Joshua 1

Joshua 1:1-3

What did Yahweh tell Joshua to do after the death of Moses?

Yahweh told Joshua to arise, cross the Jordan River with all the people, and go into the land he was giving to the sons of Israel.

Joshua 1:5

ULT	UST
<i>No man will {be able to} stand to your face all of the days of your life. I will be with you just as I was with Moses. I will not abandon you and I will not leave you.</i>	<i>No people group will be able to defeat you as long as you live. I will help you as I helped Moses. I promise that I will not abandon you and I will never leave you.</i>

Why did Yahweh say that no one would be able to stand against Joshua?

Yahweh said that no one would be able to stand against Joshua because Yahweh would be with Joshua just as he had been with Moses.

Joshua 1:7

ULT	UST
<i>Only be strong and be very courageous, to be careful to do according to all of the law that Moses, my servant, commanded you. Do not turn aside from it {to} the right or {to} the left, so that you may succeed in every {place} where you go.</i>	<i>Just be strong and very brave so that you can be sure to obey all the laws that my servant Moses gave to you. {Obey those laws} so that you may be successful wherever you go. Do not stop obeying any of them.</i>

What did Yahweh ask Joshua to do regarding the law of Moses?

Yahweh asked Joshua to be strong and very courageous, and to be careful to do according to all the law that Moses commanded, not turning from it to the right or to the left.

Joshua 1:8

ULT	UST
<i>This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth but you shall meditate on it day and night, so that you will be careful to do according to everything written in it. For then you will make your ways prosperous and then you will succeed.</i>	<i>Make sure to read continually the laws that God gave Moses. Constantly think about those laws so that you will carefully obey each one. If you do that, then you will be successful in the things you do.</i>

What did Yahweh tell Joshua he should meditate on day and night?

Yahweh told Joshua that the book of the law should not depart from his mouth, but he should meditate on it day and night.

Joshua 1:11

ULT	UST
<i>“Pass through the midst of the camp and command the people, saying, ‘Prepare provisions for yourselves, because within three days you are crossing over this Jordan to enter to possess the land that Yahweh your God is giving to you to possess it.’”</i>	<i>“Go throughout the camp and give these orders to the people: ‘Prepare all the food that you will take with you, because the day after tomorrow we will cross the Jordan River. We are going across in order to conquer the land that Yahweh, our God, has promised to give us.’”</i>

What did Joshua tell the officers of the people to command the people?

Joshua told the officers to command the people to prepare provisions for themselves because within three days they would cross the Jordan to possess the land Yahweh was giving them.

Joshua 1:13

ULT	UST
<i>“Remember the word that Moses the servant of Yahweh commanded you, saying, ‘Yahweh your God {is} giving rest to you, and he will give to you this land.’</i>	<i>“Keep in mind the orders that Moses the servant of Yahweh gave you. Moses said, ‘Yahweh your God will give you this land so that you can live here peacefully.’</i>

What did Joshua remind the people that Moses had said Yahweh would give them?

Joshua reminded the people that Moses had said, “Yahweh your God is giving rest to you, and he will give to you this land.”

Joshua 1:14

ULT	UST
<i>Your wives, your little ones, and your livestock may remain in the land that Moses gave to you on the other side of the Jordan. But you yourselves, being armed, shall cross over to the face of your brothers, all of the warriors of valor, and you shall help them</i>	<i>Your wives, your little children, and your cows, sheep, and goats may stay here in this land that Moses gave you on the east side of the Jordan River. But all the men of fighting age{, twenty years old or older,} must cross the Jordan River. They must go ahead of the people of the other tribes. Your soldiers must take all their weapons so that they can help their fellow Israelites.</i>

What did Joshua tell the Reubenites, the Gadites, and half the tribe of Manasseh to do?

Joshua told them that their wives, children, and livestock could remain in the land Moses had given them east of the Jordan, but all their warriors, being armed, should cross over to help their brothers.

