2 Peter 1:1

ULT

¹ Simon Peter, a servant and an apostle of Jesus Christ, to the ones having received a faith equal in value with us, by {the} righteousness of our God and Savior Jesus Christ:

UST

¹ {I,} Simon Peter, serve Jesus the Messiah, and I am an apostle {whom he appointed}. {I am writing this letter} to you whom God has caused to believe {in the Messiah} just like he caused us {apostles} to believe {in the Messiah}. {Jesus has done this} by his righteous acts. Jesus the Messiah is our God, and he is the one who saves us.

Who wrote 2 Peter?

Simon Peter, a slave and apostle of Jesus Christ, wrote the letter or book we call 2 Peter.

To whom did Peter write?

Peter wrote to those who had received the same precious faith.

2 Peter 1:2

ULT

² May grace and peace be multiplied to you in {the} knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord.

UST

² I pray that God will increase his kind acts toward you and make you more peaceful because you know God and Jesus, {who is} our Lord.

2 Peter 1:3

ULT

³ As his divine power has given to us all the {things} for life and godliness through the knowledge of the one having called us through {his} glory and excellence,

UST

³ God has given us everything that we need in order to live a life that honors him. {He does this} by his power as God. (He does this) by what we know about him. God is the one who chose us (to be his people) by his glorious and excellent character.

How were all the things of divine power for life and godliness given to Peter and the recipients of faith?

They were given to them through the knowledge of God.

Why did God give Peter and the recipients of faith all the things of divine power for life and godliness, along with great and precious promises? (vv3-4)

He did that so that they might be sharers in the divine nature.

2 Peter 1:4

ULT

4 through which he has given to us the precious and great promises so that through them you might be sharers of {the} divine nature, having escaped the corruption in the world by lust,

UST

⁴ (By his glorious and excellent character,) God has promised that he will do priceless and great things for us. {He has done this} so that by {believing in} what he has promised, you will be able to act like God, {and} you will no longer suffer the moral corruption that is in the world through the desire to do sinful things.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

2 Peter 1:5

ULT

⁵ and now {for} this same {reason}, applying all diligence, supply in your faith, goodness; and in goodness, knowledge;

UST

⁵ Because God has done all that, do your best to not only believe in the Messiah, {but also} to do good things. {And make sure that you not only} do good things, {but that you also} learn more about God.

What were the recipients of faith ultimately supposed to gain through their faith? (vv5-7)

They were ultimately supposed to gain love through their faith.

2 Peter 1:6

ULT

⁶ and in knowledge, self-control; and in self-control, endurance; and in endurance, godliness;

UST

⁶ {And make sure that you do not only} learn more about God, {but that you also} control yourself {in what you do and say}. {And make sure that you do not only} control yourself {in what you do and say}, {but that you also} remain faithful to God in hardship. {And make sure that you do not only} remain faithful to God in hardship, {but that you also} honor him.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

2 Peter 1:7

ULT

⁷ and in godliness, brotherly affection; and in brotherly affection, love.

UST

⁷ {And make sure that you do not only} honor God, {but that you also} show affection to each other as family members. {And make sure that you do not only} show affection to each other as family members, {but that you also} love others.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

2 Peter 1:8

ULT

⁸ For these {things} existing and increasing in you cause you to be neither barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

UST

⁸ {Do these things,} because if you do all these things more and more, then they will make you productive with respect to your knowing our Lord Jesus the Messiah.

2 Peter 1:9

ULT

⁹ For he in whom these {things} are not present is blind, nearsighted, having received forgetfulness of the cleansing of his past sins.

UST

⁹ {Do these things,} because a person who does not do these things {is not aware that these things are important.} {This person is like} a blind person {who cannot see what is around him,} {or like} a nearsighted person {who can only see things that are close to him.} {This person has even} forgotten that God has forgiven him for the sinful things {he did} in the past.

What has the spiritually blind person forgotten?

He has forgotten the cleansing from his old sins.

2 Peter 1:10

ULT

¹⁰ Therefore, brothers, be even more diligent to make your calling and election sure, for doing these {things}, you will certainly not ever stumble.

