Psalms 1:1

ULT	UST
<i>The happinesses of the man who walks not in the advice of the wicked, and stands not in the pathway of sinners, and sits not in the seat of scoffers,</i>	<i>The person who will have a truly good life is the person who does not do what evil people tell him to do, who does not imitate sinful people's behavior, and who does not become like people who enjoy mocking.</i>

What does the happy man not do?

He does not do what the wicked advise him to do.

Where does the happy man not stand?

He does not stand in the pathway of sinners.

Where does the happy man not sit?

He does not sit in the seat of scoffers.

Psalms 1:2

ULT	UST
<i>but in the instruction of Yahweh {is} his delight, and in his instruction he meditates day and night.</i>	<i>Instead, he delights in what Yahweh teaches, he thoughtfully reads it aloud every day and every night.</i>

In what does the man delight?

He delights in the instruction of Yahweh.

When does the man meditate on the instruction of Yahweh?

He meditates on it day and night.

Psalms 1:3

ULT	UST
<i>And he is like a tree set to grow by streams of water, which gives its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither, and he makes successful all that he does.</i>	<i>Like having plenty of water causes a well-cultivated tree to produce fruit at the right time, and keeps it from dying, so {his faithfulness to Yahweh} causes everything this person does to prosper.</i>

What is the man like?

He is like a tree set to grow by streams of water.

What will happen to everything the man does?

Whatever he does will prosper.

Psalms 1:4

ULT	UST
<i>Not so the wicked! But {they are} like the chaff that wind chases away.</i>	<i>That is not what wicked people are like! Instead, they are like chaff that the wind blows away.</i>

What are wicked people like?

They are like the chaff that the wind chases away.

Psalms 1:5

ULT	UST
<i>Thus the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous.</i>	<i>Just so, wicked people will not be able to endure {when Yahweh} judges {the world}. Neither will sinful people {be present when Yahweh} gathers all the righteous people together.</i>

What will happen to wicked people in the judgment?

They will not stand in the judgment.

Psalms 1:6

ULT	UST
<i>For Yahweh knows the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked will perish.</i>	<i>{All of this is} because Yahweh cares for righteous people, but wicked people keep sinning until {Yahweh} destroys them {forever}.</i>

Who knows the way of the righteous?

Yahweh knows the way of the righteous.

What will happen to the way of the wicked?

The way of the wicked will perish.

Psalms 2

Psalms 2:2

ULT	UST
<i>The kings of the earth take their stand, and the rulers conspire together against Yahweh and against his anointed.</i>	<i>Earthly kings prepare to revolt, the rulers plot together to fight against Yahweh and against his chosen king.</i>

Who are the rulers conspiring against?

They are conspiring against Yahweh and against his anointed.

Psalms 2:3

ULT	UST
<i>"Let us tear apart their bonds and cast their cords away from us."</i>	<i>{They shout,} "We should break free from the shackles {that they control us with}. We should throw aside the ropes {that they rule over us with}!"</i>

What do the rulers want to tear apart and throw off?

They want to tear apart the restraints Yahweh and his chosen king put on them and cast off their rule.

Psalms 2:4

ULT	UST
<i>He who is sitting in the heavens laughs; the Lord mocks them.</i>	<i>But the heavenly ruler sneers at them; the Lord ridicules those rulers.</i>

Who sits in the heavens and mocks the nations who rebel?

The Lord mocks them.

Psalms 2:6

ULT	UST
<i>"I, I have poured out my king on Zion, the mountain of my holiness."</i>	<i>{Yahweh says,} "It is I who has made my king rule in Zion, {which is} my sacred hill."</i>

Who has the Lord anointed?

The Lord has anointed his king on Zion, his holy mountain.

Psalms 2:7

ULT	UST
<i>I will describe a decree of Yahweh. He said to me, "You are my son! Today I have begotten you."</i>	<i>{Yahweh's king says,} "I will proclaim what Yahweh has decreed. Yahweh said to me, 'You are my son; today I have become your father."</i>

What decree does Yahweh give to the psalmist?

Yahweh says, "You are my son! Today I have begotten you."