Joshua 1:16

ULT	UST
<i>And they answered Joshua, saying, "All of what you have commanded us, we will do, and to everywhere you send us, we will go.</i>	<i>The people answered Joshua, "We will do everything you have told us to do, and we will go wherever you tell us to go.</i>

How did the people answer Joshua's commands?

The people answered Joshua by saying they would do all that he had commanded them and go wherever he sent them.

Joshua 2

Joshua 2:1

ULT	UST
<i>And Joshua, the son of Nun, secretly sent from Shittim two men, spies, saying, "Go, see the land and Jericho." And they went and entered the house of a woman, a prostitute, and her name {was} Rahab, and they stayed there.</i>	<i>Then Joshua son of Nun chose two men from their camp at Shittim. He told them, "Go secretly and find out all that you can about the land, especially about the city of Jericho." They left the camp and went to Jericho. A prostitute whose name was Rahab lived in that city. They stayed in her house that night.</i>

Where did the two spies stay when Joshua sent them to see the land and Jericho?

The two spies stayed at the house of a prostitute named Rahab in Jericho.

Joshua 2:4

ULT	UST
<i>But the woman had taken the two men and had hidden them. And she said, "Indeed, the men came to me, but I did not know from where they {were}."</i>	<i>But Rahab had already hidden the two men {inside her house}. She told the messengers, "Yes, it is true that those men came to me. But I did not know that they were spies."</i>

What did Rahab do with the two spies when the king of Jericho sent men to find them?

When the king's men came to Rahab looking for the spies, she had hidden the spies, and she denied knowing where they were.

Joshua 2:5

ULT	UST
<i>And the gate was to shut at darkness, and the men went out. I do not know where the men went. Pursue quickly after them, for you may overtake them."</i>	<i>Those men left Jericho at dusk, before the guards closed the city gates. I do not know where they were going. But if you hurry, you might catch up with them."</i>

What did Rahab tell the men from the king of Jericho about the spies?

Rahab told the king's men that the spies had come to her, but she did not know where they were from, and they left at dark when the gate was about to shut. She told the men to pursue them quickly to overtake them.

Joshua 2:9

ULT	UST
<i>And she said to the men, "I know that Yahweh has given the land to you and that the dread of you has fallen on us and that all the dwellers of the land have melted from your faces.</i>	<i>She said to them, "We know that Yahweh is going to enable you Israelites to conquer this land. As a result, all the people living in this land are so afraid of you that we will not be able to fight with you.</i>

What reason did Rahab give the spies for why she had hidden them?

Rahab told the spies that she knew Yahweh had given them the land and that the dread of them had fallen on her people.

Joshua 2:10

ULT	UST
<i>For we have heard that Yahweh dried up the water of the Sea of Reeds from your faces in your going out from Egypt, and what you did to two of the kings of the Amorite who {were} on the other side of the Jordan, to Sihon and to Og, that you devoted them.</i>	<i>We have heard about how Yahweh dried up the water of the Sea of Reeds so that you could cross it when you left Egypt. We also heard how you killed Sihon and Og, the two kings of the Amorite people group who lived on the eastern side of the Jordan River. We heard how you totally destroyed them.</i>

What reports had made Rahab believe Yahweh had given the Israelites the land?

Rahab said she believed Yahweh had given the Israelites the land because she had heard how Yahweh dried up the water of the Sea of Reeds for them and what they did to the two Amorite kings, Sihon and Og.

Joshua 2:13

ULT	UST
<i>that you will keep alive my father and my mother and my brothers and my sisters and all who {are} to them and you will deliver our lives from death."</i>	<i>Spare the lives of my father and mother, my brothers and sisters, and all of their families. Promise me that you Israelites will not kill us {when you destroy this city}."</i>

What did Rahab ask the spies to do for her and her family?

Rahab asked the spies to swear by Yahweh that they would keep her father, mother, brothers, sisters, and all their households alive and deliver them from death.

Joshua 2:14

ULT	UST
<i>And the men said to her, "Our lives in place of yours to die! If you do not tell this matter of ours, then it will happen, in Yahweh's giving the land to us, that we will do kindness and faithfulness with you."</i>	<i>The two men told her, "May Yahweh cause us to die if we let anyone kill you or your family! If you do not tell others what we are planning to do, then we will act kindly toward you and all your family. We will not kill you when Yahweh enables us to conquer this land."</i>

What did the spies promise Rahab?

