Deuteronomy 1:1

ULT	UST
<i>These {are} the words that Moses spoke to all Israel across the Jordan in the wilderness, in the Arabah opposite Suph, between Paran and between Tophel and Laban and Hazeroth and Di Zahab.</i>	<i>In this book are speeches that Moses said to all the Israelites. He spoke to them after they had set up their tents east of the Jordan River. They were in the desert plain along the Jordan near a place named Suph. Suph is between the desert of Paran {on one side of the Jordan River} and the towns of Tophel, Laban, Hazeroth, and Di Zahab {on the other side of the river}.</i>

Where was Moses when he spoke to Israel?

Moses was east of the Jordan in the wilderness, in the plain of the Jordan River valley.

Deuteronomy 1:3

ULT	UST
<i>And it happened, in the fortieth year, in the eleventh month, on {day} one of the month, Moses spoke to the sons of Israel according to all that Yahweh commanded him concerning them,</i>	<i>Forty years had passed since the Israelites had left Egypt, and it was the first day of the eleventh month. Moses told the Israelite people everything that Yahweh had commanded him to tell them.</i>

When did Moses speak to the people of Israel, telling them all that Yahweh commanded him?

Moses spoke to the people in the fortieth year after they had left Egypt.

Deuteronomy 1:8

ULT	UST
<i>Look, I have given the land to your faces. Go and possess the land that Yahweh swore to your fathers, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, to give to them and to their seed after them.'</i>	<i>Know that I will give that land to you. I, Yahweh, promised the land to your ancestors Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. I promised that I would give it to them and to their descendants. So go and occupy it.'</i>

To whom had Yahweh promised to give the land?

Yahweh had promised to give the land to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob and to their descendants.

Deuteronomy 1:9-10

Why did Moses feel he could not govern the people alone?

There were too many of them since God had multiplied them and made them as numerous as the stars of the heavens.

Deuteronomy 1:13

ULT	UST
<i>Nominate for yourselves wise and understanding and well-known men from your tribes, and I will appoint them as your heads.'</i>	<i>So choose some men from your tribes who are wise and who have good sense and whom people respect. Then I will assign them to be your leaders.'</i>

Who would help Moses solve all the problems and disputes of the people?

The people would choose wise, understanding, and well-known men from each tribe and appoint these men leaders to help Moses.

Deuteronomy 1:16

ULT	UST
<i>And I commanded your judges at that time, saying, 'Listen in between your brothers, and you should judge righteously between a man and between his brother, and between his foreigner.'</i>	<i>Then, I instructed your leaders, 'Listen when your people are quarreling. Consider each case fairly, including cases where Israelites quarrel with each other. Also consider cases where an Israelite quarrels with someone from another land who lives among you.'</i>

What did Moses command the judges to do?

He commanded them to hear and judge righteously concerning the quarrels and cases the Israelites had with each other or with any foreigner who lived among them.

Deuteronomy 1:19

ULT	UST
<i>And we journeyed from Horeb and went through all that great and terrible wilderness that you saw on the way to the hill {country} of the Amorites, as Yahweh our God had commanded us; and we came to Kadesh Barnea.</i>	<i>Then, just as Yahweh our God told us to do, we left Horeb. We went through a huge and dangerous wilderness. The wilderness was on the road to the hilly area where the Amorite people live. We arrived at Kadesh Barnea.</i>

Where did Israel travel through as they journeyed from Horeb to the hill country?

They traveled through all the great and terrible wilderness.

Deuteronomy 1:22

ULT	UST
<i>And you drew near to me, all of you, and you said, 'Let us send men to our faces, and they shall spy out the land for us, and return to us a word {about} the way which we will go up into and the cities which we will come to.'</i>	<i>But your fathers all came to me and said, 'We should first send some men ahead of us to explore the land. Then, they can return and tell us which will be the best road to go there and what kind of towns are there.'</i>

What did the people ask Moses to do before they would enter the land?

They asked Moses to send men ahead to explore the land and report back about it.

Deuteronomy 1:23

ULT	UST
<i>And the word was good in my eyes, and I took from you 12 men, one man per tribe.</i>	<i>I thought that what they had planned was good, so I chose 12 men, one man from each tribe.</i>

Who did Moses choose to scout out the land?

He chose one man from each of the 12 tribes.

Deuteronomy 1:25

ULT	UST
<i>And they took with their hands from the fruit of the land and brought {it} down to us. And they returned to us a word and said, 'Good {is} the land that Yahweh our God is giving to us.'</i>	<i>They picked some of the fruit that they found there and brought it to us. They reported that the land that Yahweh our God was giving to us was very good.</i>

What did the men report back about the land?

They reported that the land that Yahweh was giving them was good.

Deuteronomy 1:27

ULT	UST
<i>And you grumbled in your tents and said, 'In the hatred of Yahweh against us he brought us from the land of Egypt to give us into the hand of the Amorites to destroy us.'</i>	<i>Your parents stayed in their tents and complained. They said, 'Yahweh hates us, so he has brought us here from Egypt to allow the Amorite people to destroy us.'</i>

What were the people grumbling against Yahweh about?

They said Yahweh hated them and he brought them out of the land of Egypt to destroy them.

Deuteronomy 1:28

ULT	UST
<i>Where {can} we go up? Our brothers have caused our heart to melt, saying, "The people {are} greater and taller than us, {with} cities great and fortified to the heavens; and also, we have seen the sons of the Anakites there."</i>	<i>We do not want to go there. The men whom we sent there have caused us to become very afraid. They have told us that the people there are stronger and bigger than we are. They said that there are very high walls around their towns. They also said that they saw giants there that are descendants of Anak.'</i>

What did the spies say about the people of the land?

They said that the people of the land were stronger and taller than the Israelites and had fortified cities.

Deuteronomy 1:29-31

What did Moses say was the reason the people did not need to be afraid?

He told them not to be afraid, because Yahweh would go before them and would fight for them like he did in Egypt and in the wilderness.

Deuteronomy 1:34-36

What did Yahweh say when he became angry?

He said that not one of these men would see the good land except Caleb.

Deuteronomy 1:38

ULT	UST
<i>Joshua, the son of Nun, who stands to your face, he will go in there; encourage him, for he will cause Israel to inherit it.</i>	<i>Joshua son of Nun, who is your helper, will enter it. Support him, because he will enable the Israelite people to occupy that land.'</i>

What did Yahweh tell Moses to do for Joshua, the son of Nun?

Yahweh told Moses to encourage Joshua for he would lead Israel to occupy the land.

Deuteronomy 1:39

ULT	UST
<i>And your children that you said would be plunder, and your sons who today do not know good or evil, they will go in there. And to them I will give it, and they will possess it.</i>	<i>Yahweh continued to declare, 'You said that your enemies would capture your children, {but this did not happen}. Your children are very young, so they do not yet know what is good and what is evil. However, they are the ones who will enter that land. I will give them the land, and they will occupy it.</i>

Who did Yahweh say will go into the land and possess it?

He said their children will go in and will possess the land.

Deuteronomy 1:42-43

What did the people do when Yahweh told them not to attack the hill country?

They were arrogant and went up to the hill country to fight anyway.

Deuteronomy 2

Deuteronomy 2:1

ULT	UST
<i>And we turned and journeyed into the wilderness on the way to the Sea of Reeds, as Yahweh had spoken to me. And we went around Mount Seir many days.</i>	<i>Then we turned around and went through the desert toward the Sea of Reeds as Yahweh told us to do. We wandered near Mount Seir for a long time.</i>

Where did Moses say they journeyed?

They journeyed into the wilderness on the way to the Sea of Reeds.

Deuteronomy 2:4-5

What did Yehweh command the people to be careful not to do?

They were not to fight the descendants of Esau, who live near Mount Seir, for Yahweh had given that land to them.

Deuteronomy 2:6

ULT	UST
<i>You will buy food from them with silver, and you will eat. And also, you will purchase water from them with silver, and you will drink.”</i>	<i>{When you travel near their land}, buy food and water from them.’</i>

How were they to get food and water?

They were to buy food and water from the people living there so they could eat and drink.

Deuteronomy 2:9

ULT	UST
<i>And Yahweh said to me, ‘You shall not trouble Moab, and you shall not fight against them {in} battle, for I will not give to you from its land a possession, because I have given Ar to the sons of Lot, {as} a possession.”</i>	<i>Yahweh said to me, ‘Do not bother the people of Moab by starting to fight against them, because I am not going to give you any of their land. The reason is that they are descendants of Lot. I gave them the city of Ar, {their capital, and the other areas in that country}.”</i>

What did Yahweh tell them they were not to do in Moab?

They were not to trouble or fight with the people of Moab because Yahweh had given that land to them.

Deuteronomy 2:14

ULT	UST
<i>And the days which we came from Kadesh Barnea until we crossed the wadi of Zered {were} 38 years, until all the generation of the men of war were finished from among the camp, as Yahweh had sworn to them.</i>	<i>It had been 38 years from the time we first left Kadesh Barnea until we crossed Zered Gorge. During those years, all the fighting men of that generation of Israelites died, as Yahweh had solemnly said would happen.</i>

How long did it take Israel to go from Kadesh Barnea to the wadi of Zered?

It took them 38 years from when they left until they crossed wadi of Zered.

Deuteronomy 2:16

ULT	UST
<i>And it happened, when all the men of war came to an end, dying from among the people,</i>	<i>After all the men who had been old enough to fight had died,</i>

What happened to all the men who had been old enough to fight?

All the men who had been old enough to fight had died.

Deuteronomy 2:19

ULT	UST
<i>And you will approach on the other side of the sons of Ammon. You shall not trouble them, and you shall not fight them, for I will not give to you from the land of the sons of Ammon {as} a possession, because I have given it to the sons of Lot {as} a possession.’”</i>	<i>When you come near the border of the land where the descendants of Ammon live, do not bother them or start to fight against them. The reason is that they are also descendants of Lot, so I am not going to give you any of the land that I have given to them.’”</i>

To whom had Yahweh given the land where the people of Ammon were living?

Yahweh had given that land to the descendants of Lot.

Deuteronomy 2:25

ULT	UST
<i>This day I will begin to put the fear of you and the terror of you on the faces of the peoples under all the heavens, that they might hear a report of you and might quake and tremble from your face.'</i>	<i>Today I will begin to cause everyone, everywhere to be afraid of you. Everyone who hears about you will be very afraid of you.'</i>

What will the people of the land do when they hear news about the Israelites?

They will tremble and be afraid because of what they hear about the Israelites.

Deuteronomy 2:26-27

What words of peace did Moses send to Sihon, king of Heshbon?

Moses asked that they be allowed to pass through his land, staying on the road and not turning to the right or left.

Deuteronomy 2:28

ULT	UST
<i>You will sell me food for silver, and I will eat. And give to me water for silver, and I will drink. Only let me pass through on my feet</i>	<i>We will pay you for food and water. We want only to walk through your land</i>

How did Moses plan to get food and water for the people?

He asked the king to sell him food and water so the Israelites could eat and drink.

Deuteronomy 2:32-33

What happened when Sihon came out to fight against Moses and his people?

Yahweh allowed Moses and his people to defeated him, killing him, his son, and all his people.

Deuteronomy 2:34

ULT	UST
<i>And we captured all his cities at that time and devoted every city, men and the women and the children; we left no survivor.</i>	<i>We captured and destroyed all of King Sihon's cities. {We killed} the men, women, and children. We did not allow any of them to remain alive.</i>

What happened to all the king's cities?

Moses captured all the king's cities and destroyed them, including women and children, leaving no survivors.

Deuteronomy 3

Deuteronomy 3:1

ULT	UST
<i>And we turned and went up the road of the Bashan. And Og, the king of the Bashan, came out against us, he and all his people, to the battle {at} Edrei.</i>	<i>Then we turned north and went toward the region of Bashan. Og, the king of that area, and all his soldiers marched south to fight against us at the city of Edrei.</i>

What did Og, the king of Bashan, do to Israel as they approached his land?

As Israel approached the land of Bashan, the king and all his soldiers came and attacked them.

Deuteronomy 3:3

ULT	UST
<i>And Yahweh our God also gave Og, the king of Bashan, and all his people into our hands. And we struck him down until not a survivor of his remained.</i>	<i>So Yahweh our God caused us to defeat King Og and his soldiers. We killed them all. We did not allow any of them to remain alive.</i>

What did Israel do to the king of Bashan and his people?

They defeated the king of Bashan, killing him and all his people, leaving no survivors.

Deuteronomy 3:7

ULT	UST
<i>But all the cattle and the spoil of the cities we plundered for ourselves.</i>	<i>But from those cities we took for ourselves all the livestock and valuable things.</i>

What did Israel do with the cattle and the spoil of the cities?

They took for themselves all the cattle and the spoil of the cities.

Deuteronomy 3:12-13

To whom did Moses give the land that they had captured?

He gave it to the Reubenites, the Gadites, and half of the tribe of Manasseh.

Deuteronomy 3:18

ULT	UST
<i>And I commanded you at that time, saying, ‘Yahweh your God has given to you this land to possess it. The girded ones, all sons of bravery, will cross over to the faces of your brothers, the sons of Israel.</i>	<i>At that time, I told you three tribes, ‘Yahweh our God is giving you this land east of the Jordan River. So now, your soldiers must cross the Jordan River ahead of the men from the other Israelite tribes. {Help them to conquer the land}.</i>

What did Moses command the men of war of the Reubenites, the Gadites, and half of the tribe of Manasseh to do?

He commanded them to cross over the Jordan River to help the rest of the people of Israel conquer that land.

Deuteronomy 3:20

ULT	UST
<i>until Yahweh causes your brothers, as you, to have rest. And they will possess, they also, the land that Yahweh your God is giving to them across the Jordan. And you will return, {every} man, to his inheritance that I have given to you.’</i>	<i>{Your men must help} your fellow Israelites until Yahweh enables them to live there peacefully. Help them until they also capture all of the land that Yahweh our God is giving to them, which is on the west side of the Jordan River, just as he did for you {here on the east side of the river}. After that, you all may return to this land that I have allotted to you.’</i>

When did Yahweh say the Reubenites, the Gadites, and half of the tribe of Manasseh could return to their own land?

