1 Samuel 1:1-2

Who were the two wives of Elkanah?

The wives of Elkanah were Hannah and Peninnah.

1 Samuel 1:2

ULT	UST
<i>And two wives {were} to him. The name of the one {was} Hannah, and the name of the second {was} Peninnah. And children were to Peninnah, but to Hannah children {were} not.</i>	<i>Elkanah had two wives. Their names were Hannah and Peninnah. Now Peninnah had several children, but Hannah had no children.</i>

How many children did Hannah have at that time?

At that time Hannah had no children.

1 Samuel 1:5

ULT	UST
<i>But to Hannah he gave one portion {for} two faces, for he loved Hannah but Yahweh had shut her womb,</i>	<i>But he would serve Hannah twice as much meat because he loved her very much even though Yahweh had not allowed her to give birth to children.</i>

Why did Elkanah give twice as much meat to Hannah?

He gave a double portion to Hannah because he loved her.

1 Samuel 1:6

ULT	UST
<i>but her adversary also provoked her {with} provocation in order to make her thunder, because Yahweh had shut up her womb.</i>	<i>But Elkanah's other wife, Peninnah, would try to make Hannah upset. She would remind her that Yahweh had not allowed her to give birth to any children.</i>

Why did Hannah's adversary provoke her?

She provoked Hannah in order to make her upset, because Yahweh had closed her womb.

1 Samuel 1:9-10

What did Hannah do because she was so sorrowful about not having children?

She went to the house of Yahweh, and she cried very sorrowfully as she prayed to Yahweh.

1 Samuel 1:11

ULT	UST
<i>And she vowed a vow, and she said, "Yahweh of Armies, if looking, you will look on the affliction of your female servant and remember me and not forget your female servant and give to your female servant a seed of men, then I will give him to Yahweh all of the days of his life, and a razor will not go up on his head."</i>	<i>Hannah made a solemn promise. She said, "Yahweh, you command the heavenly armies{, so you are powerful enough to do anything}. I am a woman who serves you devotedly. Please consider how unhappy I am. Please do something to help me. Allow me to give birth to a son. If you do that, then I will dedicate him to you for as long as he lives. And {to show that we have dedicated him,} we will never cut his hair."</i>

What did Hannah vow to Yahweh?

Hannah vowed that if Yahweh would give her a son, she would give him to Yahweh and they would never cut his hair.

1 Samuel 1:12-14

Because Hannah was speaking to Yahweh from her heart, what did Eli the priest think about her actions?

Eli saw Hannah's lips moving but did not hear her voice, so he thought she was drunk.

1 Samuel 1:15-16

What did Hannah assure Eli she was doing?

Hannah assured Eli that she was not drunk but was talking to Yahweh because someone made her feel very badly.

1 Samuel 1:17-18

What did Eli say to Hannah that caused her to go on her way, eat, and no longer feel sad?

Eli told her to go in peace and said that he hoped the God of Israel would grant her request.

1 Samuel 1:20

ULT	UST
<i>And it happened, in the turning of the days, that Hannah conceived and bore a son. And she called his name Samuel, for "I requested him from Yahweh."</i>	<i>She became pregnant, and nine months later she gave birth to a son. She named him Samuel. That name expressed in her language that Yahweh had answered her prayer for a son.</i>

When Hannah conceived and gave birth to a son, what did she name him?

Hannah named her son Samuel because she had requested him from Yahweh.

1 Samuel 1:21-23

Why did Hannah not go with her husband to the house of Yahweh for the yearly sacrifice?

She did not go because she was waiting until her son was weaned.

1 Samuel 1:24-25

What offerings did Hannah bring with her when she brought her son to the house of Yahweh?

Hannah brought three bulls, an ephah of flour, and a skin of wine.

1 Samuel 1:26-28

What did Hannah present to Yahweh?

Hannah presented her son to Yahweh for as long as he would live.

1 Samuel 2

1 Samuel 2:1

ULT	UST
<i>And Hannah prayed and said, "My heart rejoices in Yahweh, my horn is high in Yahweh. My mouth {is} wide against my enemies, for I rejoice in your salvation.</i>	<i>Then Hannah prayed. She said, "In my inner being I am so happy about what you, Yahweh, have done! I am strong because I belong to you. I laugh at my enemies because I am celebrating the way that you, Yahweh, have helped me.</i>

Why did Hannah laugh at her enemies?

Hannah laughed because she rejoiced in Yahweh's salvation.

1 Samuel 2:3

ULT	UST
<i>May you not multiply, may you {not} speak, haughty, haughty! Let the arrogant go out from your mouth. For Yahweh {is} a God of knowledge, and by him actions are weighed.</i>	<i>{You people who oppose God,} stop making so many boasts! Yahweh is a God who knows everything, and he will evaluate what each person does. So do not speak so arrogantly!</i>

Why does Hannah say that people should not boast or speak arrogantly?

People should not boast or speak arrogantly because Yahweh is a God of knowledge, and by him actions are weighed.

1 Samuel 2:5

ULT	UST
<i>The satisfied hire themselves out for bread, but the hungry cease. Even the barren bears seven, but the plenteous of sons languishes.</i>	<i>Many people who previously had plenty to eat now have to work for other people to earn money to buy food, but many who were always hungry are not hungry anymore. Women who could not have any children before have now given birth to many children, but women who had many children before are not able to have any more.</i>

In Hannah's song, who is the one who is unable to have more children?

The woman who had many children before is not able to have any more.

1 Samuel 2:6

ULT	UST
<i>Yahweh makes die and makes alive, causing to go down to Sheol and causing to come up.</i>	<i>You, Yahweh, cause some people to die, and you cause other people to live. It seems that some people will soon go to where dead people go, but you make them healthy again.</i>

Who decides death and life, or who goes down to Sheol or is raised up?

Yahweh is the one who decides death and life, and who causes people to go down to Sheol or to come up from there.