The spies promised Rahab that their lives would be given in place of hers if she did not tell about their mission, and they would deal kindly and faithfully with her when Yahweh gave them the land.

Joshua 2:18

ULT	UST
<i>Behold us, coming into the land! You shall tie this cord of thread of scarlet in the window through which you lower us down, and your father and your mother and your brothers and all of the house of your father, you shall gather to you at the house.</i>	<i>When we come into the land, you must tie this red cord in the window through which you let us down. You must gather together your father and mother, your brothers and sisters, and their families inside your house.</i>

What did the spies tell Rahab she must do for her and her family to be safe when they came into the land?

The spies told Rahab to tie a scarlet cord in the window and gather her father, mother, brothers, and all her father's household into her house.

Joshua 2:24

ULT	UST
<i>And they said to Joshua, “Truly Yahweh has given all of the land into our hand, for indeed, all of the dwellers of the land are melting from our faces.”</i>	<i>They said to Joshua, “We are certain that Yahweh is going to enable us to conquer that whole land. We know that because all the people there are very afraid of us.”</i>

What did the spies report to Joshua when they returned?

The spies told Joshua that Yahweh had given all the land into their hand and that all the inhabitants of the land were melting because of them.

Joshua 3

Joshua 3:2-3

What did the officers tell the people to do when they saw the Levite priests carrying the Box of the Covenant of Yahweh?

The officers told the people that when they saw the Box of the Covenant and the priests carrying it, they should set out from their place and follow it.

Joshua 3:3-4

Why did the officers tell the people to stay about 2,000 cubits behind the Box of the Covenant of Yahweh?

The officers told the people to stay that far behind the Box of the Covenant so they would know the way to go, since they had not passed that way before.

Joshua 3:5

ULT	UST
<i>And Joshua said to the people, "Consecrate yourselves, for tomorrow Yahweh will do wonders in your midst."</i>	<i>Then Joshua told the Israelites, "Perform the ceremonies that will make yourselves acceptable to Yahweh, because tomorrow he is going to do things for you that will amaze you!"</i>

What did Joshua say Yahweh was going to do among the people the next day?

Joshua said that Yahweh was going to do wonders for the people the next day.

Joshua 3:8

ULT	UST
<i>And you, you shall command the priests, the carriers of the Box of the Covenant, saying, ‘As you come unto the edge of the waters of the Jordan, in the Jordan you shall stand.’”</i>	<i>Tell the priests who are carrying the sacred chest, ‘When you come to the edge of the Jordan River, stand still in the water.’”</i>

What did Yahweh tell Joshua to command the priests carrying the Box of the Covenant when they reached the edge of the Jordan River?

Yahweh told Joshua to command the priests to stand still in the Jordan River once they reached the edge of its waters.

Joshua 3:13

ULT	UST
<i>And it will happen as soon as the soles of the feet of the priests, the carriers of the Box of Yahweh, the Lord of all of the earth, rest in the waters of the Jordan, the waters of the Jordan will be cut off, the waters coming down from above. And they will stand, one heap.”</i>	<i>When the priests who are carrying the chest of Yahweh, who rules over all the earth, put their feet in the waters of the Jordan River, the water will stop flowing. The water coming from upstream will pile up {because Yahweh will cause them to be blocked}.”</i>

What did Joshua tell the people would happen when the soles of the feet of the priests carrying the Box of Yahweh rested in the waters of the Jordan?

Joshua told the people that as soon as the soles of the priests’ feet rested in the Jordan’s waters, the waters flowing from above would be cut off and stand in one heap.

Joshua 3:16

ULT	UST
<i>Then the waters coming down from above stood {still}. They rose up, one heap, at a great distance away, at Adam, the city that {is} beside Zarethan, and those going down to the sea of Arabah, the Sea of Salt, were completely cut off. (Now the people crossed over opposite Jericho.)</i>	<i>the water stopped flowing. The water piled up far upstream, at a town named Adam, near the city named Zarethan. The water stopped flowing down to the Sea of Arabah, which people also call the Sea of Salt. {The water} completely stopped flowing, and the people were able to cross the river near Jericho.</i>

Where did the people cross the Jordan River?