Psalms 2:8

ULT	UST
<i>Ask from me, and I will give nations {as} your inheritance and the extremities of the earth {as} your possession.</i>	<i>Request {this from} me: {ask to} inherit the nations, {ask to} own the {whole} earth {even the} farthest parts. I will give them to you.</i>

What will Yahweh do with the nations and most distant regions of the earth?

Yahweh will give them as an inheritance and possession.

Psalms 2:9

ULT	UST
<i>You will break them with an iron rod; like a jar of a potter, you will smash them to pieces."</i>	<i>You will strike them with an iron rod and they will shatter into small pieces as if they were a clay pot."</i>

What will happen to the nations?

They will be broken and smashed.

Psalms 2:11

ULT	UST
<i>Serve Yahweh with fear and rejoice with trembling.</i>	<i>Worship Yahweh respectfully. Be joyful and afraid {while you are worshipping him}!</i>

How should the kings and rulers respond to Yahweh's decree?

They should serve Yahweh in fear and rejoice with trembling.

Psalms 2:12

ULT	UST
<i>Kiss the son, lest he be angry and you perish in the way, for his anger burns for just a moment. The happinesses of all the seekers of refuge in him.</i>	<i>Swear to be truly loyal to his son otherwise, he may become angry and suddenly kill you because he can become angry quickly. But all those who ask him to protect them will have a life that is truly good.</i>

Why should the kings give allegiance to Yahweh's son?

They should give him allegiance so that he will not be angry and they will not perish.

What happens to all those who take refuge in the son?

They will have a life that is truly good.

Psalms 3

Psalms 3:1

ULT	UST
<i>Yahweh, how many my oppressors have become! The risers against me are many.</i>	<i>Yahweh, I have so many enemies! Many people are deciding to oppose me.</i>

What does David say about how many enemies he has?

David says that his so many enemies who have decided to oppose him.

Psalms 3:3

ULT	UST
<i>But you, Yahweh, are a shield round about me, my glory, and the lifter up of my head.</i>	<i>But Yahweh, you are like a shield that protects me. You greatly honor me, and you encourage me.</i>

What does David say Yahweh is to him?

David says Yahweh is a shield that protects him and he is the one who encourages.

Psalms 3:4

ULT	UST
<i>{With} my voice I call to Yahweh, and he answered me from the hill of his holiness. Selah</i>	<i>Whenever I cry loudly to Yahweh {for help}, he {comes} from {Zion,} his sacred hill, to help me. Selah</i>

What does Yahweh do when David calls out to him?

He answers David from his holy hill.

Psalms 3:6

ULT	UST
<i>I will not fear the multitudes of people who stand against me round about.</i>	<i>There may be thousands {of enemy soldiers} who surround me, but I am not afraid.</i>

Who does David say he will not fear because of Yahweh's protection?

David will not be afraid of the many people who stand against him.

Psalms 3:7

ULT	UST
<i>Rise up, Yahweh! Save me, my God! For you hit all my enemies on the cheek; the teeth of the wicked you break.</i>	<i>Yahweh, get up! My God, rescue me! You can {insultingly} slap my enemies on their cheeks, and destroy those wicked people's {power like breaking animals'} teeth,</i>

What does David say Yahweh does to his enemies?

Yahweh destroys David's enemies power like he is breaking animals' teeth.

Psalms 3:8

ULT	UST
<i>Salvation {is} of Yahweh. Your blessing {is} on your people. Selah</i>	<i>Yahweh rescues! Bless your people! Selah</i>

From whom does salvation come?

Salvation comes from Yahweh.

Psalms 4

Psalms 4:1

ULT	UST
<i>Answer me when I call, God of my righteousness; in distress you relieve me. Be gracious {to} me and hear my prayer.</i>	<i>Righteous God, respond to me when I pray to you. You who have {always} rescued me when I was distressed, act mercifully toward me and pay attention to what I pray.</i>

Who does David ask to answer when he calls?

David prays for the God of his righteousness to answer when he calls.

Psalms 4:2

ULT	UST
<i>Son of man, until when {will} my glory become shame? {Until when} will you love futility, {until when} will you seek falsehood? Selah</i>	<i>How long will you mortal people dishonor me instead of honoring me? How long will you love what is useless, and chase lies? Selah</i>

What does David say the people are doing to his glory?

They are dishonoring him instead of honoring him.

