<i>In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.</i>	<i>The Word existed before the universe existed. The Word was with God. The Word also was God.</i>

What was in the beginning?

In the beginning was the Word.

What was the Word?

The Word was God.

John 1:1-2

Who was the Word with?

The Word was with God.

John 1:3

ULT	UST
<i>All things came into being through him, and without him came into being not one thing that has come into being.</i>	<i>God made everything through him. God made every single thing in the universe with him.</i>

Was anything made without the Word?

All things were made through him, and without him there was not one thing made that has been made.

John 1:4

ULT	UST
<i>In him was life, and the life was the light of men.</i>	<i>The Word gives eternal life, and that eternal life is {God's good and true} light {that he revealed} to humans.</i>

What was in the Word?

In him was life.

John 1:6

ULT	UST
<i>There was a man—having been sent from God—his name {was} John.</i>	<i>God sent a man named John {who was known as John the Baptizer}.</i>

What was the name of the man sent from God?

His name was John.

John 1:7

ULT	UST
<i>He came as a witness in order that he might testify about the light, so that all might believe through him.</i>	<i>He came in order to declare to people about {Jesus, who is} the light. {He declared this} so that everyone might trust in the light by means of his {testimony}.</i>

What did John come to do?

He came as a witness to testify about the light, that all might believe through him.

John 1:8-11

Did the world know or receive the light John came to testify about?

The world did not know the light John came to testify about, and that light's own people did not receive him.

John 1:12

ULT	UST
<i>But as many as received him, he gave to them the authority to become children of God, to the ones believing in his name,</i>	<i>But to everyone who accepted him and trusted in him he gave the right to become God's children.</i>

What did the light do for those who believed on his name?

To those who believed on his name he gave the right to become children of God.

John 1:13

ULT	UST
<i>the ones not born from bloods, nor from the will of the flesh, nor from the will of a man, but from God.</i>	<i>These children of God were not spiritually born by means of normal human birth, nor by human desire, nor by the desire of their fathers. Rather, they were spiritually born by God.</i>

How could those who believed on his name become children of God?

They could become children of God by being born by God.

John 1:14

ULT	UST
<i>And the Word became flesh and dwelled among us, and we beheld his glory, glory as of the One and Only from the Father, full of grace and truth.</i>	<i>The Word became a real human being and temporarily lived here {where we live}. We have seen him display his glorious nature. {That is} the glorious nature of the Unique Son who came from the Father. He fully possesses God's kind acts and true teachings.</i>

Is there or was there any other person like the Word, who came from the Father?

No! The Word is the only unique person who came from the Father.

John 1:16

ULT	UST
<i>For from his fullness we have all received even grace after grace.</i>	<i>{We know the Word fully possesses God's kind acts and true teachings} because all of us have benefited from what he fully possesses, {having benefited from} one kind act after another.</i>

What have we received from the fullness of this one John testified about?

From his fullness we have all received free gift after free gift.

John 1:17

ULT	UST
<i>For the law was given through Moses. Grace and truth came about through Jesus Christ.</i>	<i>{This is} because God gave his laws {to the Israelites} by Moses. But God's kind acts and true message came into full existence by Jesus the Messiah.</i>

What came through Jesus Christ?

Grace and truth came through Jesus Christ.

John 1:18

ULT	UST
<i>No one has seen God at any time. The One and Only God, the one being in the bosom of the Father, that one has made {him} known.</i>	<i>No one has ever seen God. But Jesus, the Unique One, is God. He is close to God the Father, and he himself has revealed the Father.</i>

Who has seen God at any time?

No man has seen God at any time.

Who has made God known to us?

The one who is in the bosom of the Father has made him known to us.

John 1:22-23

Who did John say he was when asked by the priests and Levites from Jerusalem?

He said, "I am the voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Make the way of the Lord straight,' just as Isaiah the prophet said."

John 1:29

ULT	UST
<i>The next day he sees Jesus coming to him and says, "Behold, the Lamb of God, the one taking away the sin of the world!"</i>	<i>The day after that happened, John saw Jesus coming toward him. Then he said to the people, "Look! {He is} the Lamb of God! He will sacrifice himself to forgive the sins of the people in this world."</i>

What did John say when he saw Jesus coming to him?

He said, "Look, there is the lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world."

John 1:31

ULT	UST
<i>And I did not know him, but so that he might be revealed to Israel, because of this, I came baptizing in water."</i>	<i>I did not know who he was {at first}. Nevertheless, I have been baptizing people with water for the very purpose of revealing him to the people of Israel."</i>

Why did John come baptizing with water?

He came baptizing with water so that Jesus, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world, could be revealed to Israel.

John 1:32-33

What was the sign that revealed Jesus as the son of God to John?

The sign was that on whoever John saw the Spirit descending and remaining, that one is the one who baptizes in the Holy Spirit.

John 1:37

ULT	UST
<i>And his two disciples heard {him} speaking, and they followed Jesus.</i>	<i>Then John's two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus.</i>

What did two of John's disciples do when they heard John call Jesus "the lamb of God"?

They followed Jesus.

John 1:40

ULT	UST
<i>One of the two having heard from John and having followed him was Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter.</i>	<i>One of those two disciples who had heard what John had said and followed Jesus was Andrew. {He was} Simon Peter's brother.</i>

What is the name of one of the two who heard John speak and then followed Jesus?

The name of one of the two is Andrew.

John 1:41

ULT	UST
<i>This one first finds his own brother Simon and says to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which is translated "Christ").</i>	<i>Andrew first {went and} found his brother Simon. {When he came to him,} he said, "We have found the Messiah!" (Messiah is "Christ" in the Greek language.)</i>

What did Andrew tell his brother Simon about Jesus?

Andrew told Simon, "We have found the Messiah."

John 1:42

ULT	UST
<i>He brought him to Jesus. Jesus, having looked at him, said, "You are Simon, the son of John. You will be called Cephas" (which is translated "Peter").</i>	<i>Andrew took Simon to Jesus. When Jesus looked at Peter, he said, "You are Simon. Your father's name is John. {From now on} your name will {also} be Cephas" (which {means "rock" in Aramaic and} is "Peter" in Greek).</i>

What did Jesus say Simon would be called?

Jesus said Simon would be called "Cephas" (which means "Peter").

John 1:44

ULT	UST
<i>Now Philip was from Bethsaida, from the city of Andrew and Peter.</i>	<i>Philip was from the city of Bethsaida {in Galilee}. {This is also the city that} Andrew and Peter were from.</i>

What was the city of Andrew and Peter?

The city of Andrew and Peter was Bethsaida.

John 1:49

ULT	UST
<i>Nathaniel replied to him, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are King of Israel!"</i>	<i>Then Nathaniel declared, "Teacher, you must be the Son of God! You are the King of Israel {whom we have been waiting for}!"</i>

What did Nathaniel say about Jesus?

Nathaniel said, "Rabbi, you are the son of God! You are the King of Israel."

John 1:51

ULT	UST
<i>And he says to him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, you will see the heaven opened, and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of Man."</i>	<i>Then Jesus said to him, "I am telling you the truth: {Just like the vision your ancestor Jacob long ago saw,} you will see heaven opened up, and you will see God's angels going up and coming down on me, the Son of Man."</i>

What did Jesus say Nathaniel would see?

Jesus told Nathaniel he would see the heavens opened, and all the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of Man.

John 2

John 2:1-2

Who was at the wedding in Cana of Galilee?

Jesus, his mother, and his disciples were at the wedding in Cana of Galilee.

John 2:3-5

Why did the mother of Jesus tell Jesus, “They have no wine”?

She told this to Jesus because she expected the he would do something about the situation.

John 2:7-8

What two things did Jesus tell the servants to do?

He first told them to fill the water pots with water. Then he told the servants to take some of the “water” to the head waiter.

John 2:10

ULT	UST
<i>and says to him, “Every man serves the good wine first, and the cheaper wine when they have become drunk. You have kept the good wine until now.”</i>	<i>Then he told the bridegroom, “Everyone serves the best wine first and serves the cheap wine later, when the guests have drunk a lot {and can not tell the difference}. However, you have saved the best wine until now.”</i>

What did the head waiter say after he tasted the water that had become wine?

The head waiter said, “Every man places first the good wine and then the cheaper wine when men are drunk. But you have kept the fine wine until now.”

John 2:11

ULT	UST
<i>This beginning of the signs Jesus did in Cana of Galilee, and he revealed his glory, and his disciples believed in him.</i>	<i>That was the first of the miraculous signs that Jesus did. He did it in the town of Cana, which is in the region of Galilee. There he showed how great he is. So his disciples trusted in him.</i>

What was the response of Jesus' disciples on seeing this miraculous sign?

Jesus' disciples believed in Jesus.

John 2:14

ULT	UST
<i>And he found in the temple the ones selling oxen and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting there.</i>	<i>There in the temple {courtyard} he saw men selling cattle, sheep, and pigeons {for those making sacrifices there}. {He also saw} men sitting at tables, exchanging money {for temple money}.</i>

What did Jesus find when he went to the temple in Jerusalem?