UST

¹⁰ Consequently, you fellow believers, make even more effort to make sure that God has chosen you to be his people. If you do these things I have just told you about, then you will absolutely never become separated from God.

If the brothers did their best to make their calling and election sure, what would happen? (vv10-11)

They would not stumble, and an entrance would be granted to them into the eternal kingdom of their Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

2 Peter 1:11

ULT

¹¹ For in this way will be richly provided to you the entrance into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

UST

¹¹ {This is true} because, {by your doing} thus, God will wholeheartedly allow you to enter into the place where our Lord and Savior Jesus the Messiah will rule {his people} forever.

2 Peter 1:12

ULT

¹² Therefore, I will always remind you about these {things}, although you have known {them} and have been established in the present truth.

UST

¹² Consequently, {because these things are so important,} I am always prepared to keep on reminding you about these things. {I will remind you} even though you already know {them} and are firmly convinced of the true teaching that you now have.

Why did Peter think it was right for him to remind the brothers of these things? (vv12-14) Becuase their Lord Jesus Christ had shown him that he would soon remove his tent.

2 Peter 1:13

ULT

13 But I think (it is) right, as long as I am in this tent, to arouse you in remembrance,

UST

¹³ Nevertheless, I consider it to be right for me to keep reminding you {about these things} as long as I am alive.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

2 Peter 1:14

ULT

¹⁴ knowing that the putting off of my tent is imminent, just as also our Lord Jesus Christ revealed {this} to me.

UST

¹⁴ {I want to remind you of these things,} because I know that I shall die soon. {I shall die} just like our Lord Jesus the Messiah has made clear to me {previously}.

2 Peter 1:15

ULT

¹⁵ Likewise, I will be diligent to cause you to always have the remembrance of these {things} after my departure.

UST

¹⁵ In addition, I will make every effort {by writing these things down} to cause you to keep on remembering these things after I have died.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

2 Peter 1:16

ULT

¹⁶ For we did not make known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ {by} having followed cleverly invented myths, but {by} having become eyewitnesses of the majesty of that one.

UST

¹⁶ {I will do this} because, when we apostles told you that our Lord Jesus the Messiah is coming back in power {some day}, we were not basing {what we told you} on stories that we had cleverly made up. On the contrary, {we told you} what we saw with our own eyes, the divinely majestic Jesus.

What did those who were eyewitnesses of Jesus' majesty see? (vv16-17)

They saw that he received honor and glory from God the Father.

2 Peter 1:17

ULT

¹⁷ For he has received honor and glory from God {the} Father, such a voice having been brought to him by the Majestic Glory: "This is my Son, my Beloved, in whom I myself am well pleased."

UST

¹⁷ {I can say we were eyewitnesses} because {we were there when} God the Father honored him and glorified him, {when Jesus heard} a voice from the majestically glorious God. {And the voice said,} "This is my Son, whom I love very much. I am very pleased with him."

2 Peter 1:18

ULT

¹⁸ And we ourselves heard this voice, having been brought from heaven, being with him on the holy mountain.

UST

¹⁸ We ourselves also heard this voice of God that came from heaven when we were with Jesus on that sacred mountain.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

2 Peter 1:19

ULT

¹⁹ And we have the very certain prophetic word, to which you do well to pay attention, as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until {the} day might dawn and {the} morning star might rise in your hearts,

UST

¹⁹ And we have what the prophets wrote {previously}, {which is} absolutely reliable. Pay attention to what they wrote, because it is like a lamp that is shining in a dark place {that helps people see where they are going}. {That light} will shine until the day {of the return of the Messiah} dawns and {Jesus}, the star that appears before the morning, gives your minds greater understanding.

How can we be certain that the prophetic word is sure? (vv19-21)

Because written prophecy does not come from the reasoning of the prophet, nor any prophecy from the will of man, but by men carried along by the Holy Spirit who spoke from God.

2 Peter 1:20

ULT

²⁰ knowing this first, that every prophecy of scripture does not come from one's own interpretation.

UST

²⁰ Above all, you should know that no prophet could interpret {his prophecy} by his own imagination.

2 Peter 1:21

ULT

²¹ For no prophecy was ever brought by {the} will of man, but men being carried along by {the} Holy Spirit spoke from God.