1 Samuel 2:7

ULT	UST
<i>Yahweh is making poor and making rich, bringing down yet bringing up.</i>	<i>Yahweh, you cause some people to be poor, but you cause others to become rich. You humble some people, but you honor other people.</i>

Who makes people poor or rich?

Yahweh makes people poor, and he makes them rich.

1 Samuel 2:8

ULT	UST
<i>Raising the poor from the dust, he lifts up the needy from the trash heap to make {them} sit with nobles, and he makes them inherit a seat of honor. For the pillars of the earth {are} to Yahweh, and he has set the world on them.</i>	<i>Needy people often do not have homes, but Yahweh gives those poor people places to live in. People then treat them respectfully, and they even sit with community leaders. After all, it was Yahweh who created a place on which the world itself rests.</i>

Who raises up the poor and lifts the needy to sit in a seat of honor?

Yahweh raises them up to sit in a seat of honor.

1 Samuel 2:9

ULT	UST
<i>He will keep the feet of his faithful ones, but the wicked will be silenced in darkness. For not by strength does a man prevail.</i>	<i>You protect from harm people who are loyal to you, but you cause wicked people to die and go to the dark place where dead people go. People do not defeat their enemies by their own strength.</i>

Who does Hannah say will protect the feet of his faithful people and silence the wicked in darkness?

Hannah says that Yahweh will guard the feet of his faithful people and will silence the wicked.

1 Samuel 2:10

ULT	UST
<i>{By} Yahweh, the ones opposing him will be shattered. He will make thunder against him in the heavens. Yahweh will judge the ends of the earth. And he will give strength to his king and lift up the horn of his anointed one."</i>	<i>Yahweh, you will break into pieces those who fight against you. You will come powerfully to punish them. You, Yahweh, will judge people everywhere. When you choose a king for us Israelites, you will make him strong. Yes, when you have a leader anoint someone as our king, you will make him powerful."</i>

Who will judge the ends of the earth and give strength to his king?

Yahweh will judge the ends of the earth and give strength to his king.

1 Samuel 2:11

ULT	UST
<i>Then Elkanah went to Ramah, to his house. And the boy was serving Yahweh at the face of Eli the priest.</i>	<i>After that, Elkanah and his family returned to their home in Ramah. But Samuel, who was still a little boy, stayed at the sacred tent to work with Eli the priest to help the people worship Yahweh.</i>

What child served Yahweh in the presence of Eli the priest?

Samuel served Yahweh in the presence of Eli the priest.

1 Samuel 2:12

ULT	UST
<i>Now the sons of Eli {were} sons of wickedness. They did not know Yahweh.</i>	<i>Eli's two sons {were priests like their father, but they} did very bad things. That was because they did not respect Yahweh.</i>

Whose sons were wicked men who did not know Yahweh?

Eli the priest's sons did very bad things.

1 Samuel 2:13-14

What was the custom of the priests with the people at the time of sacrifice?

The custom was for the priest's servant to come with a three-pronged fork while the meat was boiling and take whatever the fork brought up for the priest.

1 Samuel 2:15-16

What evil thing did Eli's sons have their servant do?

They had their servant demand raw meat for the priest before the fat was burned as an offering to Yahweh, and had him take it by force if the person refused.

1 Samuel 2:17

ULT	UST
<i>So the sin of the young men {was} very great at the face of Yahweh. For the men disdained the offering of Yahweh.</i>	<i>Eli's sons were committing a very serious sin that offended Yahweh personally. They were treating very disrespectfully the offerings that people were bringing to Yahweh.</i>

Why was the sin of Eli's sons so great?

Their sin was great before Yahweh because the men were treating very disrespectfully the offerings that people were bringing to Yahweh.

1 Samuel 2:18-19

What would Samuel's mother make for him from year to year to clothe him?

She would make him a small robe each year.

1 Samuel 2:20

ULT	UST
<i>And Eli would bless Elkanah and his wife and would say, "May Yahweh give seed to you from this woman in place of the request that one requested of Yahweh." And they would go to his place.</i>	<i>Then Eli would ask God to do good things for Elkanah and his wife. He would say to Elkanah, "I hope that Yahweh will enable your wife to give birth to other children, since she brought the child here whom she asked Yahweh to give her." Then Elkanah and his family would return to their home.</i>

How would Eli bless Elkanah and his wife?

Eli blessed them by asking Yahweh to give them more children from Hannah.

1 Samuel 2:21

ULT	UST
<i>For Yahweh visited Hannah, and she conceived and bore three sons and two daughters. And the boy Samuel grew with Yahweh.</i>	<i>And Yahweh helped Hannah to have three more sons and two daughters. {She raised them at home,} while Samuel {stayed in Shiloh and} grew up while doing work for Yahweh in his sacred tent.</i>

What was Yahweh's response to Eli's prayer for Samuel's parents to have more children?

Yahweh helped Hannah, and she bore three more sons and two daughters.

1 Samuel 2:23-24

What did Eli say to his sons when he heard evil reports about them?

Eli told his sons that the report he was hearing from Yahweh's people about their evil deeds was not good. He told them to stop doing what they were doing.

1 Samuel 2:25

ULT	UST
<i>If a man sins against a man, then God will intercede for him, but if a man sins against Yahweh, who will intercede for him?" But they would not listen to the voice of their father, for Yahweh desired to make them die.</i>	<i>Suppose one person does something wrong to another person. Then God can act as a referee between them. But suppose a person does something wrong to Yahweh. Then no one can act as a referee between him and Yahweh!" But Eli's sons would not stop what they were doing, even though their father had commanded them to stop. This was because Yahweh had decided that they had already done so many wicked things that they deserved to die.</i>

Why did Eli's sons not listen to his voice?

Eli's sons did not listen to his voice because Yahweh desired to make them die.

1 Samuel 2:26

ULT	UST
<i>But the boy Samuel was going and growing and {was} good both with Yahweh and also with men.</i>	<i>Samuel, however, continued to grow up, and the things that boy did pleased Yahweh and other people.</i>

Who grew up and was good in the sight of Yahweh and also with men?