The people crossed the Jordan opposite Jericho, while the waters from above stood in a heap far away at Adam.

Joshua 3:17

ULT	UST
<i>So the priests, the carriers of the Box of the Covenant of Yahweh, stood firmly on dry ground in the midst of the Jordan. And all of Israel {was} crossing over on dry ground until when all of the nation had finished crossing over the Jordan.</i>	<i>The priests who were carrying the sacred chest of Yahweh stood on dry ground in the middle of the Jordan {riverbed}. They continued to stand there until all the people of Israel had crossed the river on dry ground.</i>

What did the priests who carried the Box of the Covenant of Yahweh do while all Israel crossed the Jordan?

The priests who carried the Box of the Covenant stood firmly on dry ground in the middle of the Jordan River until all the nation had finished crossing.

Joshua 4

Joshua 4:3

ULT	UST
<i>and command them, saying: ‘Lift up for yourselves from here, from the midst of the Jordan, from the firm standing place of the feet of the priests, 12 stones. And you shall bring them over with you and you shall leave them in the lodging place in which you will lodge tonight.’”</i>	<i>Tell them to pick up 12 stones from the middle of the dry Jordan {riverbed} where the priests are standing. Tell them to carry those stones and put them down at the place you will stay tonight.”</i>

What did Yahweh tell Joshua to command 12 men (one from each tribe) to do?

Yahweh told Joshua to command the 12 men to take 12 stones from the middle of the Jordan, from where the priests’ feet stood, and carry them to their lodging place.

Joshua 4:7

ULT	UST
<i>then you shall say to them, ‘Because the waters of the Jordan were cut off from the face of the Box of the Covenant of Yahweh. In its crossing over in the Jordan, the waters of the Jordan were cut off.’ And these stones will be for a memorial to the sons of Israel forever.”</i>	<i>Tell them that {these stones are here} because Yahweh blocked the water in the Jordan River {so that it stopped flowing} when the priests were carrying the sacred chest of Yahweh. When the chest was carried into the Jordan River, Yahweh blocked the water {so that we were able to cross the Jordan on dry ground}. These stones will cause our descendants to remember forever what Yahweh has done.”</i>

What did Joshua say was the purpose of the 12 stones taken from the Jordan River?

The stones would be a memorial to the people of Israel forever, because the waters of the Jordan were cut off before the Box of the Covenant of Yahweh when it crossed.

Joshua 4:13

ULT	UST
<i>About 40, 000 equipped {ones} of the army crossed over to the face of Yahweh to the plains of Jericho for battle.</i>	<i>As Yahweh was watching, about 40, 000 soldiers crossed the riverbed. These men were ready fight in the Israelite army. They were heading for the plains of Jericho, where they would fight a battle.</i>

About how many armed warriors crossed over before Yahweh to the plains of Jericho for battle?

About 40,000 armed warriors crossed over before Yahweh to the plains of Jericho for battle.

Joshua 4:18

ULT	UST
<i>And it happened that when the priests, the carriers of the Box of the Covenant of Yahweh, came up from the midst of the Jordan, {when} the soles of the feet of the priests were lifted up to dry ground, then the waters of the Jordan returned to their place and went over all of its banks, as yesterday and the third day.</i>	<i>Then the priests, carrying the sacred chest of Yahweh, came up out of the Jordan {riverbed}. As soon as the priests walked up out of the riverbed onto the riverbank, the water of the Jordan River started flowing again, and the river overflowed its banks as it had been doing before.</i>

What happened when the priests who carried the Box of the Covenant of Yahweh came up out of the Jordan and their feet touched dry ground?

When the priests' feet touched dry ground, the waters of the Jordan returned to their place and flowed over all its banks as before.

