### **UST**

<sup>4</sup> After they arrived, they looked up and were surprised to see that someone had rolled away the stone because it was very large.

# How did the women enter the tomb even though there had been a very large stone at the entrance?

Someone had rolled away the very large stone from the entrance.

#### Mark 16:5

#### **ULT**

<sup>5</sup> And having entered into the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side, and they were alarmed.

# **UST**

<sup>5</sup> They entered the tomb and saw an angel who looked like a young man. He was sitting at the right side of the cave. He was wearing a white robe. As a result, they were astonished.

#### What did the women see when they entered the tomb?

The women saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side.

# Mark 16:6

#### **ULT**

<sup>6</sup> But he says to them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus, the Nazarene, who has been crucified. He has been raised! He is not here. See the place where they laid him.

# **UST**

<sup>6</sup> The young man said to them, "Do not be astonished! I know that you are looking for Jesus, the man from Nazareth, who was put to death by being nailed to a cross. But he has become alive again! He is not here! Look! Here is the place where they placed his body.

#### What did the young man say about Jesus?

The young man said that Jesus was risen and was not there.

#### Mark 16:7

#### **ULT**

<sup>7</sup> But go, tell his disciples and Peter, 'He is going ahead of you to Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you.'"

#### **UST**

<sup>7</sup> Go and tell his apprentices. Particularly be sure that you tell Peter. Tell them, 'Jesus is going ahead of you to Galilee district, and you will see him there, just like he told you previously'!"

# Where did the young man say the disciples would meet Jesus?

The young man said the disciples would meet Jesus in Galilee.

# Mark 16:8

#### **ULT**

<sup>8</sup> And having gone out, they ran from the tomb, for trembling and amazement was gripping them. And they said nothing to anyone because they were afraid.

#### **UST**

<sup>8</sup> The women went outside and ran from the tomb. They were trembling because they were afraid, and they were astonished. But they did not say anything to anyone about this because they were afraid.

#### Mark 16:9

#### **ULT**

<sup>9[1]</sup> [Now early on the first {day} of the week, after he arose, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, from whom he had cast out seven demons.

#### **UST**

<sup>9[1]</sup> [When Jesus became alive again early on Sunday morning, the first day of the Jewish week, he appeared first to Mary from Magdala. She was the woman from whom he had previously forced out seven evil spirits.

## To whom did Jesus first appear after his resurrection?

Jesus first appeared to Mary Magdalene.

#### Mark 16:10

#### **ULT**

<sup>10</sup> She went and told those who {were} with him, while they were mourning and weeping.

# **UST**

<sup>10</sup> She went to those who had been with Jesus, while they were mourning and crying. She told them what she had seen.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

# Mark 16:11

#### **ULT**

<sup>11</sup> And they heard that he was alive and that he had been seen by her, but they did not believe.

# **UST**

<sup>11</sup> But when she told them that Jesus was alive again and that she had seen him, they refused to believe it.

How did Jesus' disciples respond when Mary told them she had seen Jesus alive? The disciples did not believe.

# Mark 16:12

# ULT

<sup>12</sup> Now after these things, he appeared in a different form to two of them as they were walking, going out into the country.

# **UST**

<sup>12</sup> Later that day, Jesus appeared in a different form to two of his apprentices while they were walking from Jerusalem to the surrounding area.

#### Mark 16:13

#### **ULT**

<sup>13</sup> And they, having gone, told the rest of the disciples, but they did not believe them.

# **UST**

<sup>13</sup> After they recognized him, those two went back to Jerusalem. They told his other apprentices what had happened, but they did not believe it.

# How did Jesus' disciples respond when two other people told them they had seen Jesus alive?

The disciples did not believe.

#### Mark 16:14

#### **ULT**

<sup>14</sup> Now later, he appeared to the eleven as they were reclining to eat, and he rebuked them for their unbelief and hardness of heart, because they did not believe those who saw him after he rose from the dead.

## **UST**

<sup>14</sup> Later Jesus appeared to the eleven apprentices while they were eating. He scolded them because they had stubbornly refused to believe the reports of those who saw him after he had become alive again.

# When he appeared to the disciples, what did Jesus say to them about their unbelief? Jesus rebuked the disciples for their unbelief.

#### Mark 16:15

# ULT

<sup>15</sup> And he said to them, "Going into all the world, preach the gospel to the entire creation.

#### **UST**

<sup>15</sup> He said to them, "Go into the whole world and preach the good news to everyone!

#### What command did Jesus give the disciples?

Jesus commanded the disciples to go into all the world and preach the gospel.

#### Mark 16:16

#### **ULT**

<sup>16</sup> He who believes and is baptized will be saved, and he who does not believe will be condemned.

# **UST**

<sup>16</sup> God will save everyone who believes your message and who is baptized. He will condemn everyone who does not believe.

# Who did Jesus say would be saved?

Jesus said those who believed and were baptized would be saved.

# Who did Jesus say would be condemned?

lesus said those who did not believe would be condemned.

#### Mark 16:17

#### **ULT**

<sup>17</sup> Now these signs will go with those who believe: In my name they will cast out demons. They will speak in new languages.

#### UST

<sup>17</sup> Those who believe the good news will perform miracles to show that I am with them. By my power they will do miracles like these: they will force evil spirits out of people. They will speak in languages that they have not learned.

## What signs did Jesus say would go with those who believed? (vv17-18)

Jesus said those who believed would cast out demons, would speak in new languages, would not be hurt by anything deadly, and would heal others.

#### Mark 16:18

#### **ULT**

<sup>18</sup> They will pick up snakes, and if they drink anything deadly, it will not hurt them. They will lay hands on the sick, and they will get well."

#### UST

<sup>18</sup> If they pick up snakes or if they drink any poisonous liquid accidentally, they will not be hurt. God will heal sick people on whom they lay their hands."

#### Mark 16:19

#### **ULT**

<sup>19</sup> After the Lord Jesus had spoken to them, he was taken up into heaven and sat down at the right hand of God.

## **UST**

<sup>19</sup> After the Lord Jesus had said this to his apprentices, God took him up into heaven. Then he sat down on his throne beside God at the place of highest honor at his right hand, to rule with him.

# What happened to Jesus after he spoke to the disciples?

After he spoke to the disciples, Jesus was taken up into heaven and sat down at the right hand of God.

# Mark 16:20

#### **ULT**

<sup>20</sup> Now those, having gone out, preached everywhere, while the Lord worked with them {and} confirmed the word by the signs that went with them. Amen.]

# **UST**

<sup>20</sup> As for the apprentices, they went out from Jerusalem, and then they preached everywhere. Wherever they went, the Lord enabled them to perform miracles. By doing that, he showed people that God's message is true.]

## What did the disciples then do?

The disciples then left and preached everywhere.

#### What did the Lord then do?

The Lord then worked with the disciples and confirmed the word with miraculous signs.

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