Samuel grew up and was good in the sight of Yahweh and with men.

1 Samuel 2:27-28

Who told Eli that Yahweh chose Eli's ancestors out of all the tribes of Israel to be Yahweh's priest?

A man of God told Eli that Yahweh had chosen his ancestors.

1 Samuel 2:29

ULT	UST
<i>Why do you kick at my sacrifice and at my offering that I commanded {for} the Dwelling and honor your sons more than me by the fattening of yourselves from the first of every offering of Israel, of my people?</i>	<i>But you and your sons are treating with great disrespect the sacrifices and offerings that I commanded the people to bring to my sacred tent! You are letting your sons do what they want instead of making sure that all of you do what I want. You have all been getting fat from eating the best parts of all the sacrifices that my Israelite people have been bringing to me!’</i>

How had Eli and his sons scorned Yahweh’s sacrifices and offerings?

They scorned the sacrifices and offerings by honoring his sons above Yahweh and fattening themselves on the best parts of offerings.

1 Samuel 2:33

ULT	UST
<i>But I will not cut off a man to you from near my altar, to make your eyes fail and to make your soul grieve. And all of the increase of your house will die {as} men.</i>	<i>I will allow some of your descendants to survive and continue to serve at my altar. But they will be so sad about what happens to the sacred tent that their eyes will get very tired from crying. And all of your descendants will die while they are still young.</i>

What did Yahweh tell Eli would happen to the men in his family?

Yahweh told Eli that all the men born in his family would die young.

1 Samuel 2:34

ULT	UST
<i>And this {is} the sign for you that will come to the two of your sons, to Hophni and Phinehas: in one day the two of them will die.</i>	<i>And your two sons, Hophni and Phinehas, will both die on the same day. That will prove to you that everything I have told you will happen.</i>

What did Yahweh say would be a sign to Eli that his prophecy would come true?

The sign would be that both of his sons would die on the same day.

1 Samuel 2:35

ULT	UST
<i>And I will raise up for myself a faithful priest. He will do just as {is} in my heart and in my soul. And I will build for him an established house, and he will walk about to the face of my anointed all of the days.</i>	<i>I have chosen another man to be my priest. He is someone who will serve me faithfully. He will do everything I want. I will make sure that he has descendants who will be priests. He will continually be a helper to the king whom I will appoint.</i>

Who will walk before Yahweh's faithful priest always?

Yahweh has chosen another man who will serve him faithfully and continually be a helper to the king whom Yahweh will appoint.

1 Samuel 2:36

ULT	UST
<i>And it will happen that every remaining one in your house will come to bow down to him for a piece of silver and a loaf of bread, and he will say, "Please assign me to one of the priestly positions to eat a piece of bread."'"</i>	<i>All of your descendants who remain alive will have to go to that priest and ask him to give them money and food. They will have to ask him to allow them to work with the other priests so that they can earn money to buy food.'"</i>

Why will everyone left in Eli's family come and bow down to the faithful priest?

They will ask him to allow them to work with the other priests so that they can have food to eat.

1 Samuel 3

1 Samuel 3:2-4

What was Samuel's reply when he heard Yahweh call to him as he was lying down?

Samuel replied that he was ready to do whatever you ask.

1 Samuel 3:5

ULT	UST
<i>And he ran to Eli and said, "Behold me, for you called to me." But he said, "I did not call. Go back, lie down." So he went and lay down.</i>	<i>Then he got up and ran to Eli. He told him, "I have come because you called me. I am ready to do whatever you ask." But Eli replied, "No, I did not call you. Go back to bed." So Samuel went and lay down again.</i>

What did Eli tell Samuel to do when Samuel ran to him?

Eli said that he did not call Samuel and told him to go lie down again.

1 Samuel 3:7

ULT	UST
<i>(Now Samuel did not yet know Yahweh, for the word of Yahweh had not yet been revealed to him.)</i>	<i>{Samuel did not realize that it was Yahweh who was speaking to him because} he had not yet become personally acquainted with Yahweh. That was because Yahweh had not previously spoken to him to reveal something to him.</i>

What had not yet been revealed to Samuel?

The word of Yahweh had not yet been revealed to Samuel.

1 Samuel 3:8

ULT	UST
<i>And Yahweh resumed calling Samuel for a third {time}. And he arose and went to Eli and said, "Behold me, for you called to me." Then Eli understood that Yahweh was calling to the boy.</i>	<i>After he lay down again, Yahweh called out to Samuel yet again. So Samuel got up yet again and went to Eli. He said, "I have come because you called me. I am ready to do whatever you ask." Then Eli realized that it was Yahweh who had been calling Samuel.</i>

What did Eli realize after the third time that Samuel came to him?

Eli realized that it was Yahweh who had been calling Samuel.

1 Samuel 3:9

ULT	UST
<i>And Eli said to Samuel, "Go, lie down. And it will happen that, if he calls to you, then you shall say, 'Speak, Yahweh, for your servant is listening.'" So Samuel went and lay down in his place.</i>	<i>So Eli told Samuel, "Go and lie down again. If the same person calls you again, say, 'I am ready to obey you, Yahweh, so please tell me what you want me to do.'" So Samuel went back to bed and lay down.</i>

What did Eli tell Samuel to say if he was called again?

Eli told Samuel to say that Yahweh should speak, because his servant was listening.

1 Samuel 3:11

ULT	UST
<i>And Yahweh said to Samuel, "Behold, I am doing a thing in Israel that everyone hearing it, the two of his ears will tingle."</i>	<i>Then Yahweh said to Samuel, "Listen carefully! I am about to do something here in Israel that will shock everyone who hears about it."</i>

What did Yahweh say would happen to the ears of everyone when they heard what he was going to do?

Yahweh said that the ears of everyone who heard it would tingle.