Joshua 4:20

ULT	UST
<i>And those 12 stones that they had taken from the Jordan, Joshua set up at Gilgal.</i>	<i>At Gilgal, Joshua set up the 12 {large} stones that the 12 men had carried from the Jordan {riverbed}.</i>

Where did Joshua set up the 12 stones that the men had taken out of the Jordan?

At Gilgal Joshua set up the 12 stones that came out of the Jordan.

Joshua 4:24

ULT	UST
<i>so that all of the peoples of the earth may know the hand of Yahweh, that it is mighty, so that you will fear Yahweh your God all of the days.”</i>	<i>{Yahweh did that} in order that all the peoples of the earth would know that he is very powerful. And because you have seen this, as a result, you will always revere Yahweh your God.”</i>

Why did Joshua say the people should tell their children what Yahweh had done for them at the Jordan?

Joshua said they should tell their children so that all the peoples of the earth might know Yahweh’s hand is mighty, and so that they might fear Yahweh their God all the days.

Joshua 5

Joshua 5:1

ULT	UST
<i>And it happened that when all of the kings of the Amorite who {were} on the other side of the Jordan, toward the sea, and all of the kings of the Canaanite who {were} beside the sea heard that Yahweh had dried up the waters of the Jordan from the face of the sons of Israel until they had crossed over, then their heart melted, and a spirit was no longer in them from the face of the sons of Israel.</i>	<i>The leaders of the Amorites and Canaanites heard about how Yahweh had dried up the water of the Jordan River in front of the Israelites so that they could cross it. Those leaders included all the kings of the Amorites who {lived} on the west side of the Jordan River, toward the {Great} Sea. They also included all the kings of the Canaanites, who {lived} close to the {Great} Sea. When those kings heard {what Yahweh had done}, they became very afraid and no longer desired to fight {the Israelites}.</i>

What was the reaction of the Amorite and Canaanite kings when they heard Yahweh had dried up the Jordan's waters for Israel?

When the kings heard how Yahweh had dried up the Jordan's waters, their hearts melted, and there was no longer any spirit in them because of the sons of Israel.

Joshua 5:2

ULT	UST
<i>At that time Yahweh said to Joshua, "Make for yourself knives of flint and again, circumcise the sons of Israel a second time."</i>	<i>While {the Israelites were staying at Gilgal,} Yahweh said to Joshua, "{Someone had circumcised the Israelite males who lived in Egypt before they left there. Now} make knives from flint stones and circumcise all the Israelite males whom no one has yet circumcised."</i>

What did Yahweh command Joshua to make and do a second time for the sons of Israel?

Yahweh commanded Joshua to make flint knives and circumcise the sons of Israel a second time.

Joshua 5:7

ULT	UST
<i>And he raised up their sons instead of them; Joshua circumcised them. For they were uncircumcised because they had not circumcised them on the way.</i>	<i>The sons of those who had disobeyed Yahweh were the ones whom Joshua and other Israelite leaders circumcised {at Gilgal}. They circumcised them there because no one had done that while they were traveling in the wilderness.</i>

Why did Joshua have to circumcise the sons of those who came out of Egypt?

Joshua had to circumcise them because they were uncircumcised, as they had not been circumcised while they were traveling in the wilderness.

Joshua 5:10

ULT	UST
<i>And the sons of Israel camped at Gilgal, and they performed the Passover on day 14 of the month, in the evening, on the plains of Jericho.</i>	<i>On the evening of the fourteenth day of that month, while the people of Israel were staying at Gilgal, on the plain near the city of Jericho, they celebrated the Passover festival.</i>

What festival did the sons of Israel celebrate while camped at Gilgal on the plains of Jericho?

While camped at Gilgal, the sons of Israel celebrated the Passover on the evening of the fourteenth day of the month.

Joshua 5:12

ULT	UST
<i>And the manna stopped from the morrow of their eating from the yield of the land, and manna was no longer for the sons of Israel. And they ate from the produce of the land of Canaan in that year.</i>	<i>The next day, {Yahweh} stopped {sending} manna for the people of Israel {to eat}. From then on, they ate food that grew in the land of Canaan.</i>

What food stopped the day after the people of Israel ate the produce of the land of Canaan?