Yahweh said they could return to their own land after the rest of the Israelites captured the land that God was giving to them.

Deuteronomy 3:22

ULT	UST
<i>Do not fear them, for Yahweh your God, he, he {is} the one fighting for you.’</i>	<i>Do not be afraid of those people, because Yahweh our God is the one who will fight on your behalf.’</i>

What did Moses tell Joshua not to do?

He told Joshua not to fear the enemy because Yahweh would be the one who would fight for him.

Deuteronomy 3:25

ULT	UST
<i>Let me cross, please, and see the good land that {is} across the Jordan, that good hill {country}, and Lebanon.'</i>	<i>So please allow me to cross the Jordan River. Let me see the good land on the west side, the good hilly area, and the mountains in Lebanon.'</i>

What did Moses ask Yahweh to allow him to do?

He asked Yahweh to let him go see the good land across the Jordan River and in Lebanon.

Deuteronomy 3:26

ULT	UST
<i>But Yahweh was angry with me because of you, and he did not listen to me. And Yahweh said to me, 'Enough for you—you shall not continue speaking to me again on this matter.'</i>	<i>But Yahweh was angry with me because of what your parents had done. He would not pay attention to me. Instead, he said, 'That is enough {talk} from you! Do not talk to me about that again!'</i>

How did Yahweh respond to Moses' request to go and see the land?

Yahweh was angry with Moses because of what the people had done and did not listen to his request.

Deuteronomy 3:27

ULT	UST
<i>Go up the head of Pisgah and lift up your eyes westward and northward and southward and eastward. And look with your eyes, for you will not cross this Jordan.</i>	<i>Climb up to the top of Mount Pisgah. Then look toward the west, east, north, and south. Look at it all carefully because you will not cross the Jordan River {to see the land from there}.</i>

What did Yahweh allow Moses to do?

Yahweh told him to go up to the top of Mount Pisgah and look all around from there, for he would not cross the Jordan River.

Deuteronomy 3:28-29

What did Yahweh tell Moses to do for Joshua?

He told Moses to instruct, encourage, and strengthen Joshua, because he would lead the people across the river to occupy the land that he could see.

Deuteronomy 4

Deuteronomy 4:1

ULT	UST
<i>And now, Israel, listen to the statutes and to the ordinances that I will teach you to do so that you will live and go in and possess the land that Yahweh, the God of your fathers, is giving to you.</i>	<i>Now, you Israelite people, obey all the rules and regulations that I will teach you. If you do that, you will remain alive. You will be able to enter and occupy the land that Yahweh, the God whom your ancestors worshiped, is giving to you.</i>

What must the people of Israel do so that they may live and go in and possess the land that Yahweh is giving them?

They must listen and obey the laws that Moses will teach them so that they may possess the land.

Deuteronomy 4:2

ULT	UST
<i>Do not add onto the word that I command you, and do not take from them, keeping the commandments of Yahweh your God that I am commanding you.</i>	<i>Do not change the words of my commands to you. Obey all the commands of Yahweh our God that I am giving to you.</i>

What does Moses instruct the people not to do?

They must not add to or take away from the words of the commands Moses is giving them so they will obey the commandments of Yahweh.

Deuteronomy 4:3

ULT	UST
<i>Your eyes have seen what Yahweh did in Baal Peor; for all the men who walked after the Baal of Peor, Yahweh your God has destroyed them from your midst.</i>	<i>You have seen what Yahweh did at Baal Peor, for example, when he destroyed all the people who worshiped {the god} Baal there.</i>

What happened to the men who were worshiping Baal?

Yahweh destroyed the men that worshiped the Baal of Peor.

Deuteronomy 4:6

ULT	UST
<i>And you shall keep and do {them}, for it {is} your wisdom and your understanding in the eyes of the peoples who will hear all these statutes and may say, 'Surely this great nation {is} a wise and understanding people.'</i>	<i>Obey them faithfully because, if you do that, you will show the people of other nations that you are very wise. When they hear about all these rules, they will say, 'The people of this great nation of Israel are certainly very wise!'</i>

What will be the result of Israel keeping the rules that Moses commanded them?

The people around them will notice that because they keep these rules, they are a nation that has wisdom and understanding.

Deuteronomy 4:9

ULT	UST
<i>Only guard yourself and guard your soul strongly, lest you forget the things which your eyes have seen, and lest they retreat from your heart all the days of your life. But make them known to your sons and to the sons of your sons.</i>	<i>But be very careful! Do not forget what you have seen God do. Remember those things as long as you are alive. Tell them to your children and your grandchildren.</i>

What should the people do so that they do not forget what God has done?

They should guard themselves by remembering the things God has done and telling them to their children and their grandchildren.

Deuteronomy 4:11-12

What did the people hear out of the middle of the fire on the mountain?

They heard Yahweh's voice out of the middle of the fire but did not see him.

Deuteronomy 4:13

ULT	UST
<i>And he declared to you his covenant that he commanded you to do, the Ten Words. And he wrote them on two tablets of stone.</i>	<i>And he declared to them his covenant that he wants you also to obey. He gave them the Ten Commandments. He wrote those on two stone tablets.</i>

What was the covenant written on that Yahweh commanded them to obey?

The Ten Commandments that Yahweh gave to Moses for the people to obey were written on two tablets of stone.

Deuteronomy 4:16

ULT	UST
<i>lest you act corruptly, and make for yourselves an idol of the form of any image, a likeness of male or female,</i>	<i>Do not sin by making for yourselves any carved figure! Do not make anything that resembles the likeness of anything: man, woman,</i>

What were the people told not to do so as to not act corruptly?

They were told not to make any carved figures or idols of any thing.

Deuteronomy 4:19

ULT	UST
<i>And lest you lift up your eyes to the heavens and see the sun and the moon and the stars, all the multitude of the heavens, and be seduced and bow down to them and serve them, those which Yahweh your God has allotted for all the peoples under all the heavens.</i>	<i>Do not look up toward the sky and desire to worship anything that you see there, the sun or the moon or the stars. Yahweh our God has given those to {help} all people everywhere.</i>

Why did Moses tell the people to be careful about the sun, moon, and stars?

He told them that they should be careful to not be seduced to worship the heavens, sun, moon, or stars.

Deuteronomy 4:20

ULT	UST
<i>And Yahweh has taken you and brought you out of the furnace of iron, from Egypt, to be a people of his inheritance, as this day.</i>	<i>Yahweh has brought your families out of Egypt, where they were suffering as though they were in a blazing furnace. That is so that they would be people who belong to him, which is what you are today.</i>

Why did Yahweh bring the people out of Egypt?

He brought them out of Egypt to be a people who belong to him.

Deuteronomy 4:21

ULT	UST
<i>And Yahweh was angry with me on account of your words. And he swore I would not cross the Jordan, and I would not go in to the good land that Yahweh your God is giving to you {as} an inheritance.</i>	<i>But Yahweh was angry with me because of what your parents did. He declared that I would never enter the land that he is giving to you.</i>

What did Yahweh declare to Moses because he was angry with him?

He declared that Moses would not cross the Jordan River into the good land.

Deuteronomy 4:23-24

Why did Yahweh forbid Israel to make any carved figure or idol?

Yahweh their God is a jealous God and wants them to worship only him.

Deuteronomy 4:25-26

What does Moses say will happen if the people corrupt themselves and do evil in Yahweh's sight?

They will perish in the land over the Jordan and be completely destroyed.

Deuteronomy 4:27

ULT	UST
<i>And Yahweh will scatter you among the peoples, and you will be left men of {small} number in the nations, where Yahweh will drive you there.</i>	<i>Yahweh will force the rest of you to go and live among the people of many other nations. Only a few of you will survive there.</i>

What does Moses say Yahweh will do to the people if they worship idols?

Yahweh will scatter them among other nations and only a few would survive.

Deuteronomy 4:29

ULT	UST
<i>And from there you will search for Yahweh your God, and you will find {him} when you seek him with all your heart and with all your soul.</i>	<i>But while you are there, you will try to know Yahweh your God. If you try with all that you are to know him, he will answer you.</i>

When will the people find Yahweh?

They will find him when they search for him with all their heart and all their soul.

Deuteronomy 4:30

ULT	UST
<i>When {there is} trouble for you, and you find all these things in the later days, then you will return to Yahweh your God and listen to his voice.</i>	<i>In the future, when people mistreat you {there} and all those {bad} things happen to you, you will again worship only Yahweh and obey him.</i>

What will make the people return to Yahweh their God and listen to his voice?

When they are in trouble and when all the bad things have come on them, they will return to Yahweh.

Deuteronomy 4:34

ULT	UST
<i>Or has God attempted to go and take for himself a nation from the midst of {another} nation, by trials, by signs and by wonders and by war and by a mighty hand and by an outstretched arm and by great terrors, as everything that Yahweh your God did for you in Egypt before your eyes?</i>	<i>Certainly God has never before tried to take a huge group of people from one nation {to another location} as he did for us when he brought us out of Egypt. We saw Yahweh our God use his power when he performed miracles, sent plagues, terrified people, and fought the Egyptians for us.</i>

What did God do for the people when they were in Egypt?

God chose for himself all these people from the midst of another nation, by using his great power when he performed miracles, sent plagues, and fought the Egyptians for them.

Deuteronomy 4:35-36

What did Yahweh do to show the people that he alone is God?

He allowed them to hear his voice speak from heaven, and on earth he made them see his great fire and hear his voice coming from it.

Deuteronomy 4:37-38

What did Yahweh do for Israel because he loved their ancestors?

He chose their descendants and brought them out of Egypt with his great power. He gave them their land after driving out the more powerful nations.

Deuteronomy 4:41-42

Where could a person flee if he killed another person accidentally?

He could flee to one of the three cities that Moses had selected on the east side of the Jordan River.

Deuteronomy 4:44-45

What was included in the law that Moses gave the people of Israel?

He gave them the law which included all the instructions, rules, and regulations that he told them when they came out of Egypt.

Deuteronomy 4:46-47

From which two kings did Moses and his people take land on the east side of the Jordan River?

The Israelites took the land of Sihon, king of the Amorites, and Og, king of Bashan.

Deuteronomy 5:2

ULT	UST
<i>Yahweh our God cut a covenant with us at Horeb.</i>	<i>When we were at Mount Horeb, Yahweh our God made a covenant with us.</i>

Where did Yahweh make his covenant with the people?

Yahweh made his covenant with the people of Israel at Horeb.

Deuteronomy 5:4-5

Why did Moses stand between Yahweh and the people when Yahweh revealed his word to them?

They were afraid of the fire from which Yahweh was speaking so Moses stood between them in order to tell them what he said.

Deuteronomy 5:6

ULT	UST

He told them that he is Yahweh their God, who brought them from the land of Egypt and freed them from slavery.

What does God tell Israel not make, bow down to, or serve?

They should not make carved figures of any likeness of anything that is in the sky, on earth, or in the water. If they do, God will punish them and their descendants.

Deuteronomy 5:10

<i>But I show covenant faithfulness to thousands, to lovers of me and to keepers of my commandments.</i>	<i>However, I will faithfully love forever all of those who love me and obey my commandments.</i>

What will Yahweh do for those who love him and keep his commandments?

He will show covenant faithfulness to those who love him and obey his commandments.

Who will Yahweh not leave unpunished?

He will not leave unpunished those who use his name for wrong purposes.

What does Yahweh say about the seventh day?

The seventh day is a day of rest which is dedicated to Yahweh their God, so they must not do any work.

They should not murder, commit adultery, steal, or give false witness.

What did the people say they would do when Moses tells them everything that Yahweh says?

They said they will listen and obey Yahweh's word.

What did Yahweh say about the response of the people?

Yahweh said he heard what the people said and that what they had spoken was good.

What did Moses say would happen to the people if they did all that Yahweh had commanded them?

Yahweh will become angry with them and he will destroy them completely if they worship the gods of the people around them.

Why should the people fear Yahweh?

They should fear him so that things will go well for them and so that he will protect them as a nation.

What must the people do to the people of the land that Yahweh is bringing them into?

They must defeat them and destroy them completely.

Deuteronomy 7:2-3

What must the Israelites not do with the people of those nations?

They are not to make any covenants with them, show them mercy, or arrange any marriages with them for their sons or daughters.

Deuteronomy 7:5

How should Israel deal with anything associated with the idols of the people of these nations?

They should break down their altars, smash their sacred stone pillars, cut down their Asherah poles, and burn their idols.

That is why he rescued you by his great power from slavery in Egypt and from Pharaoh, the king of Egypt.</i>

Did Yahweh keep his oath to their ancestors?

Yahweh kept his oath and rescued them from slavery to Pharaoh in Egypt.

What will Yahweh do with those who love him and keep his commandments?

Yahweh will keep his covenants with those who love him and keep his commandments and faithfully love them forever.

In what ways will the people be blessed by Yahweh if they keep his decrees?

God will love them and bless them and multiply them by giving them many children, crops, and animals.

What will God do to the nations of whom Israel is afraid?

God will make them experience the same kinds of great trials and other displays of his power that they saw in Egypt.

God will greatly confuse them in battle and cause them to panic until they are destroyed.

<i>You shall burn idols of their gods in fire, do not covet silver and gold on them and take {it} for yourself, lest you become trapped by it, for it {is} an abomination to Yahweh your God.</i>	<i>You must burn the carved figures {that represent} their gods. Do not desire to take the silver or gold {decorations} that are on those idols. If you take them for yourselves, they will be like a trap {to cause you to disobey God}. Yahweh hates every part of those idols.</i>

What are they to do to the idols of the gods of the nations?

They are to burn the idols and not even keep the gold or silver they are made of, as they are to be completely destroyed.

What should the people of Israel remember?

They should remember all the ways that Yahweh led them over those 40 years in the wilderness. He was testing them to find out if they would obey his commandments or not.

He allowed them to be hungry and then fed them manna so that they would know that they could not live only by having enough food to eat but also by paying attention to everything that Yahweh says.

Their clothing did not wear out and their feet did not swell.

How did Yahweh instruct the Israelites?

As a man instructs and corrects his son, so Yahweh taught and corrected them.

Deuteronomy 8:7-8

What is in the good land into which God is bringing them?

The land will be filled with many sources of water, grain, fruit and olive trees, and honey.