1 Samuel 3:13

ULT	UST
<i>Now I have declared to him that I am judging his house forever for the iniquity that he knew. For his sons have been cursing themselves, but he has not restrained them.</i>	<i>Eli's sons have been doing things that are so wicked that they deserve severe punishment. Eli knows they have been doing those things. But he has not disciplined them. So I told him that I would punish all future generations of his family.</i>

What had Eli's sons brought upon themselves?

Eli's sons had brought a curse upon themselves.

1 Samuel 3:14

ULT	UST
<i>And therefore I have sworn to the house of Eli, 'If forever the iniquity of the house of Eli will cover itself by sacrifice or by offering!'"</i>	<i>That is why I solemnly told Eli's family, 'Even if you give me sacrifices or offerings, I will still consider you guilty of your sin and punish you for it.'"</i>

What would never be atoned for by sacrifice or offering?

The iniquity of Eli's house would never be atoned for by sacrifice or offering.

1 Samuel 3:15

ULT	UST
<i>And Samuel lay until the morning, then he opened the doors of the house of Yahweh. But Samuel was afraid of telling the vision to Eli.</i>	<i>Samuel stayed in bed until it became light. Then he got up and opened the doors of the building {as usual}. He was too afraid to tell Eli what Yahweh had said to him when he appeared to him.</i>

What was Samuel afraid to do in the morning after he opened the doors of the house of Yahweh?

He was afraid to tell Eli about the vision.

1 Samuel 3:17-18

What did Samuel do after Eli told him that he must not hide from him the words that Yahweh had spoken?

Samuel told him everything and hid nothing from him.

1 Samuel 3:20

ULT	UST
<i>So all of Israel, from Dan and unto Beersheba, knew that Samuel was established as a prophet of Yahweh.</i>	<i>As a result, all the people of Israel, from the northern end of the country to the southern end, realized that Samuel was a prophet who truly spoke for Yahweh.</i>

What did all Israel from Dan to Beersheba know about Samuel?

All Israel knew that Samuel was established as a prophet of Yahweh.

1 Samuel 4

1 Samuel 4:1-2

What was the result of the battle between Israel and the Philistines?

Israel was defeated by the Philistines.

1 Samuel 4:3

ULT	UST
<i>And the people came into the camp, and the elders of Israel said, "Why did Yahweh strike us today to the face of the Philistines? Let us take for ourselves from Shiloh the Box of the Covenant of Yahweh, and it will come in our midst, and it will save us from the palm of our enemies."</i>	<i>When the remaining Israelite soldiers returned to their camp, the Israelite elders asked, "Why did Yahweh allow the Philistine army to defeat us today? {It must have been because we did not bring the sacred chest into battle with us.} We should bring the sacred chest here from Shiloh. That way we can bring it with us when we go into battle again, and it will keep our enemies from defeating us!"</i>

What did the elders of Israel decide to do so that they could be saved from the power of their enemies?

The elders decided to bring the Box of the Covenant of Yahweh from Shiloh to be with them.

1 Samuel 4:4

ULT	UST
<i>So the people sent to Shiloh, and they carried from there the Box of the Covenant of Yahweh of Armies, sitter on the cherubim. And the two sons of Eli, Hophni and Phinehas, {were} there with the Box of the Covenant of God.</i>	<i>So the soldiers sent some men to Shiloh, and those men brought back the sacred chest of Yahweh, the commander of the heavenly armies. There were statues of winged creatures on top of the chest, and those statues were like a throne for Yahweh. Eli's two sons Hophni and Phinehas traveled with the sacred chest to the Israelite military camp.</i>

Who was with the Box of the Covenant of God?

The two sons of Eli, Hophni and Phinehas, were there with the Box of the Covenant.

1 Samuel 4:5-6

What did the Philistines wonder when they heard the great shout from the people of Israel?

The Philistines wondered about the meaning of the great shout in the camp of the Hebrews.

1 Samuel 4:7

ULT	UST
<i>And the Philistines feared, for they said, "A god has come into the camp!" And they said, "Woe to us! For it was not like this yesterday {or} the third day!</i>	<i>They said, "A god has come into their camp {to help them fight against us}!" This made them very afraid. They said, "We are in big trouble now! Nothing like this has ever happened before!</i>

Who did the Philistines say had come into the camp of the Hebrews?

The Philistines said that a god had come into the camp.

1 Samuel 4:8

ULT	UST
<i>Woe to us! Who will deliver us from the hand of these mighty gods? These are they, the gods having struck the Egyptians with every plague in the wilderness.</i>	<i>We certainly are in big trouble! The gods of the Israelites are very strong, and it will be difficult to overcome their power. It was the gods of the Israelites who made the Egyptians suffer from many plagues in the barren land outside their country.</i>

With what did the Philistines say that the gods of Israel had struck the Egyptians in the wilderness?

They said that the gods had struck the Egyptians with every kind of plague.

1 Samuel 4:10-11

What happened to the two sons of Eli when the Box of God was taken Israel was struck and fled?

The two sons of Eli, Hophni and Phinehas, died.

1 Samuel 4:12-13

What did the whole city do when the man from the battle line entered the city and told the news?

When the man told the news, the whole city cried out.

1 Samuel 4:14

ULT	UST
<i>And Eli heard the sound of the outcry, and he said, "What {is} the sound of this tumult?" And the man hurried and came and reported to Eli.</i>	<i>Eli heard the noise and asked, "Why are people making all this noise?" So the messenger ran over to Eli and told him what had happened.</i>

What question did Eli ask when he heard the noise of the outcry?

Eli asked what the sound of the tumult meant.

1 Samuel 4:16-17

What did the man tell Eli had happened to his sons and to the Box of God when Israel was defeated?

The man told Eli that his two sons were dead and the Box of God had been taken.