He found money changers and those that sold oxen, sheep and pigeons.

John 2:15

ULT	UST
<i>And having made a whip from cords, he drove {them} all out from the temple, and the sheep and the oxen, and he scattered the coins of the money changers and overthrew their tables.</i>	<i>So Jesus made a whip from some braided leather strips, and he used it to drive all those people out from the temple {along with} the sheep and the cattle. He also scattered the coins of the moneychangers on the ground and flipped their tables over.</i>

What did Jesus do to the sellers and money changers?

He made a whip of cords and drove all of them out from the temple, including both the sheep and the oxen. He also poured out the money changers' money and overthrew their tables.

John 2:16

ULT	UST
<i>And to the ones selling pigeons, he said, "Take these things away from here. Do not make the house of my Father a house of commerce."</i>	<i>He told those who were selling pigeons, "Take these pigeons out of here! Do not turn my Father's house into a marketplace!"</i>

What did Jesus say to the pigeon sellers?

He said, "Take these things away from here. Stop making my father's house a marketplace."

John 2:18

ULT	UST
<i>Then the Jews responded and said to him, "What sign do you show us, since you are doing these things?"</i>	<i>The Jewish leaders then responded by asking Jesus, "What miracle can you do for us {to prove that you have authority from God} to do these things that you are doing?"</i>

How did the Jewish authorities respond to Jesus' actions in the temple?

They asked Jesus, "What sign will you show us, since you are doing these things?"

John 2:19

ULT	UST
<i>Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up."</i>	<i>Jesus replied to them, "If you destroy this temple, then in three days I will rebuild it."</i>

How did Jesus answer the Jewish authorities?

He answered them by saying, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up."

John 2:21

ULT	UST
<i>But that one was speaking about the temple of his body.</i>	<i>However, the temple Jesus was speaking about was his own body, {not the temple building}.</i>

What temple was Jesus referring to?

Jesus was speaking of the temple of his body.

John 2:23

ULT	UST
<i>Now when he was in Jerusalem at the Passover, at the festival, many believed in his name, seeing his signs that he was doing.</i>	<i>At a later time, when Jesus was in Jerusalem at the Passover celebration, during {the days of} the celebration, many people trusted in him because they saw the miracles he kept on doing.</i>

Why did many believe in Jesus' name?

They believed because they saw all the miraculous signs he did.

John 2:24-25

Why would Jesus not trust himself to the people?

He would not trust himself to the people because he knew all people, what was in mankind, and because he did not need anyone to testify concerning mankind.

John 3

John 3:1

ULT	UST
<i>Now there was a man from the Pharisees, Nicodemus {was} his name, a ruler of the Jews.</i>	<i>Now there was a man named Nicodemus. He was a member of {a strict Jewish religious group called} the Pharisees. He was a member of the highest Jewish governing council.</i>

Who was Nicodemus?

Nicodemus was a Pharisee, a member of the Jewish Council.

John 3:2

ULT	UST
<i>This one came to him at night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you have come from God as a teacher, for no one is able to do these signs that you do unless God is with him."</i>	<i>He visited Jesus at night. He said to Jesus, "Teacher, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God. {We know this} because no one can do these miracles you are doing unless God is helping him."</i>

What did Nicodemus testify to Jesus?

Nicodemus told Jesus, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him."

John 3:3-4

What did Jesus tell Nicodemus that confused and perplexed Nicodemus?

Jesus told Nicodemus that one had to be born again in order to enter the kingdom of God.

John 3:4

ULT	UST
<i>Nicodemus says to him, "How is a man able to be born, being an old man? He is not able to enter a second time into the womb of his mother and to be born, is he?"</i>	<i>Then Nicodemus said to him, "How can a person be born again when he is old? No one can enter his mother's womb and be born a second time!"</i>

What questions did Nicodemus ask that let us know that Jesus' statements confused and perplexed Nicodemus?

Nicodemus said, "How can a man be born when he is old? He cannot enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born, can he?"

John 3:10

ULT	UST
<i>Jesus answered and said to him, "Are you the teacher of Israel and yet you do not understand these things?"</i>	<i>Jesus answered him, "You are an important religious teacher among the people of Israel, so you should understand what I am saying!"</i>

How did Jesus rebuke Nicodemus?

He rebuked Nicodemus by saying, "Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things?"

John 3:13

ULT	UST
<i>And no one has ascended into heaven except the one having descended from heaven—the Son of Man.</i>	<i>I, the Son of Man, am the only one who has gone up to heaven, and I am the only one who has come down {to earth} from heaven.</i>

Who has ascended into heaven?

No one has ascended into heaven except he who descended from heaven, the Son of Man.

John 3:14-15

Why must the Son of Man be lifted up?

He must be lifted up so that all who believe in him may have everlasting life.

John 3:16

ULT	UST
<i>For God so loved the world, that he gave his One and Only Son, so that everyone believing in him would not perish but would have eternal life.</i>	<i>{This is} because God loved the world's people in this way, so that he gave his Unique Son in order that anyone who trusts in his Son would not die but would live forever.</i>

How did God show he loved the world?

He showed his love by giving his Only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have everlasting life.

John 3:17

ULT	UST
<i>For God did not send the Son into the world so that he might condemn the world, but so that the world might be saved through him.</i>	<i>{This is true} because God did not send me, his Son, into the world in order to declare the world's people guilty. Rather, {God sent me} in order to save the world's people by me.</i>

Did God send his son to condemn the world?

No. God sent his son so that the world should be saved through his son.

John 3:19

ULT	UST
<i>Now this is the judgment: that the light has come into the world, and men loved the darkness rather than the light, for their deeds were evil.</i>	<i>Now God's judicial ruling is as follows: {the one who is} the light entered the world, but people loved evil instead of him, because they do evil deeds.</i>

Why do men fall under judgment?

Men fall under judgment because light has come into the world, and men loved the darkness rather than the light because their works were evil.

John 3:20

ULT	UST
<i>For everyone is doing evil hates the light and does not come to the light, so that his deeds might not be exposed.</i>	<i>{They love the darkness} because every person who continually does evil deeds hates {the one who is} the light and will never come to him. {They avoid the light} so that the light might not reveal what they do.</i>

Why do not those who do evil come into the light?

Those who do evil hate the light and will not come into it, because they do not want their deeds exposed.

John 3:21

ULT	UST
<i>But the one doing the truth comes to the light, so that his deeds might be revealed, that they have been worked in God."</i>	<i>But the person who continually does true deeds comes to the one who is the light so that the light might show everyone what he does {and so that everyone might know} that God was helping him do these deeds."</i>

Why do those who practice the truth come into the light?

They come into the light so that their deeds may be clearly seen and to make known that their deeds have been brought about in obedience to God.

John 3:30

ULT	UST
<i>It is necessary for that one to increase, but for me to decrease.</i>	<i>{Jesus, the bridegroom,} must become more influential, and I, {the bridegroom's friend,} must become less influential.</i>

What did John say would happen to Jesus' ministry compared to John's ministry?

John said, "He must increase, but I must decrease."

John 3:33

ULT	UST
<i>The one having received his testimony has set his seal that God is true.</i>	<i>{However,} whoever believes what Jesus says has verified that God is truthful.</i>

What did those who accepted the testimony of the one from above, from heaven, confirm?

They confirmed that God is true.

John 3:35

ULT	UST
<i>The Father loves the Son and has given all things into his hand.</i>	<i>God the Father loves the Son and has given him authority over everything.</i>

What has the Father given into the hand of the Son?

He has given all things into the Son's hand.

John 3:36

ULT	UST
<i>The one believing in the Son has eternal life, but the one disobeying the Son will not see life, but the wrath of God remains on him."</i>	<i>Whoever trusts in God's Son will live forever {with him in heaven}. Whoever does not obey the Son of God will never have eternal life. Rather, God will continually be furious with him."</i>

What do those who believe in the Son have?

They have eternal light.

What happens to those who disobey the Son?

They will not see life, but the wrath of God abides on them.

John 4

John 4:1-3

When did Jesus leave Judea and depart for Galilee?

Jesus left Judea and departed for Galilee after he knew the Pharisees had heard that he was making and baptizing more disciples than John.

John 4:5

ULT	UST
<i>Then he comes to a town of Samaria called Sychar, near the piece of land that Jacob gave to his son Joseph.</i>	<i>Next, they arrived at a city named Sychar in the region of Samaria. Sychar was near the plot of ground that Jacob had given to his son Joseph {a long time ago}.</i>

Where did Jesus come to on his way to Galilee?

He came to a Samaritan town called Sychar.

John 4:7

ULT	UST
<i>A woman from Samaria comes to draw water. Jesus says to her, "Give me to drink,"</i>	<i>A Samaritan woman came out {to the well} {to lower a bucket on a rope} to pull up some water. Jesus said to her, "Please give me some water to drink."</i>

Who came to Jacob's well while Jesus was there?