Psalms 4:3

ULT	UST
<i>But know that Yahweh has set apart the faithful for himself. Yahweh hears when I call to him.</i>	<i>You all should know that Yahweh treats people who are faithful to him as special to him. Yahweh will pay attention when I pray to him.</i>

Who does Yahweh set apart for himself?

Yahweh sets apart the faithful for himself.

Psalms 4:4

ULT	UST
<i>Tremble and do not sin! Meditate in your heart on your bed and be silent. Selah</i>	<i>You should be afraid of Yahweh, and {because of that} stop sinning! While you lie on your bed, examine what you are thinking and stop accusing {me}. Selah</i>

What does David tell people to do while lying on their beds?

David tells them to meditate in their hearts and be silent.

Psalms 4:5

ULT	UST
<i>Sacrifice sacrifices of righteousness and trust in Yahweh.</i>	<i>Instead, offer to Yahweh the proper sacrifices and continually trust him.</i>

What kind of sacrifices does David say to offer?

He says to offer sacrifices of righteousness.

In whom does David say to trust?

He says to trust in Yahweh.

Psalms 4:6

ULT	UST
<i>Many say, "Who will show us good?" Lift up the light of your face on us, Yahweh!</i>	<i>Many people are wishing for something good to happen. Yahweh, please do good things for us!</i>

What do many people say?

Many people ask who will show them anything good.

Psalms 4:7

ULT	UST
<i>You have put joy in my heart more than the time {when} their grain and their new wine abound.</i>	<i>You have made me very joyful, even more than {these complainers are} when they have plenty of food and drink.</i>

What has Yahweh put in David's heart?

Yahweh has put more joy in his heart than others have in their hearts when their grain and new wine abound.

Psalms 4:8

ULT	UST
<i>In peace I will both lie down and sleep, for you alone, Yahweh, cause me to dwell securely.</i>	<i>I can lie down at night and sleep without worrying because {I know that} it is only you, Yahweh, who keeps me safe.</i>

Who makes David safe and secure when he lies down in peaceful sleep?

Yahweh alone makes David safe and secure.

Psalms 5

Psalms 5:1

ULT	UST
<i>{To} my words give ear, Yahweh! Understand my murmuring!</i>	<i>Yahweh, listen to what I say! Comprehend my distressed sigh.</i>

Who does David ask listen to what he says and understand his murmuring?

David asks Yahweh to listen to what he says and understand his distressed sigh.

Psalms 5:2

ULT	UST
<i>Listen attentively to the sound of my cry for help, my king and my God, for to you I pray!</i>	<i>{Since} you are my king and my God, hear and respond when I plead aloud for rescuing, because I am praying to you {only}.</i>

What names does David use for the one who listens to the sound of his cry?

David calls him his king and his God.

Psalms 5:3

ULT	UST
<i>Yahweh, in the morning you hear my voice. In the morning I prepare for you and watch.</i>	<i>Yahweh, you will hear me pleading each morning. Every morning I will request that you save me, and I will wait for you to do it.</i>

What does David say he will do each morning?

David says he will prepare for Yahweh and watch.

Psalms 5:4

ULT	UST
<i>For you are not a god pleased with wickedness; evil ones will not sojourn with you.</i>	<i>You are a God who certainly does not approve of wicked people; evil- doers never stay as your guests.</i>

What does God certainly not do?

He certainly does not approve of evil, and evil people will not be his guests.

Psalms 5:5

ULT	UST
<i>The arrogant will not stand in front of your eyes; you hate all doers of iniquity.</i>	<i>Boasters are not allowed to come worship you. You hate everyone who does evil things.</i>

Who will not stand in God's presence?

The arrogant will not stand in God's presence.

Whom does God hate?

God hates all who do evil things.

Psalms 5:6

ULT	UST
<i>You will destroy speakers of falsehood; the man of blood and deceit Yahweh abhors.</i>	<i>You kill liars. Yahweh despises murderers and people who deceive others.</i>

What will God do to liars?

God will destroy liars.

Who does Yahweh despise?

Yahweh despises violent and deceitful men.