1 Samuel 4:18

ULT	UST
<i>And it happened, in his mentioning of the Box of God, that he fell backward from upon the seat at the side of the gate. And his neck was broken, and he died, for the man {was} old and heavy. And he had judged Israel 40 years.</i>	<i>As soon as Eli heard what had happened to the sacred chest, he fell backward off his seat beside the city gate. Because he was very old and very fat, he broke his neck when he fell, and that killed him. He had led the Israelite people for 40 years.</i>

What was the injury that killed Eli when he fell over backward from his seat by the side of the gate?

Eli broke his neck and he died.

1 Samuel 4:19

ULT	UST
<i>Now his daughter-in-law, the wife of Phinehas, {was} pregnant, {about} to give birth. And she heard the report about the Box of God being taken and {that} her father-in-law had died and her husband. And she knelt down and gave birth, for her pangs turned themselves upon her.</i>	<i>The wife of Eli's son Phinehas was pregnant, and it was almost time for her to give birth to her baby. When she heard the news that the Philistines had captured God's sacred chest and that her husband and her father-in-law had died, her labor pains suddenly began. She crouched down and gave birth.</i>

What happened when Phinehas's pregnant wife heard that the Box of God was captured and her father-in-law and husband were dead?

Phinehas's wife knelt down and gave birth because her labor pains suddenly began.

1 Samuel 4:21-22

What name did Phinehas's wife give to the baby and why did she give him that name?

She named the baby Ichabod, saying that the glory had departed from Israel because the Box of God had been taken.

1 Samuel 5

1 Samuel 5:1-3

In what position did the people find the idol Dagon the next day after the Philistines brought the Box of God into Dagon's house?

Dagon was found fallen face down on the ground before the Box of Yahweh.

1 Samuel 5:4

ULT	UST
<i>And they arose early in the morning on the next day, and behold, Dagon had fallen on his face to the ground to the face of the Box of Yahweh. They said it should not stay because the hand of their God was severe against them and against their god Dagon.

The cows went straight in the direction of Beth Shemesh.

What request did the elders of Israel make of Samuel?

They asked Samuel to appoint a king to judge them, like all the other nations.

Saul took one of the servants and passed through many places without finding them.

What did Saul tell his servant they should do when they came to the land of Zuph?

Saul told his servant that they should go back so his father would not stop being concerned about the donkeys and become concerned about them.

What happened when Saul, the son of Kish, was chosen as the next king?

They looked for Saul, but he could not be found.

He wrote all those things in a scroll. He placed the scroll for safekeeping in a location where people worshiped Yahweh. Then Samuel sent all the people home.</i>

How were the customs of the kingship established and preserved?

Samuel told the people the customs of the kingship, wrote them in a book, and placed the book before Yahweh.

1 Samuel 10:27

<i>But some sons of wickedness said, "How shall this {one} save us?" And they despised him, and they did not bring a gift to him. But he was like one being silent.</i>	<i>But some bad men said, "A man like him will not be able to save us from our enemies!" They did not think he would make a good king, and they refused to give him any gifts {to show that they would be loyal to him}. But {even though Saul knew about their insult,} he said nothing about it at the time.</i>

How did some wicked men show their dislike for Saul?

Some wicked men despised Saul and did not bring him a gift.

1 Samuel 11:1-2

What was the response of Nahash the Ammonite to the request for a covenant from the men of Jabesh?

He said he would make a covenant with them if he could gouge out all their right eyes and bring disgrace on Israel.

1 Samuel 11:3

<i>And the elders of Jabesh said to him, "Leave us alone seven days, and let us send messengers through all of the border of Israel. And if {there is} no one saving us, then we will go out to you."</i>	<i>The leaders of Jabesh replied, "Please do not attack us for the next seven days. During that time, we will send messengers throughout the land of Israel {to ask for help}. If no one comes to help us, then we will surrender to you."</i>

How did the elders of Jabesh respond to Nahash's proposal?

They asked for seven days to send messengers throughout Israel to see if anyone would save them.

1 Samuel 11:4-5

Why were the people in Saul's town of Gibeah weeping?

They were weeping because they had heard the words of the men from Jabesh.

1 Samuel 11:6-8

How did Saul respond to the threat against Jabesh?

The Spirit of God rushed upon him, he became very angry, and he persuaded the men of Israel and Judah to fight.

1 Samuel 11:9

<i>And they said to the messengers having come, "Thus you shall say to the men of Jabesh Gilead, "Tomorrow deliverance will be for you, at the heat of the sun.'" And the messengers went and declared {this} to the men of Jabesh, and they rejoiced.</i>	<i>So Saul and Samuel sent the messengers back to the people at Jabesh Gilead to tell them, "We will come and rescue you tomorrow by the middle of the morning." The messengers went and told this to the people of Jabesh. They became very happy when they heard this news.</i>

What message did the messengers bring back to the men of Jabesh?

They told the men of Jabesh that they would have deliverance the next day by the time the sun was hot.

1 Samuel 11:10

<i>And the men of Jabesh said, "Tomorrow we will go out to you. And you may do to us according to all of the good in your eyes."</i>	<i>Then the leaders of Jabesh told Nahash, "We will surrender to you tomorrow, and then you can do to us whatever you want."</i>

What did the men of Jabesh say to Nahash the Ammonite?

They told Nahash that they would come out to him the next day, and he could do to them whatever seemed good to him.

1 Samuel 11:11

<i>And it happened on the next day that Saul put the people {into} three companies. And they came into the midst of the camp during the watch of the morning, and they struck Ammon until the heat of the day. And it happened that the {ones} being left scattered, and two among them were not left together.</i>	<i>That night Saul divided his troops into three groups. They marched all night and arrived at the city before the sun rose the next morning. They attacked the camp of the Ammonite soldiers {from three different directions}. By noontime they had killed most of them. Those who survived ran away, and none of them regrouped to continue fighting.</i>

What was the outcome of the battle between Israel and the Ammonites?

The people of Israel attacked and defeated the Ammonites, and the survivors were totally scattered.

Why did Saul say that none of the men who opposed him would be put to death?