A Samaritan woman came there to draw water.

What did Jesus first say to the Samaritan Woman?

He said to her, "Give me some water to drink."

John 4:8

ULT	UST
<i>for his disciples had gone away into the city so that they might buy food.</i>	<i>{He said this} because his disciples had left {him by himself} and had gone into the city in order to buy food.</i>

Where were Jesus' disciples?

They had gone away into town to buy food.

John 4:9

ULT	UST
<i>Then the Samaritan woman says to him, "How do you, being a Jew, ask from me to drink, being a Samaritan woman?" (For Jews do not have dealings with Samaritans.)</i>	<i>And the Samaritan woman said to Jesus, "I am surprised that you, a Jew, are asking me, a woman from Samaria, for a drink." ({She said this} because Jews usually would not have anything to do with Samaritans.)</i>

Why was the Samaritan woman surprised that Jesus would talk to her?

She was surprised because Jews had no dealings with the Samaritans.

John 4:10

ULT	UST
<i>Jesus answered and said to her, "If you had known the gift of God and who is the one saying to you, 'Give me to drink,' you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water."</i>	<i>Jesus replied to her, "If you had known the gift that God wants to give you, and if you had known who I am who is requesting a drink from you, you would have asked me for a drink, and I would have given you living water."</i>

What does Jesus say to turn the conversation to the things of God?

Jesus tells her that if she had known the gift of God and who was talking to her, she would have asked, and he would have given her living water.

John 4:11

ULT	UST
<i>The woman says to him, "Sir, you do not have a vessel and the well is deep. From where then do you have the living water?"</i>	<i>The woman replied, "Sir, you do not have a bucket {with which to draw the water up out of the well,} and this well is deep. {Since you can not get the water out of this well,} where did you get this living water from?"</i>

What statement does the woman make to indicate she does not understand the spiritual nature of Jesus' comments?

The woman replied, "Sir, you do not have a bucket, and the well is deep. Where would you get that living water?"

John 4:14-15

What does Jesus tell the woman about the water that he will give?

Jesus tells the woman that those who drink the water he gives will never thirst again, and the water will become a fountain of water springing up into eternal life.

John 4:15

ULT	UST
<i>The woman says to him, "Sir, give me this water so that I might not thirst and might not come here to draw {water}."</i>	<i>The woman said to Jesus, "Sir, please give me some of this water in order that I may never become thirsty again or have to come to this well to draw water again."</i>

Why does the woman now want this water that Jesus offers?

She wants the water so she will not get thirsty and will not have to come to the well to draw water.

John 4:16

ULT	UST
<i>He says to her, "Go, call your husband, and come here."</i>	<i>Jesus told her, "Go get your husband and bring him here."</i>

Jesus then changes the subject of conversation. What does he tell the woman?

Jesus tells her, "Go, call your husband, and come back here."

John 4:17

ULT	UST
<i>The woman answered and said to him, "I do not have a husband." Jesus says to her, "You have rightly said, 'I do not have a husband,'</i>	<i>The woman answered him, "I have no husband." Jesus told her, "You are right in saying that you have no husband,</i>

How does the woman answer Jesus when he tells her to call her husband?

The woman tells Jesus she has no husband.

John 4:18

ULT	UST
<i>for you have had five husbands, and the one whom you now have is not your husband. This you have said is true."</i>	<i>because you have had not one, but five, husbands, and the man you are currently {living with} is not your husband. What you have said {about not having a husband} is true."</i>

What does Jesus say about the woman which he could not know by natural means?

He tells her she has had five husbands and the man she now has is not her husband.

John 4:20

ULT	UST
<i>Our fathers worshiped on this mountain, but you say that in Jerusalem is the place where it is necessary to worship."</i>	<i>Our ancestors worshiped God right here on this mountain, but you Jews say that we must worship God at {your temple} in Jerusalem."</i>

What controversy does the woman bring up to Jesus concerning worship?

She bring up a controversy about where is the proper place to worship.

John 4:23-24

What does Jesus tell the woman about the kind of worshipers the Father seeks?

Jesus tells her God is a Spirit, and true worshipers must worship God in spirit and in truth.

John 4:25-26

What does Jesus say to the woman when she tells Jesus that when Messiah (Christ) comes, he will declare everything to them?

Jesus tells her that he is the Messiah (Christ).

John 4:28-29

What did the woman do after her conversation with Jesus?

The woman left her water pot, went back to town, and said to the people, "Come see a man who told me all things that I ever did. This could not be the Christ, could it?"

John 4:30

ULT	UST
<i>They went out from the town and came to him.</i>	<i>Those men left the city and came to Jesus.</i>

What did the town's people do after they heard the woman's report?

They left the town and came to Jesus.

John 4:34

ULT	UST
<i>Jesus says to them, "My food is that I might do the will of the one having sent me and might complete his work."</i>	<i>Jesus told them, "This is what sustains me: It is to do what my Father—who sent me—wants and to complete my Father's work."</i>

What does Jesus say his food is?

Jesus said his food was to do the will of the one who sent him and to complete his work.

John 4:36

ULT	UST
<i>The one harvesting receives wages and gathers fruit for eternal life, so that the one sowing and the one harvesting might rejoice together.</i>	<i>The one who harvests these crops receives payment and collects fruit, which is people receiving life forever {in heaven}. The result is that those who sow the seed and those who reap the harvest will be glad together.</i>

What is the benefit of harvesting?

The harvester receives wages and gathers fruit for everlasting life, so that he who sows and he who harvests may rejoice together.

John 4:39

ULT	UST
<i>Now many of the Samaritans from that city believed in him because of the report of the woman, testifying, "He told me all things that I have done."</i>	<i>Now many Samaritans who lived in the city of Sychar trusted in Jesus because of what the woman had told them. She said, "He told me so many things that I have done."</i>

Why did many Samaritans in that city to believe in Jesus?

The woman's report caused many Samaritans in that city to believe in Jesus.

John 4:42

ULT	UST
<i>And they said to the woman, "We no longer believe because of your speech, for we ourselves have heard, and we know that this one is truly the Savior of the world."</i>	<i>The townspeople told the woman, "We believe in Jesus now, but not just because of what you told us about him. {We believe} because we have heard his message for ourselves. Now we know that this man truly is the one who saves the believers in the world {from their sins}."</i>

What did many of those Samaritans believe about Jesus?

They said that they now knew that Jesus was indeed the Savior of the world.

John 4:45

ULT	UST

They welcomed him because they had seen all the things that he had done in Jerusalem at the festival.

A certain royal official whose son was sick came to Jesus, imploring him to come down and heal his son.

Jesus told him people would not believe unless they saw signs and wonders.

<i>Jesus says to him, "Go. Your son lives." The man believed the word that Jesus spoke to him, and he went away.</i>	<i>Jesus told him, "Go home. Your son will live." The man trusted what Jesus told him, and he started to go back home.</i>

What did the royal official do when Jesus did not go with him but told him, "Go; your son lives"?

The man believed the word that Jesus spoke to him, and he went his way.

John 4:53

ULT	UST
<i>Then the father realized {that it was at that} hour in which Jesus had said to him, "Your son lives." And he himself and his whole household believed.</i>	<i>And the boy's father recognized that his son had recovered at the exact time that Jesus had told him that his son would live. So this same man, along with everyone who lived in his house, trusted in Jesus.</i>

What was the result after the father of the sick child was told that his son was living and that the fever had left him the day before at the seventh hour, at the same hour Jesus had told him, "Your son lives."?

The result was the royal official and his whole household believed.

What did Jesus say to the sick man he had healed after Jesus found him in the temple?

Jesus told him, “See, you have become well! Do not sin any more, lest something worse happens to you.”

<i>The man went away and announced to the Jews that Jesus is the one having made him healthy.</i>	<i>That man went away and told the Jewish leaders that the man who had healed him was Jesus.</i>

What did the healed man do after Jesus told him to stop sinning?

What happens if you do not honor the Son?

If you do not honor the Son, you do not honor the Father who sent him.

The scriptures testify concerning Jesus.

What was Philip's response to Jesus' question, "Where are we going to buy bread so that these may eat?"?

Philip said, "Two hundred denarii worth of bread would not be sufficient for each one to have even a little."

What happened to the weather after the disciples got into a boat and started out for Capernaum?

A strong wind began to blow and the sea started getting rough.

The one coming to me will certainly not hunger, and the one believing in me will certainly not ever thirst."</i>	<i>Jesus told the crowd, "{Like food sustains physical life}, I am the bread that gives eternal life. {Unlike with food or drink}, anyone who trusts in me will surely be satisfied forever."</i>

What does Jesus say is the bread of life?

Jesus says that he is the bread of life.

<i>Did not Moses give you the law? Yet none of you does the law. Why do you seek to kill me?"</i>	<i>Moses did indeed give you laws {from God}. None of you completely obeys those laws. {Since that is true,} why are you trying to kill me {for supposedly disobeying those same laws that you do not obey}?"</i>

According to Jesus, who does the law?