UST

²¹ {This is true} because no one ever prophesied a {true} prophecy according to what a human wanted. On the contrary, those who spoke {prophecies} from God did so by the Holy Spirit guiding them.

2 Peter 2

2 Peter 2:1

ULT

¹ Now false prophets were also among the people, as false teachers will also be among you, who will bring in heresies of destruction, and denying the master who bought them, bringing swift destruction on themselves.

UST

¹ But people who falsely proclaimed {messages from God} were also amidst the Israelites. In the same way there will also be people who teach false {messages} amidst you. They will introduce opinions {that will result in} eternal condemnation. They will even reject their owner, {Jesus,} who redeemed them. {As a result of this,} God will soon condemn them {for eternity}.

What will false teachers secretly bring to the believers?

False teachers will bring destructive heresies to the believers.

What will come upon the false teachers?

False teachers will bring swift destruction upon themselves.

What will false teachers do with deceptive words? (vv1-3)

False teachers greedily make a profit off of the brothers.

2 Peter 2:2

ULT

² And many will follow their licentious acts, because of whom the way of truth will be slandered.

UST

² And many {people} will do the same unrestrained immoral acts {as these false teachers}. Because of these false teachers, {unbelievers} will speak evil of Christianity.

2 Peter 2:3

ULT

³ And in greed, they will exploit you with false words, for whom condemnation from long ago is not idle, and their destruction does not sleep.

UST

³ And due to their greedy hearts, {these false teachers} will make a profit off of you by telling you lies. God condemned them a long time ago, and God will certainly destroy them.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

2 Peter 2:4

ULT

⁴ For if God did not spare angels who had sinned, but, in chains of darkness throwing down to Tartarus, he handed over $\{those\}$ being kept for judgment; [1]

UST

⁴ {This judgment is certain} because God did not let the angels who acted sinfully remain unpunished. On the contrary, he threw them into hell {where they are} chained in darkness. God imprisoned {these sinful angels} there and is holding them there in order to judge them.

Who did God not spare? (vv4-6)

God did not spare the angels who sinned, the ancient world, and the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah.

2 Peter 2:5

ULT

⁵ and he did not spare {the} ancient world, but protected {the} eighth, Noah, a preacher of righteousness, having brought a flood upon {the} world of {the} ungodly {ones};

UST

⁵ And God did not let {the people who lived in} the world long ago remain unpunished. However, he preserved eight people, including Noah, who was a righteous herald, when he destroyed by a flood the ungodly {people who lived in the} world {at that time}.

Who did God preserve in the Flood?

God preserved Noah with seven others.

2 Peter 2:6

ULT

⁶ and {the} cities of Sodom and Gomorrah, having reduced to ashes, he condemned to destruction, having set an example {of the things that} are going to happen to {the} ungodly {ones};

UST

⁶ And God condemned the cities {called} Sodom and Gomorrah to be destroyed by burning them completely to ashes. {This resulted in God} making {those cities} an example of what will happen to people who dishonor God.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

2 Peter 2:7

ULT

⁷ and he rescued righteous Lot, being oppressed by the behavior of the lawless ones in licentiousness,

UST

⁷ And God rescued Lot, who was a righteous man. Lot was greatly distressed because of the unrestrained immoral acts of the people who acted lawlessly {in Sodom}.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

2 Peter 2:8

ULT

⁸ (for, by seeing and by hearing, {that} righteous {man}, living among them day from day, was tormenting {his} righteous soul by lawless works);

UST

⁸ (When he lived with those wicked people {in Sodom}, that righteous man Lot distressed himself every day by what he saw and heard. {He did so} because of the things people did that were against God's law.)

2 Peter 2:9

ULT

 9 {the} Lord knows how to rescue godly {ones} from a trial, and to keep {the} unrighteous {ones} to be punished in {the} day of judgment,

UST

⁹ {Since these things are all true, then you can be sure that} the Lord knows how to rescue people who honor him from being tried. And {the Lord also knows how} to keep those who do unrighteous deeds {ready} {in order} to punish them at the time when he judges.

What did God show by not sparing some and preserving others?