Saul said no one would be put to death, because that day Yahweh had brought deliverance to Israel.

1 Samuel 11:14-15

Why did Samuel, Saul, and all the people of Israel go to Gilgal?

They went to Gilgal to renew the kingship, make Saul king before Yahweh, and sacrifice peace offerings.

1 Samuel 12

1 Samuel 12:4-5

What did the people of Israel say when Samuel asked if he had ever wronged them?

The people of Israel told Samuel he had not defrauded or oppressed them or taken anything from anyone.

1 Samuel 12:6-7

Why did Samuel tell the people of Israel to present themselves before Yahweh?

He told them to present themselves so he could make the case against them that they should not have asked for a king instead of trusting Yahweh to rescue them.

1 Samuel 12:8-9

What did God do to the ancestors of Israel after they forgot Yahweh their God?

Yahweh sold them into the hand of Sisera, the Philistines, and the king of Moab, who all fought against them.

1 Samuel 12:10-11

What did Yahweh do after Israel's ancestors cried out to him and asked to be rescued from their enemies?

Yahweh sent Jerubbaal, Bedan, Jephthah, and Samuel to rescue them.

1 Samuel 12:12-13

What did Samuel remind the people of Israel that they had requested?

Samuel reminded the people that they had wanted a king to reign over them, even though Yahweh their God was their king.

1 Samuel 12:14-15

What choice did Samuel present to the people of Israel?

They could fear Yahweh and serve him, or they could rebel against his command and his hand would be against them.

What did Samuel challenge the people of Israel to do?

1 Samuel 12:17-18

What did Samuel ask Yahweh to send so that the people would know the extent of their wickedness?

He asked Yahweh to send thunder and rain during the wheat harvest.

1 Samuel 12:19-20

How did Samuel respond when the people of Israel realized their sin?

Samuel told the people not to be afraid, but to serve Yahweh with all their heart and not turn aside.

1 Samuel 12:22

<i>For Yahweh will not forsake his people, because of his great name. For Yahweh was pleased to make you into a people for himself.</i>	<i>Yahweh wants everyone in the world to know what a faithful God he is. So he will not abandon us after he gladly chose us to be his own people.</i>

What message of comfort did Samuel give to the people of Israel?

Samuel comforted the people by telling them that Yahweh would not forsake them, because of his great name.

And I will instruct you in the good and straight way.</i>	<i>For my part, you can be sure that I will keep praying for you. If I did not, I would be sinning against Yahweh. What did Samuel promise to do for Israel?

He promised to continue to pray for them and to instruct them in the good and right way.

What did Samuel challenge the people of Israel to do?

Samuel told them to fear Yahweh and serve him faithfully with all their heart, considering the great things he had done for them.

1 Samuel 13:2

What did Saul do with the soldiers he did not choose to be with him?

Saul sent the rest of the soldiers home to their own tents.

How did Israel make itself stink among the Philistines?

They made themselves stink among the Philistines because Jonathan had struck the garrison of the Philistines at Geba.

1 Samuel 13:5

<i>And the Philistines gathered themselves to fight with Israel: 30, 000 chariots and 6, 000 horsemen and people like the sand that is on the shore of the sea for abundance. How did the Philistines respond to the attack by Jonathan?

They gathered 30,000 chariots, 6,000 horsemen, and people as numerous as the sand on the seashore to fight against Israel.

1 Samuel 13:6-7

How did the men of Israel react to the forces of the Philistines?

They were distressed, so they hid in caves, thickets, cliffs, pits, and cisterns, and some fled across the Jordan.

1 Samuel 13:8-10

What did Saul do when Samuel did not come to Gilgal after seven days?

Saul offered the burnt offering himself.

1 Samuel 13:11-12

What excuse did Saul give Samuel for not waiting for him to offer the sacrifices?

He said he saw that the Philistine army was going to attack, and he had not yet asked Yahweh to help Israel, so he forced himself to offer the burnt offering.

1 Samuel 13:13

<i>And Samuel said to Saul, "You have acted foolishly! You have not kept the command of Yahweh your God that he commanded you. For now Yahweh would have established your kingdom over Israel forever.</i>	<i>Samuel told Saul, "That was a very foolish thing to do! You did not obey what Yahweh, your God, commanded about sacrifices. If you had obeyed him, Yahweh would have allowed you and your descendants to rule Israel for a long time.</i>

How did Samuel rebuke Saul?

Samuel told Saul that he had acted foolishly by not keeping the command that Yahweh gave him.

What did Samuel say would be the consequences of Saul's disobedience?

Because Saul did not obey Yahweh's command, none of his descendants will become king. Instead, Yahweh has found someone else who will do what he wants him to do, and he will make that person the next king of Israel.

The Philistines sent out soldiers in three groups to attack different Israelite towns.

For the Philistines had said, "Lest the Hebrews make a sword or a spear."</i>	<i>The Philistines did not want the Israelites (whom they called Hebrews) to be able to make any swords or spears. What problem did the Israelites face in their fight against the Philistines?

There were no blacksmiths in all the land of Israel, so they could not make swords or spears.

<i>So it was on the day of battle that a sword or spear {was} not found in the hand of any of the people who {were} with Saul and with Jonathan, but one was found for Saul and for his son Jonathan.</i>	<i>As a result, none of the 600 men who were with Saul and Jonathan had swords or spears that they could use to fight the Philistines. Only Saul and Jonathan, his son, had swords and spears.</i>

How were the soldiers of Israel hindered on the day of battle?

None of the people with Saul and Jonathan had a sword or spear in their hand.

1 Samuel 14:1

<i>And it happened one day that Jonathan, the son of Saul, said to the young man, the carrier of his equipment, "Come, and let us cross over to the garrison of the Philistines that {is} across from here." What secret plan did Jonathan, the son of Saul, have?

Jonathan planned to cross over to the Philistines' garrison, but he did not tell his father.