Deuteronomy 8:10

They were reminded not to forget Yahweh by failing to obey his commandments.

Why might the people forget Yahweh who brought them out of Egypt?

When all that they possess increases, including herds, flock, and silver and gold, they might become proud and they might forget Yahweh.

Deuteronomy 8:15-16

How did Yahweh provide water and food in the terrible wilderness for the people of Israel?

Yahweh brought water out of solid rock for them to drink and provided manna for them to eat.

Deuteronomy 8:19-20

What would cause the people to perish like the nations around them?

They will perish if they forget their God and worship and serve other gods, because they would not listen to the voice of Yahweh.

What is the reason God is driving the nations out?

He is driving them out because of their wickedness, and to keep his promise to Israel's ancestors, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

Why was Yahweh angry with the people of Israel?

He was angry with them because they were rebellious against him.

Deuteronomy 9:9

<i>When I went up to the mountain to take the tablets of stone, the tablets of the covenant that Yahweh cut with you, and I stayed on the mountain 40 days and 40 nights, bread I did not eat and water I did not drink.</i>	<i>I climbed the mountain to receive from him the stone tablets on which he had written the Ten Commandments. I stayed there 40 days and nights. During that time I did not eat or drink anything.</i>

What did Moses eat and drink on the mountain?

He did not eat or drink anything for 40 days and 40 nights on the mountain.

Deuteronomy 9:12

<i>And Yahweh said to me, 'Get up, go down quickly from here, for your people, whom you brought out from Egypt, have become corrupted. They have quickly turned aside from the path that I commanded them. They have made for themselves a cast figure.'</i>	<i>But then he said to me, 'Go down the mountain immediately! This is because {the people whom you are leading}, the people whom you led out of Egypt, have committed a terrible sin! They have very quickly done what I commanded them not to do. Why did Yahweh tell Moses to quickly go down from the mountain?

Yahweh told him the people had corrupted themselves by doing what Yahweh had commanded them not to do and had made for themselves an idol to worship.

Deuteronomy 9:13-14

Why did Yahweh say he would destroy the Israelites?

Yahweh said he had seen that they were a stubborn people.

Deuteronomy 9:15-16

What did Moses find that Israel had made while he was on the mountain?

They had sinned against Yahweh by molding a calf as an idol just as he had commanded them not to do.

Deuteronomy 9:17-18

What did Moses do after he saw that the people had done evil in the sight of Yahweh?

He threw down the tablets and broke them before their eyes, he prostrated himself before Yahweh for 40 days and nights, and did not eat or drink because of their sin.

Deuteronomy 9:19-20

Why did Moses pray for the people and Aaron?

He prayed because Yahweh was angry enough with the people and with Aaron to destroy them.

Deuteronomy 9:21

ULT	UST
<i>And I took your sin, the calf that you had made, and burned it in the fire and crushed it and ground well, until crushed to dust. And I threw its dust into the stream coming down from the mountain.</i>	<i>Your parents had sinned {by requesting Aaron} to make {a metal figure of} a calf. So I took that figure and I melted it in a fire. Then, I crushed it and ground it into very tiny pieces. Then I threw those tiny pieces into the stream that flowed down the mountain.</i>

What did Moses do to the calf that the people had made?

Moses burned it, crushed it, and ground it into dust and threw the dust into the stream that came down from the mountain.

Deuteronomy 9:22-24

How did the people provoke Yahweh to anger?

They rebelled against the commandment of Yahweh by not trusting him or obeying what he told them.

Deuteronomy 9:25-26

What was Moses praying as he prostrated himself before Yahweh for 40 days and nights?

He prayed that Yahweh would not destroy his people whom he had rescued and brought out of Egypt.

Deuteronomy 9:27-28

What was Moses thinking the people of Egypt would say if Yahweh destroyed his people?

He is afraid the people of Egypt would say that Yahweh was not able to bring Israel into the land he had promised them but that he took them into the wilderness to kill them because he hated them.

Deuteronomy 10:2

Yahweh wrote the same Ten Commandments on the tablets that he had written on the first tablets.

What tribe had Yahweh chosen to carry the box of the covenant and to serve Yahweh?

Yahweh chose the tribe of Levi to carry the chest, to serve him, and to bless people in his name.

What did Moses tell the people to circumcise?

Why should Israel love the foreigner?

But now Yahweh our God has caused us to be as numerous as the stars in the sky.</i>

How has God blessed the people since they first went down into Egypt?

There were only 70 of their ancestors who went down into Egypt but now, God has made them as numerous as the stars of the heavens.

The children of the Israelites who were born while they wandered in the wilderness had not seen Yahweh's discipline and his mighty deeds that he did in Egypt.

Deuteronomy 11:4

<i>and what he did to the army of Egypt, to its horses and to its chariots, how he caused the water of the Sea of Reeds to flow over their faces in their pursuit after you, and Yahweh has destroyed them to this day,</i>	<i>Your children did not see Yahweh destroy the army of Egypt, their horses, or their chariots. Your children did not see how Yahweh caused the Sea of Reeds to flood and drown the army of Egypt as they were coming after their ancestors. Yahweh continues to make Egypt's army weak even to this day.</i>

How did Yahweh destroy the army of Egypt when they pursued after Israel?

Yahweh caused the water of the Sea of Reeds to drown the army of Egypt as they pursued after Israel.

Deuteronomy 11:7

ULT	UST
<i>but your eyes have seen all the great work of Yahweh that he did.</i>	<i>You and your parents have seen all these miracles that Yahweh performed.</i>

What had the Israelites seen?

The Israelites had seen all the great works that Yahweh did.

Deuteronomy 11:8-9

What will happen to the people if they keep all the commandments?

If they keep all the commandments, they will be strong, go in and possess the land, and they and their descendants will live in the land for a long time.

Deuteronomy 11:10-11

How is the land they are going to enter different from the land of Egypt?

In the land they are going to enter there are many hills and valleys and plenty of water from the rain.

Deuteronomy 11:13-14

What would Yahweh give them if they obey his commandments and to love and serve him with all their heart and soul?

Yahweh will give them rain in its season, that they may gather their grain and be able to make wine and oil.

Deuteronomy 11:16-17

What will Yahweh do if the people turn aside and worship other gods?

He will become angry and will restrain the heavens so there will not be any rain.

Deuteronomy 11:20-21

What should the people do so that they will live for a very long time in the land?

They will write the commandments on the doorposts of their house and on their gates.

Deuteronomy 11:22-23

If the people keep all the commandments of Yahweh and cling to him, what will he do for them?

Yahweh will drive out all the other nations that are larger and mightier than they are.

Deuteronomy 11:25

What did Moses give Israel that day?

He gave them a blessing and a curse.

Where must the people go in order to possess the land?

They must cross over the Jordan to possess and live in the land.

Deuteronomy 12

Deuteronomy 12:2

What places did Moses tell Israel to destroy?

They were to destroy all the places where the nations that Israel dispossessed had worshiped their gods.

Deuteronomy 12:3

<i>And you shall break down their altars and shatter their stone pillars and burn their Asherah in the fire. And you shall cut down the carved figures of their gods and destroy their name out of that place.</i>	<i>Tear down their altars, demolish the stone pillars {that they have dedicated to their gods}, burn the poles {that they use when they worship the goddess Asherah}, and chop down their carved idols. This is so that no one will ever worship them in those places again.</i>

What does Yahweh instruct the people of Israel do to the name of the gods of the nations?

He told Israel to destroy everything to do with those gods in order to remove their name from there.

Deuteronomy 12:5-6

In what place were the people of Israel to bring their burnt offerings, sacrifices, tithes, and offerings?

They were to go to the place that Yahweh their God would choose.

Deuteronomy 12:8

ULT	UST
<i>You shall not do as everything that we are doing here today, {every} man {doing} whatever {is} right in his eyes;</i>	<i>{When you are in that land,} you must not do some of the things that we have been doing. Until now, you have all been worshipping Yahweh the way you want to.</i>

What kinds of things were the people of Israel doing?

They were doing whatever they thought was right.

Deuteronomy 12:10

ULT	UST
<i>And you will cross the Jordan and live in the land that Yahweh your God is causing you to inherit, and he will cause you to rest from all your surrounding enemies, and you will live safely.</i>	<i>After you cross the Jordan River, you will start to live in the land that Yahweh our God is giving to you. He will protect you from all your enemies that will surround you. You will live peacefully.</i>

What kind of rest will Yahweh give to Israel when they go over the Jordan?

He will give them rest by protecting them from all their surrounding enemies, so they will live in safety.

Deuteronomy 12:15

<i>Only, you may kill and eat animals within all your gates, in all the desire of your soul, according to the blessing of Yahweh your God that he has given to you; the unclean and the clean may eat it, such as the gazelle and the deer.</i>	<i>However, you may kill and eat your animals wherever you live as much as you want. These animals are blessings from Yahweh your God. Impure and pure people may eat that meat, just like you would eat the meat of a gazelle or a deer.</i>

What animals can Israel kill and eat?

Israel can kill and eat domesticated animals where they are living.

Deuteronomy 12:16

<i>Only you shall not eat the blood; you shall pour it on the earth like water.</i>	<i>But do not eat the blood {of any animal}. Let the blood drain onto the ground {before you cook the meat}.</i>

What was Israel not allowed to eat?

Israel was not allowed to eat the blood, but must pour it out on the earth.

Deuteronomy 12:17

ULT	UST
<i>You are not allowed to eat within your gates from the tithe of your grain and your new wine and your oil and the firstborn of your herd or flock, and any of your vows that you vow and your freewill offerings and the contribution of your hand.</i>	<i>Do not eat any offering for Yahweh where you live. Do not eat the one tenth of your produce and animals that you are set aside for Yahweh. Do not eat any of the offerings for promises, unprompted offerings, or special contributions.</i>

Where was Israel told they could not eat their tithes and sacrifices?

They were not allowed to eat what was intended for tithing or sacrificing where they lived.

Deuteronomy 12:18

ULT	UST
<i>But you shall eat them to the face of Yahweh your God in the place that which Yahweh your God will choose—you and your son and your daughter and your male servant and your female servant and the Levite who {is} within your gates; and you shall rejoice to the face of Yahweh your God in all the sending out of your hand.</i>	<i>Instead, you must eat those offerings in the presence of Yahweh in the place that he chooses. You must do this along with your children, your servants, and the Levites who live in your towns. You should rejoice in the presence of Yahweh in everything that you do.</i>

Where were the people of Israel to eat their tithes and sacrifices?

They were to eat these offerings in the place that Yahweh their God will choose.

Deuteronomy 12:19

ULT	UST
<i>Watch yourself lest you forsake the Levite all your days on your land.</i>	<i>Be sure that you take care of the Levites all during the time that you live in your land.</i>

What was Israel told be sure not to do?

They were told to not forget to take care of the Levites.

Deuteronomy 12:20

ULT	UST
<i>When Yahweh your God broadens your borders, as he has spoken to you, and you say, 'I will eat meat,' due to the desire of your soul to eat meat, you may eat meat in all the desire of your soul.</i>	<i>In the future, Yahweh will give you more territory, as he has promised. At that time, if you want to eat meat in that new territory, you may eat as much as you want.</i>

What can Israel eat when Yahweh their God enlarges their borders as he has promised them?

Israel can eat the meat from the new land.

Deuteronomy 12:21

<i>If the place that Yahweh your God chooses to put his name there is too far from you, then you may sacrifice from your herd and from your flock that Yahweh has given to you, as I have commanded you; and you may eat within your gates, in all the desire of your soul.</i>	<i>If the place that Yahweh our God chooses for you to worship him is far from {where} you {live}, I will tell you what to do. You may kill and eat some of your animals where you live, as much as you want.</i>

What can Israel eat if the place that Yahweh their God chooses to put his name is too far from them?

If the place that Yahweh Israel's God chooses to put his name is too far from where they live, then they may kill some of their flock for sacrifices as well as to eat.

Deuteronomy 12:23

<i>Only be strong, do not eat the blood, for the blood is the life, and do not eat the life with the meat.</i>	<i>But be sure that you do not eat the blood of any animal. This is because blood keeps humans and animals alive. You must not eat that which sustains life along with the meat.</i>

Where did they consider the life of the animal?

Israel was to consider the blood as the life of the animal and thus should not eat it with the meat.

Deuteronomy 12:26

<i>But your sacred things that you have and your vow offerings, you shall take and go to the place that Yahweh will choose.</i>	<i>But this is what you must do with your offerings and anything that you promise to give to Yahweh. You must take those things to the place that he will choose.</i>

What is Israel instructed to take to the place that Yahweh chooses?

Israel is to take the sacred things that they have and their offerings to the place that Yahweh chooses.

Deuteronomy 12:27

<i>And you shall make your burnt offerings, the meat and the blood, on the altar of Yahweh your God; and the blood of your sacrifices shall be poured out on the altar of Yahweh your God, and you shall eat the meat.</i>	<i>There you will offer the animals for the wholly burned sacrifice on the altar. {You will also offer the fellowship sacrifice there. After you kill the animals, the priest} will take the blood from the animals and splatter it onto every side of the altar. {Then, the priests will receive their portion of the meat.} You may eat {the rest of} the meat.</i>

What is to be done with the blood and the meat of the animals they offer as a burnt offering?

They are to pour the blood out on the altar of Yahweh their God and eat the meat.

Deuteronomy 12:28

ULT	UST
<i>Keep and listen to all these words that I command you so that it may go well for you and for your sons after you until forever, when you do the good and the right in the eyes of Yahweh your God.</i>	<i>Faithfully obey all these commands. If you do that, you and your descendants will prosper forever. This is because you will be doing what Yahweh our God says is right for you to do.</i>

What is Israel instructed to do so that it may go well with them and with their descendants after them?

Israel is to listen to and obey all the words that Yahweh commands them and do what is good and right so that things may go well for them and their descendants forever.

Deuteronomy 12:29-30

What does Yahweh instruct Israel to watch out for when God enables Israel to go in and dispossess the nations in the land and live there?

Israel is to pay attention so that they are not trapped into serving the gods of those nations.