God's actions showed that the Lord knows how to rescue the godly men and how to keep the unrighteous men in custody.

2 Peter 2:10

ULT

¹⁰ but especially the ones going after {the} flesh in {its} lusts of defilement, and despising authority. Audacious {ones}! Self-willed {ones}! They do not tremble while insulting glorious {ones};

UST

¹⁰ And {he will punish} especially those who keep on doing what their sinful hearts want to do, {which are things that make them} displeasing to God. {These people} also scorn divine authority. How bold {they are}! They do whatever they wish! They are not even afraid to insult God's glorious angels.

Who were the glorious ones the ungodly men were unafraid to blaspheme? (vv10-11)

The glorious one were angels, who do not bring insulting judgments against men to the Lord.

2 Peter 2:11

ULT

¹¹ whereas angels, being greater in strength and power, do not bring an insulting judgment against them in the presence of {the} Lord.

UST

¹¹ But {God's} angels, {even though} they are much more powerful than these people, do not accuse glorious beings in an insulting manner in front of God!

2 Peter 2:12

ULT

¹² But these {men}, as unreasoning animals, having by nature been born for capture and destruction, slandering about {those things} in which they are ignorant, they will also be destroyed in their destruction,

UST

¹² However, these {false teachers} are like animals that cannot think rationally. According to the way they naturally behave, they were born so that others may capture and destroy them. They say bad things about things they do not even know. God will surely destroy them when it is time for their destruction.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

2 Peter 2:13

ULT

¹³ being harmed {as} wages of unrighteousness, considering {as} pleasure the reveling in {the} day, stains and blemishes, reveling in their deceptions while feasting with you; ^[2]

UST

¹³ {These false teachers} suffer harm as the proper punishment for their harmful deeds. {They are} pleased to party in an immoral manner {even} during the daytime. {Like} ugly stains {on one's clothing,} {they are disgraceful to your gatherings}! {They even} celebrate their deceptive deeds while eating {a meal} with you!

(There are no questions for this verse.)

2 Peter 2:14

ULT

¹⁴ having eyes full of an adulteress, and never ceasing from sin, enticing unstable souls, having hearts trained in covetousness, children of cursing.

UST

¹⁴ They constantly want to have immoral sexual relations with {every} woman {they see}. They cannot stop sinning. They lure spiritually weak people {into sin}. {As athletes train for sports, these false teachers} train themselves to be greedy. {God} has cursed them!

Who do the false teachers entice?

The false teachers entice unstable souls.

2 Peter 2:15

ULT

¹⁵ Abandoning {the} straight way, they have gone astray, having followed the way of Balaam of Bosor, who loved {the} wages of unrighteousness. ^[3]

UST

¹⁵ They refuse to live the way God wants them to. They are acting wickedly. They are imitating what Balaam, the son of Bosor, did {long ago}. He loved {to receive money as} payment for wicked deeds.

Who stopped the prophet Balaam's insanity? (vv15-16)

A mute donkey speaking in a human voice stopped Balaam.

2 Peter 2:16

ULT

¹⁶ But he had a rebuke for his own transgression—a mute donkey, having spoken in a voice of a man, restrained the irrationality of the prophet.

UST

¹⁶ However, God rebuked him for his wicked deed {against Israel}. {And even though donkeys do not speak}, God used {Balaam's} donkey to speak to him with a human voice and stop his foolish action.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

2 Peter 2:17

ULT

¹⁷ These {men} are waterless springs and mists driven by a storm, for whom the gloom of darkness has been reserved.

UST

¹⁷ These {false teachers} are {useless}, {like} springs that do not give water. {They are like} clouds that the storm pushes away {before they can give rain}. {God} has reserved the darkness {of hell} for them.

2 Peter 2:18

ULT

¹⁸ For, speaking arrogant {things} of vanity, they entice by lusts of {the} flesh, by licentious acts, the ones barely escaping from the ones living in error,

UST

¹⁸ {This is true} because they persuade people to sin who have recently {become believers and} stopped doing what wicked unbelievers do. {These false teachers do this} by speaking proud words that are not worth anything. {They persuade these people to sin} by doing whatever their sinful natures want to do.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

2 Peter 2:19

ULT

¹⁹ promising freedom to them, while themselves being slaves of destruction. (For by what someone has been overcome, by this he has been enslaved.)