Jesus said none of you does the law.

John 7:23

ULT	UST
<i>If a man receives circumcision on the Sabbath so that the law of Moses might not be broken, why are you angry with me because I made a man completely healthy on the Sabbath?</i>	<i>Since you sometimes circumcise someone on the day for rest in order to avoid disobeying the law of Moses, you should not be angry with me for {doing a good work like} healing someone on that day!</i>

What is Jesus' argument for healing on the Sabbath?

Jesus' argument was: You will circumcise a man on the Sabbath so that the law of Moses is not broken. Then why are you angry with me because I made a man completely well on the Sabbath.

John 7:24

ULT	UST
<i>Do not judge according to appearance, but judge righteous judgment."</i>	<i>Stop judging me according to what you have seen! Rather, judge me according to what God says is right."</i>

How did Jesus tell the people to judge?

Jesus told them not to judge according to appearance, but to judge righteously.

John 7:27

ULT	UST
<i>But we know where this one is from. But when the Christ would come, no one knows where he is from."</i>	<i>But {this man cannot be the Messiah!} We know where this man came from, but when the Messiah comes, no one will know where he is from."</i>

What was one of the arguments the people made for not believing Jesus was the Christ?

The people said they knew where Jesus came from, but they said when Christ comes, no one will know where he comes from.

John 7:32

ULT	UST
<i>The Pharisees heard the crowd murmuring these things about him, and the chief priests and the Pharisees sent officers so that they might arrest him.</i>	<i>Some of the Pharisees overheard them quietly speaking these things about Jesus. Then they and the ruling priests sent temple guards to arrest him.</i>

Who sent officers to arrest Jesus?

The chief priests and the Pharisees sent officers to arrest Jesus.

John 7:35-36

Did the Jews understand what Jesus meant when he said, “Yet a little while am I still with you, and then I go to him who sent me. You will seek me but will not find me; where I go, you will not be able to come.”?

By their conversation among themselves, they indicated that they did not understand Jesus’ statement.

John 7:37-39

What was Jesus referring to when he said, “If anyone is thirsty, let him come to me and drink. He who believes in me, as the scripture has said, from within him will flow rivers of living water”?

Jesus said this about the Spirit, whom those who believed in him would receive.

John 7:45-46

How did the officers answer the chief priests and Pharisees who said to them, “Why did you not bring him (Jesus)”?

The officers answered, “No man has ever spoken like this before.”

John 7:50-51

How did Nicodemus answer the Pharisees when the Pharisees asked the officers sent to arrest Jesus, “Have you also been led astray? Have any of the rulers believed in him, or any of the Pharisees”?

Nicodemus said to the Pharisees, “Does our law judge a man unless it first hears from him and knows what he does?”

John 8

John 8:2-3

While Jesus was teaching the people in the temple, what did the scribes and Pharisees do?

They brought in a woman caught in the act of adultery and placed her in their midst and asked Jesus what he had to say about her (to judge her).

John 8:4-6

Why did the scribes and Pharisees really bring this woman to Jesus?

They really brought this woman to Jesus in order to trap Jesus so that they might have something to accuse him about.

John 8:7

ULT	UST
<i>But when they continued asking him questions, he stood up and said to them, "Let the blameless one among you throw a stone at her first."</i>	<i>While they continued to question him, he got up and told them, "Let the one among you who has never sinned throw the first stone at her {and lead the rest to kill her}!"</i>

What did Jesus say to the scribes and Pharisees after they kept asking Jesus about the woman caught in adultery?

Jesus said to them, "He who is without sin among you, let him be the first to throw a stone at her."

John 8:9

ULT	UST
<i>But each of the Jews went out, beginning with the oldest, so that they all went out, and he was left alone, with the woman being in the midst.</i>	<i>{After he did this,} those Jewish leaders {who were questioning him} started walking away, one by one. The older ones left first and then the younger ones. Then only Jesus was there with the woman in the midst of the people.</i>

What did the people do after Jesus spoke to them about who should be the first to throw a stone at the woman caught in adultery?

After Jesus spoke, they went out one by one, beginning from the eldest and ending with the last.

John 8:11

ULT	UST
<i>And she said to him, "No one, Lord." And he said, "Neither do I condemn you. Go, from now sin no longer."]</i>	<i>The woman replied, "There is no one, sir." Then Jesus said, "I do not condemn you {to be punished} either. Leave, and from now on do not sin like this anymore!"]</i>

What did Jesus tell the woman (caught in adultery) to do?

Jesus told her to go her way and to sin no more from then on.

John 8:13

ULT	UST
<i>Then the Pharisees said to him, "You testify about yourself; your testimony is not true."</i>	<i>The Pharisees then told him, "You are the only witness for yourself! {Since the law of Moses requires at least two witnesses,} what you say cannot be true!"</i>

What was the Pharisees complaint after Jesus said, "I am the light of the world; he who follows me will not walk in the darkness but will have the light of life"?

The Pharisees complained that Jesus was bearing witness about himself and that his witness was not true.

John 8:17-18

How did Jesus defend his witness as being true?

Jesus said that in their law it is written that the testimony of two men is true. He then stated that he and the Father who sent him both bear witness about Jesus.

John 8:23-24

On what did Jesus base his statement about the Pharisees that they would die in their sins?

Jesus based that statement on his knowledge of them, that they were from below, and he was from above. They were of this world and he was not of this world.

John 8:24

ULT	UST
<i>Therefore, I said to you that you will die in your sins. For unless you believe that I am, you will die in your sins."</i>	<i>Because of this I told you that you will die without God forgiving you for all the sins that you have committed. This will certainly happen unless you trust that I am {God, as I say I am}."</i>

How could the Pharisee escape dying in their sins?

Jesus said they would die in their sins unless they believed "that I am."

John 8:26-27

What things did Jesus say to the world?

Jesus said to the world the things he heard from the Father.

John 8:29

ULT	UST
<i>And the one having sent me is with me. He has not left me alone, because I always do what is pleasing to him."</i>	<i>My Father, who sent me, is always with me. He has never abandoned me, because I always do only the things that delight him."</i>

Why did the Father who sent Jesus stay with him and not leave him alone?

The Father was with Jesus and did not leave him alone because Jesus always did the things that were pleasing to the Father.

John 8:31

ULT	UST
<i>Then Jesus said to the Jews having believed in him, "If you remain in my word, you are truly my disciples;</i>	<i>Jesus then told the Jews who now believed that he was the Messiah, "If you obey what I teach you, then you are my genuine disciples.</i>

How did Jesus say the Jews who had believed in him could know they were truly his disciples?

They could know they were truly Jesus' disciples by remaining in his word.

John 8:33

ULT	UST
<i>They replied to him, "We are the seed of Abraham and have never been slaves to anyone; how can you say, 'You will be free'?"</i>	<i>They answered him, "We are the descendants of Abraham. We have never been anyone's slaves! Why do you say that we need to be free?"</i>

What did the Jews that believed Jesus think Jesus was referring to when he said, "... and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."?

Those Jews thought Jesus was speaking of being slave of, or in bondage to, men.

John 8:34

ULT	UST
<i>Jesus answered them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, that everyone committing sin is a slave of sin."</i>	<i>Jesus replied, "I am telling you the truth: Anyone who sins {is controlled by his sinful desires like} a slave {is controlled by his master}.</i>

What was Jesus referring to when he said, "and you shall know the truth and the truth will set you free"?

Jesus was referring to being set free from being slaves of sin.

John 8:37

ULT	UST
<i>I know that you are the seed of Abraham, but you seek to kill me, because my word has no place in you.</i>	<i>I know that you are Abraham's physical descendants. However, you are trying to kill me because you refuse to trust what I say.</i>

What is the reason, according to Jesus, the Jews sought to kill Jesus?

They sought to kill Jesus because his word had no place in them.

John 8:39-40

Why did Jesus say these Jews were not Abraham's children?

Jesus said they were not Abraham's children because they did not do the works of Abraham. Instead, they sought to kill Jesus.

John 8:42

ULT	UST
<i>Jesus said to them, "If God were your Father, you would have loved me, for I came from God and am here; for neither have I come from myself, but that one sent me.</i>	<i>Jesus told them, "If God were your Father, which he is not, you would love me because I came from him and have come to this world. {This is true} because I did not come on my own authority. Rather, I came because God sent me.</i>

When these Jews say they have one Father, God, how does Jesus refute them?

Jesus said to them, "If God were your Father, you would have loved me, for I came from God and am here; for neither have I come from myself, but that one sent me."

John 8:44

ULT	UST
<i>You are from your father, the devil, and you want to do the desires of your father. That one was a murderer from the beginning and does not stand in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he would speak a lie, he speaks from his own {nature}, because he is a liar and the father of it.</i>	<i>You belong to your father, the devil, and you desire to do what he desires. He has been murdering people since the time people first {sinned}. He has rejected what is true, because he never speaks those true things. Whenever he lies, he is doing what is natural for him to do, because he is a liar. He is even the origin of lying.</i>

Who does Jesus say is the father of these Jews?

