## 2 John 1

## 2 John 1:1

#### ULT

<sup>1</sup> The elder, to the chosen lady and her children, whom I love in the truth—and not only I, but also all who have known the truth—

### UST

<sup>1</sup> {From John,} the elder. {I am writing this letter} to you, the congregation {of people} that God has chosen {to belong to him}. I sincerely love all of you believers. Not only do I myself love you, but all those who know and accept the true message {that Jesus taught} also love you.

#### By what title does the writer John introduce himself in this letter?

John introduces himself as the elder.

#### To whom is this letter written?

The letter is written to the elect lady and her children.

## 2 John 1:2

#### ULT

<sup>2</sup> because of the truth that remains in us and will be with us to eternity.

#### UST

<sup>2</sup> {We love you} because we have all accepted God's true message. This true message has become a part of us and will be with us forever.

#### ULT

<sup>3</sup> Grace, mercy, {and} peace will be with us from God the Father and from Jesus Christ, the Son of the Father, in truth and love.

#### UST

<sup>3</sup> God the Father and Jesus the Messiah, the Father's Son, will {continue to} act kindly and mercifully toward us and will make us peaceful. {They will do this because} they are truthful and they love {us}.

#### From whom does John say grace, mercy, and peace come?

John says grace, mercy, and peace come from God, the Father, and from Jesus Christ, his Son.

## 2 John 1:4

#### ULT

<sup>4</sup> I rejoiced greatly that I found some of your children walking in the truth, just as we have received a commandment from the Father.

#### UST

<sup>4</sup> I have learned that some of the believers from your congregation are living according to the true message {that God has taught us}. That made me very happy. This is just what our Father commanded us to do.

#### Why is John rejoicing?

John is rejoicing because he has found some of the lady's children walking in the truth.

## 2 John 1:5

#### ULT

<sup>5</sup> And now I ask you, lady—not as writing a new commandment to you, but what we have had from the beginning—that we should love one another.

#### UST

<sup>5</sup> And now, dear congregation, I ask you {to do what God commanded:} that we should love each other. I am not writing this to you as a new thing that God has commanded {us to do}. Instead, we have known this command to love each other from when we first believed in the Messiah.

#### What commandment does John say they have had from the beginning?

The commandment they have from the beginning is that they love one another.

#### ULT

<sup>6</sup> And this is love, that we should walk according to his commandments. This is the commandment, just as you heard from the beginning, that you should walk in it.

#### UST

<sup>6</sup> This is what it means to love {God and each other}. We should obey what God commands us to do. This is what God commands you, {to love each other,} so you need to do it. You have heard this from when you first believed in the Messiah.

#### What does John say that love is?

Love is to walk according to God's commandments.

## 2 John 1:7

#### ULT

<sup>7</sup> For many deceivers have gone out into the world, who do not confess Jesus Christ coming in flesh. This is the deceiver and the antichrist.

#### UST

<sup>7</sup> I say this because there are many people in this world who travel around, deceiving people. These deceptive people refuse to say that Jesus the Messiah came to the earth and was a man. This {teaching} comes from the {original} deceiver, the one who opposes the Messiah.

#### What does John call those who do not confess that Jesus Christ came in the flesh?

John calls them the deceiver and the antichrist.

## 2 John 1:8

#### ULT

<sup>8</sup> Watch yourselves, that you do not lose what we have worked for, but may receive a full reward.

#### UST

<sup>8</sup> Be careful so that you do not {let those teachers deceive you! If you let them deceive you, you will} lose the reward that we have worked for. So be careful to make sure that you receive the complete reward!

#### What does John tell the believers to be careful not to do?

John tells the believers to be careful not to lose what they have worked for.

#### ULT

<sup>9</sup> Everyone who goes beyond and does not remain in the teaching of Christ does not have God. The one who remains in the teaching, this one has both the Father and the Son.

#### UST

<sup>9</sup> Those who do not continue to believe and teach the things that the Messiah taught, but instead believe and teach other things, do not have {a true relationship with} God. But those who continue to believe and teach what the Messiah taught do have {a true relationship} both {with God,} our Father{,} and {with Jesus,} his Son.

## 2 John 1:10

#### ULT

<sup>10</sup> If anyone comes to you and does not bring this teaching, do not receive him into your house and do not say to him, "Greetings."

### UST

<sup>10</sup> So when anyone comes to you who teaches something different from what the Messiah taught, do not welcome him into your homes! Do not even greet him {or wish him well in any way, so that you do not encourage him}.

# What does John tell the believers to do with anyone who does not bring the true teaching about Christ?

They should not receive anyone who does not bring the true teaching about Christ.

## 2 John 1:11

#### ULT

<sup>11</sup> For the one who says to him, "Greetings," shares in his evil deeds.

#### UST

<sup>11</sup> If you greet these people respectfully, you are helping them to do the evil things that they do.

# Of what is a believer guilty if he receives someone who does not bring the true teaching about Christ?

The believer who receives and greets a false teacher shares in his evil deeds.

#### ULT

<sup>12</sup> Having many things to write to you, I did not want with paper and ink. However, I hope to come to you and to speak mouth to mouth, so that your joy might be made complete.

#### UST

<sup>12</sup> I have much more that I want to say to you. But I have decided not to write them to you in a letter. Instead, I hope to be with you soon and to talk with you personally. Then we will be completely joyful together.

#### What does John hope to do in the future?

John hopes to come and speak directly with the elect lady.

## 2 John 1:13

#### ULT

<sup>13</sup> The children of your chosen sister greet you.

### UST

<sup>13</sup> Your fellow believers in the congregation here, whom God has also chosen, greet you.