Psalms 5:7

ULT	UST
<i>But I, in the greatness of your covenant faithfulness, I will come into your house; I will bow down toward your temple of holiness in fear.</i>	<i>As for me, I will come {worship you} where you live, because you faithfully love us so abundantly. I will reverently kneel to worship you at your sacred temple.</i>

Why will David come into Yahweh's house?

David will come into Yahweh's house because of Yahweh's great covenant faithfulness.

How will David bow down toward Yahweh's holy temple?

David will bow down in reverence.

Psalms 5:8

ULT	UST
<i>Yahweh, guide me in your righteousness because of my watchers; straighten before my face your path.</i>	<i>Yahweh, my enemies are watching me {to try to catch me doing something wrong}. Please show me how to do what is right, just as you always do what is right. Make it easy for me to live obediently to you.</i>

Why does David ask Yahweh to guide him in righteousness?

David asks Yahweh to guide him in righteousness because of those who are watching him.

Psalms 5:9

ULT	UST
<i>For there is no firmness in his mouth; their inward being is destruction. An open tomb is their throat; their tongue they make smooth.</i>	<i>Please do this because my enemies are untrustworthy; one of their strongest desires is to destroy people. They speak things that are vile like the smell of an open grave. They flatter people {to trap and destroy them}.</i>

How does David describe his enemies?

David describes his enemies as untrustworthy, desiring to destroy people, speaking things that are vile like the smell of an open grave, and flattering people to trap and destroy them.

Psalms 5:10

ULT	UST
<i>Make them guilty, God; may they fall due to their schemes! Because of their many transgressions, drive them out, for they rebel against you!</i>	<i>O God, declare that they are guilty and punish them. Cause to happen to them the harmful events that they plan to cause to happen to others. Get rid of them because they have sinned often, and rebelled against you.</i>

What does David ask God to do to his enemies because of their many transgressions and their rebellion against God?

David asks God to declare his enemies guilty and to drive them out.

Psalms 5:11

ULT	UST
<i>But may all refuge seekers in you rejoice; may they shout joyfully to eternity, and may you cover over them, and may lovers of your name exult in you.</i>	<i>But enable all the people who ask you to protect them to be glad; enable them to sing gladly always. Please protect them. Enable everyone who loves it when you are famous to praise you.</i>

Why should those who take refuge in God shout for joy?

They should shout for joy because God defends them.

Psalms 5:12

ULT	UST
<i>For you, Yahweh, you bless the righteous, you surround him {with} favor as a shield.</i>	<i>{I ask this} because Yahweh, you always bless those who act righteously; you protect them as if your good acts are like a shield around them.</i>

What will Yahweh do for the righteous?

Yahweh will bless the righteous and surround them with his favor as with a shield.

Psalms 6

Psalms 6:1

ULT	UST
<i>Yahweh, rebuke me not in your nose, and in your rage discipline me not.</i>	<i>Yahweh, do not correct me angrily, do not punish me wrathfully.</i>

What is David asking Yahweh not to do?

He asks Yahweh not to rebuke him in his anger or discipline him in his wrath.

Psalms 6:2

ULT	UST
<i>Be gracious {to} me, Yahweh, for I am frail! Heal me, Yahweh, for my bones are shaking!</i>	<i>Yahweh, act kindly toward me because I have become weak. Yahweh, heal me because my body shakes fearfully.</i>

What is David asking Yahweh to do because David is frail?

David asks Yahweh to have mercy on him and to heal him.

Psalms 6:4

ULT	UST
<i>Turn back, Yahweh! Rescue my soul! Save me for the sake of your covenant faithfulness!</i>	<i>Yahweh, relent from your anger and deliver me! Help me because you always do what you promise!</i>

Why does David say that Yahweh should rescue and save him?

Because of Yahweh's covenant faithfulness.

Psalms 6:5

ULT	UST
<i>For in death, there is no remembrance of you. In Sheol, who will thank you?</i>	<i>{Do this} because {I and} no one {else} who is dead can honor you. {I and} no one {else} can praise you {if we are} in the place where the dead are.</i>

What will not be remembered in death?

In death there is no remembrance of Yahweh.

Psalms 6:6

ULT	UST
<i>I am weary with my groaning. During every night, I cause my bed to swim, With my tears, my couch I melt.</i>	<i>I am exhausted because of my pain. I cry all night long, so that my tears soak and seem as if they will wash away my bed and my cushions.</i>

What does David do to his bed because he is weary and groaning?