1 Samuel 14:2-3

What did the six hundred men with Saul not know?

They did not know that Jonathan had gone.

<i>And Jonathan said to the young man, the carrier of his equipment, "Come, and let us cross over to the garrison of these uncircumcised! We will go to where those pagans have set up their tents. Perhaps Yahweh will help us. It does not matter to him that there are only two of us, rather than many soldiers. What proposal did Jonathan present to his young armor-bearer?

Jonathan proposed that they cross over to the garrison of the uncircumcised, because perhaps Yahweh would act for them.

Turn yourself; behold me, with you according to your heart."</i>	<i>The young man who was carrying Jonathan's weapons said, "Go ahead and do what you are planning. What was the armor-bearer's response to the proposal?

Jonathan's armor-bearer told him to do all that was in his heart and that he was with him and would help him in all that he wanted to do.

What would be the sign to Jonathan and his armor-bearer that Yahweh had given the Philistines into their hand?

If the Philistines told them to come up to them, that would be the sign.

1 Samuel 14:11-12

What did Jonathan say to his armor-bearer after the Philistines told them to come up?

He told his armor-bearer to follow him because Yahweh had given the Philistines into the hand of Israel.

1 Samuel 14:13-14

What was the result of the attack that Jonathan and his armor-bearer made on the Philistine garrison?

Jonathan and his armor-bearer killed about twenty men.

1 Samuel 14:16-17

What did Saul do when his watchmen saw the Philistine army dispersing?

Saul had the people counted to see who was missing, and they discovered it was Jonathan and his armor-bearer.

1 Samuel 14:18-19

Why did Saul tell Ahijah the priest to bring the Box of God to him?

Saul wanted to inquire of God, but he stopped because the tumult in the Philistine camp was increasing.

Who rejoined the Israelites who had remained with Saul and Jonathan?

The Hebrews who had previously deserted to the Philistines in their camp rejoined the Israelites. Now those men helped Saul and Jonathan and the other Israelite soldiers fight against the Philistines.

Who saved Israel that day?

Yahweh saved Israel that day.

What caused the men of Israel to be distressed and faint?

Saul had put the people under an oath, cursing any man who ate food before evening.

And he returned his hand to his mouth, and his eyes brightened.</i>	<i>But {because he had left the camp early that morning,} Jonathan did not know that his father had made the soldiers swear that they would not eat any food before evening. So when he saw a honeycomb in a tree, he reached out with the end of the spear he was holding and collected some honey. He ate that honey, and it was evident from his appearance that afterward he felt stronger.</i>

How did Jonathan unknowingly break the oath?

Jonathan, who had not heard the oath, ate some honey from a honeycomb.

1 Samuel 14:29-30

How was Jonathan critical of the oath his father had made?

Jonathan said that if the people had been allowed to eat from the plunder of their enemies, the slaughter among the Philistines would have been greater.

1 Samuel 14:33-34

How did the people of Israel sin against Yahweh after their battle against the Philistines?

The people ate meat with the blood still in it.

1 Samuel 14:37-38

What did Saul believe was the reason why he did not receive an answer when he inquired of God?

Saul believed that God did not answer him on that day because someone had sinned.

1 Samuel 14:38-39

How did Saul say he would deal with the sin that had been committed?

He said that the person who committed the sin would surely die, even if it was his son Jonathan.

1 Samuel 14:41-42

How was it determined that Jonathan was the person who had sinned?

The priest threw a lot, and it indicated that either Jonathan or Saul had sinned, not one of the other Israelite soldiers. He threw the lot again, and the lot indicated that Jonathan had sinned.

1 Samuel 14:45

<i>But the people said to Saul, "Shall Jonathan die, who has done this great salvation in Israel? Profane! The life of Yahweh, if from the hair of his head should fall to the ground! How was Jonathan saved from death?

The people redeemed Jonathan and would not allow him to die because he had brought about a great salvation for Israel.

How did Saul lead Israel as their king?

Saul fought against all his enemies on every side and rescued Israel from the hands of those who plundered them.

1 Samuel 15

1 Samuel 15:2-3

Why did Yahweh want Saul to attack and completely destroy Amalek?

Yahweh wanted to punish Amalek for what he had done to Israel when he opposed them on the way up from Egypt.

1 Samuel 15:5-7

Why did Saul tell the Kenites to depart from the Amalekites?

He warned the Kenites to move away because they had shown kindness to the people of Israel when they came up from Egypt. He did not want to kill them when he killed the Amalekites.

1 Samuel 15:8-9

How did Saul disobey the directions that Yahweh had given to him?

Saul spared King Agag and the best of the sheep, cattle, and lambs, and was not willing to devote them to destruction as Yahweh had commanded.

1 Samuel 15:10-11

Why did Yahweh regret that he had made Saul king?

Yahweh regretted making Saul king because Saul had turned from following him and was no longer obedient to him.

1 Samuel 15:12-13

What lie did Saul tell Samuel?

Saul told Samuel that he had obeyed what Yahweh told him to do.

1 Samuel 15:14

ULT	UST
<i>And Samuel said, "Then what {is} this sound of a flock in my ears? And the sound of cattle that I am hearing?"</i>	<i>But Samuel replied, "If that is true, then I should not be hearing sheep bleating or cattle mooing, but I am!"</i>

How did Samuel respond to the lie that Saul had told him?

Samuel asked about the bleating of sheep and the lowing of cattle that he was hearing.

1 Samuel 15:15

<i>And Saul said, "They have brought them from the Amalekite. For the people had compassion on the best of the flock and the cattle, to sacrifice {them} to Yahweh your God. But the remainder, we devoted."</i>	<i>Saul replied, "The soldiers wanted to save the best sheep and cattle so they could offer them as sacrifices to Yahweh, your God. So they took these animals from the Amalekites and brought them here. But we completely destroyed all the other animals that the Amalekites had."</i>

What excuse did Saul give to Samuel to explain his disobedience?