Deuteronomy 12:31

ULT	UST
<i>Do not do thus to Yahweh your God, for every abomination {to} Yahweh, which he hates, they have done for their gods; for they even burn their sons and their daughters in the fire for their gods.</i>	<i>Do not try to worship Yahweh our God as they have worshiped their gods. This is because they do disgusting things when they worship them. Yahweh hates those disgusting things. The worst thing that they do is that they burn their own children on altars for their gods.</i>

What have the other nations done to their sons and daughters in order to worship the gods?

The other nations have even burned their sons and daughters on altars to these other gods.

Deuteronomy 13

Deuteronomy 13:2-3

Why should the people of Israel not listen to a prophet who predicts something that happens and then says that they should go after other gods and worship them?

The people of Israel should not listen because Yahweh is testing them to know whether they love him with all their heart and with all their soul.

Deuteronomy 13:5

ULT	UST
<i>And that prophet or that dreamer of dreams shall be put to death because he has spoken rebellion against Yahweh your God, who brought you out from the land of Egypt, and who redeemed you from the house of slaves, to drive you out from the way in which Yahweh your God commanded you to walk. And you shall remove the evil from among you.</i>	<i>But you must execute anyone who tells you to disobey Yahweh our God. This includes anyone who says he is a prophet, or anyone who says that he can interpret dreams. This is because Yahweh himself rescued your families from being slaves in Egypt. Those people want to convince you to disobey what Yahweh has told you to do. Execute them to make sure no one in your community does those kinds of evil acts.</i>

What should the people of Israel do to the prophet who tells them to worship other gods?

They should put that prophet to death because he has spoken against what Yahweh has commanded them.

<i>If your brother, the son of your mother or your son or your daughter or the wife of your bosom or your friend who {is} like your life, secretly entices you, saying, 'Let us go and serve other gods' (that you have not known, you nor your fathers,</i>	<i>Your brother, son, daughter, wife, or some close friend might privately urge you to disobey. They might urge you to worship other gods that you and your ancestors never knew about before.</i>

What have the people of Israel been instructed to do to anyone who secretly entices them and says that they should go and worship other gods?

They must surely kill anyone who entices them to worship other gods.

Deuteronomy 13:10

ULT	UST
<i>And you shall stone him to death with stones because he seeks to drive you away from Yahweh your God, who brought you out from the land of Egypt, from the house of slaves.</i>	<i>Kill such people by throwing stones at them. This is because they tell you to disobey Yahweh our God, who rescued your ancestors from being slaves in Egypt.</i>

How should the people of Israel kill the person who tells them to disobey Yahweh their God?

They should stone that person to death.

Deuteronomy 13:12-14

What shall the people of Israel do if they hear that some wicked person is telling others to go and worship other gods?

They should investigate it thoroughly to see if it is true.

Deuteronomy 13:15

ULT	UST
<i>striking, you shall strike the dwellers of that city to the mouth of the sword, devoting it and all who {are} in it and its livestock to the mouth of the sword.</i>	<i>Then kill all the people in that town and kill all their livestock, too. Destroy the town completely.</i>

What should Israel do to a city if they learn that it is true that the inhabitants have been worshipping other gods?

They should kill the inhabitants of that city and destroy everything in it.

Deuteronomy 13:17

ULT	UST
<i>And in your hand you shall not cling to anything from the devoted thing, so that Yahweh will turn from the burning of his nose and give to you compassion and have compassion on you and make you increase, as he has sworn to your fathers,</i>	<i>You must not take for yourselves anything that Yahweh has said you must destroy. If you do what I say, Yahweh will stop being angry with you, and he will act mercifully toward you. He will cause you to have many children, which is what he promised our ancestors that he would do.</i>

What are the people told about the things that Yahweh has told them to destroy?

They must not take any of those things for themselves that Yahweh has told them to destroy, so that Yahweh will not be angry and will have compassion on them as he promised their ancestors.

Deuteronomy 14

Deuteronomy 14:1

ULT	UST
<i>You {are} the sons of Yahweh your God. Do not cut yourselves, and do not make a baldness between your eyes for the dead,</i>	<i>We are people who belong to Yahweh our God. Do not gash yourselves or shave the hair on your foreheads when you grieve {like the other people groups do}.</i>

What does Moses instruct the people of Yahweh not to do?

They are not to cut themselves nor shave any part of their heads for the dead.

Deuteronomy 14:6

ULT	UST
<i>And you may eat any animal among the animals parting the hoof or {with} a cleft splitting {into} two hooves, chewing the cud.</i>	<i>Those are animals that have split hooves and that also chew the cud.</i>

What are the two characteristics of the animals that the Israelites are allowed to eat?

Israel may eat any animal that has split hooves and also chews the cud.

Deuteronomy 14:8

ULT	UST
<i>And the pig, because he parts the hoof and {chews} not the cud, he {is} unclean to you. From their meat do not eat, and do not touch their carcasses.</i>	<i>Do not eat pigs. They are unacceptable for you to eat. They have split hooves, but they do not {chew} the cud. Do not eat the meat of those animals; do not even touch their dead bodies.</i>

Why is the pig not to be eaten?

The pig is unclean for the Israelites because he has split hooves but does not chew the cud.

Deuteronomy 14:9

<i>You may eat this from all that is in the water, all that has fins and scales you may eat.</i>	<i>You may eat any fish that has fins and scales.</i>

What are the characteristics of the things from the water that the Israelites are allowed to eat?

They may eat whatever has fins and scales.

Deuteronomy 14:19

ULT	UST
<i>And all winged, swarming things are unclean to you; they must not be eaten.</i>	<i>You must not eat any insect with wings and which swarm. They are unacceptable to Yahweh for you to eat.</i>

Are the Israelites allowed to eat winged swarming things?

All winged, swarming insects are unclean for the Israelites and must not be eaten.

Deuteronomy 14:21

ULT	UST
<i>You must not eat anything dying {of itself}; you may give it to the sojourner who {is} within your gates, and he may eat it or sell to a foreigner. For you {are} a nation sanctified to Yahweh your God. You must not boil a young goat in the milk of its mother.</i>	<i>Do not eat any animal that has died naturally. You may allow foreigners who live among you to eat those things. You may also sell them to other foreigners. But you are a people group that belongs to Yahweh our God. You must not cook a young sheep or goat in its mother's milk.</i>

May the Israelites eat anything that dies of natural causes?

They may not eat anything that dies naturally, but they may give it to a foreigner to eat or sell.

What could the Israelites not do with a young goat?

They must not boil a young goat in its mother's milk.

Deuteronomy 14:22

ULT	UST
<i>Tithing, you shall tithe all the produce of your seed that comes out of the field year {after} year.</i>	<i>Once each year you must set apart a tenth of all the crops that you gather from your fields.</i>

What are the Israelites to do with the crops produced in their fields?

Israelites must set apart a tenth of all their crops once a year.

Deuteronomy 14:23

ULT	UST
<i>And you shall eat to the face of Yahweh your God, in the place that he will choose to make his name stay there, the tithe of your grain, your new wine, and your oil and the firstborn of your herd and your flock, so that you will learn to honor Yahweh your God all the days.</i>	<i>Take them to the place that Yahweh our God will choose for you to worship him. There you must eat the tenth of your grain, your wine, your olive oil, and the meat of the firstborn male animals of your cattle and your sheep. Do this in order that you may learn to always honor Yahweh. {He has blessed you by giving you these things.}</i>

What are the Israelites instructed to eat in the place that he will choose?

Israel must eat the tithe, which was a tenth of their grain, new wine, and of their oil, as well as the firstborn animals in the place that Yahweh will choose.

Deuteronomy 14:24-25

What are the Israelites allowed to do if they are blessed with such a large crop that they are not able to carry the tithe to the place that Yahweh will choose?

If the journey is too far for them to carry all of the tithe of what Yahweh has blessed them with, they can sell a tenth of their crops and take the money to the place that Yahweh has chosen.

Deuteronomy 14:27

ULT	UST
<i>And the Levite who {is} within your gates, do not forsake him, for he has no portion nor inheritance with you.</i>	<i>But be sure to not neglect to help the descendants of Levi who live in your towns, because they will not own any land.</i>

Who has no inheritance with the Israelites and must not be neglected?

The Levites will not own any land so the others must not neglect to help them.

Deuteronomy 14:28-29

What are the Israelites instructed to do at the end of every three years?

At the end of every three years the Israelites are to store the tithe of their produce from that year for the Levites, the foreigners, the fatherless, and the widows to have enough to eat.

Deuteronomy 15

Deuteronomy 15:1

ULT	UST
<i>At the end of seven years, you shall make a remission.</i>	<i>At the end of {every} seven years, you must cancel all debts.</i>

What must the Israelites do at the end of every seven years?

At the end of every seven years the Israelites must cancel all debts.

Deuteronomy 15:2

ULT	UST
<i>And this {is} the word of the remission: Every owner of debt shall release his hand that he has loaned to his neighbor; he shall not oppress his neighbor and his brother, because the remission of Yahweh has been proclaimed.</i>	<i>Do it like this: Each of you who has lent money to a fellow Israelite must cancel that debt. You must not insist that he pay it back. You must do that because Yahweh has declared the cancelation of debts every seven years.</i>

Why are debts to be canceled every seven years?

Everyone will cancel that which he has loaned to a fellow Israelite because Yahweh has declared the cancelation of debts every seven years.

Deuteronomy 15:3

ULT	UST
<i>You may collect {from} a foreigner, and what is yours {with} your brother your hand shall release.</i>	<i>During that year you may require foreigners who live among you to pay what they owe you, but you must not demand that from any fellow Israelite.</i>

From whom can Israelites continue to collect payment at the end of every seven years?

The Israelites can continue to collect payment of a debt from a foreigner.

Deuteronomy 15:4-5

ULT	UST
	<i>Yahweh our God will bless you in the land that he is giving to you. If you obey Yahweh our God and obey all the commandments that I am giving to you today, then there will not be any poor people among you.</i>

Why should there be no poor among the Israelites?

If they do all that Yahweh has commanded them, there should no longer be poor among them since Yahweh will bless them.

Deuteronomy 15:6

ULT	UST
<i>For Yahweh your God will bless you, as he spoke to you; you will lend to many nations, and you, you will not borrow, and you will rule over many nations, and they will not rule over you.</i>	<i>Yahweh our God will bless you like he has promised to do. You will be able to lend money to people of other people groups, but, for your part, you will not need a loan from any of them. You will control many people groups, but they will not control you.</i>

What will happen to demonstrate that Yahweh has blessed Israel as he promised?

Israel will lend to many nations, but will not borrow; Israel will rule over many nations, but the other nations will not rule over them.

Deuteronomy 15:7

<i>If there is poor among you, from one of your brothers, within one of your gates in your land that Yahweh your God is giving to you, do not harden your heart, and do not shut your hand from your poor brother,</i>	<i>In the towns that Yahweh our God is giving to you, if it happens that there are any Israelites there who are poor, then do not be selfish and refuse to help them.</i>

What are the Israelites told not to do if there is a poor man among them?

The Israelites are told not to be selfish and refuse to help them.

Deuteronomy 15:9

ULT	UST
<i>Watch yourselves, lest there be a wicked matter in your heart, saying, 'The seventh year, the year of remission, {is} near,' and you do wrong in your eyes against your poor brother and do not give to him, and he calls out to Yahweh about you, and it would be sin for you.</i>	<i>When the year of canceling debts is near, do not think to yourself that {you should not lend anyone money because} they will not need to pay it back. It would be evil to withhold help from a needy fellow Israelite. If you do that, he could pray to Yahweh against you. Then {Yahweh will say that} you have sinned by not helping that person.</i>

What should the Israelites be careful not to do when the seventh year, the year of remission is near?

They should not refuse to give help to a poor man because the year of canceling debts is near.

Deuteronomy 15:10

ULT	UST
<i>Giving, you shall give to him, and your heart shall not do evil in your giving to him, because of this matter Yahweh your God will bless you in all your work and in all the sending out of your hand.</i>	<i>Give generously to poor people and not grudgingly. If you give generously to them, Yahweh will bless you in everything that you do.</i>

What will Yahweh do for the Israelites in return for giving generously to the poor?

Yahweh will bless the Israelites in everything they do.

Deuteronomy 15:11

ULT	UST
<i>For the poor will not cease to be among the land; therefore I command you, saying, 'Opening, you shall open your hand to your brother, to your needy, and to your poor in your land.'</i>	<i>There will always be some poor people in your land, so I command you to give generously to poor people, to your fellow Israelites.</i>

Why is Israel commanded to give generously to their fellow Israelites, to the needy and the poor in their land?

They should give generously because there will always be poor living among them.

Deuteronomy 15:12-14

What are Israelites instructed to give a Hebrew man or a Hebrew woman who is released to go free in the seventh year?

They must provide for that person freely out of their flocks and their crops with which Yahweh their God has blessed them.

Deuteronomy 15:15

ULT	UST
<i>And you must remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt, and Yahweh your God redeemed you; therefore I am commanding you today this matter.</i>	<i>Do not forget that your ancestors were once slaves in Egypt and that Yahweh our God freed them. So, I am now commanding you to do this.</i>

What are the Israelites to remember as they give to the one they set free?

The Israelites are told to remember that they were slaves in the land of Egypt and Yahweh freed them.

Deuteronomy 15:16-17

What is an Israelite to do to a male or female slave who says that they do not want to leave?

The Israelite is to pierce the slave's ear, and he or she will be their slave forever.

Deuteronomy 15:18

ULT	UST
<i>It must not seem difficult in your eyes when you send him out free from you, for double the wage of a hired man he has served you six years. And Yahweh your God will bless you in all that you do.</i>	<i>Do not complain when you are required to free your slaves. Keep in mind that they served you for six years, and you got double the value in comparison with a hired worker. If you free them, Yahweh our God will bless you in everything that you do.</i>

Why should it not seem difficult for the Israelite to let the slave go free?

It should not be difficult because he has served them for six years and given them twice the value of a hired person.

Deuteronomy 15:19

ULT	UST
<i>All the firstborn that are born in your herd and your flock, you shall sanctify the males to Yahweh your God. You shall not work with the firstborn of your herd, and you shall not shear the firstborn of your flock.</i>	<i>Set aside for the honor of Yahweh our God the firstborn male animals from your cattle and sheep. Do not force them to do any work for you, and do not shear the wool of the firstborn animals.</i>

What must the people of Israel do with the firstborn males in their herd and their flock?