UST

¹⁹ {They also do this} by telling their listeners that they are free to do whatever they want while, at the same time, they themselves are controlled {by their sinful desires} that will destroy them. {This is true} because the thing that overpowers a person's will takes control of that person.

To what is a man a slave?

A man is a slave to whatever overcomes him.

2 Peter 2:20

ULT

²⁰ For if, having escaped the defilements of the world through {the} knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, but, having been entangled again, they have been overcome by these {things}, for them the last {things} have become worse than the first {things}.

UST

²⁰ And if they have stopped doing the things that defile sinful human society by knowing the one who rules over us and saves us, Jesus the Messiah, but those {defiling things} {began to} control them again, {then} their situation is worse now than {it was} at first.

For those who escape the wickedness of the world through the knowledge of Jesus Christ and then return to them, what would be better? (vv20-21)

What would be better is for them not to have known the way of righteousness.

2 Peter 2:21

ULT

²¹ For it was better for them not to know the way of righteousness than, having known {it}, to turn away from the holy commandment {that} has been delivered to them.

UST

²¹ {This is because} it would have been better for them if they had never learned how to live in the way that pleases God than to learn {this way} and reject {God's} holy commands that {the apostles} taught them.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

2 Peter 2:22

ULT

²² {This} of the true proverb has happened to them: "A dog returns to its own vomit, and a washed pig to {the} rolling of mud."

2:4 [1]

2:13 [2]

2:15 ^[3]

UST

²² This is a true proverb {that describes} what has happened to {these false teachers}: "They are like dogs that return to eat their own vomit," and, "They are like pigs that have washed themselves and then roll again in the mud."

2 Peter 3

2 Peter 3:1

ULT

¹ Beloved ones, this {is} now a second letter I write to you, in which I arouse your pure mind in remembrance,

UST

¹ Fellow believers whom I love, this {letter} that I am now writing to you is the second letter {that I have written to you}. {I have written} both {of these letters to you} to remind you of the things that your sincere minds already know.

Why did Peter write this second letter? (vv1-2)

He wrote so that the beloved might recall the words said before by the prophets and about the command of their Lord and Savior.

2 Peter 3:2

ULT

² to remember the words spoken previously by the holy prophets and the command of the Lord and Savior through your apostles,

UST

² {I have written these letters} in order to remind you of the prophecies that the holy prophets spoke a long time ago. {I also want you} to remember what the one who rules over us and saves us has commanded you through the teaching of the apostles {whom we sent to} you.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

2 Peter 3:3

ULT

³ knowing this first, that mockers will come with mockery in the last days, going according to their own lusts,

UST

³ It is important for you to understand that people who mock will come and mock {the return of Jesus} during the time shortly before Jesus returns. {Those people} will do whatever they want to do.

What would mockers say in the last days? (vv3-4)

Mockers would question the promise of Jesus' return and say that all things remain the same since the beginning of creation.

2 Peter 3:4

ULT

⁴ and saying, "Where is the promise of his coming? For since the fathers fell asleep, all things continue in the same way from {the} beginning of creation."

UST

⁴ {These mockers} will say, "Jesus' promise to return is not true! {We know this} because since Israel's ancestors died, everything has remained the same. It has been the same way since God created everything!"

(There are no questions for this verse.)

2 Peter 3:5

ULT

⁵ For this is hidden {from} them willingly, that {the} heavens existed long ago, and {the} earth had been formed out of water and through water by the word of God,

UST

⁵ {They will say this} because they deliberately ignore that God caused the heavens to exist a long time ago by commanding it to be so, and he caused the earth to come out from water and up through water {by commanding it to be so}.

How were the heavens and earth established, and how were they being reserved for fire and for the day of judgment and the destruction of ungodly people? (vv5-7)

They were established and reserved by the word of God.

2 Peter 3:6

ULT

⁶ through which the world at that time perished, having been flooded by water.

UST

⁶ And God, by his command and by water, destroyed the world that existed at that time. {He did so} by flooding the earth with water.