The manna stopped the day after they ate the produce of the land, and the sons of Israel no longer had manna.

Joshua 5:13

ULT	UST
<i>And it happened, in Joshua being by Jericho, that he lifted up his eyes and looked, and behold, a man {was} standing in front of him and his drawn sword {was} in his hand. And Joshua went to him and said to him, "Are you for us or for our enemies?"</i>	<i>One day, when Joshua was near Jericho, he looked up and saw someone who appeared to be a man standing in front of him. The man was holding a sword in his hand. Joshua approached him and asked him, "Are you going to fight for us or against us?"</i>

Who did Joshua see standing in front of him with a drawn sword when he was by Jericho?

Joshua saw a man standing in front of him with his drawn sword in his hand.

Joshua 5:14

ULT	UST
<i>And he said, "No, but I myself have now come {as} the commander of the army of Yahweh." And Joshua fell on his face to the earth and bowed down. And he said to him, "What {is} my lord speaking to his servant?"</i>	<i>The man replied, "I am not a soldier in any human army. Rather, I am the commander of Yahweh's army. I have come {here to help you}." Then Joshua very respectfully got down on his knees and touched his face to the ground. Joshua said to him, "What do you want me to do? I will do it."</i>

Who did the man with the drawn sword say he was?

The man with the drawn sword told Joshua that he had come as the commander of the army of Yahweh.

What did Joshua ask the commander of Yahweh's army?

Joshua fell on his face to the earth, bowed down, and asked what his lord was speaking to his servant.

Joshua 5:15

ULT	UST
<i>And the commander of the army of Yahweh said to Joshua, "Slip off your sandal from upon your foot, because the place that you are standing on, it {is} holy." And Joshua did so.</i>	<i>The commander of Yahweh's army replied, "The ground on which you are standing is holy {because I am here}. So take off your sandals." So Joshua took off his sandals.</i>

What did the commander of Yahweh's army tell Joshua to do because the place on which he was standing was holy?

The commander of Yahweh's army told Joshua to remove his sandals from his feet because the place on which he was standing was holy.

Joshua 6

Joshua 6:2

ULT	UST
<i>And Yahweh said to Joshua, “See, I have given Jericho into your hand, and its king, the warriors of valor.</i>	<i>Then Yahweh said to Joshua, “Pay attention {to what I am about to tell you}! I am going to enable your army to conquer the city of Jericho and its king and its soldiers.</i>

What did Yahweh promise Joshua concerning Jericho, its king, and its warriors?

Yahweh promised Joshua that he had given Jericho, its king, and its warriors into Joshua’s hand.

Joshua 6:3

ULT	UST
<i>And you shall circle the city, all of the men of war, circling the city one time. Thus you shall do six days.</i>	<i>You and your army must march around the city once a day for six days.</i>

How were the men of war to circle the city of Jericho for six days?

All the men of war were to circle the city, going around it one time each day for six days.

Joshua 6:4-5

What did Yahweh tell Joshua should happen on the seventh day involving priests, shofars, and the people?

Yahweh told him that seven priests should carry seven shofars before the Box, and on the seventh day the people should circle the city seven times while the priests blew the shofars; then, at a long blast, all the people should shout.

Joshua 6:5

ULT	UST
<i>And it will happen, when they make a long blast with the horn of the ram, as soon as you hear the sound of the shofar, all of the people shall shout a great shout. And the wall of the city will fall under itself and the people shall go up, a man in front of him."</i>	<i>{After they have all marched around the city seven times, then} the priests must blow their horns very loudly. When you and the Israelite soldiers hear that, you must all shout very loudly. Then the city wall will collapse onto itself, and all the Israelite soldiers will go straight into the city."</i>

What did Yahweh say would happen to the city wall when the people shouted on the seventh day?

Yahweh said the wall of the city would collapse unto itself, and the people should go up, every man straight into the city.