All night he soaks it with his tears.

Psalms 6:7

ULT	UST
<i>My eye has wasted away from grief, it advances because of all my adversaries.</i>	<i>I am very sad and {I cry so much that} I cannot see well. My vision has become weak from {crying because of} all my enemies.</i>

What happens to David's eyes because of his grief and because of all his adversaries?

His vision becomes weak, so that he cannot see well.

Psalms 6:8-9

Why should those who practice iniquity get away from David?

Because Yahweh has heard the sound of his weeping and his appeal for mercy and accepts his prayer.

Psalms 6:10

ULT	UST
<i>Let all my enemies be shamed and greatly disturbed. Let them turn back. Let them be shamed {in} an instant.</i>	<i>{When that happens,} all my enemies will be ashamed and very troubled. They will relent {from attacking me because they will} suddenly {be} ashamed.</i>

What does David ask God to make happen to his enemies?

He asks that all his enemies will be ashamed and greatly troubled and they will turn back.

Psalms 7

Psalms 7:1

ULT	UST
<i>Yahweh my God, in you I have taken refuge; save me from all my pursuers, and rescue me!</i>	<i>Yahweh my God, I have come to you so that you can protect me. Save me from everyone who is chasing me {in order to harm me}. Rescue me!</i>

In whom does David take refuge?

David takes refuge in Yahweh his God.

What is David asking Yahweh to do?

David is asking Yahweh to save him from those who chase him, and to rescue him.

Psalms 7:3-5

What does David say should happen to him if he has done wrong?

David says that if he has done wrong, his enemy should be allowed to chase and capture him and leave him lying dead.

Psalms 7:6

ULT	UST
<i>Arise, Yahweh! In your nose, be lifted with the rage of my adversaries! And wake up for me! You have ordered judgment.</i>	<i>Get up Yahweh! Because you are angry, show that you are greater than what my furious enemies can do! Be alert so you can rescue me by doing what you have said is just!</i>

What is David asking Yahweh to do in Yahweh's anger?

David is asking Yahweh show that he is greater than what David's furious enemies can do.

What does David say Yahweh has already ordered?

David says that Yahweh has already ordered judgment.

Psalms 7:7

ULT	UST
<i>And an assembly of peoples surround you, and over it return on high!</i>	<i>The people of all nations gather around you; return to ruling over them all!</i>

What does David want Yahweh to do concerning the peoples?

David wants Yahweh to take his rightful place ruling over all the peoples.

Psalms 7:8

ULT	UST
<i>Yahweh, adjudicate the peoples! Judge me, Yahweh, according to my righteousness and according to my integrity, Most High!</i>	<i>Yahweh, judge the people of all nations! Decide favorably for me, Yahweh, because I am righteous and honorable {before you the} highest judge.</i>

Who does David want Yahweh to judge?

David wants Yahweh to judge all the peoples, including himself.

Psalms 7:9

ULT	UST
<i>May the evil of the wicked end, and {would} you establish the righteous. The righteous God examines hearts and kidneys.</i>	<i>God, you are righteous and look closely at what people think and want. Please stop evil people from doing wicked things, and make {all of us} who are righteous secure!</i>

What does David say the righteous God does?

David says God examines thoughts and desires.

Psalms 7:10

ULT	UST
<i>My shield is with God, the savior of the upright of heart.</i>	<i>God, you protect me as a shield protects soldiers; you rescue all those who are righteous in their inner being.</i>

Where does David's protection come from?

David's protection comes from God.

Who does God save?

God saves the upright in heart.

Psalms 7:11

ULT	UST
<i>God is a righteous judge, and a God {who is} indignant on every day.</i>	<i>God judges everyone correctly. God condemns {the wicked} constantly.</i>

How does David describe God?

David describes God as a righteous judge who is indignant each day.

Psalms 7:12

ULT	UST
<i>If he does not repent, his sword he will sharpen, his bow he has bent and prepared.</i>	<i>Whenever the wicked do not repent, it is as though God sharpens his sword and puts a string on his bow {to get ready to kill them}.</i>

What will God do if a person does not repent?

God will sharpen his sword and will prepare his bow for battle.