Jesus says their father is the devil.

What did Jesus say about the devil?

Jesus said that the devil was a murderer from the beginning and does not stand in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When the devil speaks a lie, he speaks from his own nature because he is a liar and the father of lies.

John 8:47

ULT	UST
<i>He who is from God hears the words of God; because of this you do not hear, because you are not from God."</i>	<i>Those who belong to God accept {and obey} what he has said. Since {this is true,} you do not accept {and obey} what God has said, because you do not belong to God."</i>

Who hears the words of God?

He who is from God hears the words of God.

John 8:51

ULT	UST
<i>Truly, truly, I say to you, if anyone keeps my word, he will certainly not see death into eternity."</i>	<i>I am telling you the truth: Anyone who obeys my teaching will surely never die!"</i>

What does Jesus say will happen if anyone keeps Jesus' word?

If anyone keeps Jesus' word, he will never see death.

John 8:52

ULT	UST
<i>The Jews said to him, "Now we know that you have a demon. Abraham and the prophets died; but you say, 'If anyone keeps my word, he will certainly not taste death into eternity.'"</i>	<i>The Jews opposing Jesus said to him, "Now we are sure that a demon is controlling you! Abraham and the prophets died long ago! Yet you say that anyone who obeys your teaching will surely never die!"</i>

Why did the Jews say Jesus had a demon?

They said this because Jesus said, "Truly, truly, I say to you, if anyone keeps my word, he will never see death."

John 8:52-53

Why did the Jews think Jesus' statement about never seeing death was outlandish?

They thought this because they were thinking of the physical death of the body. Even Abraham and the prophets died (their physical bodies).

John 8:58

ULT	UST
<i>Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, before Abraham came into existence, I am."</i>	<i>Jesus told them, "I am telling you the truth: I was {God} before Abraham was born!"</i>

What statements does Jesus make to say that he was alive before Abraham?

Jesus said, "Truly, truly, I say to you, before Abraham was born, I AM."

John 9

John 9:2

ULT	UST
<i>And his disciples asked him, saying, "Rabbi, who sinned, this one or his parents, so that he might be born blind?"</i>	<i>His disciples asked him, "Teacher, whose sin caused this man to be blind when he was born? Did this man or his parents sin?"</i>

What is the assumption made by the disciples as to why the man was born blind?

The disciples are assuming that the reason the man was born blind is because either the man or his parents had sinned.

John 9:3

ULT	UST
<i>Jesus answered, "Neither did this one sin, nor his parents, but so that the works of God might be revealed in him.</i>	<i>Jesus replied, "It was neither the sin of this man nor the sin of his parents {that caused him to be blind when he was born}. Rather, {he was blind when he was born} so that I might show people the miraculous works God will do in him.</i>

What does Jesus say is the reason the man was born blind?

Jesus says the man was born blind so that the works of God should be revealed in him.

John 9:6-7

What did Jesus do and say to the blind man?

Jesus spit on the ground, made some mud and anointed the man's eyes with the mud.

John 9:7

ULT	UST
<i>And he said to him, "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam," (which is translated "Sent"). So he went away and washed and came back seeing.</i>	<i>Then Jesus said to the blind man, "Go and wash {the mud off} in the pool of Siloam!" ("Siloam" means "sent" {in Aramaic}). So the man left and washed {the mud off in that pool}. Then he went {home} when he was able to see.</i>

What happened after the blind man washed in the pool of Siloam?

He came back seeing.

John 9:9

ULT	UST
<i>Some said, "It is he." Others said, "Not at all, but that one is like him." He kept saying, "It is me."</i>	<i>Some people said, "Yes, he is that man." Other people said, "No, but he just looks like that man." However, the man himself said, "Yes, I am the man who was blind!"</i>

What did the man testify when a dispute arose as to whether or not he was the man born blind who used to sit and beg?

The man testified that he was the blind beggar.

John 9:13

ULT	UST
<i>They bring him, the one formerly blind, to the Pharisees.</i>	<i>{Some of the people there} took the man who used to be blind to some of the Pharisees.</i>

What did the people do who were with the formerly blind beggar?

They took the man to the Pharisees.

John 9:14

ULT	UST
<i>(Now it was a Sabbath on the day Jesus made the mud and opened his eyes.)</i>	<i>(Now the day when Jesus made the mud {with his saliva} and enabled the man to see was the Jewish day for rest.)</i>

When did the healing take place?

The healing of the blind man took place on the Sabbath.

John 9:15

ULT	UST
<i>Then again the Pharisees also began asking him how he received his sight. But he said to them, "He put mud on my eyes, and I washed, and I see."</i>	<i>Then the Pharisees questioned the man for a second time. {This time} as well, they asked him about how he was now able to see. He told them, "The man placed mud on my eyes, and I washed {it off}, and now I {am able to} see {for the first time}."</i>

What did the Pharisees ask the formerly blind man?

They asked him how he had received his sight.

John 9:16

ULT	UST
<i>Then some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God because he does not keep the Sabbath." Others said, "How is a man, a sinner, able to do such signs?" And there was a division among them.</i>	<i>Some of the Pharisees then said, "{We know that} this man has not come from God, because he does not follow the rules for the Jewish day for rest." Some other Pharisees said, "Surely a sinful man could not do the kinds of miraculous signs that this man does!" So the Pharisees disagreed with each other {regarding who Jesus was}.</i>

What was the division that arose among the Pharisees?

Some Pharisees said Jesus was not from God because he did not keep the Sabbath (he healed on the Sabbath) and some of the Pharisees said how could a man that is a sinner do such signs.

John 9:17

ULT	UST
<i>Therefore, they ask the blind man again, "What do you say about him, since he opened your eyes?" And he said, "He is a prophet."</i>	<i>So the Pharisees asked the blind man again, "What do you say about this man, since you say that he is the one who enabled you to see?" The man said, "He must be a prophet."</i>

What did the formerly blind man say about Jesus when asked?

The formerly blind man said, "He is a prophet."

John 9:18

ULT	UST
<i>Therefore, the Jews did not believe about him that he was blind and received his sight until they called the parents of him having received sight.</i>	<i>Because {the man believed that Jesus was a prophet}, the Jewish leaders did not believe that the man had been blind and then became able to see until after they summoned the man's parents {in order to question them}.</i>

Why did the Jews call in the parents of the blind man that had received his sight?

They called in the man's parents because they still did not believe the man was the one that had been blind.

John 9:20

ULT	UST
<i>So his parents answered and said, "We know that this is our son and that he was born blind."</i>	<i>His parents replied, "We are certain that this man is our son. We are also certain that he was blind when he was born."</i>

What did the parents of the man testify concerning their son?

The parents testified that the man was indeed their son and that he had been born blind.

John 9:21

ULT	UST
<i>But how he now sees, we do not know, or who opened his eyes, we do not know. Ask him; he has full maturity. He will speak for himself."</i>	<i>Nevertheless, we do not know how he is able to see at this time. We also do not know who enabled him to see. Ask him. He is old enough to speak on his own behalf."</i>

What did the man's parents say they did not know?

They said they did not know how he could now see, or who opened his eyes.

John 9:22

ULT	UST
<i>His parents said these things because they were afraid of the Jews. For the Jews had already agreed that if anyone would confess him {as} the Christ, he would be put out of the synagogue.</i>	<i>(The Jewish leaders had previously agreed among themselves that they would ban anyone who declared that Jesus was the Messiah from entering the Jewish meeting place. Because of this, the man's parents were afraid of them and told them those things.)</i>

Why did the man's parents say, "He is an adult. Ask him"?

They said this because they were afraid of the Jews. For the Jews had already agreed that if anyone should confess Jesus to be the Christ, he should be put out of the synagogue.

John 9:24

ULT	UST
<i>Therefore, for a second time they called the man who had been blind and said to him, "Give glory to God. We know that this man is a sinner."</i>	<i>So the Jewish leaders summoned for a second time the man who had been blind. They told him, "Glorify God {by speaking only the truth}! We ourselves are certain that this man {who you say healed you} is sinful."</i>

What did the Pharisees say to the formerly blind man when they called him in the second time?

They said, "Give glory to God. We know this man (Jesus) is a sinner."

John 9:25

ULT	UST
<i>Then that one replied, "I do not know whether he is a sinner. One thing I know: that being blind, now I see."</i>	<i>The man whom Jesus healed replied, "I do not know if he is sinful or not. One thing I do know is that I used to be blind, but now I can see."</i>

What was the formerly blind man's response to the Pharisees when they called Jesus a sinner?

He replied, "Whether he is a sinner, I do not know. One thing I do know: Once I was blind, and now I see."

John 9:27

ULT	UST
<i>He answered them, "I have told you already, and you did not listen! Why do you want to listen again? You do not want to become his disciples also, do you?"</i>	<i>He replied, "I have already told you the answers to those questions, but you did not listen to what I said. Why do you want me to tell you again? Could it be that you also desire to become his disciples?"</i>

What questions did the formerly blind man ask the Pharisees?