Joshua 6:10

ULT	UST
<i>And Joshua commanded the people, saying, "You shall not shout, and you shall not make your voice heard, and a word shall not go out from your mouth until the day I say to you, 'Shout!' Then you shall shout."</i>	<i>But {all the Israelites, except the priests who were blowing their horns, were silent, because} Joshua had commanded them to say nothing. He had told them, "Do not make a war cry. Do not yell or say even one word until the seventh day {when we have walked around the city and} I tell you to shout. On that day, you must shout!"</i>

What did Joshua command the people not to do until he told them to shout?

Joshua commanded the people not to shout, nor let their voice be heard, nor let a word go out of their mouth until the day he told them to shout.

Joshua 6:17

ULT	UST
<i>And the city is a devoted thing, it and all that {is} in it, for Yahweh. Only Rahab the prostitute will live, she and all who {are} with her in the house, because she hid the messengers whom we sent.</i>	<i>Yahweh has declared that you must destroy the city and everything in it {to show that} it belongs to him. You must only spare Rahab the prostitute and all the people who are in her house with her, because she hid the spies we sent {to Jericho}.</i>

Who did Joshua say would live when the city of Jericho was devoted to Yahweh, and why?

Joshua said that only Rahab the prostitute and all who were with her in her house would live, because she hid the messengers they sent.

Joshua 6:19

ULT	UST

What did the people of Israel do to everything in the city after the walls of Jericho fell?

The people of Israel devoted to destruction by the sword all that was in the city—men and women, young and old, oxen, sheep, and donkeys.

What did Joshua command the two men who had spied out the land to do regarding Rahab?

Joshua commanded the two spies to go into the prostitute's house and bring her out, and all who belonged to her, as they had sworn to her.

What did the spies who went to Ai report back to Joshua about its people?

The spies reported to Joshua not to make all the people go up, but that about 2,000 or 3,000 men should strike Ai, because its people were few.

What happened when about 3,000 men from Israel attacked Ai?

The men of Ai struck down about 36 of the Israelite men, pursued them from the gate to the quarries, and struck them on the descent.

Joshua tore his garments and fell on his face to the earth before the Box of Yahweh until evening, he and the elders of Israel; and they put dust on their heads.

What did Yahweh tell Joshua was the reason Israel was defeated at Ai and could not stand before their enemies?

Yahweh told Joshua that Israel had sinned by transgressing his covenant, taking from the devoted things, stealing, deceiving, and putting it among their own things.

Achan told Joshua he had hidden them in the earth in the middle of his tent, with the silver underneath.

Joshua 7:24

Yahweh told the people they could plunder the spoil and livestock of Ai for themselves.

Joshua 8:3

<i>And Joshua and all of the people of war arose to go up to Ai. And Joshua chose 30, 000 men, warriors of valor, and sent them at night.</i>	<i>So Joshua led all his army toward the city of Ai. He chose 30, 000 of his best soldiers and prepared them to go out during the night.</i>

How many warriors did Joshua choose and send by night for the ambush of Ai?

Joshua chose 30,000 men, warriors of valor, and sent them out by night.

Joshua did not draw back his hand with which he stretched out the curved sword until he had devoted all the inhabitants of Ai.

What did Israel plunder for themselves from Ai, according to Yahweh's command to Joshua?

Israel plundered the livestock and the spoil of Ai for themselves, according to the word of Yahweh which he had commanded Joshua.

They took worn-out sacks, worn-out and mended wine skins, wore worn-out and patched sandals and garments, and took dry, crumbly bread.

The five Amorite kings and all their camps gathered and went up; they camped against Gibeon and fought against it.

Come up to us quickly and save us and help us, because all of the kings of the Amorite dwelling {in} the hill country have gathered against us."</i>	<i>The men of Gibeon sent this message to Joshua at the camp at Gilgal: "Protect us, because we are your subjects. Come quickly and save us! Help us, because all the Amorite kings who live in the hill country have joined their armies together to attack us!"</i>

What message did the men of Gibeon send to Joshua at the camp in Gilgal?

The men of Gibeon sent to Joshua, asking him not to withdraw his hand from them, but to come up quickly, save them, and help them, because all the Amorite kings from the hill country had gathered against them.