They must set them aside for Yahweh and not use them for work or shear them.

Deuteronomy 15:21-22

What are the Israelites to do with the firstborn animal if it is lame or blind or has any other defect?

They must not sacrifice it to Yahweh, but instead they can eat it.

Deuteronomy 16

Deuteronomy 16:1

ULT	UST
<i>Keeping the month of Aviv, and you shall make the Passover to Yahweh your God, for in the month of Aviv, Yahweh your God brought you out from Egypt {by} night.</i>	<i>{Each year} honor Yahweh our God in the early spring with the Passover Celebration. It was on a night in the early spring that Yahweh rescued your families from Egypt.</i>

Why are the Israelites to keep the Passover for Yahweh their God in the month of Aviv?

The Israelites are to celebrate the Passover each year during the month of Aviv because Yahweh brought Israel out of Egypt in that month.

Deuteronomy 16:2

ULT	UST
<i>And you shall sacrifice the Passover to Yahweh your God, the flock and the herd, in the place that Yahweh will choose to make his name stay there.</i>	<i>In order to celebrate, go to the place that Yahweh will choose for you to worship him. There, sacrifice one young animal from your sheep or cattle to Yahweh.</i>

What will the Israelites do to celebrate the Passover?

The Israelites will sacrifice some of the flock and the herd in the place that Yahweh will choose.

Deuteronomy 16:3-4

Why are the Israelites to eat no leavened bread or have yeast in all their land for seven days?

They are to eat no leavened bread or have yeast during those days to remind them that they came out of the land of Egypt with too much haste for bread to rise.

Deuteronomy 16:4

ULT	UST
<i>And no yeast shall be seen among you in all your borders seven days, and nothing from the meat that you sacrifice in the evening on the first day shall remain until the morning.</i>	<i>During the Passover Celebration, which will last for seven days, you must not have any yeast {in any house} in your land. Furthermore, you must eat the meat of the animal that you sacrifice on the evening of the first day of the Passover Festival during that night. Do not allow any of it to remain until the next day.</i>

What are the Israelites told about the meat that they sacrifice in the evening on the first day?

The Israelites are to make sure there is no meat that they sacrifice in the evening remaining the next morning.

Deuteronomy 16:6

ULT	UST
<i>Instead, at the place that Yahweh your God will choose to make his name stay there, you shall sacrifice the Passover in the evening at the going down of the sun, at the appointed time of your exit from Egypt.</i>	

Where are the Israelites to offer the sacrifice of the Passover?

They are to sacrifice at the place that Yahweh will choose.

When will the sacrifice of the Passover be performed?

The sacrifice of the Passover is to be performed in the evening when the sun is setting, at the time when the Israelites started to leave Egypt.

Deuteronomy 16:8

ULT	UST
<i>Six days you shall eat unleavened bread, and on the seventh day {is} a festive assembly for Yahweh your God, do not do work.</i>	<i>Each day for six days the bread that you eat must have no yeast in it. On the seventh day, you must all gather to worship Yahweh our God. You must not do any work on that day.</i>

What are the Israelites supposed to do on the first six days as they celebrate Passover?

The Israelites are to eat unleavened bread for six days.

What are the Israelites supposed to do on the seventh day as they celebrate Passover?

On the seventh day, they are to have a festive assembly and do no work.

Deuteronomy 16:9-10

How do the Israelites determine the start of the Festival of Weeks for Yahweh?

The Israelites will count seven weeks from the time they begin to harvest their grain.

Deuteronomy 16:10

ULT	UST
<i>And you shall make the Festival of Weeks for Yahweh your God {with} the contribution of a freewill offering of your hand that you shall give, as Yahweh your God has blessed you.</i>	<i>Then, to honor Yahweh our God, celebrate the Celebration of Weeks. Do that by bringing to him an offering {of grain}. Yahweh has blessed you by causing it to grow in your fields during that year. If you had a big harvest, bring a big offering. If you had a small harvest, bring a small offering.</i>

What contribution do the Israelites give on the Festival of Weeks?

They must give Yahweh a freewill offering according to how much Yahweh has blessed them.

Deuteronomy 16:12

ULT	UST
<i>And you shall remember that you were a slave in Egypt, and you shall keep and do these statutes.</i>	<i>When you celebrate these festivals by obeying these commands, remember that your families were slaves in Egypt.</i>

What must they remember during the Festival of Weeks?

They must remember that they were slaves in Egypt.

Deuteronomy 16:13

ULT	UST
<i>You must make the Festival of Huts for yourselves seven days into your gathering from your threshing floor and from your winepress.</i>	<i>Each year, after you have threshed all your grain and pressed the juice from all your grapes, you must celebrate the Festival of Shelters for seven days.</i>

What festival are the Israelites instructed to keep for seven days after they have gathered in the harvest from their threshing floors and from their wine presses?

They are to keep the Festival of Shelters for seven days after they have gathered in their harvest.

Deuteronomy 16:16

ULT	UST
<i>Three times in a year all your males shall appear to the face of Yahweh your God at the place that he will choose: at the Festival of Unleavened Bread and at the Festival of Weeks and at the Festival of Huts. And he shall not appear to the face of Yahweh empty,</i>	<i>So, each year all of you Israelite men must gather to worship Yahweh our God at the place that he will choose, to celebrate three festivals: The Festival of Unleavened Bread, the Celebration of Weeks, and the Festival of Shelters. No one should come before Yahweh without an offering.</i>

At what the three festivals must all the males of Israel gather to worship Yahweh at the place that Yahweh chooses?

They must gather to worship Yahweh at the Festival of Unleavened Bread, the Festival of Weeks, and at the Festival of Shelters.

Deuteronomy 16:16-17

How much is every male Israelite supposed to give to Yahweh instead of coming without an offering?

Every male Israelite is to give in proportion to how much Yahweh has blessed him with that year.

Deuteronomy 16:18

ULT	UST
<i>You shall set for yourself judges and officers within all your gates that Yahweh your God is giving to you, from your tribes, and they shall judge the people {with} righteous judgment.</i>	<i>Appoint judges and other officials throughout your tribes, in all the towns in the land that Yahweh our God is giving to you. They must judge people fairly.</i>

Where are the Israelites to find their judges and officers?

The judges and officers will be taken from each of their tribes to judge the people with righteous judgment.

Deuteronomy 16:19

ULT	UST
<i>You shall not twist a judgment; you shall not recognize a face and you shall not take a bribe, for a bribe blinds the eyes of the wise and perverts the words of the righteous.</i>	<i>They must not judge unjustly. They must not favor one person more than another. The judges must not accept bribes because a bribe causes a wise person to ignore what is right and misrepresent the words of righteous people.</i>

Why are the judges not to show partiality or take a bribe?

If a judge takes a bribe, he will find it difficult to judge fairly but will instead want to do what the person who bribes him wants him to do.

Deuteronomy 16:20

ULT	UST
<i>Righteousness, righteousness you shall pursue, so that you will live and possess the land that Yahweh your God is giving to you.</i>	<i>You must be completely fair and just, in order that you may live long enough to occupy the land that Yahweh our God is giving to you.</i>

Why must the judges pursue righteousness and judge fairly?

They must pursue righteousness and judge fairly, so that they may live and occupy the land that Yahweh is giving them.

Deuteronomy 16:21-22

What are the Israelites not to set up for themselves?

They are not to set up an Asherah pole or a stone pillar to worship any idol.

Deuteronomy 17

Deuteronomy 17:1

ULT	UST
<i>Do not sacrifice to Yahweh your God an ox or a sheep that has on it a blemish, any bad thing, for it {is} an abomination to Yahweh your God.</i>	<i>Do not sacrifice to Yahweh our God any cattle, sheep, or goat that has any defect. This is because Yahweh detests that kind of gift.</i>

Why must the Israelites not sacrifice an ox or a sheep with any blemish or defect to Yahweh?

A sacrifice that is not perfect will be detestable to Yahweh.

Deuteronomy 17:2-4

What are the Israelites told to do if they hear that a man or woman within their cities have done what is evil in the sight of Yahweh and is serving other gods?

The Israelites are to investigate thoroughly to know if this is true and that the idol worship is actually happening.

Deuteronomy 17:5

ULT	UST
<i>then you shall bring that man or that woman who has done this evil thing to your gates, the man or the woman, and you shall stone them with stones, and they shall die.</i>	<i>In that case, you must take the man or woman who has sinned outside of your town. Then you must kill that person by throwing stones at him or her.</i>

What are the Israelites to do with a man or woman who has done such an evil thing as worshiping other gods?

The Israelites are to stone that person to death.

Deuteronomy 17:6

ULT	UST
<i>At the mouth of two witnesses or three witnesses, he who is to die shall die. He shall not die at the mouth of one witness.</i>	<i>At least two people must confirm that they saw the person sin before you execute that person. If only one person says they saw the sin happen, you must not kill the accused person.</i>

How many witnesses are needed to convict a person to death?

Two or three witnesses are needed to convict a person to death.

Deuteronomy 17:7

ULT	UST
<i>The hand of the witnesses shall be the first on him to put him to death, and afterward the hand of all the people, and you shall remove the evil from among you.</i>	<i>The people who saw the sin happen should throw stones at the guilty person. Then all the other people from that town should throw stones until the guilty person dies. By doing that, you will make sure no one from your community does this evil action of worshiping idols.</i>

Who must throw the first stones when putting a person to death?

The witnesses must be the first to throw the stones, followed by the rest of the people of Israel.

Why must the Israelites stone the person to death who has done this evil action of worshiping other gods?

This will get remove this evil from among them.

Deuteronomy 17:8-9

Who is to judge if the Israelites have a matter that is too hard for them to judge?

They must go to the place that Yahweh will choose, and explain the case to the Levites who are serving as priests and to the judge who is serving at that time and they will make the decision.

Deuteronomy 17:12

ULT	UST
<i>And the man who does arrogantly, not listening to the priest who is standing there to serve Yahweh your God, or to the judge, then that man shall die, and you shall remove the evil from Israel.</i>	<i>You must execute anyone who proudly disobeys the judge or the priest who stands there in the presence of Yahweh and decides what should be done. By doing that, you will make sure no one from all the Israelites does this evil action.</i>

What man must die in order to remove the evil from Israel?

Anyone who acts arrogantly and does not listen to the decision of the priest or judge, must die to remove the evil from Israel.

Deuteronomy 17:14-15

How will the Israelites decide who to set up as a king over them at the time when they are in the land?

Israelites will select from among their fellow Israelites someone whom Yahweh will choose.

Deuteronomy 17:16

ULT	UST
<i>Only he shall not multiply horses for himself, so that he shall not cause the people to return to Egypt so that he may multiply horses, for Yahweh said to you, 'You will no longer return that way again.'</i>	<i>After he becomes the king, he should not own a large number of horses. He should not send people to Egypt to buy horses for him. Remember that Yahweh told you that you would never return to Egypt.</i>

Why must the king of Israel not own multiple horses, nor send anyone back to Egypt to buy more horses?

He must not send anyone back to Egypt to buy more horses for him because Yahweh has told the Israelites to never return to Egypt.

Deuteronomy 17:17

ULT	UST
<i>And he shall not multiply wives for himself, and his heart will not turn aside. And he shall not multiply for himself silver and gold excessively.</i>	<i>And he must not marry a lot of wives. If he did that, they might cause him to stop worshiping Yahweh. He must not obtain a lot of silver and gold.</i>

Why is the king told not to have many wives?

He is not to marry a lot of wives because they might cause his heart to turn away from Yahweh.

Deuteronomy 17:18-19

What is the king instructed to do so that he may learn to honor Yahweh his God, and keep and obey all of his law?

He must write for himself a copy of this law on a scroll from which he is to read every day of his life.

Deuteronomy 17:19-20

Why is the king instructed to keep the scroll of the law with him?

He must read from the scroll daily so that he does not think he is more important than his fellow Israelites, and so that he will completely obey the commandments.

Deuteronomy 18

Deuteronomy 18:1-2

Why would the Levites be allowed to eat from the offerings given to Yahweh?

The Levites would be able to eat the offerings because they would not receive land as an inheritance like the other Israelites.

Deuteronomy 18:3-4

What was to be given to the priests from the sacrifices of the people?

From the sacrifices of the people, the priests were to be given the shoulder, two cheeks, and stomach of the oxen and sheep and the first parts of their grain, wine, oil, and fleece of the sheep.

Deuteronomy 18:5

ULT	UST
<i>For Yahweh your God has chosen him out of all your tribes to stand to serve in the name of Yahweh, him and his sons, all of the days.</i>	<i>You must do this because Yahweh our God has chosen the tribe of Levi from all of your tribes. He did this so that they would always be the priests who would serve him.</i>

Why were the priests supposed to receive these portions from the sacrifices of the people?

They were to receive these portions because Yahweh chose them from among the tribes to serve as priests in his name.

Deuteronomy 18:6-7

Which Levites can serve in the place that Yahweh will choose?

Any Levite who wants to can serve as a priest in the place that Yahweh will choose.

Deuteronomy 18:9-11

What were some of the disgusting practices followed by the other nations in the land?

Some of the disgusting practices were sacrificing their children, using divination, practicing magic, using sorcery, and talking with the dead or spirits.

Deuteronomy 18:12-13

Why will Yahweh drive out the nations from the land?

Yahweh will drive out the nations from the land because he hates the disgusting things they do and he wants his people to stay away from those things.

Deuteronomy 18:15

ULT	UST
<i>Yahweh your God will raise up for you a prophet from among you, from your brothers, like me. You shall listen to him,</i>	<i>Some day he will send from your people a prophet like me. You must obey him.</i>

Who did Yahweh promise to raise up from among the people?

Yahweh promised he would raise up a prophet like Moses for them to obey.

Deuteronomy 18:20

ULT	UST
<i>But the prophet who presumes to speak a word in my name, which I have not commanded him to speak or who speaks in the name of other gods, then that prophet shall die.'</i>	<i>There could be someone who pridefully says that he is a prophet and that his message comes from me, but I did not send him. Or, there could be someone who speaks a message that he says other gods have revealed to him. You must execute that person.'</i>

When must a prophet be executed?