The formerly blind man said, "Why do you want to hear it again? You do not want to become his disciples too, do you?"

John 9:31

ULT	UST
<i>We know that God does not hear sinners, but if someone is devout and does his will, he hears this one.</i>	<i>We are certain that God does not respond to {the prayers of} sinful people. Rather, he responds to {the prayers of} people who worship him and who do what he wants them to do.</i>

When the Pharisees reviled the man, what did the formerly blind man say everyone knew?

The formerly blind man said that everyone knew God does not listen to sinners.

John 9:34

ULT	UST
<i>They answered and said to him, "You were completely born in sins, and you are teaching us?" And they put him out.</i>	<i>The Jewish leaders replied to him, "You were born blind entirely as a result of {your parents'} sins! How dare you teach us!" Then they banned him from the Jewish meeting place.</i>

How did the Pharisees respond to the blind man's retort?

They rebuked the man he was born in sin and yet he dared to teach them. Then they cast the man out of the synagogue.

John 9:35

ULT	UST
<i>Jesus heard that they had put him out, and having found him, he said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?"</i>	<i>Jesus heard that the Jewish leaders had banned the man he had healed from the Jewish meeting place. When he {searched for him and} found him, he asked him, "Do you trust the Son of Man?"</i>

What did Jesus do when he heard the formerly blind man had been cast out of the synagogue?

Jesus went looking for the man and found him.

John 9:35-36

What did Jesus say to the formerly blind man after Jesus found him?

Jesus asked the man if he believed in the Son of Man, and then he told the formerly blind man that he (Jesus) was the Son of Man.

John 9:38

ULT	UST
<i>Now he said, "Lord, I believe" and he worshiped him.</i>	<i>The man said, "Lord, I trust {that you are the Son of Man}." Then he went down on his knees and worshiped Jesus.</i>

How did the formerly blind man respond when told that Jesus was the Son of Man?

The formerly blind man told Jesus he believed, and he worshiped Jesus.

John 9:41

ULT	UST
<i>Jesus said to them, "If you were blind, you would have no sin, but now you say, 'We see.' Your sin remains."</i>	<i>Jesus replied, "If you recognized that you are spiritually blind, you would not be guilty of sin. However, because you claim to perceive God's truth, like someone who sees, you are still guilty of your sin."</i>

What did Jesus say about the sins of the Pharisees?

Jesus told them, "If you were blind, you would have no sin. However, now you say, 'We see.' So your sin remains."

John 10

John 10:1

ULT	UST
<i>"Truly, truly, I say to you, the one not entering through the gate into the sheep pen but climbing up some other way, that one is a thief and a robber.</i>	<i>"I am telling you the truth: Anyone who enters into the sheep pen by any way other than the pen's gate is a thief or bandit {who has come to steal the sheep}.</i>

According to Jesus, who is a thief and a robber?

He who does not enter by the gate into the sheepfold, but climbs up some other way, that man is a thief and a robber.

John 10:2

ULT	UST
<i>But the one entering through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep.</i>	<i>The man who enters the sheep pen through the gate is the shepherd {who takes care} of the sheep.</i>

Who enters the sheepfold by the gate?

He who enters the sheepfold by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep.

John 10:3-4

Why do the sheep follow the shepherd when he calls them?

They follow the shepherd because they know his voice.

John 10:5

ULT	UST
<i>Now they will certainly not follow a stranger, but they will flee from him, for they do not know the voice of strangers."</i>	<i>His sheep will never follow someone whom they do not know. Rather, they will run away from him because they do not recognize the voices of people they do not know."</i>

Will the sheep follow a stranger?

No. The sheep will not follow a stranger.

John 10:7-8

What were all those who came before Jesus came?

All those who came before Jesus came were thieves and robbers, and the sheep did not listen to them.

John 10:9

ULT	UST
<i>I am the gate. If anyone enters through me, he will be saved, and he will go in and go out and will find pasture.</i>	<i>I myself am the gate {to heaven}. God will save {from eternal punishment} anyone who comes to him by trusting in me. {Whoever trusts in me} will be like a sheep who walks around safely and finds food.</i>

Jesus said he was the gate. What happens to those who enter through that gate?

Those who enter through Jesus, the gate, will be saved; they will go in and out and will find pasture.

<i>I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.</i>	<i>I myself am like a good shepherd. The good shepherd is willing to die {in order to protect and to save} his sheep, {and so am I willing to die for my disciples}.</i>

What does the good shepherd, Jesus, do for his sheep?

Jesus, the good shepherd, lays down his life for the sheep.

John 10:16

ULT	UST
<i>And I have other sheep that are not from this sheep pen. It is necessary for me to bring them also, and they will hear my voice and there will be one flock, one shepherd.</i>	<i>There are also sheep that belong to me and are from a different sheep pen. {They are people who are not Jews.} I must also bring them to myself. They will respond to what I say, and all those who belong to me will be united as one flock, and I will be their one shepherd.</i>

Does Jesus have another sheep fold, and if so, what will happen to them?

Jesus said he had other sheep that were not of that fold. He said he must bring them, and they would hear his voice so that there would be one flock and one shepherd.

John 10:17

ULT	UST
<i>Because of this the Father loves me, because I lay down my life so that I might take it up again.</i>	<i>My Father loves me because I will willingly die in order that I may make myself alive again.</i>

Why does the Father love Jesus?

The Father loves Jesus because Jesus lays down his life that he may take it up again.

John 10:18

ULT	UST
<i>No one takes it away from me, but I lay it down from myself. I have authority to lay it down, and I have authority to take it up again. I received this command from my Father."</i>	<i>Nobody is forcing me to die. Rather, I myself choose to die. I have authority to willfully die and I have authority to make myself alive again. That is the work my Father has commanded me to do."</i>

Does someone take Jesus' life away?

No. He lays if down of himself.

Where did Jesus get the authority to lay down his life and to take it again?

Jesus received this command from his Father.

What did the Jews say because of Jesus' words?

Many said, "He has a demon and is insane. Why do you listen to him?" Others said, "These are not the statements of one possessed with a demon. Can a demon open the eyes of the blind?"

<i>Then the Jews surrounded him and began saying to him, "How long are you taking away our life? If you are the Christ, tell us openly."</i>	<i>The Jewish leaders gathered around Jesus and said, "How long will you keep us wondering about who you are? If you are the Messiah, then tell us plainly {so that we can know}."</i>

What did the Jews say to Jesus when they surrounded him in the Temple in Solomon's porch?

They said, "How long will you hold us in suspense? If you are the Christ, tell us plainly."

How was God going to be glorified?

God was going to be glorified in the Son of Man. When the Son of Man was glorified, that glorified God.

What does Jesus call the other comforter that the Father will give to be with the disciples forever?

Jesus calls him the Spirit of Truth.

Why can the world not receive the Spirit of Truth?

Where does Jesus say the Spirit of Truth will be?

Jesus said the Spirit of Truth would remain with and be in the disciples.

To whom did Jesus reveal the Father's name?

Jesus revealed the Father's name to the people the Father gave to Jesus from the world.

Jesus prays for people who will believe in him through the word of those who followed him at that time.

What does Jesus ask the Father to do for those the Father has given to Jesus?

Jesus asks the Father to keep them in the Father's name so they may be one, for them to be one in both Jesus and the Father so that the world would believe God sent Jesus.

How does the Father love those he gave to Jesus?

The Father loves them even as he loved Jesus.

Jesus asks that his followers may be with him where he is, to see his glory.

Who else came to the garden with lanterns, torches and weapons?

Judas, leading a group of soldiers and officers from the chief priests and Pharisees, also came to the garden.

Jesus asked them, "For whom are you looking?"

Why did Jesus say, "I told you that I am he; so if you are looking for me, let these others go"?

Jesus said this so that the word might be fulfilled that he said: "Of those whom you have given me, I lost not one."

What did Jesus tell Peter after Peter cut off the ear of Malchus, the servant of the high priest?

Jesus said to Peter, "Put your sword back into its sheath. The cup that the Father has given me, should I not drink it?"

<i>And they led him first to Annas, for he was the father-in-law of Caiaphas, who was high priest that year.</i>	<i>Then they took him to Annas first, because he was Caiaphas's father-in-law, and Caiaphas was the high priest that year.</i>

After the group of soldiers, their captain and the officers of the Jews seized Jesus, where did they take him?

They first took Jesus to Annas.

Who was Annas?

Annas was the father-in-law to Caiaphas, who was high priest that year.

The woman guarding the door to the courtyard, the people standing around the fire of coals and one of the servants of the high priest, who was a relative of the man whose ear Peter had cut off, all asked Peter if he was with Jesus or a disciple of Jesus.

In brief how did Jesus answer when the high priest asked Jesus about his disciples and his teaching?

Jesus said he spoke openly to the world in public. He told the chief priest to ask those who heard him about what he said.