2 Peter 3:7

ULT

⁷ But the present heavens and the earth, by the same word, are having been reserved for fire, being kept for a day of judgment and destruction of the ungodly men.

UST

⁷ However, God, by the same command, has set apart the heavens and the earth that exist now for fire. God is keeping them for the time when he will judge and destroy people who act wickedly.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

2 Peter 3:8

ULT

⁸ But let this one {thing} not be hidden {from} you, beloved ones, that one day with {the} Lord {is} like 1,000 years, and 1,000 years {are} like one day.

UST

⁸ Fellow believers whom I love, do not ignore this one truth: from God's perspective a short period of time is no different from a long period of time!

(There are no questions for this verse.)

2 Peter 3:9

ULT

⁹ {The} Lord does not delay {concerning} the promise, as some consider delay, but is patient toward you, not wanting any to perish, but all to move on to repentance.

UST

⁹ The Lord is not acting slowly to fulfill his promise of Jesus' return. Some people think {that this is so}. On the contrary, God is being patient with you, because he does not want any of you to be punished eternally. Rather, he wants everyone to repent.

Why was the Lord patient towards the beloved?

Because he desires that they not perish, but have time for all to repent.

2 Peter 3:10

ULT

¹⁰ But {the} day of {the} Lord will come as a thief, in which the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and {the} elements will be destroyed, being burned up, and {the} earth and the deeds in it will be found.

UST

¹⁰ In contrast {to what those mockers say}, the time when the Lord returns will come unexpectedly. At that time there will be a great roaring sound and the heavens will cease to exist. God will also destroy the basic elements of nature by fire. Then God will reveal the earth and everything that has been done in it.

How will the day of the Lord come?

The day of the Lord will come like a thief.

2 Peter 3:11

ULT

¹¹ All of these {things} being thus destroyed, of what sort is it necessary for you to be in holy behaviors and godliness,

UST

¹¹ Since God will destroy all these things {I have just mentioned} in the way {I have described}, you must certainly behave in a holy manner and do what pleases God.

Why did Peter ask the beloved what kind of people they should be in respect to holy living and godliness? (vv11-13)

Because the heavens and earth would be destroyed, and because they expected righteousness to live in the new heavens and new earth.

2 Peter 3:12

ULT

¹² waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which {the} heavens, being set on fire, will be destroyed, and {the} elements, being burned up by heat, will be melted?

UST

¹² {Do these things} while expecting and trying to speed up the time of Jesus' return. On account of that day, God will destroy the heavens with fire and melt the basic elements of nature with heat.

2 Peter 3:13

ULT

¹³ But new heavens and a new earth, according to his promise, we are waiting for, in which righteousness dwells.

UST

¹³ {Although all those events will happen,} we are expecting the new heavens and new earth that God has promised to create. Everyone will be righteous in that new universe.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

2 Peter 3:14

ULT

¹⁴ Therefore, beloved ones, while waiting for these {things}, be diligent to be found spotless and blameless by him, in peace.

UST

¹⁴ Because this is true, fellow believers whom I love, while you are waiting for these things {to happen}, do your best to make sure that Jesus will see that you are not living sinfully {and that you are} at peace {with God}.

(There are no questions for this verse.)

2 Peter 3:15

ULT

¹⁵ And consider the patience of our Lord {to be} salvation, just as also our beloved brother Paul wrote to you according to the wisdom having been given to him,

UST

¹⁵ And think about this: Our Lord Jesus is patient so that more people can be saved. Paul, a fellow believer whom we love, has also said this when he wrote to you. He wrote using the wisdom that God gave him.

What will happen to ignorant and unknowledgeable men who distort the wisdom given to Paul and distort other Scriptures? (vv15-16)

Their actions will result in their own destruction.

2 Peter 3:16

ULT

¹⁶ as also in all the letters, speaking in them about these {things}, in which are some difficult to understand things, which the ignorant and unstable distort, as also the other scriptures, to their own destruction.

UST

¹⁶ In all the letters that Paul wrote, he also writes about these things {that I have just mentioned}. In his letters are also some {teachings} that are difficult to understand.