A prophet must be executed if he speaks a prophecy in Yahweh's name that Yahweh has not commanded him to speak, or he speaks in the name of other gods.

Deuteronomy 18:22

ULT	UST
<i>When a prophet speaks in the name of Yahweh, and the thing does not happen and does not come to pass, it {is} a word that Yahweh has not spoken. The prophet has spoken it in presumption; you shall not be afraid of him.</i>	<i>If a person claims to be a prophet who speaks for Yahweh, but what that person said will happen does not happen, then {you will know that} Yahweh did not reveal that message to him. That person said it just so that others would think that he is important, and you do not need to take that person seriously.</i>

What does it mean if a prophecy spoken in Yahweh's name does not happen?

If a prophecy does not happen, then the prophecy is something that Yahweh has not spoken.

Deuteronomy 19

Deuteronomy 19:1-3

Why did Yahweh instruct the people to select three cities?

He instructed the people to select three cities so that everyone who kills another person could flee to one of them for safety.

Deuteronomy 19:4-6

Why should the one who kills another flee to a safe city?

He should flee so that the relative of the victim does not pursue him in anger and kill him.

Deuteronomy 19:4-5

What provision does Yahweh make for the person who kills another person by accident?

Yahweh provided three cities to which that person could flee and live.

Deuteronomy 19:8-9

ULT	UST
	<i>Do everything that I am today commanding you to do. Love Yahweh our God and obey his instructions continually. If you do that, Yahweh our God will give you much more land {than you will have when you first inhabit the land}. You will receive all the land according to what he promised your ancestors. When that happens, select three more cities {in the new land for people to escape to}.</i>

What would be the conditions for adding three more cities for people to escape to?

If Yahweh enlarged their borders, then they must add three more cities for people to escape to.

Deuteronomy 19:11-12

What should happen if a person ambushes and kills someone and then flees to one of these cities?

The elders of this man's city must bring him back and turn him over to the victim's relative so that the attacker may be executed.

Deuteronomy 19:14-15

How many witnesses are needed for someone to be punished for their sin?

There must be two or three witnesses for anyone to be punished for their sin.

Deuteronomy 19:17-18

What should be done when controversy exists between two men?

Then the two men who have a controversy must go before the priests and the judges who are serving at that time. The judges will inquire thoroughly to see if the witness falsely testified against the other.

Deuteronomy 19:18-19

What must be done if a witness is found to be false?

If the testimony of a witness is found to be false, then they must do to him as he had planned to do to the person he accused.

Deuteronomy 20

Deuteronomy 20:1

ULT	UST
<i>When you go out to battle against your enemies, and see horses and chariots, a people more numerous than you, you shall not be afraid of them, for Yahweh your God {is} with you, who raised you up from the land of Egypt.</i>	<i>When your fighting men go to fight your enemies and see that they have many horses and chariots and that their army is much bigger than yours, do not be afraid of them, because Yahweh our God, who brought the Israelites safely out of Egypt, will be with you.</i>

Why must the people of Israel not be afraid when they go out to battle against their enemies?

The people of Israel must not be afraid because Yahweh their God, who brought them out of the land of Egypt, will be with them.

Deuteronomy 20:2-4

What should the priests do when the people of Israel draw near to the battle?

The priest should speak to the people and tell them not to be afraid because Yahweh is with them to fight for them.

Deuteronomy 20:5

ULT	UST
<i>And the officers shall speak to the people, saying, 'Who {is} the man who has built a new house and has not dedicated it? Let him go and return to his house, lest he die in battle and another man dedicate it.'</i>	<i>Then the leaders must say to the fighting men, 'If anyone among you has just built a new house and has not dedicated it {to God}, he should go home {and dedicate the house}. If he does not do that, if he dies in the battle, someone else will dedicate the house {and live in it}.'</i>

What should a man do if he has built a new house and not yet dedicated it?

He should return to his house so he does not die in battle and another man dedicate it.

Deuteronomy 20:7

ULT	UST
<i>And who {is} the man who is engaged {to} a woman and has not taken her? Let him go and return to his house, lest he die in battle and another man take her.'</i>	<i>If anyone among you has become engaged to marry a woman but has not married her yet, he should go home {and marry her}. If he stays here and dies in the battle, someone else will marry her.'</i>

What should a man do if he is engaged to a woman and not yet married her?

He should return and marry her so he does not die in battle and another man marry her.

Deuteronomy 20:10-11

What was to happen if the people in a city far from Israel accepted the Israelites' offer of peace?

All the people found in that city were to become forced labor for the Israelites and serve them.

Deuteronomy 20:12-13

What must happen if the city does not accept the offer of peace, but instead makes war against Israel?

Israel must attack it and when Yahweh gives Israel victory they must kill every man in it.

Deuteronomy 20:16-18

Why must the people of Israel utterly destroy everything that breathes in the cities of the land which Yahweh will give them as an inheritance?

They must destroy everything so that the people of the land do not teach them to do disgusting things for their gods, which would cause them to sin against Yahweh.

Deuteronomy 20:19-20

What should Israel do with the trees in the cities which they have under siege?

Israel should not cut down the trees that are used for food, but they can cut down the trees that are not used for food to build structures for attacking the city.

Deuteronomy 21

Deuteronomy 21:1-2

What should happen if someone who has been killed is found lying in a field and it is not known who killed him?

The elders and judges should measure to determine the nearest city to where the body was found.

Deuteronomy 21:5

ULT	UST
<i>And the priests, the sons of Levi, shall come forward, for Yahweh your God has chosen them to serve him and give blessing in the name of Yahweh, and upon their mouth is every dispute and every assault.</i>	<i>The priests must go there also, because Yahweh our God has chosen them from the tribe of Levi to serve him and to be his representatives when they bless people. He has also chosen them to settle disputes involving injuries.</i>

Why are the priests to be consulted to settle disputes involving injuries?

The priests are to be consulted and their decision to be accepted because Yahweh has chosen them to serve him in this way.

Deuteronomy 21:6-8

What ritual must the elders of the city nearest to the killed man perform so that this murder will be forgiven?

The elders of that city must wash their hands over the heifer whose neck was broken and declare that the people did not do this murder and Yahweh will not consider them guilty.

Deuteronomy 21:10-13

What is an Israelite man to do if he sees a woman among the captives who he wants as his wife?

If a man sees a woman among the captives who he wants as his wife, he is to bring her home where she will shave her head, cut her nails, and change her clothes. He is to give her a month to mourn for her parents and then he can marry her.

Deuteronomy 21:14

ULT	UST
<i>And it will be, if you do not delight in her, then you shall send her to her desires, but you surely shall not sell her for money, you shall not mistreat her in return for humiliating her.</i>	<i>Later, if he no longer is pleased with her, he must let her leave him and go wherever she wants. But because {sending her away} will humiliate her, he may not sell her to anyone else like a slave.</i>

How is an Israelite man to treat a captive that he had taken as a wife if he is no longer pleased with her?

He must let her go rather than sell her for money.

Deuteronomy 21:15-17

If a man has two wives, and he favors the one who has borne him his firstborn son, how must he distribute his inheritance?

This man must recognize the firstborn son of the wife he does not favor by giving him a double portion of all that he possesses.

Deuteronomy 21:18-19

What must the parents of a rebellious son do if the son will not obey them?

They must bring that rebellious son to the elders of the city.

Deuteronomy 21:20

ULT	UST
<i>And they shall say to the elders of his city, 'This son of ours {is} stubborn and rebellious; he will not listen to our voice; {he is} a glutton and a drunkard.'</i>	<i>Then the parents must say to the elders of that city, 'This son of ours is stubborn and always rebelling against us. He will not pay attention to what we tell him. He eats too much, and he gets drunk.'</i>

What must the parents of the rebellious son say to the elders of his city?

The parents of the rebellious son must tell the elders that their son is stubborn and rebellious and does not listen to them.

Deuteronomy 21:21

ULT	UST
<i>And all the men of his city shall stone him with stones, and he shall die; and you shall remove the evil from among you. And all Israel will hear and fear.</i>	<i>Then all the men of that city must execute him by throwing stones at him. By doing that, you will make sure no one from among you does this evil action. Everyone in Israel will hear about what happened and they will be afraid to do what he did.</i>

Why must the men of the city respond by stoning the son to death?

They must stone the son to death to remove the evil from among them, and cause all Israel to hear of it and fear.

Deuteronomy 21:22-23

What must happen if a man commits a sin worthy of death and is hanged on a tree?

The man's body must not remain all night on the tree, but must be buried the same day so the land will not be defiled.

Deuteronomy 22

Deuteronomy 22:1-2

What are they to do when they would see a stray animal of a fellow Israelite?

They are to return the animal to its owner. If the owner is not nearby or they do not know who he is, they should take the animal to their own house until the owner comes searching for it and then return it to him.

Deuteronomy 22:4

ULT	UST
<i>You shall not see the donkey of your brother or his ox fallen down in the road and hide yourself from them; lifting, you shall lift it up.</i>	<i>And if you see a fellow Israelite's donkey or cow that has fallen down on the road, do not act as though you did not see it. Help the owner to lift the animal up so that it can stand on its feet again.</i>

What did Moses tell them to do when they see an animal of a fellow Israelite fallen down in the road?

They must help their fellow Israelite lift it up again.

Deuteronomy 22:5

ULT	UST
<i>A thing of a man shall not be on a woman, and neither shall a man wear the clothing of a woman; for all who do these {are} an abomination to Yahweh your God.</i>	<i>Women must not wear men's clothes, and men must not wear women's clothes. Yahweh our God hates people who do things like that.</i>

What is an abomination to Yahweh?

It is an abomination to Yahweh for a woman to wear men's clothing or a man to wear women's clothing.

Deuteronomy 22:6-7

What should the people of Israel do if they find a mother in a bird's nest with her young or sitting on the eggs?

They must let the mother go, but the young they may take for themselves.

Deuteronomy 22:8

<i>When you build a new house, then you shall make a railing for your roof, and you will not bring blood on your house if one who falls should fall from it.</i>	<i>If you build a new house, you must put a railing around the roof. In this way, you will not be guilty of having caused someone's death if a person falls from it and dies.</i>

What is required when an Israelite builds a house?

It is required that he put a railing around the roof so he would not be guilty of causing someone's death if anyone fell from it.

Deuteronomy 22:9

ULT	UST
<i>You shall not plant your vineyard with two kinds of seed, lest all the produce of the seed that you have sown and the yield of the vineyard be set apart.</i>	<i>Do not plant any crop in the area where your grapevines are growing. If you do, the harvest of both will become sacred.</i>

What would happen if the Israelites plant their vineyards with two kinds of seeds?

If they plant their vineyards with two kinds of seeds, all the produce of the seed and the yield of the vineyard would have to be set apart.

Deuteronomy 22:12

ULT	UST
<i>You shall make tassels for yourself on the four corners of your garment with which you cover {yourself}.</i>	<i>Twist threads together to make tassels and sew them on the four bottom corners of your cloak.</i>

What were the Israelites instructed to make for the four corners of their garments?

They were instructed to make tassels for the four corners of the garments with which they covered themselves.

Deuteronomy 22:17-19

What must happen if a man has made a false accusation against his wife saying she was not a virgin?

The elders of the city must punish the man. They must fine him 100 silvers and give it to the girl's father. Also, she shall remain his wife, and he can never send her away.

Deuteronomy 22:20-21

What should happen if the proof of the wife's virginity is not found?

If they cannot find proof of her virginity, then she must be brought out and stoned to death because she has done a disgraceful thing.

Deuteronomy 22:22

ULT	UST
<i>If a man is found lying with a woman married to a husband, then they shall die, even the two of them, the man lying with the woman and the woman; and you shall remove the evil from Israel.</i>	<i>If someone catches a man having sex with another man's wife, you must execute both of them, the man and the woman. By doing that, you will make sure no one from Israel does this evil action.</i>

What must happen if a man is found lying with a woman married to another man?

Both the man and the woman must be put to death to make sure no one else from Israel does this evil action.

Deuteronomy 22:23-24

Why are the people of Israel instructed to stone to death both a girl who is engaged to a man and another man if they are found lying together?

They are instructed to stone both of them because the girl did not cry out and the man defiled the one who is engaged to be the wife of a fellow Israelite.

Deuteronomy 22:25-27

What must happen if the man forces the engaged girl to lie with him when they are out in a field?

If this happens out in a field, then the man must die, but nothing must be done to the girl because he found her out in the open countryside and even though she cried out, there was no one there to rescue her.

Deuteronomy 22:28-29

What must happen if a man lies with a girl who is a virgin, but who is not engaged and they are discovered?

The man who lay with her must give 50 silvers to the girl's father, and she shall become his wife and he may never divorce her.

Deuteronomy 22:30

ULT	UST
<i>A man shall not take the wife of his father; and he shall not uncover the hem of his father.</i>	<i>A man must not disgrace his father by having sex with any of his father's wives.</i>

What must a man not take from his father as his own?

A man must not take his father's wife as his own.

Deuteronomy 23

Deuteronomy 23:1-2

Who is not allowed to enter the assembly of Yahweh?

A man whose male organ is crushed or cut off, or a child from intermarriage and that person's descendants to the tenth generation, are not allowed to enter the assembly of Yahweh.

Deuteronomy 23:3-4

Why are Ammonites and Moabites not allowed to enter the assembly of Yahweh?

They are not allowed to enter because they did not provide the Israelites with food and water when the Israelites came out of Egypt, and because they hired Balaam to curse the Israelites.

Deuteronomy 23:5

ULT	UST
<i>But Yahweh your God was not willing to listen to Balaam, and Yahweh your God turned the curse into a blessing for you, because Yahweh your God loved you.</i>	<i>But Yahweh our God did not pay attention to Balaam; instead, he caused Balaam to bless you rather than curse you, because Yahweh our God loves you.</i>

What evidence showed that Yahweh did not listen to Balaam?

Yahweh turned Balaam's curse into a blessing for Israel.