They did not enter the Praetorium so that they might not be defiled and so that they might eat the Passover.

They answered and said to him, "If this man were not an evil doer, we would not have delivered him up to you."

The Jews said to him, "It is not lawful for us to put anyone to death."</i>	<i>So Pilate told them, "You yourselves take him and judge him by your own law." Why did the Jews take Jesus to Pilate instead of punishing Jesus themselves?

The Jews wanted to kill Jesus, but it was not lawful for them to put any man to death without permission from the Roman authorities (Pilate).

What did Pilate ask Jesus?

Pilate asked Jesus, "Are you the King of the Jews?"

John 18:36

What did Jesus tell Pilate about Jesus' kingdom?

Jesus told Pilate that his kingdom is not part of this world and does not come from here.

For this I have been born, and for this I have come into the world, so that I would bear witness to the truth. This is why I was born into this world: I came in order to tell people what is true about God. Everyone who believes what is true about God accepts and obeys what I say."</i>

For what purpose was Jesus born?

Jesus was born to be a king and to bear witness to the truth.

What is Pilate's judgment about Jesus after talking with him?

Pilate said to the Jews, "I find no guilt in this man."

The Jews cried out again and said, "Not this man, but Barabbas."

What did the soldiers do to Jesus after Pilate had Jesus whipped?

The soldiers twisted thorns together to make a crown, put it on Jesus' head, and dressed him in a purple garment. They came to him and said, "Hail, king of the Jews!" and they struck him with their hands.

Why did Pilate bring Jesus out to the people again?

Pilate brought Jesus out to the people so that they would know that Pilate found no guilt in Jesus.

What was Jesus wearing when Pilate brought him back out to the people?

Jesus was wearing the crown of thorns and the purple garment.

<i>Therefore, when the chief priests and the officers saw him, they cried out, saying, "Crucify him, crucify him!" Pilate says to them, "Take him yourselves and crucify him, for I find no guilt in him."</i>	<i>When the ruling priests and temple guards saw Jesus, they shouted, "Crucify him! Crucify him!" Pilate told them, "You yourselves take him and crucify him! As for me, I have found no evidence that this man has broken a law."</i>

What did the chief priests and the officers say when they saw Jesus?

They cried out and said, "Crucify him, crucify him!"

What did the Jews say that made Pilate even more afraid?

The Jews told Pilate, "We have a law, and by that law he ought to die because he made himself the Son of God."

John 19:9

ULT	UST
<i>and he entered into the governor's palace again and says to Jesus, "Where are you from?" But Jesus gave him no answer.</i>	<i>He entered his headquarters once more {and commanded the soldiers to bring Jesus back inside. Then} he asked Jesus, "Where did you come from?" What did Jesus say when Pilate asked Jesus, "From where do you come?"?

Jesus gave Pilate no answer.

Who did Jesus say gave Pilate power over Jesus?

Jesus said, "You would have no power against me, unless it had been given you from above."

Everyone making himself a king speaks against Caesar."</i>	<i>From that moment on, Pilate kept trying to release Jesus. However, the Jewish leaders cried out, "If you release this man, you are not loyal to Caesar! Anyone who claims to be a king opposes Caesar."</i>

Although Pilate wanted to release Jesus, what did the Jews say that prevented him?

The Jews cried out saying, "If you release this man, you are not Caesar's friend. Everyone who makes himself a king speaks against Caesar."

What was the last thing the chief priests said before Pilate handed Jesus over to them to be crucified?

The chief priests said, "We have no king but Caesar."

Where did they crucify Jesus?

They crucified Jesus at Golgotha, which means "The Place of a Skull."

Why did the soldiers do what they did with Jesus' garments?

This happened so that the Scripture might be fulfilled that said, "They divided my garments among themselves."

This happened so that the scripture would be fulfilled which says, "They divided my garments among themselves and cast lots for my clothing." The soldiers divided up Jesus' garments into four parts, a part for each soldier. But they cast lots to see who would get Jesus' shirt, which was without seams.

Who was standing near the cross of Jesus?

Jesus' mother, his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, Mary Magdalene, and the disciple whom Jesus loved were standing near the cross of Jesus.

What did Jesus tell his mother when he saw his mother and the disciple he loved standing nearby?

From that hour the disciple Jesus loved took Jesus' mother to his own home.

Why did Jesus say, "I am thirsty"?

Jesus said this in order to make the scriptures come true.

What did Jesus do after he had taken the vinegar from the sponge that was held up to his mouth?

After taking the vinegar, Jesus said, "It is finished." Then he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.

John 19:31

ULT	UST
<i>Then the Jews, because it was a day of preparation, so that the bodies would not remain on the cross during the Sabbath (for that Sabbath was an especially important day), asked Pilate that their legs would be broken and they would be taken away.</i>	<i>The Jewish leaders then asked Pilate to {order his soldiers to} break the legs of the three men on crosses {so that the men would die more quickly} and take away their bodies in order that the bodies would not remain on the crosses during the Jewish day for rest. {They asked this} because it was the day when the Jewish people prepared for the Passover celebration {and the day for rest, and leaving dead bodies on crosses during those days violated Jewish law}. (Since the next day was also the day for rest, it was a very important day.)</i>

Why did the Jews want Pilate to break the legs of the executed men?

It was the Preparation, and in order that the bodies should not remain on the cross during the Sabbath (for that Sabbath was an important day), the Jews asked Pilate that the legs of the executed men be broken so they would die quickly and that their bodies might be taken down.

<i>But having come to Jesus, as they saw that he had already died, they did not break his legs.</i>	<i>However, when they came to Jesus, they saw that he was dead already. So they did not break his legs.</i>

Why did the soldiers not break Jesus' legs?

They did not break Jesus' legs, because they saw he was already dead.

<i>However, one of the soldiers pierced his side with a spear, and immediately blood and water came out.</i>	<i>Instead, one of the soldiers stabbed Jesus' side with a spear, and right away blood and water poured out {of the wound}.</i>

What did the soldiers do to Jesus after they saw that he was already dead?

One of the soldiers pierced Jesus' side with a spear, so that blood and water came out.

<i>And the one that had seen this has testified, and his testimony is true. And that one knows that he speaks the truth so that you would also believe.</i>	<i>(I, John, am the one who saw this happen and have testified about it and what I have testified is true. Why did the one who saw all these things concerning the crucifixion of Jesus bear witness to them?

That one bore witness to these events so that you also may believe.

Why were the legs of Jesus not broken and why was Jesus pierced with a spear?

These things came about so that the scripture might be fulfilled, "Not a single bone of him will be broken." and again, "They will look on him whom they pierced."

<i>Now after these things, Joseph from Arimathea, being a disciple of Jesus (but secretly for fear of the Jews), asked Pilate that he might take away the body of Jesus. And Pilate gave him permission. So he came and took away his body.</i>	<i>After these things happened, Joseph, who was a man originally from the city of Arimathea, asked Pilate to allow him to take away Jesus' body. {He did this} because he was one of Jesus' disciples. However, he did not tell anyone that, because he was afraid of the other Jewish leaders. Pilate allowed Joseph to take away Jesus' body, so Joseph went and did so.</i>

Who came and asked to take away the body of Jesus?

Joseph of Arimathea asked Pilate that he might take away the body of Jesus.

Who came with Joseph of Arimathea to take away the body of Jesus?

Nicodemus came with Joseph of Arimathea.

What did Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus do with the body of Jesus?

They wrapped Jesus' body in linen cloths with spices. Then they laid Jesus' body in a new tomb which was in a garden.

When did Mary Magdalene come to the tomb?

She came to the tomb very early on the first day of the week.

What did Mary Magdalene see when she got to the tomb?

She saw that the stone had been rolled away from the tomb.

<i>Therefore, she runs and comes to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and she says to them, "They took away the Lord from the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him."</i>	<i>So she ran to where Simon Peter and the other disciple, John, whom Jesus loved, {were staying}. She told them, "Some people have removed the Lord Jesus' body from the tomb, and we do not know where they have put it!"</i>

What did Mary Magdalene say to the two disciples?

She told them, "They have taken away the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him."

What did Simon Peter and the other disciple do after they heard what Mary Magdalene said?

They both went to the tomb.

John 20:6-7

What did Simon Peter see in the tomb?

Peter saw the linen cloths lying there. The cloth that had been on his head was not lying with the linen cloths but was folded up in its place by itself.

<i>So then the other disciple, the one having first arrived at the tomb, also went in, and he saw and believed.</i>	<i>Then John, that other disciple who had reached the tomb before Peter, went inside as well. He saw these things and believed {that Jesus had become alive again}.</i>

He saw and believed.

What did Mary see when she stooped and looked into the tomb?

She saw two angels in white sitting, one at the head, and one at the foot, where the body of Jesus had lain.

She says to them, "Because they took away my Lord, and I do not know where they put him."</i>	<i>They asked her, "Madam, why are you crying?" What did the angels say to Mary?