Psalms 7:14

ULT	UST
<i>Behold he is pregnant with wickedness, and he conceives trouble, and he births lies.</i>	<i>Look at the wicked person who is filled with evil intentions, as though pregnant with them, who plans to trouble people like conceiving a child, and who lies as naturally as giving birth.</i>

How does David describe the wicked person who does not repent?

David describes the wicked person as filled with evil intentions, as though pregnant with them, and as one who lies as naturally as giving birth.

Psalms 7:15

ULT	UST
<i>He digs a pit and hollows it out and falls into the hole he has made.</i>	<i>If he digs a deep pit to trap others, he will fall into his own trap.</i>

What happens to the wicked man who digs a pit?

He falls into the hole he has made.

Psalms 7:16

ULT	UST
<i>His trouble returns on his head, and his violence comes down on the top of his head.</i>	<i>He experiences the bad things that he wants to cause to others, he hurts himself by the violent things that he wants to do to others.</i>

What happens to the trouble and violence of the wicked man?

He experiences the bad and violent things that he wants to do to others.

Psalms 7:17

ULT	UST
<i>I will thank Yahweh according to his righteousness, and sing praise to the name of Yahweh, the Most High.</i>	<i>I thank Yahweh because he always acts justly, I sing to praise Yahweh, who is the highest judge, and to make him famous.</i>

For what will David give thanks to Yahweh?

David will give thanks to Yahweh for his righteousness.

To whom will David sing praise?

David will sing praise to the name of Yahweh, the Most High.

Psalms 8

Psalms 8:1

ULT	UST
<i>Yahweh, our Lord, how magnificent is your name in all the earth, {you} whose splendor is bestowed on the heavens.</i>	<i>Our Lord Yahweh, people all over the world know how impressive you are! You have made the sky show {everyone} how grand you are {every time anyone looks at it}!</i>

Whose name is magnificent in all the earth?

The name of Yahweh our Lord is magnificent.

Psalms 8:2

ULT	UST
<i>Out of the mouth of children and nursing ones you have established strength because of your adversaries, to cause the enemy and avenger to end.</i>	<i>When {anyone who is weak cries for help like} nursing little children cry {for help}, you {listen and} protect them from your enemies, {the ones that want to hurt your people}. In order to protect them, you destroy enemies who want to harm them in return {for what you have justly done to them}.</i>

What did Yahweh establish out of the mouth of children and nursing ones?

Yahweh established strength.

Why did Yahweh establish strength from the mouths of children and nursing ones?

He established it in order to cause the enemy and avenger to end.

Psalms 8:3

ULT	UST
<i>When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place,</i>	<i>I look up at the sky {at night} and see the things that you have made—the moon and the stars that you have set in place.</i>

What does the psalmist see when he looks at the sky that causes him to wonder why God pays attention to people?

He sees the heavens, the moon, and the stars that God set in place.

Psalms 8:5

ULT	UST
<i>Yet you have made him to lack little from the heavenly beings, and {with} glory and majesty you have crowned him.</i>	<i>In fact though, you made humans to be just slightly lower than heavenly beings. You made humans to be glorious and majestic {like you}.</i>

How does the human race compare to the heavenly beings?

Yahweh made humans only a little lower than the heavenly beings.

With what did Yahweh crown humans?

He crowned them with glory and majesty.

Psalms 8:6

ULT	UST
<i>You made him rule over the works of your hands, everything you have put under his feet:</i>	<i>You put humans in charge of everything that you made, you made them rule over all things—</i>

What did Yahweh make mankind to do?

Yahweh made mankind to rule over the works of Yahweh's hands.

Psalms 8:7-8

What are some things that Yahweh put under mankind's feet?

He put all sheep and oxen, and even the animals of the field, the birds of the sky, and the fish of the sea, and everything that passes on the paths of the seas under mankind's feet.

Psalms 8:9

ULT	UST
<i>Yahweh, our Lord, how magnificent is your name in all the earth!</i>	<i>Our Lord Yahweh, people all over the world know how impressive you are!</i>

Whose name is magnificent in all the earth?

The name of Yahweh our Lord is magnificent.

Psalms 9

Psalms 9:1

ULT	UST

He says to trust in Yahweh and he will act on your behalf, display your justice like the daylight and your innocence like the day at noon.