Deuteronomy 23:7

ULT	UST
<i>You shall not detest an Edomite, for he {is} your brother; you shall not detest an Egyptian, because you were a foreigner in his land.</i>	<i>But do not despise any Edomites, because they are descendants of your ancestor Isaac, just like you are. Likewise, do not despise people from Egypt, because they treated your ancestors well when they first lived in Egypt.</i>

Why should they not detest the Edomites and Egyptians?

They are not to detest the Edomites because they are considered relatives of the Israelites as they are descendants of Isaac. The Egyptians should not be detested because the Israelites once lived as foreigners in Egypt.

Deuteronomy 23:9-11

If a man in the Israelite army becomes unclean because of what happens during the night, what must he do to become clean and return to the camp?

He must go outside the camp until evening. Then he must bathe in water, and at sunset he can return to the camp.

Deuteronomy 23:12-14

Why did Yahweh give instructions to the people of Israel about where and how to relieve themselves?

Yahweh was walking in the midst of their camp, so the camp must be holy in order that Yahweh would not see any unclean thing and turn away from them.

Deuteronomy 23:15-16

What are the instructions concerning a slave who escapes from their master?

Such a slave is not to be returned to their master. They are to be allowed to live among the Israelites in any town they choose, and they must not be mistreated.

Deuteronomy 23:17-18

Why were male and female cultic prostitutes not allowed among the Israelites, and why were their earnings not allowed to be brought as a vow into Yahweh's house?

These practices and the earnings from them are considered an abomination to Yahweh.

Deuteronomy 23:19-20

How is the policy for charging interest different for fellow Israelites compared to foreigners?

Israelites are not to charge interest to other Israelites on loans of money, food, or anything else. However, they are allowed to charge interest to foreigners.

Deuteronomy 23:21-23

How important is it for an Israelite to fulfill a vow made to Yahweh?

It is very important. An Israelite must not delay in fulfilling a vow made to Yahweh because Yahweh requires it, and failing to do so is a sin. They must do what they have voluntarily promised.

Deuteronomy 23:24-25

What are Israelites allowed to do when passing through a neighbor's vineyard or grain field?

When in a neighbor's vineyard, they are allowed to eat as many grapes as they want but not to put any in a container to take with them. When in a neighbor's grain field, they are allowed to pluck ears of grain by hand but not to use a sickle to cut the stalks.

Deuteronomy 24

Deuteronomy 24:1-2

What can a man who finds some indecent thing in his wife do to divorce her?

If a man has found some indecent thing in his wife, he can write her a letter of divorce, give the paper to her, and send her out of his house where she can go and become another man's wife.

Deuteronomy 24:3-4

What does Yahweh not allow if the second husband writes her a letter of divorce and sends her out of the house or if he dies?

Yahweh does not allow for the first husband who sent her away to take her again to be his wife.

Deuteronomy 24:5

ULT	UST
<i>When a man takes a new wife, he shall not go out with the army, neither shall pass onto him any matter; he shall be free for his house one year and will cheer his wife whom he has taken.</i>	<i>When a man has just married a woman, he must not become a soldier in the army. He must not have to do any other kind of government work. He must not do those things during the first year after he gets married. Instead, he must stay at home and do what he can to make his new wife happy.</i>

What are the benefits for a man who has taken a new wife?

He does not have to go to war or be commanded to go on forced duty, but he can stay home for one year to make his new wife happy.

Deuteronomy 24:6

ULT	UST
<i>He shall not impound a mill or an upper millstone, for it {is} a life for a pledge.</i>	<i>If someone lends money to another person, he may take something from that person as a guarantee that he will pay the money back. But he must not take a millstone. That is what the family needs to grind grain into flour in order to bake bread and stay alive.</i>

Why were they not allowed to take a mill or an upper millstone as a pledge from another?

They were not to take a millstone as a pledge because it would be taking a man's livelihood away from him.

Deuteronomy 24:7

ULT	UST
<i>If a man is found stealing a life from his brothers from the sons of Israel, and treats him as a slave or sells him, then that thief shall die; and you shall remove the evil from among you.</i>	<i>If someone kidnaps a fellow Israelite to make that person his slave or to sell him to become someone else's slave, you must execute the person-stealer. By doing that, you will make sure no one among you does this evil action.</i>

What are the circumstances when a man would be declared a thief and must die?

A man would be declared a thief who must die if he kidnaps a fellow Israelite and treats him as a slave or sells him.

Deuteronomy 24:8-9

What word of caution from Yahweh about leprosy did Moses pass on to the people of Israel?

Moses told them to carefully observe and follow every instruction which Yahweh gave to the priests regarding any plague of leprosy.

Deuteronomy 24:10-11

What restrictions were given when collecting a pledge on a loan made to a neighbor?

They were not to go into the house to get the pledge, but stand outside and wait for the man who received the loan to bring out the pledge.

Deuteronomy 24:12-13

What must happen if a man gives his cloak as a pledge because he is a poor man?

If the poor man gives his cloak as a pledge for a loan, the one who gives him the loan must not keep the cloak overnight, but must take it back to him by the time the sun goes down so he may sleep in his cloak.

Deuteronomy 24:14-15

What must they do for a hired servant who is poor and needy?

They must give him his wages every day because he is poor and is counting on it.

Deuteronomy 24:16

ULT	UST
<i>Fathers shall not be put to death on account of sons, and sons shall not be put to death on account of fathers. A man shall be put to death for his sin.</i>	<i>You must not execute any parents for crimes that their children have committed, and you must not execute any children for crimes that their parents have committed. You should only execute someone for the crimes that they themselves have committed.</i>

How did Yahweh make it clear that everyone was responsible for their own sins?

Yahweh told the people of Israel that the parents must not be put to death for the sins of their children and the children must not be put to death for the sins of their parents.

Deuteronomy 24:17-18

Why were the people of Israel reminded about their time of slavery in Egypt and how Yahweh rescued them from there?

They were reminded so that they would follow Yahweh's commands about how to treat foreigners, orphans, and widows.

Deuteronomy 24:19-20

What were the people of Israel commanded to do when they harvested their field or shook their olive tree?

When they harvested their crops, they were not to go back for a forgotten sheaf in the field or to beat their olive tree a second time to get more olives, but to leave them for the foreigner, the fatherless, and the widow.

Deuteronomy 25

Deuteronomy 25:1

ULT	UST
<i>If there is a dispute between men and they go to the judgment, and they judge them, then they shall declare the righteous as just and declare the wicked as unjust.</i>	<i>If people have a dispute and they go to a court, the judge will decide who is innocent and who is guilty.</i>

What will a judge do when he reaches a judgement in a dispute between two men in court?

He will declare the righteous as innocent and declare the wicked as guilty.

Deuteronomy 25:3

ULT	UST
<i>He shall not add to his 40 blows, lest he add his striking of him {with} many {more} blows than these, and your brother is humiliated before your eyes.</i>	<i>The judge may order someone to strike him up to forty times. Do not strike him more than that, since that would humiliate him publicly.</i>

Why will a judge limit the number of blows a man will receive?

The judge will order the number of blows to not exceed 40 blows so the man will not be humiliated.

Deuteronomy 25:5-6

What safeguard did Yahweh institute so that the name of a man would not disappear from Israel?

If a man dies without having a son, his brother must take the dead man's widow as his wife so that the firstborn she bears will carry on the name of that man's dead brother.

Deuteronomy 25:9-10

What punishment did Yahweh allow if the man's brother did not wish to take his brother's wife?

The brother's wife will take off his sandal in the presence of the elders, spit in his face, and tell him that this is what is done when a man refuses to preserve his brother's family line.

Deuteronomy 25:11-12

What would cause a wife to have one of her hands cut off?

If two men were fighting and the wife of one of the men grabs the private part of the other man in an attempt to rescue her husband, then her hand must be cut off.

Deuteronomy 25:15-16

What kind of dishonest act is disgusting to Yahweh?

It is disgusting to Yahweh when a man has a large and a small weight to measure rather than a correct weight.

Deuteronomy 25:17-19

Why must the people of Israel wipe out the memory of Amalek?

Amalek did not honor God when Amalek met Israel on the road and attacked those who were faint and weary at the rear as they came out of Egypt.

Deuteronomy 26

Deuteronomy 26:1-2

What must the people of Israel do when they possess the land which Yahweh has given them?

The people of Israel must take some of the first of all the harvest of the land in a basket and go to the place Yahweh has chosen for them to worship.

Deuteronomy 26:3

ULT	UST
<i>And you shall go to the priest who will be in those days and say to him, 'I declare today to Yahweh your God that I have come to the land that Yahweh swore to our fathers to give to us.'</i>	<i>Go to the high priest who is serving at that time and say to him, 'Yahweh our God solemnly promised our ancestors to give us this land. Today {by this offering} I declare to him that I am settled here {in fulfillment of his promise}.'</i>

What must they say to the priest when they give him the basket?

They must tell the priest that they declare to Yahweh that they have come and settled in the land that he swore to give to their ancestors.

Deuteronomy 26:5

ULT	UST
<i>And you shall respond and say to the face of Yahweh your God, 'My father {was} a wandering Aramean. And he went down to Egypt and stayed there, his people {were} few, and there he became a great, mighty, and numerous nation.'</i>	<i>There in Yahweh our God's presence you must say this: 'My ancestor was a nomadic man in Aram. He took his family to Egypt. They were a small group when they went there, but they lived there and their descendants became a very large and powerful nation.'</i>

What must they say about their ancestor?

The people of Israel must say that their ancestor was a wandering Aramean.

Deuteronomy 26:6

ULT	UST
<i>And the Egyptians treated us badly and afflicted us. And they set hard work upon us.</i>	<i>Then the people of Egypt acted very harshly toward them, and they forced them to become their slaves and to work very hard.</i>

How did the Egyptians treat the Israelites when they were in Egypt?

The Egyptians treated the Israelites badly and afflicted them, making them do the work of slaves.

Deuteronomy 26:8

ULT	UST
<i>And Yahweh brought us out from Egypt with a mighty hand and with an outstretched arm and with great fearsomeness and with signs and with wonders;</i>	<i>Then by your great power and by performing many kinds of miracles, and other terrifying things, you brought them out of Egypt.</i>

How did Yahweh bring Israel out of Egypt?

He brought them out with a mighty hand, with a display of his great fearsome power, with signs, and with wonders.

Deuteronomy 26:10-11

What is the purpose for setting down the basket before Yahweh?

The purpose is to worship Yahweh and rejoice in all the good that he has done for Israel, their families, the Levites, and the foreigners among them.

Deuteronomy 26:12

ULT	UST
<i>When you have finished tithing all the tithe of your harvest in the third year (the year of tithing), then you shall give {it} to the Levite, to the foreigner, to the fatherless, and to the widow, and they may eat within your gates and be satisfied.</i>	<i>Every third year, you must bring to the descendants of Levi, to the foreigners who are living among you, to the orphans, and to the widows the offering of a tenth of your crops, in order that in every town they will have plenty to eat.</i>

What must they do after they have finished giving all the tithe from their harvest?

They must give it to the Levites, to the foreigners, to the orphans, and to the widows so they may eat and be filled.

Deuteronomy 26:15

ULT	UST
<i>Look down from your holy habitation, from the heavens, and bless your people, Israel, and the land that you have given to us, as you had sworn to our fathers, a land flowing with milk and honey.'</i>	<i>So please look down from your holy living place in heaven, and bless us, your Israelite people. Also bless this very fertile land which you have given to us, as you promised our ancestors you would give it to us.'</i>

What do the people of Israel want Yahweh to do for them?

The people of Israel want Yahweh to look down from heaven and bless them and the land which he has given to them.

Deuteronomy 26:16

ULT	UST
<i>This day Yahweh your God is commanding you to obey these statutes and ordinances, and you shall keep and do them with all your heart and with all your soul.</i>	<i>Today Yahweh our God is commanding you to obey all these rules and decrees. So obey them faithfully, with all that you are.</i>

What is Yahweh commanding the people to do?

He is commanding them to obey his statutes and decrees with all their heart and soul.

Deuteronomy 26:17

ULT	UST
<i>Yahweh you have declared today to be your God, and to walk in his ways and to keep his statutes and his commandments and his ordinances, and to listen to his voice.</i>	<i>Today you have declared that it is Yahweh who is your God, and that you will conduct your lives as he wants you to do, that you will obey all his commands, rules, and decrees, and that you will do all that he tells you to do.</i>

What have the people declared before Yahweh?

They have declared that Yahweh is their God and that they will walk in his ways, keep his commandments, and listen to and obey all that he tells them to do.

Deuteronomy 26:18-19

What has Yahweh declared to the people of Israel?

Yahweh has declared that Israel is his own possession and he will set them high above all the other nations in respect to praise, reputation, and honor so they will be a people that is set apart and holy to him.

Deuteronomy 27

Deuteronomy 27:1

ULT	UST
<i>And Moses and the elders of Israel commanded the people, saying, "Keep all the commandments that I command you today.</i>	<i>Moses, along with the other Israelite leaders, said this to the people, "Obey all the commandments that I am giving to you today.</i>

What did Moses and the elders of Israel command the people of Israel to keep?

Moses and the elders of Israel told the people to keep all the commandments that Moses had given them that day.

Deuteronomy 27:2

ULT	UST
<i>And it will be, on the day when you cross the Jordan to the land that Yahweh your God is giving to you, then you shall erect for yourself large stones and plaster them with plaster.</i>	<i>Soon you will cross the Jordan River and enter the land that Yahweh, our God, promised to give to you. There, set up some large stones and cover them with plaster.</i>

What were the people to do after they cross the Jordan River to the land which Yahweh would give them?

They were to erect some large stones covered with plaster.

Deuteronomy 27:4-6

What must the people build on Mount Ebal?

The people must build an altar of stone to Yahweh without using iron tools to sacrifice burnt offerings to him.

Deuteronomy 27:8

ULT	UST
<i>And you shall write on the stones all the words of this law very plainly."</i>	<i>When you write these laws on those stones, you must write them very clearly."</i>

What were the people to write on the stones they had plastered?

They were to write all the words of the law on the stones very plainly.

Deuteronomy 27:9-10

Why was it important for the people of Israel to hear the voice of Yahweh and obey his commandments that day?

It was important because on that day they became the people of Yahweh.

Deuteronomy 27:11-12

Why were six of the tribes of Israel commanded to stand on Mount Gerizim?