He said the people had spared the best of the sheep and cattle so they could sacrifice them to Yahweh.

1 Samuel 15:17-19

How did Samuel rebuke Saul?

He told Saul that Yahweh had sent him to devote the sinners, the Amalekites, to destruction, but instead he had swooped down on the plunder and done evil.

1 Samuel 15:20-21

What excuse did Saul repeat to Samuel?

Saul insisted that he had obeyed, but that the people brought back the best of the plunder to sacrifice to Yahweh at Gilgal.

1 Samuel 15:22-23

What was Samuel's response to Saul?

Samuel said that to obey is better than sacrifice, and that rebellion is as the sin of divination, and because Saul rejected Yahweh's word, Yahweh rejected him as king.

1 Samuel 15:24

<i>And Saul said to Samuel, "I have sinned. For I have crossed over the mouth of Yahweh and your words, because I feared the people and listened to their voice.</i>	<i>Then Saul said to Samuel, "I admit that I have sinned. What reason did Saul give Samuel for his sin?

Saul said he had disobeyed Yahweh's command because he was afraid of the people, and so he listened to their voice.

What declaration did Samuel give to Saul from Yahweh?

Samuel said that Yahweh had rejected Saul from being king over Israel because Saul had rejected the word of Yahweh.

<i>And Samuel said to him, "Yahweh has torn the kingdom of Israel from upon you today, and he has given it to your fellow, {one} better than you.</i>	<i>Samuel said to him, "{You have taken this piece away from my robe, and in the same way,} Yahweh has now taken the kingship of Israel away from you. He is going to make another Israelite king instead of you. That other Israelite is a better man than you are.</i>

To whom was Yahweh going to give the kingdom of Israel?

Samuel told Saul that Yahweh was going to give the kingdom to one of Saul's neighbors, an Israelite who was a better man than Saul.

What did Samuel do to finish the task that Saul had not done?

Samuel hacked King Agag to pieces before Yahweh.

1 Samuel 16

1 Samuel 16:1

Why did Yahweh tell Samuel to stop mourning for Saul?

Yahweh told him to stop because he had rejected Saul from being king over Israel.

So Yahweh said, "Take a heifer of cattle in your hand and say, 'I have come to sacrifice to Yahweh.'</i>	<i>But Samuel said, "I am afraid to go. Yahweh answered, "Take with you a female cow that has not yet given birth, and tell the people of Bethlehem that you have come to offer it as a sacrifice to me."</i>

What did Samuel fear would happen if Saul heard he was going to Bethlehem?

He feared that Saul would kill him.

Why did David not allow his men to attack Saul?

David's heart struck him, and he said he would not stretch out his hand against his master, because he was the anointed of Yahweh.

When David left the cave after Saul, how did he show respect to Saul?

David called out to Saul as his master the king, and then he bowed with his face to the ground.

David showed Saul the edge of his robe that he had cut off, proving he had been close enough to kill him, but did not.

What was Saul's response to David?

He asked if it was David's voice, called him his son, then lifted up his voice and wept.

Why did Saul say that David was more righteous than he was?

David had repaid Saul with good even though Saul had done evil to David.

What did Saul say he knew about David at this time?

Saul knew that David would surely be king and that the kingdom of Israel would be established in David's hand.

Before Saul went home, what oath did David swear to him?

David swore that he would not cut off Saul's descendants or destroy his name from his father's house.

David sent ten young men to greet Nabal.

Nabal spoke of disrespectfully of David, implying that he was a runaway slave wandering the countryside, and he said he would not give any of his food and water to them.

What did Abigail hope to prevent by speaking to David?

She hoped to keep David from killing many people himself instead of relying on Yahweh to protect him.

What did Abigail ask David to do with the blessing she brought?

Abigail asked that the blessing be given to the young men who followed David and that he would forgive her transgression.

He had a stroke and could no longer move; about ten days later, Yahweh struck Nabal and he died.

What did David do when he heard that Nabal was dead?

David sent messengers to speak with Abigail, to take her as his wife.

Saul had given her to another man as his wife.

Whom did Saul take with him to seek David in the wilderness of Ziph?

Saul took three thousand chosen men of Israel.

David asked why his master was pursuing David, his servant, and what evil he had done.

David asked for a place to live in one of the villages in the countryside, and Achish gave him Ziklag.

1 Samuel 27:8-9

What did David and his men do when they raided the Geshurites, Girzites, and Amalekites?

They struck the land, did not let a man or woman live, and took the sheep, cattle, donkeys, camels, and garments.

1 Samuel 27:10

David would say that he had raided the south of Judah, or the south of the Jerahmeelites, or the south of the Kenites.

What did Achish want David and his men to do when the Philistines gathered to fight Israel?

Achish wanted David and his men to go out with him into the camp for battle.

1 Samuel 28:3

Why did Saul search for a woman who was a mistress of a ritual pit?

Saul was very afraid of the Philistine army, and Yahweh did not answer him by dreams, Urim, or prophets, so Saul sought a woman who owns a pit that she uses to contact people who have died.

1 Samuel 28:8-9

What was the woman afraid of when the disguised Saul went to talk to her?

She was afraid that he was setting a trap for her life, because Saul had cut off those who try to contact people who have died or to try to talk to spirits.

1 Samuel 28:10

Yahweh had torn Saul's kingdom from his hand and had given it to his fellow, to David.

During all the time since he left Saul, he has been completely loyal to me."</i>

How did Achish defend the presence of David on the battlefield to the Philistine rulers?

Achish said that in the year that David had been living near him, David had been completely loyal to him.

They feared that David would become an adversary to them in the battle by turning against them.

What did the Egyptian require before he would lead David to the raiding party?

He made David swear by God that he would not kill him or deliver him into the hand of his master.

They were spread out over the land, eating, drinking, and celebrating because of all the great plunder they had taken.

What did David recover after his attack on the raiders?

They buried their bones under the tamarisk tree in Jabesh and fasted for seven days.