They asked her, "Woman, why are you weeping?"

<i>Having said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, and she did not know that it was Jesus.</i>	<i>After she said that, she turned around and saw someone standing there. {It was Jesus,} but she did not recognize him.</i>

When Mary turned around, what did she see?

She saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus.

<i>Jesus says to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you seeking?" She, thinking that he is the gardener, says to him, "Sir, if you carried him away, tell me where you put him, and I will take him away."</i>	<i>He asked her, "Madam, why are you crying? Who are you looking for?" She thought that the man speaking to her was the gardener, so she told him, "Sir, if you have carried Jesus' body away, tell me where you have put it. I will take it {and bury it again}."</i>

Who did Mary think Jesus was?

She thought he was the gardener.

John 20:16

<i>Jesus says to her, "Mary." Having turned, she says to him in Hebrew, "Rabboni" (which means "Teacher").</i>	<i>Jesus {called her by name,} saying, "Mary!" She turned {toward him again and} said to him, "Rabboni!" (which means "Teacher" in the language spoken by the Jews).</i>

When did Mary recognize Jesus?

She recognized Jesus when he said her name, "Mary."

John 20:17

<i>Jesus says to her, "Do not hold on to me, for I have not yet gone up to the Father; but go to my brothers and say to them, 'I go up to my Father and your Father, and my God and your God.'"</i>	<i>Jesus told her, "Stop clinging to me, because I have not yet returned to {heaven to be with} my Father. Go to the disciples, my brothers, and tell them that I am about to return to {heaven to be with} my God and Father, who is also your God and Father."</i>

Why did Jesus tell Mary not to hold on to him?

Jesus told her not to hold on to him because he had not yet ascended to the Father.

What did Jesus tell Mary to say to his brothers?

Jesus told her to say to his brothers, that he will ascend to his Father and their Father, and his God and their God.

John 20:18

ULT	UST
<i>Mary Magdalene comes, telling the disciples, "I have seen the Lord," and that he said these things to her.</i>	<i>Mary Magdalene went to Jesus' disciples and told them, "I have seen the Lord Jesus!" {She} also told them what Jesus had told her.</i>

What did Mary Magdalene do after she saw the stone rolled away from the tomb?

She ran and told the other disciples Jesus' message for them.

John 20:19

<i>Then, being evening on that day, the first of the week, and the doors of where the disciples were having been closed for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and says to them, "Peace to you."</i>	<i>On the evening of that same Sunday, the disciples had locked the doors of the place where they were staying, because they were afraid of the Jewish leaders. Jesus suddenly arrived and stood among them. He told them, "May God give you peace!"</i>

What happened where the disciples were on the evening of the first day of the week?

Jesus came and stood in the midst of them.

<i>And having said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced, having seen the Lord.</i>	<i>After he said this, he showed his disciples the wounds that were in his hands and side. They were very happy when they saw the Lord Jesus!</i>

What did Jesus show the disciples?

He showed them his hands and his side.

John 20:21

ULT	UST
<i>Then he said to them again, "Peace to you. Just as the Father has sent me, so I send you."</i>	<i>Jesus then told them a second time, "May God give you peace! I am sending you {into the world} just like my Father sent me."</i>

What did Jesus tell the disciples that he would do?

Jesus said he was sending the disciples just as his Father had sent him.

What did Jesus say to his disciples after he breathed on them?

He told them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whoever's sins you forgive, they are forgiven for them; whoever's sins you keep back, they are kept back."

Thomas, one of the twelve, called Didymus, was not with the other disciples when Jesus came.

However, he told them, "I will only believe you if I see the holes in his hands that were caused by nails and put my fingers in them and if I put my hand into the wound on his side {that was made by a spear}."</i>

What did Thomas say it would take for him to believe that Jesus was alive?

Thomas said he would have to see the print of the nails in Jesus' hands and put his fingers into the nail prints and put his hand into Jesus' side before he would believe.

<i>And after eight days his disciples were inside again, and Thomas {was} with them. Jesus comes, the doors having been closed, and stood in their midst, and said, "Peace to you."</i>	<i>Eight days later, Jesus' disciples were again inside a house, and this time Thomas was with them. Although they had locked the doors, Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, "May God give you peace!"</i>

When did Thomas see Jesus?

Eight days later, while the doors were shut, Thomas was with the other disciples when Jesus came and stood among them.

<i>Then he says to Thomas, "Place your finger here and see my hands. And reach out your hand and put it into my side. And do not be unbelieving, but believing."</i>	<i>Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger into the holes here, and see the holes in my hands, and put out your hand, and place it in the wound in my side! Stop doubting {that I became alive again}. Rather, believe {that it is true}!"</i>

What did Jesus tell Thomas to do?

Jesus told Thomas to reach with his finger and see Jesus' hands and reach with his hand and put it into Jesus' side. Jesus then told Thomas not to be faithless, but believe.

<i>Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God."</i>	<i>Thomas replied, "You are my Lord and my God!"</i>

What did Thomas say to Jesus?

Thomas said, "My Lord and my God."

<i>Jesus says to him, "Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed {are} the ones not having seen, and having believed."</i>	<i>Jesus told him, "Now you believe {that I have become alive again} because you see me. God {surely} blesses those who have not seen me but yet believe {that I have become alive again}."</i>

Who did Jesus say was blessed?

Jesus said, "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

<i>Then Jesus also did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which have not been written in this book,</i>	<i>Now Jesus also did many other miraculous signs while his disciples were with him, {but} I did not write about them in this book.</i>

Did Jesus do other signs that were not written in the book?

Yes, Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples that were not written in the book of John.

Why were the signs written in the book?

They were written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and so that as you believe, you may have life in his name.

Which disciples were at the Sea of Tiberias?

Simon Peter, Thomas, called Didymus, Nathaniel from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee and two of Jesus’ other disciples were at the Sea of Tiberias.

<i>Simon Peter says to them, “I am going fishing.” They say to him, “We also are coming with you.” They went out and got into a boat, but they caught nothing during that night.</i>	<i>Simon Peter told the other disciples with him, “I am going to catch some fish.” They told him, “We will go with you.” They went out and got into the boat {and fished}, but they did not catch any fish that night.</i>

What were these disciples doing?

These disciples had gone fishing but had caught nothing all night.

<i>But he said to them, "Throw the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some." Therefore, they threw {the net} and did not have the strength to draw it in, because of the large number of fish.</i>	<i>He told them, "Throw your net off the right side of the boat and you will catch some fish." So they did so, and they caught so many fish that they were not able to pull the net {into the boat}.</i>

What did Jesus tell the disciples to do?

Jesus told the disciples to cast their net on the right side of the boat and they would catch some fish.

What happened when the disciples cast their net?

They could not draw in their net because there were so many fish in it.

<i>Then that disciple whom Jesus loved says to Peter, "It is the Lord." So when Simon Peter heard this, he put on his coat (he had taken it off to work) and jumped into the water {to swim to the shore}.</i>

What did Simon Peter do when the disciple Jesus loved said, "It is the Lord"?

He tucked up his outer garment about himself and threw himself into the sea.

What did the other disciples do?

The other disciples came in the boat, pulling the net full of fish.

What did Jesus tell the disciples to do with some of the fish that they had caught?

Jesus told the disciples to bring some of the fish they had just caught.

<i>This {was} already the third time that Jesus was revealed to the disciples, having been raised from the dead.</i>	<i>(This was the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after God had caused him to become alive again.)</i>

How many times had Jesus now shown himself to the disciples since he had risen?

This was the third time Jesus had now shown himself to the disciples since he had risen.

John 21:15

ULT	UST
<i>Then when they ate breakfast, Jesus says to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" He says to him, "Yes Lord, you know that I love you." He says to him, "Feed my lambs."</i>	<i>When they finished eating breakfast, Jesus asked Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these {others love me}?" Peter replied to him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus told him, "Take care of those who trust in me."</i>

After breakfast, what was the first thing Jesus asked Simon Peter?

Jesus asked Simon Peter if Simon loved Jesus more than these.

<i>He says to him the third {time}, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter was grieved because he said to him the third {time}, "Do you love me?" And he says to him, "Lord, you know all things; you know that I love you." Jesus says to him, "Feed my sheep.</i>	<i>Jesus asked him a third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter was sad because Jesus asked him three times if he loved him. Peter replied to him, "Lord, you know everything. You know that I love you." Jesus told him, "Take care of those who trust in me.</i>

How did Simon Peter answer Jesus the third time Jesus asked Peter if he loved Jesus?

The third time he was asked, Peter responded, "Lord, you know all things; you know that I love you."

The third time Peter responds to Jesus' question, "Do you love me?" what does Jesus tell Peter to do?

The third time, Jesus told him, "Feed my sheep."

Peter asked Jesus, "Lord, what will this man do?"

Jesus told Peter, "You follow me."

We know that what I have testified is true.</i>

Who wrote this book and to what does he bear witness?

The disciple Jesus loved wrote this book and bears witness that the events described in the book are true.