Moses told them that six of the tribes of Israel must stand on Mount Gerizim to receive the blessings that the Levites proclaimed.

Deuteronomy 27:13

ULT	UST
<i>And these shall stand for the curse on Mount Ebal: Reuben, Gad and Asher and Zebulun, Dan, and Naphtali.</i>	<i>And the tribes descended from Reuben, Gad, Asher, Zebulun, Dan, and Naphtali must stand on Mount Ebal and listen to the {things that Yahweh will do when he} curses {the people}.</i>

Why were six of the tribes of Israel commanded to stand on Mount Ebal?

Moses told them that the other six tribes of Israel must stand on Mount Ebal to receive the curses that the Levites proclaimed.

Deuteronomy 27:15

<i>'Cursed is the man who makes a carved image or cast figure, an abomination {to} Yahweh, the work of the hands of a craftsman, and sets up secretly.' And all the people shall answer and say, 'Amen.'</i>	<i>'Yahweh will curse anyone who carves a figure from wood or stone or casts a figure from metal, and secretly sets it up and worships it. Yahweh considers that those things are detestable.' And all the people must reply, 'Amen.'</i>

What is one thing that is detestable to Yahweh?

One thing that is detestable to Yahweh is a carved or cast figure made by a craftsman who sets it up to worship it in secret.

Deuteronomy 27:20

<i>'Cursed is the one who lies with the wife of his father, because he has uncovered the hem of his father.' And all the people shall say, 'Amen.'</i>	<i>'Yahweh will curse anyone who violates his father's marriage rights by having sexual relations with any of his father's wives.' And all the people must reply, 'Amen.'</i>

Why is a man cursed if he lies with his father's wife?

A man is cursed if he sleeps with his father's wife, because he has violated his father's marriage rights.

Deuteronomy 27:24-25

What did the Levites say would happen to the man who secretly kills his neighbor or takes a bribe to kill an innocent person?

That the man would be cursed.

Deuteronomy 27:26

ULT	UST
<i>'Cursed is the one who does not keep the words of this law, to do them.' And all the people shall say, 'Amen.'</i>	<i>'Yahweh will curse anyone who does not carefully obey these laws.' And all the people must reply, 'Amen.'</i>

Why did the Levites say a man should keep the words of this law by obeying them?

A man should obey the words of this law so he would not be cursed.

Deuteronomy 28

Deuteronomy 28:1-2

What did the people of Israel have to do in order to be blessed by Yahweh and to be set above all the other nations of the earth?

The people of Israel needed to listen carefully to the voice of Yahweh and obey all his commandments.

Deuteronomy 28:7

ULT	UST
<i>Yahweh shall let your enemies who rise up against you be struck down to your faces; they will come out against you one way but will flee to your faces seven ways.</i>	<i>Yahweh will enable you to defeat the armies of your enemies; they will attack you from one direction, but they will run away from you in many directions.</i>

What will Yahweh do for the people of Israel if they will obey his commandments?

Yahweh will enable them to defeat their enemies.

Deuteronomy 28:9

ULT	UST
<i>Yahweh will establish you as his sanctified people, as he has sworn to you, if you keep the commandments of Yahweh your God and walk in his ways.</i>	<i>If you obey all that Yahweh our God is commanding you to do, he will keep you as his own holy people, just as he promised you.</i>

What does Moses tell the people of Israel they will become if they obey Yahweh's commandments?

Yahweh will establish them as his own holy people.

Deuteronomy 28:12

What will happen to the people of Israel if they will not listen to the voice of Yahweh and keep all his commandments?

All the curses will come upon them.

Deuteronomy 28:23

<i>And your skies that {are} over your head shall be bronze, and the earth that {is} under you {shall be} iron.</i>	<i>It will not rain so the ground will be very hard and unproductive.</i>

What will happen to the skies and the earth if the Israelites do not obey the commandments?

The skies will not give rain and the earth will be as dry and hard as iron.

Deuteronomy 28:25

ULT	UST
<i>Yahweh shall let you be struck down to the faces of your enemies; you will go out one way against him but will flee to his face seven ways. And you will become a horror to all the kingdoms of the earth.</i>	<i>Yahweh will enable your enemies to defeat you; your soldiers will attack them from one direction, but will run away from them in many directions. People from every other nation will be horrified at what Yahweh has done to you.</i>

What will happen to Israel when they fight their enemies if they do not obey the commandments?

They will flee from their enemies and be defeated by them.

Deuteronomy 28:27-28

What will Yahweh cause to happen to the people of Israel if they are disobedient?

He will cause them to have boils, ulcers, rash, and itch, as well as madness, blindness, and mental confusion.

Deuteronomy 28:30

<i>You will betroth a woman, but another man will rape her. You will build a house but not live in it; you will plant a vineyard but not use it.</i>	<i>A man will formally arrange to marry a young woman, but someone else will rape her. You will build houses, but you will never live in them. You will plant grapevines, but you will not pick any grapes or drink any wine.</i>

What will happen if an Israelite is betrothed to a woman, builds a house, or plants a vineyard but disobeys Yahweh?

Another man will rape his betrothed and he will not be able to live in the house or enjoy the fruit of the vineyard.

Deuteronomy 28:32

<i>Your sons and your daughters {will be} given to other peoples, and your eyes will look on and will long for them all the day, and your hand will have no strength.</i>	<i>Foreigners will steal your sons and daughters. You will constantly watch for your children to return, but you will not be able to do anything for them.</i>

What will happen to the sons and daughters of the Israelites if they disobey Yahweh?

Their sons and daughters will be given to other peoples and they will not return to them.

Deuteronomy 28:37

ULT	UST

How will the disobedience of the people of Israel affect the crops which they plant?

They will put seed in their fields and plant vineyards but they will not enjoy the harvest or fruit from them because the worms and the locusts will eat them.

Deuteronomy 28:43-44

How will the foreigner become more important than the people of Israel?

Foreigners will lend to them while the people of Israel will not be able to lend to the foreigners so will be considered inferior to them.

Deuteronomy 28:45

What will happen because the people of Israel did not listen to the voice of Yahweh and keep his commandments?

All the curses listed will happen to them until they are destroyed.

Why will the people of Israel serve the enemies of Yahweh?

They will serve their enemies because they did not serve Yahweh with joyfulness and gladness of heart when they had abundant blessings.

Deuteronomy 28:49-51

What did Moses prophesy about the people of Israel?

Yahweh would bring a nation from far away to attack them with no respect for the aged or young, as well as taking their crops and animals, leaving them to starve.

Deuteronomy 28:54-55

	<i>When your enemies have surrounded your towns, even the most dainty and sensitive men among you will want food very desperately, with the result that they will kill their own children and eat them, because they will not have anything else to eat. During the siege of the city what will the man who is described not share with even his own family?

He will not give to any of them the flesh of his own children that he is going to eat.

What will happen if the people of Israel do not honor the name of Yahweh by keeping the words in the book of the law?

They will experience terrible plagues and enduring sicknesses.

How many of the people of Israel will be left after Yahweh punishes them?

Although they had been numerous, only a few of them will remain scattered among the other nations.

Why did Moses say that the people of Israel needed to be reminded of the great sufferings that their eyes had seen as well as the signs and wonders?

Moses said that until that time, Yahweh had not given them understanding about those things.

Deuteronomy 29:5-6

Why did Yahweh lead Israel for 40 years in the wilderness where their clothes and sandals did not wear out and they did not eat any bread or drink any wine or alcoholic drinks?

He did those things so that they might know that he is Yahweh their God.

What would happen to the man who says that he will have peace even though he stubbornly does what he wants?

Yahweh will not forgive him, Yahweh will be angry with him and all the curses written in the book will happen to him and Yahweh will destroy him and his family forever.

Deuteronomy 29:22-24

What will the future generations and other nations say when they see the plagues on this land and the diseases which Yahweh has sent on them?

They will say that Yahweh did this to this land and wonder why he was so angry with the people who lived there.

Deuteronomy 29:25-27

How will people reply when future generations ask why Yahweh did this to the land?

The people will say that Yahweh became very angry and brought these curses on their land because they had abandoned the covenant they had made with Yahweh and because they went and worshiped other gods, gods that they had not worshiped before and that he had told them not to worship.

Deuteronomy 29:28

Why should the people choose life?

They should choose life so as to love Yahweh their God, to obey his voice and to cling to him because he is their life and will enable them and their descendants to live for a long time in the land that he has given to them.

Deuteronomy 31:1-2

What did Moses tell all Israel about his advancing age?

He told them that he was now 120 years old and that he could no longer go everywhere that they could go.

Deuteronomy 31:2-3

What did Yahweh tell Moses about going over the Jordan?

He told Moses that he would not be going over Jordan but God would go over Jordan ahead of them and would destroy the nations there for Israel.

Deuteronomy 31:3

Moses told Joshua to be strong and courageous for Joshua would go with the people of Israel into the land that Yahweh swore to their ancestors to give to them and Yahweh will cause them to inherit the land.

Moses commanded the priests to read the law at the end of every seven years, during the Festival of Huts, in the hearing of all Israel.

Why did Moses tell the priests to assemble the men, women, children, and foreigners?

Moses told the priests to assemble all the people so that they could hear and learn, and honor Yahweh their God and keep all the words of the law and so that their children could hear and learn to honor Yahweh.

For how long should the priests read the law to the people of Israel?

Yahweh told Moses to call Joshua to the tent of meeting because the day was coming when Moses must die and Yahweh would appoint Joshua to be the new leader.

Deuteronomy 31:14-15

What happen when Moses and Joshua presented themselves in the tent of meeting?

When Moses and Joshua presented themselves in the tent of meeting, Yahweh appeared in the tent in a pillar of cloud which stood over the door of the tent.

Deuteronomy 31:16

What did Yahweh tell Moses he would do when the people break Yahweh's covenant?

Yahweh told Moses that on the day the people break his covenant, he would be very angry with them and would abandon them, and he would refuse to help them any longer.

Deuteronomy 31:17-18

What did Yahweh tell Moses would happen to the people when Yahweh hid his face from them?

Yahweh told Moses that many bad things would happen to them and he would stop protecting them.

What did Yahweh tell Moses the people would do when they were in the land that Yahweh swore to give to their ancestors?

Yahweh told Moses the people of Israel would turn to other gods, worship them, despise Yahweh and break his covenant.

Deuteronomy 31:21

<i>And it will be, when many evils and troubles find him, then this song will testify to his face as a witness (for it will not be forgotten from the mouths of his seed). For I know the intent that he is making today, before I have brought him into the land that I promised."</i>	<i>When many terrible disasters are happening to them, their descendants will remember this song. It will be like a witness that saw them commit to worship me and accuses them of breaking their promises. What did Yahweh tell Moses the song would do when many evils and troubles happen to the people of Israel?

Moses says disaster will come when Yahweh will become very angry because of the evil things they will do.

How will Israel live?

Israel will live safely and securely in a land of grain and new wine.

<i>Your happiness, Israel! Who {is} like you, a people saved by Yahweh, the shield of your help, and who {is} the sword of your majesty? And your enemies will fawn over you, but you, on their backs will trample.”</i>	<i>You people of Israel are very fortunate. There is certainly no nation like your nation, whom Yahweh has rescued {from being slaves in Egypt}. He will be like a shield to protect you and like a powerful sword to enable you to defeat your enemies. Your enemies will come to you begging for you to act mercifully toward them, but you will thoroughly overcome them.”</i>

How does Moses describing Israel?

Moses describes Israel as a people saved by Yahweh, whose enemies will come begging to them.

Deuteronomy 34

Deuteronomy 34:1-3

From where was Moses shown all the lands that the tribes of Israel would possess?

Moses was shown all the land that the tribes of Israel would possess from the top of Pisgah.

Deuteronomy 34:4

<i>And Yahweh said to him, "This {is} the land that I swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, saying, 'I will give it to your seed.' I have showed you, to your eyes, but you will not go over there."</i>	<i>Then Yahweh said to him, "This is the land that I solemnly promised Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob that I would give to their descendants. I have allowed you to see it clearly from a distance, but you will not go there."</i>

What did Yahweh allow Moses to see before he died?

Yahweh allowed Moses to see the land that Yahweh promised to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

Deuteronomy 34:5-6

Where did Moses die and where did Yahweh bury Moses?

Moses died in the land of Moab and Yahweh buried him in the valley, in the land of Moab opposite Beth Peor.

Deuteronomy 34:7

ULT	UST
<i>And Moses {was} a son of 120 years when he died; his eye was not dim, nor had his vigor fled.</i>	<i>Moses was 120 years old when he died, but he was still very strong, and he could still see very well.</i>

What was Moses physical condition when he died at 120 years of age?

When Moses died he was still strong and could see well.

Deuteronomy 34:8

ULT	UST
<i>And the sons of Israel mourned Moses in the plains of Moab 30 days, and the days of the tears of mourning {for} Moses were finished.</i>	<i>The Israelites mourned for Moses in the plains of Moab for thirty days and then they stopped crying for him.</i>

How long did the people of Israel mourn for Moses?

The people mourned for Moses for 30 days.

Deuteronomy 34:9

ULT	UST
<i>And Joshua, the son of Nun, {was} full of the spirit of wisdom, for Moses had laid his hands on him. And the sons of Israel listened to him and did what Yahweh had commanded Moses.</i>	<i>Because Moses had put his hands on Joshua the son of Nun {to appoint him to be the Israelites' new leader}, God gave Joshua a spirit that made him very wise. The Israelites obeyed Joshua, and they obeyed all that Yahweh had commanded them through Moses.</i>

Why did the people of Israel listen to Joshua and do what Yahweh had commanded Moses?

The people of Israel listened to Joshua because Joshua was full of the spirit of wisdom, for Moses had laid his hands on him.

Deuteronomy 34:10

ULT	UST
<i>And a prophet like Moses has not arisen in Israel since, whom Yahweh knew face to face,</i>	<i>Since the time that Moses lived, there has never been a prophet in Israel like him, for Yahweh spoke with him personally.</i>

How was Moses known by Yahweh?

Yahweh knew Moses face to face.

Deuteronomy 34:10-12

Has there ever been a prophet like Moses in Israel?

There has never been any other prophet like Moses in all of Israel.