He says he feels as though Yahweh had shot arrows into him and his hand had struck him.

Psalms 38:3

<i>There is no soundness in my flesh from the face of your indignation; there is no peace in my bones from the face of my sin.</i>	<i>Because you are so angry with me, my whole body suffers. My body is restless because I have sinned.</i>

Why does the psalmist say his whole body is sick?

His whole body is sick because of Yahweh's anger, and there is no peace in his bones because of his sin.

Psalms 38:4

<i>For my iniquities have passed over my head; like a heavy burden, they are too heavy for me.</i>	<i>Indeed, all my sins {are like flood waters that} rise above my head; they are like a heavy load that is too much for me to bear.</i>

How does the psalmist describe his iniquities?

He says his iniquities overwhelm him and are a burden too heavy for him to bear.

What has happened to the psalmist's wounds?

His wounds are infected and smell because of his foolish sins.

How does the psalmist describe his daily condition?

What does God know about David?

What does David not want to happen to those who wait for and seek God?

David asks that they not have shame or be humiliated because of him.

How does David want Yahweh to answer his prayer?

He asks Yahweh to answer him at a time Yahweh's choosing, rescuing him because of Yahweh's own faithful love.

What does Yahweh alone do?

What do the wicked say and do?

They mock others and speak of doing evil and oppressive things to them; they speak with pride. They talk as if they are God and boast across the earth.

Psalms 73:11

<i>And they say, "How does God know? And is there knowledge in the Most High?"</i>	<i>Wicked people say to themselves, "God certainly does not care what we do; the Most High certainly will not judge us for what we do!"</i>

What do the wicked say about God?

They say that God does not know or care about what they do, and that the Most High has no knowledge and will not judge their actions.

Psalms 73:13-14

Why does Asaph feel he guarded his heart in vain?

He has suffered and been punished every day, even though he kept his heart clean and has not committed sinful acts.

What will God do for Asaph after guiding him with his counsel?

What does Asaph say he desires?

They set up their battle flags, swung axes like woodsmen in a forest, and broke down all the carvings with hatchet and hammers.

What else did they do to the sanctuary?

What does Asaph tell the boastful and wicked not to do?

He tells them not to boast or brag about their power, and not to speak arrogantly.

What does Asaph say about God?

God is the judge and he brings some down and raises others up.

How great is the Lord's understanding?

His understanding cannot be measured.

What does Yahweh do to the wicked?

Yahweh makes wicked people fail in what they want to do.

How does Yahweh care for the animals and ravens?

Yahweh takes pleasure in those who deeply respect him and in those who confidently expect him to be faithful to his covenant promises.

Psalms 147:14

<i>The one putting peace {at} your borders, he satisfies you {with} the fat of wheat.</i>	<i>He keeps your borders safe, and gives you plenty of wheat to eat.</i>

How does Yahweh bless the people of Jerusalem?

Yahweh gives them peace by keeping their borders safe and satisfies them with plenty of wheat to eat.

Psalms 147:15

<i>The one sending his command {to} the earth, his word runs to swiftness.</i>	<i>He gives commands about what will happen on the earth, and these things happen right away.</i>

What makes thing happen on the earth?

Things happen on the earth as soon as Yahweh commands them to.

<i>The one sending his hail like crumbs, who can stand to the face of his cold?</i>	<i>He hurls down hail like small stones. When he makes it cold, no one can stand outside.</i>

How does Yahweh send down hail?

Yahweh casts his hail down like small stones.

What does the psalmist say about other nations?

Who are Yahweh's faithful ones?

The people of Israel who are close to him are respected as Yahweh's faithful people.

What should the faithful shout about?

They should shout loud praises to God.

What is the purpose of the sword in the hands of the faithful?

The sword in their hand is to punish the people of other nations for the sins they have committed against God.

What will the faithful do to the kings and nobles of the nations?

They will bind their kings with chains and their nobles with shackles of iron in order to carry out the judgment that God has decreed against them..

For what should everyone praise God?

Everyone should praise God for the mighty things he has done and for his greatness.

With what instruments should everyone praise God?

Everyone should praise God with shofars, lyres, harps, tambourines, stringed instruments, flutes, and cymbals.
